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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final road trip of the first half with the 2nd of 3 games at the Miami Marlins (0-1)...Seattle will stay in the Sunshine State for 3 games at the Tampa Bay Rays to close out the first half...the Mariners are coming off a 5-1 homestand that saw a series sweep over the Los Angeles Angels (3-0) and a series win over the Toronto Blue Jays (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call with **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell 6-5 to the Marlins in 10 innings in last night's game, falling to 5-5 in extra-innings games...Seattle is 32-13 when they score 4+ runs and 29-14 when their starter delivers a quality start.

- **Quality and Quantity** - Mariners starting pitchers have 43 quality starts this season, most in the American League and 2nd-most in the big leagues behind the Dodgers (51 QS).
- **Wild West** - Seattle sits in first place in the American League West, 0.5 games ahead of the second place Texas Rangers (46-45).
- **Muñy Being Muñy** - Mariners closer **Andrés Muñoz** has been outstanding over his last 9 appearances, recording 6 saves without allowing a run over 9.0 IP, also recording an 12:3 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- **Dynamic Duo Sets Sights on Futures Game** - LHP **Kade Anderson** and RHP **Ryan Sloan** were both named to the All-Star Futures Game roster, set for this Sunday, July 12, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

YOUNG HEARTS (HOME) RUN FREE...**Cole Young** continued his excellent run last night, going 1-for-3 with a home run and a walk...in 23 games since June 11, he is batting .286 (24x84) with 14 runs, 3 doubles, 6 home runs, 11 RBI, a .326 OBP and slugging .536 for an .862 OPS...he has played in all 92 of the Mariners games in 2026, and holds an OPS+ of 104 (100 is league average)...with his 10th homer of the season last night, he became the 10th player in Mariners history to notch double-digit home runs in his age-22 season or younger and first since **Julio Rodríguez** (2x, 2022-23).

HOW ABOUT THAT PITCHING?...Mariners pitching has been excellent since the start of the last homestand, tossing 3 shutouts (July 2, July 4-5)...the starters have recorded a quality start in 6 of 7 games, combining to go 5-1 with a 1.74 ERA (9 ER, 46.2 IP), 6 walks, 41 strikeouts, a 0.77 WHIP and holding opponents to a .175 average...during that span (6/29-c), **Mariners starters lead MLB** in ERA, WHIP and fWAR (1.7)...Mariners relievers over the 7 games combined for a 1.08 ERA (2 ER, 16.2 IP), the 2nd-lowest in MLB during that span, trailing only the Brewers (0.94)...overall this season, the Mariners starters have a 3.57 ERA (5th in MLB and 3rd in the AL), while they rank among the MLB leaders in WHIP (T-1st, 1.08), BB% (1st, 5.5%), SO/BB (1st, 4.43), K% (4th, 24.4%), Opp. AVG (6th, .228) and fWAR (T-1st, 11.0)...Mariners relievers rank 5th in MLB and 3rd in the AL with a 3.52 ERA this season.

AROZARENA NAMED AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR...MLB announced Saturday that outfielder **Randy Arozarena** was selected to the American League roster for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...Arozarena is batting .290 (89x307) with 56 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 41 RBI, 33 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .381 clip, slugging .453 with an .834 OPS in 84 games this season...he is a three-time All-Star (2023, '25-'26) and has made the Midsummer Classic in each of the last two seasons with Seattle...he is the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (10x), Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Edgar Martinez (7x), Félix Hernández (6x), Randy Johnson (5x), Alex Rodriguez (4x), Robinson Canó (3x), Nelson Cruz (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Freddy García (2x), **Andrés Muñoz** (2x), Harold Reynolds (2x) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x)...Randy is one of two players with 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the last five seasons (2021-25), along with Cleveland's José Ramírez.

WALTER IS TAKING OVER...Mariners starting pitcher **Logan Gilbert** has dominated over his last 8 starts (5/22-c), going 5-1 with a 1.78 ERA (10 ER, 50.2 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 10 walks...during that span he ranks 2nd in MLB in fWAR (1.8), trailing only Jacob deGrom (2.1) while ranking among the leaders in ERA (4th), WHIP (2nd), K% (4th, 30.3%) and Opp. AVG (2nd, .150).

THE BUCKEYE BRUISER...over his last 32 games (5/25-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .300 (30x100) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 18 RBI and 10 walks, getting on base at a .369 clip, slugging .660 with a 1.029 OPS...overall this season, Canzone is batting .267 (56x210) with 32 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 37 RBI, a .342 OBP and slugging .538 for an .880 OPS and 149 OPS+...his 14 home runs are tied with **Luke Raley** and **Julio Rodríguez** for the team lead, while his 149 OPS+ ranks 11th in MLB among players with at least 200 plate appearances.

TEX'S HOLD 'EM...in 9 appearances (8 starts) this season, **Bryce Miller** has posted a 1.71 ERA (10 ER, 52.2 IP) with 62 strikeouts and just 5 walks allowed...he leads all Major League pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (12.40), 1st in WHIP (0.66) and ranks 1st in walk rate (2.7%)...he also ranks 2nd in ERA, 2nd in opponent batting average (.165), and 3rd in strikeout rate (33.2%).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Bryan Woo** reached 500.0 innings pitched in last night's game, officially qualifying for the Mariners all-time record in rate statistics, but...**DID YOU KNOW?...**that his 3.42 ERA (190 ER, 500.0 IP) for his career is tied for the franchise record with Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, Randy Johnson and James Paxton, who all finished their Mariners careers with a 3.42 ERA.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 8

- **1982** - Bruce Bochte successfully pulls off the hidden ball trick in the 7th inning of 4-3 win against the Baltimore Orioles.
- **1994** - Alex Rodriguez makes his ML debut as the starting shortstop at Boston. Alex is 18 years, 346 days old.
- **1994** - Mariners hit into only the 9th unassisted triple play in ML history at Boston in the 6th inning. Marc Newfield lined out to Shortstop John Valentin who stepped on 2nd to retire Mike Blowers and tagged Kevin Mitchell to record the third out.
- **2001** - Bret Boone finishes the first half of the season with 84 RBI, tied for the 2nd-highest total ever for a Mariner. Ichiro finishes the first half with a then club record 134 hits.
- **2018** - Nelson Cruz, Edwin Díaz and Mitch Haniger were named to the AL All-Star Team
- **2022** - Eugenio Suárez hits first career walk-off home run to beat Toronto.
- **2023** - All-Star Futures Game is played at T-Mobile Park with OF Jonatan Clase and C Harry Ford representing the Mariners in their home ballpark.
- **2025** - **Cal Raleigh** hit his 36th home run of the season, passing Ken Griffey Jr. (35 HR in 1998) for most homers in franchise history before the All-Star Break...Raleigh's 129 career home runs are the most through a catcher's first 5 MLB seasons, passing Mike Piazza (128 HR)...Mariners franchise-record scoreless streak was snapped after 33.0 innings in the 5th inning against the Yankees.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 18th start of the season and 1st against the Blue Jays...will be the 130th start of his career and his 3rd career start against Toronto.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...W#7 vs. Angels, tossed 8.0 innings with 2 runs (2 ER), 7 hits and 1 walk allowed with 7 strikeouts...threw 100 pitches and 70 strikes...is his 7th quality start with 5+ strikeouts this season, tied for 9th most such games in the AL, matching **Logan Gilbert**.

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...is making his 8th road start of the season and the 66th road start of his career...among pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his 5.84 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road **leads MLB all-time**, ahead of Tarik Skubal's 5.69 K/BB...ranks 13th in the AL (min. 40.0 IP) in K/BB (3.6) this season, just trailing **Bryan Woo** (3.64)...his 1.37 walks-per-nine innings ranks 4th-best all-time (min. 50 GS), trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.09), Deacon Phillippe (1.34), and Josh Tomlin (1.36)...ranks T-12th just behind Woo (2.06) in BB/9 (2.11) in the AL in 2026 (min. 40.0 IP).

JUNE WRAPPED...over his last 4 outings of June, recorded 4 consecutive quality starts with 5+ strikeouts for the 2nd time in his career (last: 7/26/25-8/12/25)...over those 4 starts (6/10-6/29), Kirby owns a 3.12 ERA (9 ER, 26.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts to 6 walks for a 4.50 K/BB and a 9.35 K/9...his K/BB ranks 12th best among qualified AL pitchers during that 4 game span.

PLAYING THE LONG GAME...logged his 2nd start of 8.0+ innings pitched this season in his last start on June 29 vs. LAA...he is 1-of-2 players 12 MLB pitchers with multiple such games this season and is 1-of-8 pitchers this season to allow 3-or-fewer runs and 1-or-fewer walks over 8.0+ IP in multiple starts this season...has pitched into the 6th inning in 15 of his 17 starts this year and has cleared the 7th inning in 4 of those starts...his 104.0 innings pitched this season are tied for the 5th most in MLB...his 90.0 IP through his first 17 starts are the most he has pitched over a 17-game span to start the year since his 2023 season where he pitched 107.2 innings...is also the most innings pitched over any 17-game span in a single season since he threw 105.1 IP over 17 starts from April 14 to July 26 of 2024.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...has logged 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks in 11 games this season (last: 6/29 vs. LAA), T-7th-most in the AL, just 1 game ahead of **Bryan Woo**...his 73 career such games are 11th-most in MLB since 2022...among AL pitchers with 90+ strikeouts in 2026, his 24 walks are T-7th fewest while his BB/9 (2.1) is tied for 7th lowest...ranks 11th among qualified AL pitchers with a 3.79 K/BB.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 10 quality starts this season (last: 6/29 vs. LAA), tied for 8th most in MLB...has thrown 73 quality starts across his career, T-5th most in MLB since 2022, tied with **Luis Castillo**...has 38 career quality starts without any walks (3x this season, last: 6/17 vs. BAL), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Tarik Skubal-DET (27 G) Logan Webb (27 G) and Zack Wheeler-PHI (27 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 17 career road games (2x this season, last: 5/23 vs. KC), 2nd most in MLB since 2022 and tied for most in Mariners history with Jamie Moyer.

KEEPING THEM ON THEIR TOES...owns a 38.3% chase rate this season, ranking T-4th in MLB among qualified pitchers while posting a 35.8% career chase rate, ranking T-13th among qualified pitchers since 2022...his 678 swing and misses on pitches outside the zone rank 10th among AL pitchers since 2022, while his 343 strikeouts are 7th-most...his 51 whiffs on pitches outside the zone are 15th most in the AL this season...of pitchers in MLB with over 250 strikeouts on pitches out of the zone since 2022, his 106 walks are the 3rd-fewest, trailing Garrett Crochet-BOS/CWS (96) and Pablo López-MIA/MIN (101).

FURIOUS GEORGE...has thrown 7.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 4 starts this season (last: 6/29 vs. LAA) and in 26 career starts, tied for 15th most in MLB since 2022, matching **Logan Gilbert**...Kirby and **Bryan Woo** (5 G) are 2 of 7 pitchers in the AL this season to have 4+ games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs and 1-or-fewer walks...Kirby's 23 such starts since 2023 are tied for 3rd most in MLB across that span.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 15.2 pitches per inning this season for the 7th lowest mark in the AL among qualified pitchers...is averaging 15.6 pitches per inning across his career, tied for the 12th-fewest P/IP in MLB since 2022 (min. 500 IP).

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he **leads the Majors** in fewest walks allowed (117), walks-per-nine innings (1.4), and walk rate (3.9%) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.09)

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...**leads the Mariners franchise** (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.09)...ranks T-6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.62), matching **Luis Castillo**, 2nd in WHIP (1.141) and 10th in total strikeouts (712 SO).

PLENTY OF PUNCHOUTS...has tossed 12+ strikeouts in 3 career games, including a career-high 14 strikeouts twice last season...is 1 of 11 pitchers with 3-or-more games of 12+ strikeouts since 2024...recorded his 4th 10+ strikeout game since 2025 on June 10 at BAL...his 4 such starts are tied for 8th-most in the AL over that span.

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 4/27/23 at PHI)...is 1 of 10 pitchers with a complete game this season...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since **Logan Gilbert** did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...recorded his 2nd 8.0+ inning outing in his last start (6/29 vs. LAA) for the 3rd such outing by a Mariners pitcher this season (also: **Bryce Miller**, 6/12 at WSH), T-6th most in MLB this season...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 10 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, along with teammate **Logan Gilbert** (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

MILESTONES GALORE...earned his 50th career win on May 11 at HOU, becoming the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...his 121 games are tied for the 4th-fewest games to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, alongside: Hisashi Iwakuma and Erik Hanson...behind: Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy Garcia (100 G), and Marco Gonzales (118 G)...recorded his 700th strikeout on June 17 vs. BAL, becoming the 10th pitcher to record 700+ SO in a Mariners uniform...of those 10 pitchers, Kirby's 127 games were the 5th-fewest to reach the milestone...is the first pitcher that debuted in 2022 to record their 700th strikeout.
