PITTSBURGH PIRATES (9-5) vs. CHICAGO CUBS (6-8)

April 12, 2026 - Wrigley Field - Chicago, IL - 1:20 CDT - Game #15/Road #9

RHP Bubba Chandler (0-1, 3.12 ERA) vs. RHP Jameson Taillon (0-1, 2.53 ERA)

THE PIRATES: earned a series win with Saturday's 4-3, 11-inning victory at Wrigley Field...Have won eight of their last 10 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati)...Went 4-2 on their first homestand of 2026 from April 3-8 vs. Baltimore (3-0) and San Diego (1-2) after going 3-3 on their first road trip of the year from March 26-April 1 at New York-NL (1-2) and Cincinnati (2-1)...Have not lost back-to-back games since losing their first two games (March 26-28 at New York-NL).

CHECKING THE BROOM CLOSET: Pittsburgh will look to complete its second sweep (also April 3-5 vs. Baltimore) with a win today at Chicago (NL)...The Pirates' last sweep of the Cubs came from September 24-26, 2019 at PNC Park, while their last sweep at Wrigley Field came from April 14-16, 2017 (former Pirate Jameson Taillon allowed an unearned run in 7.0 innings on April 16)...Pittsburgh would also move to five games over .500 for the first time since April 15, 2024 (11-6) with a win this afternoon.

CENTRAL PERK: Pittsburgh has won each of its last four games against the National League Central, all coming away from PNC Park (March 31-April 1 at Cincinnati and Friday-Saturday at Chicago)...It marks the Pirates' first four-game road winning streak against the division since September 20-23, 2023...Pittsburgh's only five-game road winning streak vs. the N.L. Central (within a single season) since the division's inception in 1994 came from April 5-17, 2002, when the team won two games from April 5-6 at Chicago and three games from April 15-17 at Milwaukee...The Pirates were 7-19 in road games vs. the division in 2025... Pittsburgh has won each of its first two series vs. the N.L. Central in a season for the first time since 2018, when they won four straight series to begin the year (April 5-8 vs. Cincinnati, April 10-12 at Chicago, April 27-29 vs. St. Louis, May 4-6 at Milwaukee).

PITTSBURGH STEALER: Oneil Cruz went 4-for-5 with a double, a walk, three stolen bases and a run scored on Saturday at Wrigley Field (it was his fourth career four-hit game and first since August 27, 2024 vs. the Cubs)...He became one of only nine Pirates (15 instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least four hits and three stolen bases in a game, the first since Matt Lawton on July 26, 2005 at Florida (he was the first Major League player to do that since Cincinnati's Elly De La Cruz on May 16, 2024 at Los Angeles-NL)...Cruz joined Max Carey (July 7, 1922 vs. New York), Tony Womack (September 6, 1997 at Cincinnati) and Lawton as the only Pirates on that list to post those stats or better in a game...His 43 stolen bases since the beginning of the 2025 season lead the National League (De La Cruz ranks second with 42, while Chicago's Pete Crow-Armstrong is third with 39).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz extended his hitting streak to 10 straight games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) with his four-hit performance on Saturday at Chicago (NL)...His streak is the longest-active streak in Major League Baseball and is also the second-longest streak of his career, behind only an 11-game streak from August 20-31, 2024...He is hitting .415 (17-for-41) with seven extra-base hits and 12 RBI during the streak...Ke'Bryan Hayes had the team's longest hitting streak in 2025 (12, June 19-July 4).

NEW YORK: Nick Yorke reached base safely four times in five plate appearances after going 3-for-4 with a double and a walk on Saturday at Wrigley Field...He is hitting .476 (10-for-21) with three doubles and four walks in his first seven games this month.

FEELING BULLISH: Six Pirates relievers combined to allow two runs over 6.0 innings of work in Saturday's 11-inning win at Wrigley Field...Pittsburgh's bullpen has posted a 2.89 ERA (46.2ip/15er) and 58 strikeouts (an average of 11.2 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched) over its last 12 games (since March 29 at New York-NL)...The ERA ranks sixth among MLB bullpens in that time.

START ME UP: Pittsburgh's starting pitcher has pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in four straight games (since April 7 vs. San Diego)...That also happened once last season (July 23-27)...The last time it happened in five consecutive contests was from September 22-26, 2020...The Pirates' rotation has posted a 1.95 ERA (69.1ip/15er) in the last 13 games (since March 28 at New York-NL), the best mark among all Major League rotations during that stretch (the Cubs' rotation ranks second with a 2.01 ERA in that stretch)...Pittsburgh's nine wins in that time are tied with Cincinnati/Los Angeles (NL) for the most in MLB.

FROM THE ASHES: Braxton Ashcraft allowed one run on four hits and one walk while striking out nine batters over 5.0 innings during his start on Saturday at Wrigley Field...He joined Bob Friend (August 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (September 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (last year from September 4-10) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least eight strikeouts while allowing one or zero runs and one or zero walks in back-to-back appearances (struck out eight batters and allowed one run and zero walks in 6.0 innings on April 5 vs. Baltimore).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 12, 1965: Bob Bailey capped off a multi-hit day with a walkoff home run off San Francisco's Juan Marichal in the 10th inning, giving Pittsburgh a 1-0 win on Opening Day at Forbes Field. Bob Veale allowed three hits and one walk while striking out 10 Giants over 10.0 innings of work. It marked the first time in team history that the Pirates won a Home Opener in walkoff fashion by a score of 1-0.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Chandler lost a 5-0 decision after surrendering three runs on five hits and four walks (he struck out four batters) over his 4.1 innings of work on April 6 vs. San Diego.

TAKE FIVE: Chandler has struck out 29 batters and allowed 12 hits over his last five starts (25.1ip), dating back to last season on September 13 at Washington...He and Paul Skenes (September 16, 2024-April 2, 2025) are the only Pirates pitchers during the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least 29 strikeouts and 12 or fewer hits allowed over a five-game span.

PRIZED PROSPECT: Chandler is currently rated by both MLB Pipeline (No. 9) and Baseball America (No. 15) as a top-15 prospect in all of baseball (Pittsburgh farmhand Konnor Griffen, who made his MLB debut on April 3, is rated by the outlets as the top prospect in the sport).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He was the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three straight starts with at one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three) in 2025 as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and six or more strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances last season...Nine of the 11 runs he surrendered as a starting pitcher came during his first career start on Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee.

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They became the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game...They were the ninth pair of Pittsburgh pitchers since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight) and Richard Rodríguez (six) did so on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

DYNAMITE DEBUT: Chandler secured a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut on August 22 vs. Colorado...He was the first Pirates pitcher to earn a save in his MLB debut (since the stat became official in 1969), and he was one of four Major Leaguers to earn a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut, joining Boston's Bob Stanley (April 16, 1977 at Cleveland), St. Louis' Zack Thompson (June 3, 2022 at Chicago-NL) and San Francisco's Keaton Winn (June 13, 2023 at St. Louis)...Chandler was the only one to not surrender a run.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Chandler became one of two Pirates relievers since at least 1900 to pitch at least 4.0 innings in each of his first three outings (last year on August 22 vs. Colorado, August 27 at St. Louis and September 2 vs. Los Angeles-NL), along with Carmen Hill in 1915 (the last Major League pitcher to do that prior to Chandler was Kansas City's Atlee Hammaker in 1981)...He also became one of three Major League pitchers since 1969 (when saves became an official statistic) to earn two wins and a save across his first three outings, along with Minnesota's Tom Johnson (1974) & Cincinnati's Hector Carrasco (1994).

WIN (AND SAVE) THE DAY: Chandler earned his first Major League win with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief last year on August 27 at St. Louis (second game)...He also earned his first Major League save with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief on August 22 vs. Colorado, making him one of five Major League pitchers (since saves became an official statistic in 1969) to earn both a win and a save in his first two games, joining Rick Waits (1973/1975), Bob Stanley (1977), Mardie Cornejo (1978) and Mickey Weston (1989)...He was one of four MLB relievers during the Modern Era (since 1901) to begin his career with two outings of at least 4.0 scoreless innings (Hugh Bedient in 1912, Von McDaniel in 1957, Eric King in 1986).
