

RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of 2025 tonight at Steinbrenner Field, a seven-game stretch against the Blue Jays (2-2) and Red Sox (3G)...have won back-to-back games, but are 4-9 in their last 13 contests on the heels of a season-nigh seven-game winning streak (Aug. 29-Sept. 41...have gone 7-15-1 over their last 23 series since a 16-8-2 start...are fourth in the AL East for the 70th consecutive day dating back to July 11, 14.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...have a 3.0-game lead over the fifth-place Orioles with nine to play...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 100 in fourth and four in fifth.

Five pitchers combined on a four-hit shutout in the Rays 4-0 win over the Blue Jays vesterday, securing a split to snap a three-series skid...it was their 11th shutout win, tied for fifth most in the AL, and first at home since Aug. 2 vs, LAD (4-0).

Five of six and nine of the Rays last 12 games have been decided by one run...they lead the majors with 10 one-run affairs this month and have 50 on the season, second most in the AL behind the Mariners (51G) and tied for fifth most in MLB.

Tonight marks the fifth of 13 straight games vs. AL East opponents to conclude the regular season...the Rays are 5-13 in their last 18 intra-division games, but have won two straight on the heels of a seven-game skid July 29-Sept. 16.

The Rays need one win this series to secure their minth consecutive winning season at home dating back to 2017...entering the year, only the Yankees (33), Dodgers (19) and Bay leads the majors with a 2.91 ERA (222.2IP, 72ER) over its last 25 games since Aug. 22... the club pitched to a 1.66 ERA (38.0IP, 72ER) over its last 25 games since Aug. 22... the club pitched to a 1.66 ERA (38.0IP, 72ER) last series against Toronto, its lowest in a four-game set since since Aug. 22-25, 2022 vs. 24.014.42I.

Rays pitchers carry a 14.0-inning scoreless streak into tonight sgame and have allowed one run in their last 22.0 IP, they

RUBBER ARM RAYS—Drew Rasmussen is scheduled for his career-high 30th start tonight, which will tie Shane Baz and Ryan Pepiot for the club lead...this marks the eighth time in 28 seasons the Rays have had three pitchers make 30 starts, first since Chris Archer (33), Jake Odorizzi (33) and Drew Smyly (30) in 2016. the Rays will join the Blue Jays (Bassitt/Berrios/Gausman) and Yankees (Fried/Rodon/Warren) as the only major league clubs with three pitchers with 30 starts or more...over the previous four seasons (2021-24), only two Rays reached the mark: Zach Eflin (31) in 2023 and Corey Kluber (31) in 2022.

\*\*Rays starters lead the AL in fewest pitches per IP (15-9), rank second in WHIP (1.20) and fourth in quality starts (60)...their 813.2 IP are their most since 2017 (899.1).

The rotation has not allowed an earned run in its last 12.0 IP entering play tonight.

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING—The Rays (173HR/186SB) are 2 HR away from becoming the eighth team in MLB history with 175 HR and 175 SB and the first since the 2024 Brewers (177/217)...the Rays have accomplished the feat once previously, in 2009 (199/194)...other teams to turn the trick include the 2023 Reds (199/190), 2016 Brewers (194/181), 2007 Mets (177/200), 1998 Blue Jays (221/184) and 1996 Rockies (221/201)...with a major league-leading 186 SB, the Rays are 8 SB shy of matching the 2009 team's franchise-record 194 SB.

THE GREAT YANDINO—Yandy Díaz reached base safely 13 times via hit (7) or walk (6) last series against the Blue Jays, tying Carl Crawford (11H/2BB, Aug 6-9, 2007 at DET for the most in a series of four games or fewer in franchise history (Stats Perform). he went 7-for-12 (583) in the series and reached base safely in 13 of 18 PA (722 OBP). Diaz has tallied a hit in 16 of his last 21 games dating back to Aug 25, batting 410/495/603 (32-for-78) with 62 B. 3 HR, 8 RBI, 13 BB, 10 SO 14 R and a 1.097 OPS. he leads MLB in batting average and paces the AL in hits and is second in the AL in OPS to NYY Aaron Judge (1.240) over that stretch. With 28 doubles, he is a pair of two-baggers away from joining Ben Zobrist (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons...he is also two doubles shy of tying Aubrey Huff (172 2B) for lifth most in Rays history.

His next extra-base hit will mark his 273rd with the Rays, tying Kevin Kiermaier for eighth most in team history...his next home run will be the 100th of his career and his 97th with Tampa Bay, which would tie Fred McGriff for eighth most in club history.

CATCH HIM IF YOU CHAN—Chandler Simpson has back-to-back three-hit games and is 15-for-30 (500) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 6 R, 3 SB and a 1,131 OPS over his last eight games since Sept. 11, leading the majors in hits over that stretch while ranking second in batting average behind NYY Aaron Judge (522)...Simpson is second in MLB with 42 SB despite appearing in only 103 of the Rays 153 games...over 162 games, his current pace equates to a 66-SB campaign...the 42 SB are tied for 10th most in a season in franchise history—he is 3 SB shy of joining Carl Crawford (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays with a 45-SB season.

With a 301 average, Simpson is attempting to become the ninth major league rookie since 1901 to steal 40 bases or more while batting .300 or better and the second since 2004 along with LAA Mike Trout (.326/49SB) in 2012.

BASH BROTHERS—With 29 HR, tied with NYY Jazz Chisholm Jr. for the most among MLB second basemen. Brandon Lowe is one long ball shy of becoming the second Ray to reach 30 HR along with Junior Caminero (44HR), the Rays would be the seventh team in the majors with multiple 30-HR hitters and the fifth AL club, joining the Angels (Adell/Ward) Athletics (Kurtz/Langeliers/Rooker), Mariners (Raleigh/Rodriguez) and Yankees (Grisham/Judge)...they would become the sixth set of Rays teammates to both hit 30 HR in a season first since Lowe (39HR) and Mike Zunino (33HR) in 2021...Lowe would also become the fourth active second baseman with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining ATL Ozzie Albies (2) HOU Jose Altuve (2) and AZ Ketel Marte (2), and would join Evan Longoria (4) and Carlos Peña (3) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-HR campaigns.

With Yandy Diaz's (24HR) next long ball, he, Caminero and Lowe will become the fourth trio of Rays teammates to each hit 25 HR, joining 2021 (Lowe/Zunino/Austin Meadows). 2017 (Corey Dickerson/Logan Morrison/Steven Souza Jr.) and 2009 (Longoria/Peña/Ben Zobrist).

THE CAMINER-SHOW—With nine games to play, Junior Caminero (44HR) is 2 HR shy of tying Carlos Peñas franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has gone deep an MLB leading 17 times in his last 42 games since Aug. 1...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since Evan Longoria (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in Rays history (see table to the right). his 72 XBH match Ben Zobrist (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBH) for fifth.

\*\*Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.

\*\*He has tallied 22 HR at Steinbrenner Field, tied with Brad Miller (2016) for the second-most long balls at home in franchise history behind Peña (23HR) in 2007.

SOX AT THE STEIN—The Rays and Red Sox conclude a 13-game season series this weekend with Boston taking eight of the first 10 matchups...since a 16-1 win in the first meeting of the year on April 14 at Steinbrenner Field, the Rays have lost eight of their last nine games against the Red Sox...this includes an active six-game losing streak, their longest vs. Boston since March 30-April 8, 2018 (6G) and tied for the third longest in club history, trailing streak of 11 (April 6-June 26, 2001) and 10 games (0ct. 3, 2001-July 23 [G1], 2002]...four of six losses during the current streak have come by one run...the Rays, who have already clinched their first season series loss to the Sox since 2018 to end a six-season unbeaten run, are 9-14 against Boston since the start of 2024 (3-6 at home)...they have lost three straight series to the Sox, their longest skid since dropping five in a row from Aug. 8, 2017-April 8, 2018, since their last series win from Sept. 27-29, 2024 at Fenway Park.

\*\*Yandy Diaz has reached base safely in 11 straight starts against Boston, batting .326 (14-for-43) with 2 HR, 6 RBI, 6 BB, 8 R and a, 408 on-base pct. in those games.

\*\*Min. 250 PA, Brandon Lowes. 995 OSPs vs. the Sox in his career leads active players Jake Mangum is 16-for-35 (.457) in 10 games against the Red Sox this season.

DOWN ON THE FARM—1B Will Simpson (3-for-5, 2B, HR, 2RBI) hit a game-tying two-run homer as part of a four-run, 8th-inning rally in Double-A Montgomery's 4-2 win at Biloxi (MIL) last night, completing a two-game sweep to advance to their second consecutive SL Championship Series appearance and third in the last five seasons (2024-25, 2021)...the Biscuits will face the winner of Chattanooga (CIN) vs. Birmingham (CWS), which is set for a rubber match tonight, starting Sept. 21...the club is seeking its first league title since 2007.

TONIGHT'S START—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound for his 30th start of the campaign and 18th at Steinbrenner Field...marks his 129th career appearance (80th start) and 10th career outing (sixth start) opposite the Red Sox...has a four-decision winning streak and is one win shy of tying his career high (11, 2022)...has allowed three runs or fewer in 26 of 29 starts...was named an All-Star for the first time in his career...min. 125.0 IP, ranks fifth in the AL in ERA (2.74), WHIP (1.00) and opp. SLG (.334) and is sixth in opp. OPS (.601)...signed a two-year contract extension through 2026 with a club option for 2027 on Jan. 7, 2025.

He is on pace to become the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners Blake Snell (1.89) in 2018 and David Price (2.56) in 2012, James Shields (2.82) in 2011 and Price (2.72) in 2010.

LAST TIME OUT—He took a no-decision after departing with the Rays trailing, 3-1, in a 5-4 win over the Cubs on Sept. 13 at Wrigley Field (ND, 5.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 3BB, 5SO, HR)...lost an 11-pitch battle after walking Ian Happ in the opening frame, but stranded him in scoring position...was tagged for a solo shot by Moisés Ballesteros (first career HR) with one down in the 2nd...navigated a seven-pitch 3rd frame before running into trouble with two outs in the 4th, as a single and intentional walk preceded Dansby Swanson's two-run double...retired three of four Cubs faced on 11 pitches in the 5th to conclude the outing...Junior Caminero (GT) and Nick Fortes (GA) homered in the 8th and 9th innings, respectively, to secure the win.

\*\*T It marked his career-high 29th start, surpassing his previous mark of 28 (2022)...he has gone 5.0 IP or more in nine straight starts since coming off an innings restriction in his second start after the All-Star break, going 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (49.1IP, 13ER) in that span.

SEEING RED—Rasmussen is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (27.0IP, 9ER) across nine career appearances (5GS) vs. Boston, with the Rays going 6-3 in those games...he made one start against them this season on July 11 at Fenway Park, working a pair of innings on 53 pitches before departing due to workload management...he has held Red Sox hitters to 4-for-32 (.125) with RISP in his career and a .238/292/352 (5-for-105) clip overall...Rasmussen has gone 4.0 IP or fewer in three of his five starts against Boston and has one quality start, recorded on July 14, 2022 at Tropicana Field.

He is 2-2 with a 2.40 ERA (30.0IP, 8ER) in six starts vs. AL East opponents this season, yielding two runs or fewer in each outing.

TAMPA TALK—Rasmussen will be making his final start at Steinbrenner Field tonight...after dropping five of his first six, the Rays have won seven of his last 11 home starts, with the righty going 4-1 with a 2.38 ERA (56.2IP, 15ER), 47 SO, 14 BB, a 0.95 WHIP and a .238 (40-for-196) opp. average in those games...min. 50.0 IP, he ranks among the AL's home leaders in that span (May 23-pres.) in opp. SLG (3rd, .306), opp. OPS (4th, .583), ERA (4th), WHIP (5th), ...however, he has yielded 5 HR over his last three starts in Tampa compared to 6 HR in his first 14 outings at home.

\* He has permitted three runs or fewer in 16 of his 17 starts at Steinbrenner Field..min. 75.0 IP, his 2.60 ERA (86.2IP, 25ER) at home ranks seventh in the AL.

\* The Rays have won each of Rasmussen's last six home starts in which they provided him with multiple runs of support.

GOOSE EGGS—Rasmussen has made 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, tied with Blake Snell (2019) for the most in a single season in franchise history and third most in the majors behind DET Tarik Skubal (12) and PIT Paul Skenes (11)...his 21 such career starts are tied with Snell, Scott Kazmir and James Shields for second most in Rays history behind Chris Archer (24).

ONE AT A TIME—Rasmussen has recorded an MLB-leading 13 starts of 5.0 IP or more without allowing an extra-base hit, most in a season in Rays history, ahead of David Price in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign (9)... it marks the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since CAL Nolan Ryan (13GS) in 1977... the last pitcher with more such starts, regardless of league, was Ryan in 1972 (14GS)...the live-ball era record (since 1920) for a single season is 15 such starts, shared by OAK Vida Blue (1971), LAA Dean Chance (1964) and CLE Bob Feller (1946).

\*\* Rasmussen has yielded five hits or fewer in 15 consecutive starts, the longest single-season streak in franchise history (excluding openers) and the longest active streak in MLB.

FROZE HIM—Rasmussen's 45 called strikeouts rank sixth in the AL, trailing CLE Tanner Bibee (57), NYY Will Warren (54), BOS Garrett Crochet (52), HOU Hunter Brown (51) and DET Jack Flaherty (49)...in all of MLB, only CIN Brady Singer (47), PHI Ranger Suarez (46) and Warren (45) have more called strikeouts on fastballs than Rasmussen (42).

**HEAT CHECK**—Rasmussen throws fastballs (cutter, sinker, four-seamer) 89.4 pct. of the time, the highest rate among major league starters (min. 500 pitches thrown in starts)...among all hurlers with 500 pitches thrown or more this season, only NYY **Tim Hill** (95.6%) and LAA **Kenley Jansen** (90.7%) have higher usage rates on heaters than Rasmussen.

AMAZING AUGUST—In five starts during August, Rasmussen went 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA (29.1IP, 5ER)...min. 25.0 IP, it marked the second-lowest ERA in the AL during the month and fifth lowest in MLB, trailing MIL Freddy Peralta (0.32), ATL Hurston Waldrep (1.01), CHC Cade Horton (1.20) and BAL Trevor Rogers (1.29)...under the same parameter, it was his lowest ERA in any month of his career.

GOING STREAKING—Rasmussen's 23.0 scoreless inning streak from May 17–June 3 tied the fifth-longest single-season run in club history, trailing J.P. Howell (27.1IP, 2012), Alex Cobb (24.2IP, 2014), Kevin Kelly (24.1, 2024) and Taj Bradley (24.0IP, 2024)...only Cobb's and Bradley's streaks came as starting pitchers...Rasmussen tallied five scoreless innings or more in a franchise-record four consecutive starts during the streak...he also added a 17.1 scoreless inning streak from July 28–Aug. 13...according to Elias, he is the fifth pitcher in franchise history to record multiple scoreless inning streaks of 15.0 IP or more in a season, joining Rich Hill (2021), Alex Cobb (2014). Farnande Bedray (2012) and James Shields (2011) (2014), Fernando Rodney (2012) and James Shields (2011).

**BEST OF THE BEST**—Among active pitchers with 75 starts or more in their careers, Rasmussen's 2.89 ERA in his career ranks third behind LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (2.54) and TEX **Jacob DeGrom** (2.57)...he also ranks third in opp. slugging pct. (331) and opp. OPS (.603), sixth in opp. on-base pct. (272) and WHIP (1.06), and seventh in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.79).
