METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets return to New York yesterday and fell to the Brewers, 2-1...The Mets have lost five of their last six games...The team is 5-15 over their last 21 games...Tonight, the Mets continue a seven-game homestand (0-1) against the Brewers (0-1) and Giants (three games).

FIELD OF DREAMS: Today, the Amazin' Mets Foundation, NYC Parks, and Landtek participated in the ribbon cutting at the newly renovated Baseball Field #10 at Flushing Meadows Corona Park...The Foundation was proud to contribute over \$445,000 to renovate the field, which includes a full infield renovation, a new irrigation system, an added drainage system, and new fencing and concrete... The renovations have also ensured Baseball Field #10 is ADA compliant...The Foundation is proud to fully fund the project in support of children and youth athletes in the community.

BACK IN THE CITI: The Mets are 17-16 at home this year and have posted a 4.07 ERA...The Mets went 28-15 at home before the All-Star break last

DAVID VS. GOLIATH: David Peterson is expected to be recalled from Triple-A Syracuse to start tonight's game...Over four big league seasons, Peterson is 16-19 with a 4.83 ERA (140 ER/261.0 IP) with 115 walks and 280 strikeouts... Peterson was selected in the first round (20th overall) by the Mets in the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Eugene.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Congrats to RHP Mike Vasil who was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virgina.

PETE ALON600: Last night, Pete Alonso appeared in his 600th career game... He has appeared in 96 percent of the Mets 624 games since he debuted in 2019...His 170 home runs through career games are second only to Ryan Howard's 183...Since 2000, he ranks among the top 30 players in MLB with 272 extra-base hits through career game No. 600, just behind David Wright (275), Joey Votto (274) and Miguel Cabrera (273), and just ahead of Aaron Judge (271), Prince Fielder (269) and Yoenis Céspedes (266)...See the chart below for how Alonso stacks up with others through 600 career games:

BEER ME: Brandon Nimmo has hit .316 (30-95) with 16 runs, six doubles, five triples, two homers, two RBI, 10 walks with a .393 OBP and a .547 SLG in 28 career games against Milwaukee...Starling Marte has appeared in 119 games against the Crew and is a .290/.331/.475 hitter with 25 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs and 58 RBI...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for the Crew, is a .282/.393/.465 hitter with seven XBH and 12 RBI in 21 games vs. the Brewers.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last nine games, Francisco Lindor is batting .333 (9-27) with seven runs, two doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, six walks, three steals with a .444 OBP and a .741 SLG...Over the last 19 games, Lindor has posted a .950 OPS, batting .262 (16-61) with 12 runs, four doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks, five steals with a .377 OBP and a .574 SLG...He has posted a 2.3 fWAR this year, which ranks 16th in the National League...His 34 extra-base hits are the 11th most in the National League.

MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is one away from 200 home runs for his career...According to Elias, 13 players have hit their 200th career home runs in a Mets uniform, the last was Todd Frazier on June 20, 2019...Six Mets players did it in a home game: Todd Zeile (8/17/00), Jeromy Burnitz (8/30/02), Cliff Floyd (9/18/05), Carlos Beltran (8/26/06), Jason Bay (8/8/11), and David Wright 8/24/12).

BREWERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have lost five straight games to Milwaukee dating to September 21, 2022.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen a franchise-record 32 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 90.6% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 21 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 335 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

NIFTY FIFTY: Pete Alonso has recorded 55 RBI, while and Francisco Lindor has recorded 53 RBI this year...Alonso ranks tied for third in the NL, while Lindor is fifth...The Mets are one of four teams in the majors with two players who have each recorded at least 50 RBI...They join the Braves (Ozzie Albies -55 and Matt Olson - 60) as the only other team in the National League.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Despite missing 10 games, Pete Alonso's 24 home runs this year, are the second-most in the National League and rank third in the majors to Shohei Ohtani and Matt Olson who have each his 25.

KEEP THE CAR RUNNING: The Mets are 5-10 when both teams score six or more runs this year...They are 3-6 when both score seven or more runs and 2-3 when they both score 8 or more runs.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 21-3 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 8-1 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 22-9 (.710) when scoring first this season... The Mets are 13-34 (.277) when their opponent scores first.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 56-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 6.00 ERA (52 ER/78.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the fifth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

JUNE: New York is 6-16 (.273) in June.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with 11 saves, and a 1.59 ERA (6 ER/34.0 IP) in 30 appearances this season...He has walked eight, while striking out 41...He ranks fourth in the NL and 10th in the majors in ERA among relievers...He is tied for 16th in the NL with 41 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .169 (11-65) average this year.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has safely hit in 14 of his last 17 games...Over the last 17 games, Pham is batting .288 (19-66) with nine runs, six doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, five walks, three steals with an .803 OPS...Since May 17, Pham is batting .304 (28-92) with 13 runs, eight doubles, one triple, four home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks, six steals with a .906 OPS in 28 games.

JUNIOR METS CLINIC: The Mets hosted the Fairfield Red Storm Challenger baseball team for a Junior Mets clinic earlier today at Citi Field...The kids participated in hitting, throwing, and fielding stations alongside Mr. & Mrs. Met...Following the clinic, the team received a tour of the Mets Hall of Fame, attended batting practice, and were provided tickets to Tuesday's game against the Brewers.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits with one walk and seven strikeouts for the Syracuse Mets in their 9-8 win at the Durham Bulls on June 21.

WHAT'S BREWIN'?: Today, Peterson will face the Brewers for the second time this season...Peterson started at American Family Field on April 5, allowing five runs on five hits over 4.0 innings of work...He walked a careerhigh-tying five batters in that outing...He has made three appearances (two starts) in his career against Milwaukee...He's posted a 10.38 ERA (10 ER/8.2 IP) across the three appearances.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...He is expected to be recalled for today's start...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine... For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 FRA (20 FR/37.0 IP).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .239 (54-226) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Peterson has allowed five or more hits in all eight of his major league starts this season, the longest streak of his career...Before this stretch, he had only allowed more than four hits in consecutive starts four times in his career...The southpaw allowed four hits or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and 21 of his 28 appearances overall last season...He held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 39 of his 53 career games entering 2023.

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...lt was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
