PITTSBURGH PIRATES (71-90) vs. ATLANTA BRAVES (75-86)
September 28, 2025 - Truist Park - Atlanta, GA - 3:15 EDT - Game #162/Road #81
RHP Johan Oviedo (2-0, 3.57 ERA) vs. RHP Charlie Morton (9-11, 5.89 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won four of the first five games on this season-ending, six-game road trip to Cincinnati (2-1) and Atlanta (2-0), including a 3-1 win on Saturday at Truist Park...Have won six of their last seven games (since September 20 vs. the Athletics)...Are 59-64 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have recorded

at least one extra-base hit in 60 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 78 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 60 one-run games (Atlanta ranks third with 56 one-run games), their most in a season since also playing in 60 such games in 2014 (have not played more than 60 one-run games in a season since playing 62 such games in 1992)...Have won 15 of their last 31 road games (since July 13 at Minnesota) after winning 12 of their first 49 road games in 2025.

PRIZED PROSPECT: Bubba Chandler, who is currently rated by MLB Pipeline as the No. 7 prospect in baseball, allowed one run on four hits while striking out six batters over 5.2 innings in Saturday's 3-1 win at Atlanta...He has become the first Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three straight starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts (also did that on September 13 at Washington and September 20 vs. the Athletics)...Chandler has also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three starts) this season as the only Major League pitchers in the Modern Era to make three straight starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Over his last three starts, dating back to September 13 at Washington, he has gone 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts and a .123 batting average against (7-for-57)...Chandler has become the only Pittsburgh pitcher in the Modern Era to record a three-start span with two or fewer runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least 19 strikeouts.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz went 2-for-4 with a walk and a run scored in Saturday's 3-1 win at Atlanta (he made his first appearance at second base since September 8, 2024 for Toronto at Atlanta)...Over his last 25 games, dating back to August 29 at Fenway Park, he is batting .347 (25-for-72) with eight doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, 14 walks, 15 runs scored and a 1.085 OPS.

THE ARMS RACE: The Pirates' team ERA has gone from 5.08 in 2021 to 4.66 in 2022 to 4.60 in 2023 to 4.15 in 2024 to 3.76 this season...This would be the first time Pittsburgh has improved its team ERA in four straight seasons since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912...No other Major League team has improved its team ERA in each of the last four seasons.

START ME UP: Pittsburgh's 3.71 rotation ERA is the fifth-best mark in all of Major League Baseball...It would mark the rotation's first top-five finish since posting a 3.53 ERA in 2015, which was also the fifth-best mark in the league.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: With a win today at Atlanta, Pittsburgh would complete its eighth sweep of the year...It would be the Pirates' first three-game sweep here in Atlanta since they did that from May 23-25, 1989 at Fulton County Stadium.

WHIP IT GOOD: Pittsburgh's pitching staff enters this afternoon's season finale at Atlanta with a 1.22 WHIP, its lowest mark in a year since 1972 (1.21).

PLAYING THE FIELD: Pittsburgh has committed just 49 errors in 123 games since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta, trailing only Texas (34), Chicago-NL (39), Atlanta (40), Philadelphia (47) and Kansas City (48) for the fewest errors in Major League Baseball in that span...Individually, Jared Triolo (the 2024 National League Gold Glove winner for utility players) has accumulated seven Defensive Runs Saved as a third baseman, according to the Fielding Bible...His seven DRS as a third baseman rank seventh in MLB.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Pittsburgh's pitching staff enters this afternoon's season finale at Atlanta allowing just 0.96 home runs per 9.0 innings...That is the third-best mark in all of Major League Baseball, behind only San Francisco (0.90) and New York-NL (0.94)...The Pirates' 152 home runs allowed this season are their fewest in a full season since allowing 110 home runs in 2015.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Bryan Reynolds leads the Pirates with 143 hits, which will mark his fifth straight season leading the team in hits (since 2021)...He will join Honus Wagner (six, 1905-1910) and Roberto Clemente (five, 1963-1967) as the only Pirates players to lead the team in hits in five consecutive seasons.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

<u>September 28, 2000</u>: The Pirates scored twice in the ninth inning to rally for a 3-2 win vs. the Astros in what would be their final walkoff victory at Three Rivers Stadium. Pittsburgh was down to its final out after Brian Giles grounded out to Houston third baseman Chris Truby, which moved Mike Benjamin to second base. After John Vander Wal drew a walk, Jason Kendall recorded a pinch-hit single off Octavio Dotel that scored Benjamin and tied the game. Vander Wal then scored on Warren Morris' walkoff single.

TODAY'S STARTER RHP JOHAN OVIEDO #24

2025 RECORD: 2-0, 3.57 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-6/275 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R

BORN: March 2, 1998

AGE: 27 **SIGNED:** Thru 2025 **HOW ACQUIRED:** From St. Louis in a four-player trade on August 1, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT: Oviedo allowed two runs (came on a two-run home run from Elly De La Cruz) on two hits and three walks while striking out a season-high seven batters over 4.2 innings of work on Tuesday at Cincinnati, having a no-decision in the 4-2 win.

THE MORE YOU JO: Oviedo has made five starts with Pittsburgh where he's pitched at least 5.0 innings, allowed two or fewer hits, one or zero runs and struck out at least five batters (last on August 20 vs. Toronto)...His five such starts since making his Pirates debut in 2022 are the second-most during that span, behind only Paul Skenes (seven).

AGAINST THE BRAVES: Oviedo has a 5.06 ERA (5.1ip/3er) in two career appearances (one start) against Atlanta, both of which have come at Truist Park...He struck out two batters over 1.2 scoreless innings of relief for St. Louis on July 4, 2022 (no-decision in the Cardinals' 6-3 loss)...Oviedo also allowed three runs on nine hits, one walk and one hit batter in his start for Pittsburgh on September 9, 2023 (no-decision in the 8-4 win).

ON THE FARM: Oviedo was optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis following Pittsburgh's win on August 4 vs. San Francisco...In two starts with the Indians (August 9 vs. Omaha and August 15 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre), he allowed four runs (three earned) while striking out 15 batters over his 8.2 innings of work before being recalled on August 20.

THE LONG ROAD BACK: Oviedo missed all of 2024 while recovering from right elbow surgery (December 6, 2023)...In 2025 spring training, he was placed on the 60-day injured list on March 3 due to surgery recovery/a right lat strain...Oviedo returned to a Major League mound for the first time since September 27, 2023 at Philadelphia with his start on August 4 vs. San Francisco (he threw 43 pitches in his 1.0 inning of work).

ON THE MEND: On his rehab assignment, which was split between the rookie-level Florida Complex League Pirates, Low-A Bradenton, Double-A Altoona and Triple-A Indianapolis, Oviedo posted a 3.12 ERA (17.1ip/6er) and 21 strikeouts across six starts.

2023 IN REVIEW: Oviedo went 9-14 with a 4.31 ERA (177.2ip/85er) while making a team-high-tying 32 starts (also Mitch Keller) during the 2023 season...He had 15 starts where he allowed one or zero runs, tied with Miami's Braxton Garrett and Minnesota's Sonny Gray for the second-most starts in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (17)...Those 15 starts were also the most by any Pittsburgh pitcher in a season since Francisco Liriano in 2013 (Paul Skenes had 18 this year)...Oviedo's .237 batting average against was the eighth-lowest among all qualified pitchers in the National League...He had a career-high, 15.1-inning scoreless streak from April 3-14.

YOU COMPLETE ME: Oviedo tossed his first career complete game on August 28, 2023 at Kansas City, allowing two hits and two walks while striking out five batters and throwing a career-high 112 pitches in Pittsburgh's 5-0 win...The 112 pitches thrown by Oviedo that evening were the most by a Pirates pitcher in a complete game since Edinson Volquez threw 114 pitches in his complete game on July 10, 2014 at St. Louis.

LAND OF THE FREE: Oviedo defected from Cuba at the age of 15, living in Ecuador and the Dominican Republic before settling in Jacksonville, Florida, when he was 18...He brought his family from Cuba to the United States of America in the 2022-23 offseason.

WELCOME TO TOWN: Oviedo was acquired, along with infielder Malcom Nuñez, from St. Louis in a four-player trade that sent left-handed pitcher José Quintana and right-handed pitcher Chris Stratton to the Cardinals on August 1, 2022...He made his team debut on September 2 of that season vs. Toronto, striking out four batters in 3.0 scoreless innings...Oviedo went 2-2 with a 3.23 ERA (30.2ip/11er) in seven starts with the Pirates in 2022...His .198 batting average against (23-for-116) from the time he made his Pittsburgh debut through the end of the season was the 10th-lowest mark among all National League pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched in that stretch.

 - His 2.87 catcher's ERA (681.2ip/217er) so far this year is the lowest by any Pittsburgh backstop with at least 600.0 innings caught in a single season.

- **®** His three-walk game on 9/13 at Washington was his first since 6/25/24 with Chicago (AL)...Has 18 RBI in his last 27 games (since 8/20 vs. Toronto).
- **®** Has gone 65-for-235 (.277) w/24 extra-base hits and 43 RBI since 6/22 vs. Texas...Is 23-for-68 (.338) with 32 RBI w/RISP since 5/25 vs. Milwaukee.
