RAY REPORT—The Rays begin a seven-game homestand with the Orioles (four to play) and the Blue Jays (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...are a season-high 28 games above .500, the sixth season in 29 campaigns they have reached that mark (also: 2023, 2021, 2019, 2010, 2008)...reached 28 games over on Aug. 12, the third earliest date in club history behind 2023 (June 9) and 2010 (Aug. 3)...have won a season-high-tying nine straight contests and are a majors'-best 18-4 in their last 22 games (July 20–pres.) on the heels of a five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...have spent 89 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 48 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...the 89 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (136), Braves (134), Brewers (104), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the majors for two straight days, (Aug. 12–pres.), the second time they have done so this season (8 days, May 18-25)...they have led the AL outright for 87 of those days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform...hold a season-high 6.5-game lead in the AL East, their largest lead in August or later since winning the division by 8.0 games in 2021...marks the fourth season they have led the division by 6.5 games or more, joining 2023 (largest lead: 6.5), 2021 (largest lead: 9.5), and 2020 (largest lead: 7.0)...their 74-46 record is tied with 2010 for the best in team history through 120 games.

- ✦ The Rays completed a perfect road trip (9-0) on Wednesday with an 8-4 win over the Athletics...it marked their first undefeated road trip of three series or more in franchise history (see more in "West Coast Warriors" note below).
- ✦ Became the 13th team in the modern era (since 1900) to go 9-0 or better on a single road trip (see table on the right), including the fifth since 2003.
- ✦ Recorded their MLB-leading 13th series sweep, surpassing 2018 and 2013 (12) for second most in team history behind 2021 (14)...tied the 2021 Rays for the club's most sweeps before the end of August.
- ✦ Per Elias, the Red Sox are the only other team to have won all nine-plus games of a road trip in Mountain or Pacific time zones...Boston went a combined 9-0 against the Angels, Mariners, and Athletics from July 29-Aug. 7, 1977.
- ✦ The Rays have been successful on 20 of their last 21 stolen bases attempts (July 30–pres.) to surpass the Guardians (118SB) for the AL lead with 121 SB. **Chandler Simpson**, whose 33 SB pace the AL, has been successful on a career-high 14 straight attempts.
- ✦ **Steven Matz** is slated to be an opener for scheduled bulk reliever **Jesse Scholtens** tonight...the Rays are 115-73 (.612) in 188 games with an opener since introducing the concept on May 19, 2018 at Angel Stadium (7-1 in 2026)...they have a .560 winning pct. (.606-477) in all other games over that span.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Yesterday, the Rays signed **INF Jorge Mateo** to a major league contract and recalled **RHP Jesse Scholtens** from Triple-A Durham...to make room on the active and 40-man rosters, **RHP Michael Grove** and **INF Carson Williams** were optioned to Durham and **RHP Trevor Martin** was designated for assignment.

- ✦ In 65 games with the Braves this season, Mateo slashed .240/.285/.380 (31-for-129) with 6 2B, 4 HR, 11 RBI, and 10 SB...he was designated for assignment on Aug. 3, released on Aug. 9, and cleared waivers on Aug. 11...he will wear No. 9 for the Rays.
- ✦ Scholtens has appeared in nine games for the Rays in 2026, going 5-3 with 3.82 ERA (37.2IP, 16ER) and 30 strikeouts...he has pitched 4.0 innings or more in seven of his nine outings and allowed two runs or fewer in six of those seven.

BULLPEN BIRTHDAY COACH—Today is Bullpen Coach **Jorge Moncada's** 42nd birthday...the San Cristobal, Venezuela native has been with the Rays organization for all but one season of his coaching career, spending four seasons as major league bullpen coach (2023–pres.), seven as a minor league pitching coordinator (2016-22), one as a minor league assistant pitching coordinator (2015), eight as a minor league pitching coach (2007-14), and one as a pitching instructor (2006).

WEST COAST WARRIORS—The Rays completed a sweep of the Rockies, Mariners, and Athletics on their recent nine-game, three-city road trip, their first undefeated road trip of three series or more in franchise history...they swept three consecutive road series for the first time in Rays history and earned their fourth sweep in their last seven sets away from Tropicana Field (June 30–pres.) after sweeping one of their first 13 road series...they have won nine straight road games, tying the longest streak in Rays history for the fourth time, joining May 9-31, 2021; Aug. 15-31, 2020; and July 28–Aug. 13, 2019...the Rays earned their season-high-tying ninth consecutive win (also: June 24–July 3) and have recorded multiple winning streaks of nine games or more in a season for the second time in team history, joining 2021 (11G, 9G).

- ✦ During the road trip, the Rays slashed .293/.355/.498 (97-for-331) as a team with 17 home runs, 65 runs, 17 stolen bases and an .854 OPS...it marks the fourth time in team history the club has had 17 home runs or more and 17 stolen bases or more over any nine-game span and the first since three overlapping spans between June 9-20, 2009.
- ✦ The Rays allowed four runs or fewer in six of the nine games on the road trip, pitching to a 3.58 ERA (83.0IP, 33ER) with a 1.05 WHIP and 73 strikeouts...over the last seven games (Aug. 4–pres.), the bullpen posted a 2.37 ERA (30.1IP, 8ER) and a .178 opp. average (19-for-107) – both are fourth best in the majors over that span.
- ✦ The club has won 10 of its first 11 games to open August for the first time and needs to go 5-12 or better over the next 17 games to secure a winning month...the Rays are attempting to complete a season without recording a losing month in a non-shortened season for the first time...they did not tally a losing month during the 60-game 2020 campaign...the only time in team history they had a winning record in each month of a 162-game season through August was in 2008, with the club going 13-14 in September.
- ✦ With a victory tonight, the Rays would win double-digit consecutive games for the fourth time in franchise history (see table on the right)...they would also improve to 75-46, the best record in team history through 121 games, surpassing 2021, 2010, and 2008 (74-47).

MAKING A NAME—Since being acquired from the Marlins on Aug. 3, **Liam Hicks** has slashed .308/.438/.654 (8-for-26) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, and a 1.091 OPS in eight games with the Rays...he is the ninth Ray in franchise history to have 9 RBI or more within his first eight games with the club, the first to turn the trick since **Jonny DeLuca** (May 3-11, 2024, 9RBI) and the first primary catcher to do so since **Wilson Ramos** (June 24–July 7, 2017, 10RBI)...only six players in team history have had double-digit RBI in their first nine games with the club; DeLuca (May 3-12, 2024 - 10RBI), Ramos (June 24–July 9, 2017 - 10 RBI), **Luke Scott** (April 6-18, 2012 - 12 RBI, **Carlos Peña** (April 6-15, 2012 - 11RBI), **Ozzie Timmons** (Sept. 13-28, 2000 - 12 RBI), and **Herbert Perry** (May 6-17, 1999 - 10RBI).

- ✦ Through his first eight games with the club, he has a 203 OPS+, which would mark the best OPS+ by a primary catcher (at least 50% of games at the position) in a single season, surpassing **Curt Casali** (202 OPS+) who played nine games for the Rays in the 2017 season.
- ✦ Hicks launched a grand slam in his team debut on Aug. 4 at COL, becoming the first Rays player to turn the trick and the first player to do so in the majors since ATL **Dominic Smith** (March 28 vs. KC)...per Elias, he became the first Rays backstop in team history to have multiple extra-base hits in his first start for the club and the fifth player in franchise history...the last player to have a grand slam and two extra-base hits or more in their first game with a franchise was SF **Alex Dickerson** (June 21, 2019 at AZ - 3B, GS).
- ✦ Behind the plate, the backstop has a 2.82 CERA in 51.0 innings of work as a Ray...min. 50.0 IP, it would mark the fourth-lowest CERA in a single season in franchise history, behind **Jose Lobaton** (2011, 2.45), Casali (2014, 2.52), and **Bobby Wilson** (2015, 2.73).

THE FUTURE IS NOW—MLB.com updated the Top 100 Prospects list yesterday, with five Rays prospects making the list...2026 No. 2 overall selection, **SS Grady Emerson** [MLB No. 10 | TB No. 1] led the way as the organization's new top prospect, ahead of **OF Theo Gillen** [MLB No. 12 | TB No. 2], **C Caden Bodine** [MLB No. 51 | TB No. 3], **C Nathan Flewelling** [MLB No. 65 | TB No. 4], and **INF Cooper Flemming** [MLB No. 83 | TB No. 5]...the Rays are tied for the fourth-most prospects in the Top 100, behind only the Dodgers, Marlins, and Mariners (each 6).

- ✦ Emerson is the highest ranked player selected in the 2026 First-Year Player Draft, ahead of No. 1 overall draft pick CWS **Roch Cholewsky** [MLB No. 11]...he is one of four teenagers ranked inside the top 10 prospects.
- ✦ Along with Emerson, No. 33 draft pick **INF Taj Marchand** [TB No. 12], No. 49 draft pick **RHP Ben Blair** [TB No. 17], and No. 85 draft pick **RHP Gavin Giese** [TB No. 26] were the Rays 2026 selections that joined the organizations top 30 prospects.
- ✦ According to the publication previously had the Rays have the No. 1 farm system in the majors, with seven players within their Top 100 Prospects list...*Baseball America* previously had the Rays farm system ranked No. 5 in their preseason ranking and No. 2 in their midseason ranking.
- ✦ The Rays seven minor league affiliates have combined for a 340-270 (.557) record thus far in 2026, the second-best organizational record behind the Giants (355-255/.582)...Rays affiliates have have recorded a top-six winning percentage each season since 2017 (excluding 2020 with no MiLB games played).

TONIGHT'S BULK RELIEVER—Jesse Scholtens is expected to take the mound tonight for his 10th appearance of the season following opener **LHP Steven Matz**...marks his 38th career appearance...was recalled from Triple-A Durham yesterday for his third stint with the Rays this year (April 8-9 & April 11–July 23), including a 15-day IL stint between July 7-23 (right wrist sprain).

- A win tonight would mark Scholtens' fifth win in as many outings at Tropicana Field, tying the second-longest such streak in franchise history with **Shane McClellanahan** (2x, last: April 25–May 31, 2026), **Jake Odorizzi** (July 17–Aug. 25, 2016), **James Shields** (Aug. 7–Sept. 21, 2012), **David Price** (June 28–Aug. 18, 2009), and **Andy Sonnastine** (May 1–June 25, 2009)...the only Ray with a longer streak at Tropicana Field is **Zach Eflin** (8G), from April 1–June 23, 2023.
- Scholtens has not allowed his first batter faced to reach safely this season (0-for-7, 2 SO)...he is one of six AL pitchers (min. 5BF) who have not allowed a hit to their first batter faced this season.
- He is seeking his first career win following the All-Star break...he is 0-8 with 6.24 ERA (62.OIP, 43ER) in 17 such appearances.

LAST TIME OUT—Made his shortest outing of the year on May 25 at BAL, throwing 1.1 innings in extra frames (L, 1.1IP, 4H, 5R-3ER, SO, HR)...entered the game to begin the 12th inning, allowing the automatic runner, **Colton Cowser**, to score on a **Gunnar Henderson** RBI-groundout...retired two of his next three batters faced to end the inning...took the mound in the 13th frame, surrendering an RBI-double (**Leody Taveras**), sacrifice fly (**Jackson Holliday**), and home run (Cowser) to end the game...marked the first blown save of his career.

- Reached 100 career strikeouts after punching out **Adley Rutschman** on three pitches in the 12th inning.
- In his last outing with Triple-A Durham on Aug. 7 at CLT, he delivered 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing two hits and a walk against eight strikeouts in the no-decision.

BIRD WATCH—He has made four career appearances (one start) against Baltimore and is 1-1 with a 5.63 ERA (16.OIP, 10ER), 15 strikeouts, a 1.44 WHIP, and a .294 (20-for-68) opp. average...in three relief appearances vs. the Orioles, Scholtens is 1-1 with a 7.59 ERA (10.2IP, 9ER) and 14 strikeouts...two of those three outings were 4.0 innings or longer.

- In eight career outings(three starts)against AL East clubs, he has gone 2-3 with a 4.55 ERA (31.2IP, 16ER) and 26 strikeouts...his two wins and 26 strikeouts are tied with the AL Central (2-6, 26SO) for his most against any division.
- In intraleague games, Scholtens has posted a 4-10 career record with a 4.53 ERA (93.1IP, 47ER) across 10 appearances (all relief).

MORE THAN ONE ROLE—The right-hander has made 37 career appearances and 13 starts in the majors, with 21 of the 37 being 4.0 innings or more...as a starter in his career, he is 0-8 with a 5.91 ERA (64.OIP, 42ER) and 48 strikeouts compared to a 6-5 record with one save, a 3.90 ERA (67.OIP, 29ER), and 52 strikeouts as a reliever...in those 13 career starts, he has received three runs of support or more on two occasions (7.45 RSA)...as a reliever, he has received 8.90 (29.1IP, 29RS) runs of support per 9.0 innings pitched in seven contests.

FINALLY, BACK AT HOME—Tonight's contest marks his seventh outing of the season at Tropicana Field...his most recent came behind **Steven Matz** on May 20 vs. BAL, where he earned his fifth win of the year after spinning 4.0 innings of two-run ball on six hits, one walk, and four strikeouts in a 5-3 victory over the Orioles.

- Is 5-4 with a 4.70 ERA (61.1IP, 32ER) and 49 strikeouts over 16 career home games (five starts)...he has worked 2.0 innings or more in 14 of the 16 outings, but his teams have gone 5-9 in those games.

CAREER RECAP—Began the year in the White Sox organization in **2025**, making his season debut May 6 with Triple-A Charlotte in his first appearance post-Tommy John surgery after suffering a rehab setback during spring training...made eight appearances (6 starts) with the Knights, but was designated for assignment Aug. 3 before being claimed off waivers by the Rays Aug. 4 and optioned to Triple-A Durham...made seven starts with the Bulls before he was recalled Sept. 20 and finished the year in the majors.

- Made two appearances with the Rays out of the bullpen...on Sept. 20 vs. BOS, worked 3.0 IP with 1 ER allowed in his first major league outing since Sept. 20, 2023 at WSH...on Sept. 25 at BAL, collected a career-high 9 SO over 5.1 IP of relief, generating a career-high 17 whiffs, most by a Rays reliever in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...tied **Ryan Yarbrough** (May 31, 2018 at OAK) for the most strikeouts by a reliever in franchise history.
- Had a 34.2 pct. whiff rate, 31.6 pct. strikeout rate and 32.1 pct. chase rate...his 12 SO marked the most in team history through a pitcher's first two relief appearances with the Rays, surpassing **Cooper Criswell** (10) in 2023.
- Across 17 outings (15 starts) between Triple-A Durham (7 starts), Triple-A Charlotte (8G/6GS), and Class-A Winston-Salem (2 starts), went 2-2 with a 4.72 ERA (68.2IP, 36ER)...allowed 3 ER or fewer in 14 of the 17 appearances.
- Missed the **2024** season after suffering a torn right UCL during spring training that required March 1 Tommy John surgery, performed by Dr. Keith Meister in Arlington, Tx. ...placed on the 60-day IL on Feb. 27 and spent the year rehabbing at the White Sox training complex in Arizona.
- Broke into the majors in **2023**, appearing in 26 games (11 starts) after the White Sox selected his contract on April 7...was in the majors from April 7-13, May 22–June 1, and June 16–end of season...made his final appearance on Sept. 20 at WSH and was placed on the 15-day IL on Sept. 24 with a left calf strain.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER : LHP IAN SEYMOUR [9-3, 4.08]
