METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned a 2-1 walk-off victory over the White Sox yesterday...The Mets have won three in a row and four of their last five games...With a victory today, the Mets would move to 13 games above .500, which would match a season-high...The Mets continue a nine-game homestand (3-1) against the Dodgers (3-1), White Sox (three games) and Rockies (three games).

ODD + ENDS: The Mets 33-21 record is tied for the sixth-best start to the season in franchise history...They join the 1972, '86, '88, 2006, '07 and '22 Mets as the only squads to record as many wins through their first 54 games...New York has allowed one or zero runs in 15 games this season, tied with Texas and Detroit for the third-most such games in the majors...Yesterday marked the team's fifth walk-off win of the season, tied with Boston and Minnesota for the third-most such win in the majors...It was their 13th comeback wins of the season and their third in as many games...The Mets have won each of their last four games decided by one run...The had lost six of their previous seven one-run games.

WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT: The Mets earned the walkoff win yesterday thanks to an RBI sac fly from Francisco Lindor...He recorded his third walk-off RBI of the season and the ninth such RBI of his career...He is the first Met since Michael Conforto (2021) to have three or more walk-off RBI in a single season.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are seeking their 11th series win of the season and their eighth at home...The Mets are looking for their second straight series win after dropping the previous two series.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 20-6 home, tied with the 2015 team and the 2021 team for the best home record to begin a season...Their .769 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors this season...Mets pitchers have recorded a 2.37 ERA at home this season which is the second-lowest in the majors.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a hit in 27 consecutive at-bats, the longest active streak in the majors...He has not allowed an earned run over his last 12 games, recording five saves and allowing four hits, five walks and 16 strikeouts during that span...He has not allowed a hit over last seven appearances, which ties the longest streak of his career.

PITCHING IN: The Mets lead the majors with a 2.78 ERA and are fifth with 482 strikeouts...They are tied for fifth with five shutouts...New York's starting staff has posted a 2.84 ERA this year, the best in the majors...The bullpen ranks second in the majors with a 2.68 ERA.

THE HUASCAR GOES TO: Over the last 12 games, Huascar Brazobán has pitched to a 0.56 ERA (1 ER/16.0 IP) and has held opposing batters to a .137 (7-51) average...His nine scoreless outings of four outs or more are the most in the majors among relief pitchers...His 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) as a relief pitcher is the eighth-best such mark in the majors (min. 20.0 IP)...He has stranded 15 of 17 inherited runners (88.2%), the best mark in the majors (min. 15 inherited runners).

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 10-9 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year...Overall, New York owns a 288-285 record in Interleague play.

INTERGALACTIC: Pete Alonso has hit a franchise-record 59 home runs in Interleague Play...His 59 home runs are tied for the seventh-most all-time...It is tied for third among active players with Manny Machado...Only Aaron Judge (72) and Kyle Schwarber (64) have hit more.

SOX-METS NOTES: The Mets have won nine of their last 10 games against the White Sox.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 33 times this year, which is the most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 90 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 81, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

SMILE TUESDAYS WITH FRANCISCO LINDOR: Francisco Lindor will host student athletes from the Elmcors co-ed baseball team at Citi Field on Tuesday... Elmcors, a grantee of the Amazin' Mets Foundation, aims to foster positive life changes in members of the community through skills development that leads to self-sufficiency, a sense of accountability, and a strong, empowered community...The youth athletes will meet Lindor, watch batting practice, hear about his career, receive Mets swag, and get dental hygiene tips from dentist Dr. Howard Livers.

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched on May 21 at Boston, allowing one earned run over 4.2 innings pitched (4 H, BB, 10 K, HP)...His 10 strikeouts matched a career high (also: 9/10/21 vs. NYY and 4/21/25 vs. PHI)...Is one of 13 pitchers to record at least two games with double-digit strikeouts this season...Snapped a three-game streak of allowing four earned runs (from 5/4-16)...Marked the fourth time this season he has allowed one or zero runs in a start...He joined Noah Syndergaard (6/2/15, 4.0 IP, 10 K) and Taijuan Walker (10/4-G2/22, 4.1 IP, 10 K) as the only Mets pitchers to record at least 10 strikeouts in a start no longer than 4.2 innings.

2025: In 10 starts this season, is 3-4 with a 3.56 ERA (19 ER/48.0 IP), 23 walks and 66 strikeouts...Has recorded at least six strikeouts in five of his last six starts (since April 21), posting a 14.44 K/9.0 IP ratio in those games...Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in seven of his 10 starts, and one or zero runs in five...Has held batters to a .230 average (42-183), including left-handers to a .200 average (17-85)...Has tossed 5.0+ innings in six of 10 starts this season...When the count is 0-2, Megill has given up just one hit and has struck out 11 of 16 batters faced in that scenario...Has received more than three runs in support in just two of his outings...Among major league pitchers (min. 40.0 IP), he is third in K/9.0 IP (12.38, second in NL)...Among NL pitchers with the same qualification, he ranks third in opponents' SLG (.311), ninth in swing and miss percentage (29.8), is tied for ninth in HR/9.0 IP (0.56) and tied for tenth in strikeouts...He is one of 12 National League pitchers to allow three or fewer home runs when facing at least 150 batters (includes teammate Kodai Senga).

TYLOR MADE: Dating back to September 9, 2024, Megill has recorded a 2.97 ERA (23 ER/69.2 IP) with 31 walks and 93 strikeouts in 14 starts...He has held opposing batters to a .217 average (57-263) and has posted a 12.01 K/9.0 IP ratio...Also has posted a 0.65 HR/9.0 IP ratio (5 HR/69.2 IP)...In that span, he ranks third in K/9.0 IP (12.01, second in NL), eighth in opponents' SLG (.304, third in NL) and is tied for ninth in strikeouts (tied for fifth in NL) among major league pitchers (min. 60.0 IP).

HOMECOMING: Has posted a 1.86 ERA (4 ER/19.1 IP) and a 13.03 K/9.0 IP ratio (28 K/19.1 IP) in four starts at Citi Field this season...Did not allow an earned run in each of his first three starts at home this season (14.2 IP)...His three starts to open the season at home without an ER were tied with Glendon Rusch (3GS in 2001) and Craig Swan (3GS in 1978) for the longest such streak in franchise history...Also, his three consecutive starts without allowing an earned run at home was tied for the second-longest such streak by a Met in a single season, trailing only Jerry Koosman's four starts from 8/19-9/3(G1)/73...He was just the 13th Mets starter to accomplish the feat and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom's 3GS from 6/11-21(G1)/21...He has gone 15-11 with a 3.62 ERA (85 ER/211.1 IP) and 225 strikeouts in 43 games (40 starts) at Citi Field.

ACROSS LEAGUE LINES: Will be making his second career start against the White Sox tonight...His only outing vs. Chicago-AL came on 8/30/24 where he allowed one earned run over 5.1 innings (W, 5 H, BB, 6 K, HP)...Has made five starts against Interleague opponents this season, going 2-2 with a 3.18 ERA (8 ER/22.2 IP), 10 walks and 27 strikeouts...In 22 career outings (20 starts) in Interleague games, Megill has gone 7-4 with a 3.45 ERA (39 ER/101.2 IP), 40 walks and 109 strikeouts...Since the start of last season, the right-hander has allowed just one home run to a total of 217 American League baters, posting a 0.18 HR/9.0IP ratio in Interleague games...He also recorded a 10.73 K/9.0IP ratio (60 K/50.1 IP) in 11 games (10 starts) vs. Interleague opponents since the beginning of the 2024 season.

CH-CH-CH-CHANGEUPS: Though he has only used his changeup 7.5% of the time this season, Megill has recorded a 38.1% whiff rate with his off-speed pitch...He has held batters to a .077 average when throwing his changeup.

2024 RECAP: Over 16 games (15 starts) in 2024, Megill went 4-5 with a 4.04 ERA (35 ER/78.0 IP), adding 32 walks against 91 strikeouts...The right-hander allowed three runs or less in 11 of his 15 starts, including each of his last six starts of the season (August 30 - September 30)...He recorded at least six strikeouts in nine starts, tied for his most such starts in a single season (also: 2021)...Among National League pitchers, his 10.50 K/9.0IP ratio was tied for the ninth-best (min. 75.0 IP)...Megill pitched in the Postseason for the first time in his career, making appearances in Game 2 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia (1 ER/1.1 IP) and in Game 3 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL (4 ER/3.0 IP).

FAMILY MATTERS: His brother, Trevor, plays for the Milwaukee Brewers...Tylor and Trevor both debuted in the majors in 2021...The Megill brothers join teammates Luisangel Acuña (Ronald Acuña Jr.) and Edwin Díaz (Alexis Díaz) as three of 13 pairs of siblings to begin the season on 40-man rosters...Courtesy of *Elias*.

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2022, '24)...Over parts of four Major League seasons with the Mets, Megill has combined to go 24-25 with a 4.44 ERA (192 ER/389.1 IP), 153 walks and 412 strikeouts over 84 games (77 starts)...In 2024, he established career bests in ERA (4.04), K/9.0IP (10.50), HR/9.0IP (0.92) and FIP (3.62)...Was originally drafted by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arizona.

- Stranded an inherited runner and tossed four outs in relief on May 26 vs. Chicago-AL (BB, K)...Has stranded 15 of 17 inherited runners this season (11.8%), which is the sixth-best percentage among qualified Major League relievers and the second-best mark in the National League.
- Recorded his first loss of the season after allowing two runs (one unearned) in the 13th inning on May 23 vs. Los Angeles-NL (3 H)...Marked his first loss since August 3, 2024 at Los Angeles-AL (career-high 39 G without a loss)...Snapped a 10-game streak of not allowing an earned run (13.2 IP, from 4/27-5/21).
- Earned his third win of the season after tossing 2.1 scoreless innings in relief on May 21 at Boston (H, 4 K)...Entered the game with the bases loaded in the fifth inning and stranded all runners...Marked his most strikeouts in a game since July 6, 2024 (5 K).
- Over his last 12 games since April 27 (one opening start), has gone 2-1 with three holds, a 0.56 ERA (1 ER/16.20 IP), five walks, 16 strikeouts and a .137 opponents' BA (7-51).

- Has been scoreless over 14.0 innings against Interleague opponents this season, holding American League batters to a .093 average (4-43).
- Has gone 3-1 with one save, six holds and a 1.11 ERA (4 ER/32.1 IP) through 24 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .168 average (18-107)...19 of his 24 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held batters to a .118 average (6-51)...He is one of six Mets pitchers (seventh time) to record as low of an ERA through their first 24 games of a season, joining Doug Sisk (0.53, 1984), Francisco Rodríguez (0.73 in 2009 and 0.74 in '11), Randy Myers (0.89, 1989) Billy Wager (1.08, 2008) and Cal Koonce (1.09, 1968).
- Has recorded a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) in 22 games as a reliever this season...Among qualified NL relievers this season, is fourth in ERA, sixth in WHIP (0.85) and is tied for seventh in wins.
- His nine scoreless outings of 1.1 inning or more are the most in the majors...Eight of his 22 relief appearances have been for five or more outs and each of those outings have been scoreless...His eight such appearances are tied for the most in the majors...Is also one of six relievers to record at least six scoreless appearances of 2.0+ innings.
- Has produced a run value of six with his sinker this season, tied for the seventh-best among qualified Major League pitchers.
