## MIAMI MARLINS (34-35) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (35-34)

June 12, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #70/Home #37

RHP Sandy Alcantara (5-4, 4.33 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (5-3, 3.28 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** have lost two of the first three games on this six-game homestand against Los Angeles-NL (Tuesday-Thursday) and Miami (Friday-Sunday)...Will depart for a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Athletics (June 15-17) and Colorado (June 19-21) following Sunday's homestand finale...Have the fourth-most runs scored (351) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Los Angeles-NL (373), Washington (372) and Milwaukee (352)...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (627) in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Philadelphia (641), Cleveland (639) and Milwaukee (639).

**FISH FRY:** Pittsburgh has gone 10-4 (.714) against Miami since the beginning of the 2024 season, including taking two of three contests here at PNC Park in the last series from June 9-11, 2025...The Pirates are 46-29 (.613) all-time against the Marlins at PNC Park (since 2001)...They are looking to win three straight home series against Miami (they also swept a three-game series here from September 9-11, 2024) for the first time since winning four consecutive home series against the Marlins from 2012-15.

**TY IS THE GUY:** Tyler Callihan walked, tripled (his first Major League triple) and scored a run on Thursday vs. Los Angeles (NL)...He has reached base safely in each of his last six plate appearances after homering twice and walking twice in four plate appearances on Wednesday vs. the Dodgers...Each of Callihan's first five hits with the Pirates have been extra-base hits (he also doubled on May 28 vs. Chicago-NL and on June 6 at Atlanta)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he is only the third Pittsburgh player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have each of his first five hits with the team be extra-base hits, along with Mark Johnson (1995, first five) and Rodolfo Castro (2021, first six)...Callihan and Brandon Lowe have become the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) with at least five extra-base hits and six walks through their first eight games with the team...Callihan is the only Pirate (since RBI became official in 1920) to have five extra-base hits, six RBI and six walks through his first eight games with the team.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Pirates pitchers have struck out at least seven batters in 17 straight games (since May 24 at Toronto), marking their longest such single-season streak in the Modern Era (since 1901), surpassing the previous high of 16 games (September 2-17, 2020 and August 16-September 1, 2024).

**HOME(R) HAPPY:** Pittsburgh has hit multiple home runs in six straight home games (since May 29 vs. Minnesota)...It is just the fourth time in the Modern Era (since 1901) where the Pirates have had such a streak, along with August 15-September 6, 1947 at Forbes Field (six games), July 13-22, 1995 at Three Rivers Stadium (six games) and May 18-31, 2006 at PNC Park (seven games).

**YOUNG BUCS:** Tyler Callihan/Rafael Flores Jr. (Wednesday-Thursday) were the ninth pair of Bucs (since 1887) to hit their first career home run in back-to-back team games (h/t Elias)...They joined Fred Hartman/Joe Sugden (July 27-28, 1894), Jesse Hoffmeister/Jack Rothfuss (Sept. 13-14, 1897), Ed Phelps/Kitty Bransfield (May 26-27, 1903), Goat Anderson/Alan Storke (June 29-30, 1907), Claude Hendrix/Bill McKechnie (Sept. 2, 1911), Ed Fitz Gerald/Elmer Riddle (July 20-21, 1948), George Freese/Felipe Montemayor (April 30-May 1, 1955) & Kevin Young/Al Martin (April 9-10, 1993) as the only ones.

**PACK PNC:** Pittsburgh drew at least 30,000 fans in each of its three games against Los Angeles (NL) at PNC Park this week (Tuesday-Thursday)...It marked the first time the Pirates had three straight crowds of at least 30,000 fans since July 19-21, 2024 vs. Philadelphia...It was the first time that each game of a three-game, Monday-Thursday series at PNC Park drew at least 30,000 fans since September 16-18, 2014 vs. Boston...Pittsburgh last had at least four straight crowds of at least 30,000 fans at PNC Park from July 20-27, 2016, when seven consecutive games here drew at least 30,000 fans (July 20-21 vs. Milwaukee, July 22-24 vs. Philadelphia and July 26-27 vs. Seattle).

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 12, 1970: Dock Ellis pitched the fourth no-hitter in club history during the Pirates' 2-0 win over the Padres in the first game of a doubleheader at San Diego Stadium. Ellis, who improved to 5-4, walked eight batters and hit a batter while striking out six Padres. Willie Stargell accounted for both of Pittsburgh's runs with his solo home runs off Dave Roberts in the second and seventh innings of the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

**AS OF LATE:** Ashcraft lost a 6-3 decision after allowing a career-high-tying six runs on a career-high nine hits/one hit batter (five strikeouts) in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Atlanta.

**AGAINST THE MARLINS:** Ashcraft allowed one run on one hit and two walks over 0.1 inning of relief in his only career outing against Miami (on June 11, 2025 at PNC Park).

**MR. CONSISTENT:** Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

**PITCH EFFICIENCY:** Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.

**K COLLECTOR:** Ashcraft's 86 strikeouts are tied with Miami's Max Meyer for the seventh-most in the National League, trailing only Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (116), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (113), Atlanta's Chris Sale (92), teammate Paul Skenes (89), Cincinnati's Chase Burns (88) and Philadelphia's Jesús Luzardo (88).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

**ELITE ARM:** Ashcraft had a 2.77 ERA (74.2ip/23er) and 81 strikeouts (he issued just 17 walks) over his first 12 starts...He was one of only three Pirates (since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912) to have a sub-3.00 ERA, at least 80 strikeouts and 20 or fewer walks issued through their first 12 starts of a season... Ashcraft joined Gerrit Cole (2015, 1.73 ERA/86 K) & Paul Skenes (2024, 1.93 ERA/97 K).

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .109 batting average against (6-for-55) with runners in scoring position...He has allowed five hits in 48 at-bats w/runners in scoring position in his last 11 starts (since April 11 at Chicago-NL).

**HISTORIC STRETCH:** Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.
