## 2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs are 12-12 and lead the National League in hitting (.286) and OPS (.756) while ranking second in runs scored (132, $5.50 \mathrm{r} / \mathrm{g}$ ), slugging (.470) and on-base percentage (.351)...Reds pitchers rank 12th in the NL in second-half ERA (4.91).

## RISPY BUSINESS

In the last 2 games, both wins, Reds pitchers held opposing hitters to 0 -for-15 with RISP... Braves hitters on Sun went 0-for-11 while stranding 11 base runners, and Angels hitters last night went 0 -for-4 and stranded 5 ...over the last 3 games, Reds pitchers recorded 39 strikeouts, including a season-high 17 last night ( 11 k on Sat, 11 k on Sun at Atl).

## FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (93), HR (32), RBI (90), batting average (.309), slugging percentage (.584) and on-base percentage (.371)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 93-56, and are 28-7 (.800) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first...3B Eugenio Suárez is tied with Mil's Christian Yelich and Min's Nelson Cruz for the Major League lead with $\mathbf{1 0}$ HR in the first frame and ranks T3rd in the majors with 20 RBI...1B Joey Votto is among National League first-inning leaders in extra-base hits (14, 2nd), doubles (8, T2nd), hits (31, T3rd), slugging percentage (.609, 10th) and batting average (.337, 11 th).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 2-game series vs Adam Chodzko's Angels and Game $2(0-0)$ of a 6 -game homestand that includes tomorrow's day off followed by a 4 -game weekend series vs the Cubs...the Reds are coming off a 2-2 series plit at Atl's SunTrust Park...in their last 4 series the Reds are 3-0-1 (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl).

HEART \& HUSTLE: During pregame ceremonies tonight, the Reds and Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association will recognize SS José Iglesias with the 2019 Heart \& Hustle Award...previous Reds team recipients of the Heart \& Hustle Award include Scooter Gennett (2018), Adam Duvall (2017), Zack Cozart (2016), Todd Frazier (2015), Skip Schumaker (2014), Shin Soo-Choo (2013), Chris Heisey (2012), Miguel Cairo (2011), Jonny Gomes (2010), Adam Rosales (2009), Jerry Hairston Jr. (2008), Ryan Freel (2007) and Adam Dunn (2006).

SERIES NOTES: The Angels are visiting Great American Ball Park for the first time since the Opening Day series of the 2013 season...their 2,314 days between visits to the Queen City were the most of any Major League team...this series is the Redlegs' sixth overall series vs LAA, the second of the season and their first meeting at Great American Ball Park since the 2013 season-opening series ...the Reds are 5-10 all-time vs the Angels, including 1-2 in 2002, 0-3 in 2016 \& 0-2 in 2019 in Anaheim and 1-2 in 2007 \& 2-1 in 2013 at Great American Ball Park... in 2013 the Reds and Angels played the first interleague Opening Day game in Major League history, a 3-1 Angels win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opening game (Cin pitchers 17, LAA pitchers 13).

CUBS UP NEXT: The Reds won the first 3 series of a season vs the Cubs for the first time since they won the first 5 series of 2013, then suffered a $\mathbf{2 - 1}$ series loss in their most recent meeting (7/15-7/17 at Wrigley Field)...over the previous 4 seasons (2015-2018), the Cubs' .671 winning percentage vs the Reds ( $51-25$ ) was the best by any team against any division opponent...Joey Votto ranks third among all active players with 34 HR and 114 RBI against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only Albert Pujols (57-146) and Ryan Braun (39-136).

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) \& Farmer (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for 8 days ( $7 / 18-7 / 25$ ) until Barnhart came off the injured list prior to the game on $7 / 26 \ldots$.. Barnhart and Farmer have returned to the active roster...on $7 / 26$, Barnhart filled the roster spot vacated by Graterol, who went on the 7 -day concussion list...Farmer was reinstated from the 7 -day concusion list on $7 / 28$...he replaced Lavarnway, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 69 of the Reds' 111 games so far this season, including 46 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF ( $6 / 2$ vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 3 times as CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF ( $3 / 28$ vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF ( $5 / 9$ at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF ( $5 / 24$ at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{Mia}, \mathrm{4/15} \mathrm{at} \mathrm{LAD)}$, and remained in that game to pitch... 5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)... is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (386.1) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5 g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...on Sun vs Cubs will wear replica uniforms from 1969...the Reds are 3-7 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961 and 1967...as part of the season-long celebration, the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum underwent a comprehensive modification, while the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than 20 anniversary park benches, featuring Reds mascots wearing the 15 throwback uniforms, are on display at locations across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history. is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully ( 67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) \& Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019)...in the top of the first inning in his first regular-season game as a Major League broadcaster on 4/4/74 at Riverfront Stadium, Brennaman provided the call when Hank Aaron belted his record-tying 714th home run...over 45 years later, both Aaron and Brennaman were in attendance for Friday's game between the Reds and Braves at SunTrust Park.

## Tonight's Pitcher - \#28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his 99th career start...in his career is 33-34, 4.19 in 106 apps...beginning 6/6, in his last 10 starts is 4-3, 3.17...is his first career appearance vs the Angels...in Thu's 4-1 loss at Atl, shortened by rain to 6 innings, allowed only a 3-run HR to Freddie Freeman in the first inning...his strikeout of Trevor Story to end the fifth inning of his 3-1 win on $7 / 27$ vs Col was the 500 th strikeout of his career....has allowed 3 leadoff HR (Pit's Adam Frazier, Chi's Kyle Schwarber, Cle's Francisco Lindor)...in the $7-5$ loss on $6 / 23$ at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record 9 strikeouts through his first 3 innings (Mil's Corbin Burnes, $3 / 31 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{StL}$ ) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available...retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the franchise record for strikeouts to begin a game (Robert Stephenson, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by Travis Shaw's HR leading off the third inning...struck out the side in the third inning but in between strikeouts allowed 6 hits and 5 runs, tying his career high for runs allowed in an inning ( $9 / 20 / 15$ at Mil, 5 th)....missed the entire 2017 season with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 42 starts since he returned from those injuries is $13-14,4.51$.

## RED HOTS

Alex Wood on Thu vs the Cubs will make his third appearance of the season...in his 2 apps allowed just 4 runs, all on home runs by Yonder Alonso (2-run), Austin Riley (solo) and Ronald Acuña Jr. (solo)...began this season on the Reds' injured list because of a lower back injury, including a stint on the $\mathbf{6 0}$-day IL beginning $5 / 31 \ldots$ made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on $2 / 25$ at Sea ( $1 \mathrm{ip}, 2 \mathrm{~h}, 3 \mathrm{er}, 1 \mathrm{bb}, 0 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )...from 7/6-7/22 went 1-1, 3.18 in 4 rehab starts for Class AAA Louisville (3gs) and Class AA Chattanooga (1gs)...in December was acquired from the Dodgers, along with C/IF Kyle Farmer, OF Matt Kemp, OF Yasiel Puig and cash, for RHP Homer Bailey, IF Jeter Downs and RHP Josiah Gray.

For the Bats played 1B (62g, 59gs), 3B (3gs), LF (9gs) and CF (30g, 25gs). Was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month for May.
When he plays will become the fourth Reds player this season to make his Major League debut (CF Nick Senzel, IF/OF Josh VanMeter, RHP Jimmy Herget). Wore uniform \#82 in Major League spring training camp, his first.
9.JOSE PERAZA, inf 2nd Half: 21g, 10gs, 15-51 (.294), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1 hr , 11rb - In 49 apps beginning $5 / 31$ is hitting 283 (34-120, 7 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 19rbi, 1sb).

Tonight will make his 41 st start at 2B, tyring Derek Dietrich for the most on the team made 15 starts at SS (last, Sat at Atl), second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 96 gs ). 2nd Half: 24g, 24-83 (.289), 9hr, 17rbi, 1.035ops First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League's leaders in HR ( $9, \mathrm{~T} 1$ st), RBI (17, T10th), on-base percentage (.384, 17th), slugging percentage (.651, 4th) and extra-base hits (11, T18th).
In the first inning, is tied with Mil's Christian Yelich and Min's Nelson Cruz for the Major League lead with 10 HR while ranking T3rd in the majors with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 15th in the National League in hitting . 322 (28-87), Beginning 6/30, homered in 11 of his last 31 apps (13hr, 26 rbi ).
Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).

For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League. In his last 59 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .301, raising his season BA from . 208 (68-226, 15 2b, 7hr, 28rbi, . 375 obp ).
From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's ( $5 / 10-6 / 1$ ) for the longest by a Reds batter this season... his current on-base streak is at 5 games (.409obp).
