METSELLANEOUS: The Mets finish their second road series of the year today in Denver...The team is looking to claim their second series victory of the season and their first on the road...New York has not won consecutive series since their final road trip of the 2019 season, also against Colorado and Cincinnati...The Mets have won four of their last five games...New York is 0-1 in rubber games in 2021...The Mets are off tomorrow...The team begins a three-game set against the Cubs at Wrigley Field on Tuesday.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets have struck out 102 in 80.1 innings this season which equates to a 11.43 strikeout per nine ratio...The team's 11.43 mark is the best in the majors...The team has walked only 21 this season, giving them a 2.35 walks per nine inning ratio...That is also the best in the majors...Jacob deGrom leads the NL with 35 punchouts...He is tied with Shane Bieber for second in the majors...Tyler Glasnow leads MLB with 36.

TAP THE ROCKIES: In game one yesterday, the Mets struck out 17 in 7.0 innings...That ties a record for most strikeouts by a pitching staff in a game at Coors Field.

WHEN I WAS 17, IT WAS A VERY GOOD GAME: In game one yesterday, the Mets struck out 17 of the 26 batters they faced, a 65.4 percentage...It was the highest single-game percentage in Mets history...Yesterday marked the fourth time in franchise history that the Mets struck out 17 or more batters in a game that was 9.0 innings or less...Their franchise record is 19, which has been done twice before: October 6, 1991 at Philadelphia and April 22, 1970 vs. San Diego.

NINE IS JUST FINE: Jacob deGrom struck out a career-high nine consecutive batters during the first game of yesterday's twinbill...It was one short of an MLB record held by Tom Seaver (April 22, 1970 vs. San Diego)...He became the ninth pitcher in MLB history to strikeout at least nine consecutive batters.

NOBODY LIKES YOU WHEN YOU'RE 23: Nimmo has reached base in 23 straight games dating back to September 11 last season...He is batting .407 (33-81) with 12 runs, five doubles, a triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, 15 walks, a .505 OBP and a 1.073 OPS in that span...It is the second-longest active streak in the majors, behind only Mike Trout's 32-game streak...It is the third-longest streak in Nimmo's career.

AW SNAP: In game two yesterday, Brandon Nimmo snapped a streak where he safely reached base at least twice in nine games this season...David Wright is the only Met with a longer season-opening streak (10-straight games to start the 2012 season)...The Wyoming native is batting .471 (16-34) with five runs, three doubles, four RBI, eight walks, a .571 OBP and a 1.130 OPS...He is batting .571 (4-7) with a double and three walks against left-handed pitchers this year.

HERE'S THE PITCH: As a staff, the Mets own a 3.14 ERA (28 earned runs/80.1 innings) with 21 walks, 102 strikeouts and a .228 opponents batting average...That ERA ranks sixth in the majors and fifth in the NL.

CHEERS!: Several Mets have hit .300 or better in their career at Coors Field (min. 10 AB): Pete Alonso is 8-18 (.444) with five runs, a double, three home runs and six RBI in four games at Coors Field...Brandon Nimmo is 15-40 (.375) with four home runs and 10 RBI at the ballpark...Nimmo grew up about 100 miles from the ballpark in Cheyenne, WY...Kevin Pillar called Coors Field home last season and is a lifetime .330 (29-88) hitter here...Dominic Smith (.457, 5-14), Jonathan Villar (.349, 15-43), Albert Almora Jr. (.333, 10-30) and Michael Conforto (.313, 21-67) all have batted above .300 at Colorado.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 2-3 away from Citi Field in 2021...The Mets are playing a team from outside the NL or AL East for the first time since 2019...The Mets' last road trip away from the East Coast was a six-game trip to Colorado and Cincinnati from September 16-22, 2019.

QUALITY EATS: Through 10 complete games this season, the Mets have made seven quality starts...The Mets hurled 17 quality starts in 2020, going 9-8 in those games...Mets starters are 4-3 and own a 2.43 ERA (15 earned runs/55.2 innings) with 12 walks and 71 strikeouts in 2021...The team's 2.43 starters' ERA is second in the majors and in the Senior Circuit.

FIVE MORE MINUTES: The Mets are batting .284/.363/.397 with 19 runs, five doubles, a triple, three home runs and 13 walks over their last five games...This compares to a .222/.333/.333 mark over the team's first five games.

NOTABLE NUMBERS: Francisco Lindor is one steal away from 100 for his career...He is eight doubles away from 200 and 97 hits away from 1,000...Dominic Smith is one double away from 50 for his career...Michael Conforto is six RBI away from 350.

TOTAL DOMINATION: Dominic Smith is batting .296/.360/.564 with 64 runs, 32 doubles, a triple, 23 homers, 73 RBI, 35 walks and a .924 OPS in 149 games since the start of the 2019 season...This includes a .292/.375/.506 slash line against fellow southpaws and a .297/.356/.581 mark against right-handers.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked nine times this year...That places them tied for eighth in the majors...Michael Conforto has been hit four times, which is tied for third in MLB...Conforto was plunked a total of seven times last year, which tied for ninth in the majors...Last year, the Mets were hit by 45 pitches, which placed second behind the Cubs (52 HBP) for the major league lead...In 2019, the Mets were hit by 95 pitches in 162 games, which led the majors.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets are second in the majors and in the NL with a .347 OBP this season...Brandon Nimmo leads the majors with a .571 on-base percentage.

MOVING ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 118 home runs in his career, tying him with Ed Kranepool for 11th on the Mets all-time list...Edgardo Alfonzo is 10th with 120 dingers.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1970, Nolan Ryan tossed a one-hit shutout against the Phillies at Shea Stadium...Ryan allowed only a single to Denny Doyle to lead the game off...He walked six and struck out 15 on the way to his first win of the season...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Making his second start in three days, threw 6.0 innings of shutout ball on April 13 at Citi Field vs. Philadelphia...Earned the win...Struck out three batters and retired six via a ground ball...Stroman improved to 8-1 with a 2.61 ERA for his career against the NL East (12 G, 10 GS).

WINNING!: Stroman has gone 5-0 with a 1.49 ERA (six earned runs/36.1 innings) in his last seven starts (including his suspended outing on April 11)...The Mets have won all six of those games that have been completed...He has limited his opponent to a .195 average (25-128) during his five-game winning streak...It's the third-longest streak of his career...He won nine games in a row from September 20, 2014-May 1, 2016 and earned six straight wins from April 23-June 10, 2017.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Stroman has not allowed a run in his last 8.1 innings...This includes the last two innings of his first start on April 6, his 0.1 innings on April 11 and his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 13.

HIGH QUANTITY OF QUALITY: Stroman has thrown 6.0 innings in both of his completed starts this season and is currently sporting a 0.73 ERA, tied for sixth best in the majors.

THE STRO MUST GO ON: Threw nine pitches in a game suspended by rain on April 11 versus Miami at Citi Field, allowing one hit in 0.1 inning...In his first start of the season, Stroman earned the Mets' first win and picked up a quality start on April 6...Pitched 6.0 innings, allowing three hits and one run against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...Induced 15 ground balls and allowed only one batter to lift the ball into the air...Walked two batters and struck out three in his first regular season start since Septemer 27, 2019.

LAST START VS. COLORADO: Threw 7.0 innings of shutout ball on September 17, 2019 at Coors Field...Earned the win...Struck out seven batters and allowed four hits.

KEEP IT ON THE GROUND: Stroman recorded an 83.3 percent ground ball rate in his first start of the season...That is the highest grounder rate in any start of at least 6.0 innings so far this season...It's been almost six years since a Mets pitcher had a higher rate of ground balls in a start of 6.0 innings or more (Jonathon Niese, 85.7 percent on June 11, 2015 vs. San Francisco)...From 2014-2019, Stroman ranked third in the majors with a 58.6 percent ground ball rate...Only Dallas Keuchel (60.0 percent) and Clayton Richard (59.0 percent) induced more ground balls during that six-year period (min. 500.0 innings)...Additionally, Stroman's 0.83 HR/9 rate during that span ranked 11th in the majors.

WITH THE METS: Stroman has gone 6-2 with a 3.25 ERA (26 earned runs/72.0 innings) in his 14 starts with New York...The Mets have gone 10-3 (plus one pending suspended game) in his 14 starts after he joined the team on July 28, 2019...In 2019, he struck out 60 in 59.2 innings with the Mets (Stroman never averaged more than 9.0 K/9 in a season with Toronto).

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (0-0, 2.61 ERA)

LAST START: Walker held the Phillies to one run, earned, on three hits with three walks and eight strikeouts in a 4-3, walk-off win on April 13 (game 1) at Citi Field.

HIGH DRAMA: The Mets have won each of Walker's first two starts via a walk-off...Three of Walker's last six starts have resulted in his team coming away with a one-run victory.
