Sale vs. the Angels

LH Chris Sale tonight makes the 10th start and 12th appearance of his career against the Angels, and is a perfect 8-0 with a 1.24 ERA (9 ER/65.1 IP) in these turns. His teams are 10-1 in total in the 11 games.

Sale's eight wins are the most by a pitcher in history without a loss to Los Angeles, and his 1.24 ERA is second lowest in history by a pitcher with at least 50.0 innings against the franchise. Only Jack Aker, with a 1.22 ERA between 1965 and 1971, has a lower mark.

Sale has won each of his last five starts against Los Angeles dating to 2015, including here at Angel Stadium in 2024 while with the Braves. The left-hander allowed six hits and two runs over 6.0 innings that night, fanning 10 in Atlanta's win, 11-3.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Angels tonight begin a three-game mid-week series in what are the only scheduled meetings between the clubs this season...Atlanta and Los Angeles last met last season, with a three-game series at Truist Park.

A The Braves lost two-of-three to the Angels last season, the first time they dropped a series to Los Angeles since 2017...Since MLB moved to a balanced schedule in 2023, meaning the two clubs now play every year, Atlanta is 5-4 (.556) vs. Los Angeles.

A Atlanta and Los Angeles have met just 27 times since the advent of interleague play in 1997, with the Braves going 14-13 (.519) against the Angels all-time...Neither club has ever swept the other in nine total three-game series between the clubs.

A Atlanta is playing just its fifth series all-time here in Anaheim, and its first since the 2024 season...The Braves are an even 6-6 (.500) in 12 games here in their history, but took two-of-three here in their last trip in 2024.

A LH Chris Sale is set to make his third start of the season and his first away from Truist Park...The 6-foot-6, 180-pound left-hander is a perfect 2-0 through his first two starts, with a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) and nine strikeouts.

A RH José Soriano has never lost to Atlanta in two starts and three career appearances, going a perfect 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (2 ER/11.2 IP) and 13 strikeouts...The 6-foot-3, 220-pound Dominican Republic native tossed 7.0 scoreless innings against Atlanta last season, fanning seven in a win, 5-1... He has yet to allow a run this season, pitching 12.0 consecutive scoreless innings in a pair of wins to open the year.

DEFENSE: Atlanta has played 801.0 innings in the field this season, and currently ranks second in the majors with 12 defensive runs saved...The club leads all of baseball with a total defensive value of 5.3 and 11 runs saved above average.

A The Braves lead the majors with 12 double plays turned in the infield, including at least one twin killing in each of its last seven games...Atlanta has done this despite inducing a ground ball percentage of just 39.8%, which ranks 23rd in baseball.

A Three different Braves rank in the top 12 in all of baseball in defensive runs saved...Shortstop Mauricio Dubón leads Atlanta's defensive effort and ranks fifth in baseball with three defensive runs saved, while Matt Olson & Ozzie Albies rank 11th and 12th, respectively, with two...Dubón leads all shortstops, while Olson & Albies both rank second at their respective positions.

A Ten different Braves players have at least one defensive run saved this season...Nine different Braves have a positive total defensive value.

A Albies last made an error on June 8 of last season, and has cleanly handled his last 377 chances.

DRAKE BALDWIN: Collected three hits and plated four of Atlanta's five runs yesterday afternoon in Arizona, going 3-for-5 with a run scored and a homer...He has driven in nine of the Braves' last 30 runs (30%).

A He is currently tied for the National League lead in both homers (four) and RBI (12), and leads the NL outright in runs scored (10).

A In the last 14 seasons, Baldwin is one of just eight National League players to reach four home runs, 12 RBI and 10 runs scored in his team's first 10 games, and the first to do so since Bryan Reynolds (PIT) in 2023...The last Brave to reach those counting stats through 10 games was Dale Murphy, who did so to start the 1985 season (6 HR, 18 RBI, 13 R).

VERSATILITY: Twelve of Atlanta's 13 available position players appeared in yesterday's game, with 11 different Braves appearing in the field...Catcher Jonah Heim was the only Braves position player to not log an appearance yesterday.

A Three different Braves - Mauricio Dubón, Kyle Farmer & Austin Riley - manned third base yesterday...Just five different players appeared at third for Atlanta all of last season.

A Dubón and Mike Yastrzemski both played multiple positions in yesterday's game, with Dubón playing third & left field, and Yastrzemski playing both left & right.

OFFENSE: The Braves plated five runs and struck out just six times in 10 innings yesterday afternoon...Atlanta currently leads the majors with a strikeout percentage of just 17.7% on the year, after fanning in 22.2% of its plate appearances last year.

A The Braves have fanned in over 20% of their plate appearance in eight consecutive seasons, and last had a percentage lower than this year in 2009 (16.8%).

A Atlanta also ranks second in the majors with 30 barreled balls on the season, trailing just Los Angeles-NL (31)...Michael Harris II is tied for fourth in the majors with six barrels this season, and his 19 "hard-hit" balls (over 95 mph) are tied with Alex Bregman for most in baseball.

A The Braves as a club rank second in baseball in expected slugging (.463), third in expected weighted on-base (.342) and seventh in expected batting average (.250).

PITCHING: Atlanta allowed a season-most six runs in yesterday's loss to Arizona, but still lead the majors with a team ERA of just 1.82...The Braves are the only team in baseball allowing less than two earned runs per game.

A The Braves bullpen also leads the majors outright with a 1.08 ERA, while Atlanta starters pace the NL and rank second in baseball with a 2.26 mark.

A Atlanta has done so despite pitching more total innings (55.2) than any other team in the NL.

Today's Game

- Slated to make the 12th career appearance and 10th career start against Los Angeles (AL), and third start of the season.
- Sale is a perfect 8-0 with a 1.24 ERA (9 ER/65.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts in 11 career appearances (nine starts) against the Angels.
- His eight career wins against the Angels without a loss are the most by any pitcher against the club among active pitchers without a defeat.
- Has held the Angels to a .145 batting average (35-for-241) in his career...Made his only prior appearance at Angel Stadium on June 7, 2024, striking out 10 over 6.0 innings while allowing two earned runs in an 11-3 Atlanta victory.
- This is Sale's first road start of 2026...Earned wins in each of his first two starts, holding opponents to a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) with nine strikeouts and zero walks through 12.0 innings...Has not issued a walk this season.
- Enters tonight two wins shy of 150 for his career.
- Has now posted a quality start in each of his first two outings this season, extending his streak to four consecutive quality starts dating to August 28, 2025.
- Posted a 2.40 ERA (84 ER/315.1 IP) with 399 strikeouts in 52 appearances (51 starts) through his first three seasons with Atlanta (2024-26)...One strikeout from reaching 400 as a Brave.
- Since joining the Braves in 2024, Sale's 2.40 ERA is the third lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 starts...Trails only Cy Young Award winners Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.10) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.25).
- Sale's 2.11 FIP since joining the Braves leads the majors among pitchers with at least 50 starts over that span...Ahead of Pittsburgh's Skenes (2.15) and Detroit's Skubal (2.25).
- Sale's career rate of K/9 (11.11) and K/BB ratio (5.28) are both the highest marks in baseball history among pitchers with at least 2,000.0 innings pitched.
- He's logged 91 games with 10 or more strikeouts throughout his career; eighth-most in MLB history...Has 20 career games with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks issued, also the eighth most in baseball history dating to 1901...Needs two more to tie six-time All-Star Curt Schilling for seventh on the all-time list.
- Signed a one-year, \$27 million contract extension with Atlanta on February 24, keeping him under club control through 2027 with a team option for 2028.
- Went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 19.2 innings with just one walk...Allowed one run over 6.0 innings in his final spring outing on March 21 at Boston.

2026

- Won his seventh career Opening Day start on March 27, holding Kansas City to three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts in the 6-0 victory...Threw 88 pitches (54 strikes), inducing two double plays, and did not allow a runner past second base.
- Became the first Braves starting pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more innings on Opening Day since Michael Soroka (6.0 IP, July 24, 2020).
- Is the first Braves lefty to toss 6.0-plus scoreless innings while allowing three or fewer hits in the season opener since Tom Glavine on April 7, 1992 at Houston.
- His seven Opening Day starts are tied for the second-most among active pitchers with Toronto's Max Scherzer...Trails only Detroit's Justin Verlander (12)...Is the 11th pitcher in MLB history to make multiple Opening Day starts for three different teams.
- Was the season-opening starter for Chicago (AL) in 2013-14, '16, Boston in 2018-19 and Atlanta in 2025-26.
- Earned the win in his second start on April 1, holding the Athletics to one hit and one run over 6.0 innings with three strikeouts in Atlanta's 5-1 victory...Shea Langeliers' solo home run in the fourth was the lone baserunner against Sale, who threw 79 pitches (57 strikes).

2025

- Went 7-5 with a 2.58 ERA (36 ER/125.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts in 21 games (20 starts) in his second season with Atlanta...Was named to the NL All-Star team for the second consecutive season.
- Missed 62 games after landing on the 15-day injured list on June 21 with a fractured left rib cage...Posted a 1.75 ERA in six appearances since being activated.
- Pitched to a 2.72 ERA with a 51:6 strikeout-to-walk ratio over his final 36.1 innings after returning from the injury.
- Recorded his 2,500th career strikeout on May 29 against Philadelphia - the fastest pitcher to reach the milestone in innings pitched (2,026.0 IP), breaking Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson's previous mark (2,107.2 IP).
- Made his first relief appearance since May 8, 2012 while with Chicago (AL) in the season finale on September 28 against Pittsburgh, striking out nine over 5.2 innings to earn the win.

- Awards:** NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).
- In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.
- In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.
- Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.

- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave in 2025, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
- Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...His nine total barrels and 2.9% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
- Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.0% is highest in the majors (min. 350) games.
- Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
- Has not allowed a run in 46 of his last 49 appearances since June 9 of last season...He leads major league relievers in ERA (1.14, 6 ER/47.1 IP) and WHIP (0.65), ranks second in batting average against (.131) and third in fWAR (1.7) in that span...Is the first Braves pitcher to allow six runs or less across 49 appearances since Craig Kimbrel from June 15, 2013-April 12, 2014.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (226 apps.), Iglesias owns the best ERA (2.30, 57 ER/222.2 IP), WHIP (0.93) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.92, 241 K/49 BB).
- Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (182), fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio and hits-per-nine-innings (6.4) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
- Was named the NL Reliever of the Month for August for the third consecutive season after converting all 10 of his save opportunities and allowing a 0.69 ERA (1 ER/13.0 IP) in the month.

- Pitched to a 5-0 record with a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP), a 0.68 WHIP and 22 strikeouts in 24 outings with Atlanta to conclude the 2025 season.
- Since his Braves debut on July 31, Kinley ranks among major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA (2nd, 0.62, 2 ER/29.0 IP), opponent's OPS (3rd, .345), WHIP (4th, 0.66) and batting average against (4th, .120).
- Is tied with Raisel Iglesias for the fewest runs allowed (2) in a pitcher's first 28 outings with Atlanta in the live-ball era...He holds the second-lowest ERA (0.62), only trailing Iglesias' mark of 0.34 when he arrived to the club in 2022.
- Allowed a run in his third appearance with the Braves, August 5, and then allowed one additional tally over his final 21 games...Strung together a career-high scoreless streak of 19.1 innings between runs.
- Among Braves pitchers with at least 24 appearances in a season, Kinley holds the second-best ERA, WHIP, hits-per-nine-innings (4.0) and ERA+ (583) marks in a single campaign.
- Ranked in the 100th percentile in baseball by allowing a hard-hit percentage of 29.6 percent.
