## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (67-49) at TEXAS RANGERS (60-58)

**Sunday, August 10, 2025; Globe Life Field; Game 117; Road 59; 2:35 pm EDT; NBCSP/94WIP**  
**RHP Zack Wheeler (9-5, 2.64 ERA) vs LHP Patrick Corbin (6-7, 3.91 ERA)**

- GAME #116 RECAP:** The Phillies defeated the Rangers in Arlington last night, 3-2 ... Starter Jesús Luzardo earned his 11<sup>th</sup> win of the season after holding Texas to just one run on seven hits over 6.0 innings (82 pitches) ... Rangers starter Jacob deGrom kept the Phils off the scoreboard through the first 6.0 innings, but Max Kepler's 2-run double in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning erased the one-run deficit and put the Phils ahead ... Bryson Stott added an RBI single later in the 7<sup>th</sup> ... Jhoan Duran worked a perfect 9<sup>th</sup> inning to record the save, his 3<sup>rd</sup> in as many chances with Philadelphia and his 19<sup>th</sup> of 2025 ... The win gave the Phillies their first ever series victory against the Rangers in Texas.
- DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS:** Today, the Phillies continue their only 3-city road trip of the season – this 10-game trip marks their longest since last August when they played 3 at SEA, 3 at LAD and 4 at ARI ... Going into play today, the Phillies are two games over .500 on the road this year at 30-28 compared to 37-21 at CBP (.638) ... However, the Phillies have a +47 run differential on the road this year (250-203) which is the 3<sup>rd</sup>-best run differential on the road in MLB, trailing only MIL (+95) and CHI (+70) ... The Phillies have allowed the fewest runs of any team in baseball on the road, 20 runs clear of HOU who ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> at 223 and 23 clear of the next closest NL club (LAD, 226) ... **When they score at least 2 runs on the road this year, the Phillies are 30-13 (.698 win %, best in MLB), when they score at least 3 runs they are 26-10 (.722 win %, 5<sup>th</sup>-best in MLB) and when they score at least 4 runs they are 23-5 (.821 win %, 3<sup>rd</sup>-best in MLB).**
- PHILLER** The Phillies are 25-12-1 in their first 38 series played this season with an MLB-best .671 winning percentage in series play (next: LAD, 22-12-2, .667) ... Since the All-Star Break, the Phillies lead the NL with 38 home runs (next: COL, 29) and 79 extra-base hits (next: COL, 69) ... They also lead all NL clubs since the break in SLG at .486 (next: COL, .459) and rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in OPS (.804) & average exit velocity (90.4) ... **Over the last 9 games (since 7/30), Philadelphia's starting pitchers have 45 strikeouts to 3 walks** ... The Phillies have won 5 straight games against TEX after a 3-game sweep at CBP in May 2024 and Friday night's win snapped a 10-game road losing streak against TEX, marking the club's first win in Arlington since Opening Day 2014 on 3/31/14 ... The Phillies are 48-2 when leading after 6 innings (.960 win %, best in MLB) and 56-2 when leading after 7 innings (.966 win %, best in MLB) ... The Phillies bullpen enters today's game having allowed only 1 run over it's last 15.2 innings of work since 8/3 ... The Phillies have won 5 of their last 6 series: 2-1 over BOS (65-53 record), 2-1 over NYY (62-55 record), 2-1 over DET (67-51 record) and 2-1 over BAL (53-64 record).
- COUNTING STARS:** The Phillies have 5 of the top 20 players in the National League on their roster using FanGraphs WAR ... Among all NL players (batters and pitchers), **Trea Turner** ranks 4<sup>th</sup> (4.6), **Cristopher Sánchez** ranks 9<sup>th</sup> (4.1), **Kyle Schwarber** ranks 11<sup>th</sup> (4.0), **Zack Wheeler** ranks 12<sup>th</sup> (3.9) and **Jesús Luzardo** ranks 20<sup>th</sup> (3.4) ... Philadelphia's 5 players inside the top 20 are the most of any club in the NL ... The Cubs (Pete Crow-Armstrong, Kyle Tucker & Matthew Boyd), Dodgers (Shohei Ohtani, Will Smith & Yoshinobu Yamamoto) and Diamondbacks (Corbin Carroll, Geraldo Perdomo & Ketel Marte) are the only other clubs with at least 3 players inside the top 20.
- WHAT'S LEFT TO SAY?:** In 93 plate appearances against left-handed **relievers** this year (most of any LHH in MLB), **Kyle Schwarber** is slashing .325/.441/.779 with 10 home runs and a 1.222 OPS ... Sunday night, with his 10<sup>th</sup> home run off a left-handed reliever, Schwarber joined **Barry Bonds** and **Ken Griffey Jr.** as the only 3 left-handed hitters with 10+ home runs against left-handed relievers in a single season in the Divisional Era (since 1969) – Bonds had 11 in 2002 and Griffey had 10 in both 1994 and 1996 ... Overall this year, against all LHP (SP and RP), Schwarber is slashing .269/.387/.635 with a 1.022 OPS and 16 home runs.
- BOBBY D'S BASEBALL CAMP:** The Phillies infield has 16 Outs Above Average combined this year which among all 30 infields in MLB ranks T-5<sup>th</sup> ... Since 2023, the Phillies infield has been credited with 36 OAA which ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in baseball ... Over the previous 3 years (2020-22), Philadelphia's infield ranked 27<sup>th</sup> in MLB with -37 Outs Above Average (+73 OAA swing from 2020-22 to 2023-25) ... This season, **Trea Turner** has 13 OAA which ranks 9<sup>th</sup> among all players in baseball (99<sup>th</sup> percentile) and would establish a new career best (previous: 12 OAA in 2018 with WSH).
- HEY I KNOW YOU:** The Phillies today reclaimed **RHP David Robertson** from Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... The club signed the righty to a one-year contract and optioned him to Lehigh Valley (AAA) on 7/21 ... Robertson, signed by the Phillies as a free agent before the 2019 season and then re-acquired via a trade with the Chicago Cubs in 2022, will become only the 3<sup>rd</sup> player in franchise history to have 3 separate stints with the club and first since **HOF Chuck Klein** over a 16-year period from 1928-44 (other: Bill Hallman over a 15-year period from 1888-1903) ... A veteran of 16 major league seasons, Robertson has a career 2.91 ERA (283 ER, 876.2 IP) in 861 games (1 start) with a 32.0% strikeout rate (1,154 SO/3,612 BF) ... He last pitched for the Texas Rangers in 2024 and posted a 3.00 ERA (24 ER, 72.0 IP) over 68 appearances ... His 1.9 fWAR last season ranked ninth among all relievers in Major League Baseball and tied for fifth in the American League (with Kirby Yates), trailing only Cade Smith (2.7), Griffin Jax (2.6), Mason Miller (2.3) and Emmanuel Clase (2.2).
- MARSH MADNESS:** Phillies OF **Brandon Marsh** enters today's game having hit safely in his last 5 games (.500, 8-for-16) and has posted a slash line of .486/.500/1.000 with a 1.500 OPS over his last 12 games ... In that 12-game stretch (since 7/26), the lefty has 17 hits in his last 35 at-bats with 6 doubles and 4 home runs ... Since being reinstated from the 10-day injured list (right hamstring strain) back on May 3, Marsh is slashing .313/.369/.481 (.850 OPS) in 76 games ... 23 of his 67 hits in that span have gone for extra bases and his .313 AVG ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> among all NL batters (min. 235 PA) ... Marsh opened the season .095/.220/.167 with 1 home run and 5 RBI over his first 17 games of 2025.
- AMERICA'S TEAM:** Today, the Phillies will extend their MLB record as they play the last of their 21 consecutive Interleague games (previous MLB record was 15 straight, done hundreds of times by other clubs) ... Coming out of the break, the Phillies faced an AL team in each of their first 7 series – 21 straight games – and will not play another NL club until tomorrow (Cincinnati) ... The Phillies are 12-8 (.600) in their 20 games against the AL since coming out of the break with a +25 run differential (109-84) ... Overall, the Phils' .605 win% (23-15) in Interleague is T-4<sup>th</sup> in MLB.
- TAKE A BOW, THOMS:** Since his first game as manager on June 3, 2022, **Rob Thomson** (317 wins, .575 win %) has the Phillies 3<sup>rd</sup> in wins and winning percentage among all clubs in MLB, trailing only LAD (343 wins, .621 win %) and ATL (319 wins, .579 win %) ... His .575 career winning percentage ranks 1<sup>st</sup> in Phillies history, 24<sup>th</sup> all time among MLB managers (min. 315 G) and 3<sup>rd</sup> among active managers, behind only Dave Roberts (.623) & Aaron Boone (.579).

**LAST START:** 8/2 vs DET: L, 6.0 IP, 9 H, 4 R, 3 ER, 3 HR, 0 BB, 10 SO, 98 pitches (70 strikes) ... The Phillies fell to the Tigers, 7-5, at CBP ... Wheeler recorded his 4<sup>th</sup> straight start at CBP with 10 SO and no walks and his 6<sup>th</sup> overall on the season ... All 4 of the runs scored came across the plate via home run ... The Tigers hit 2 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and when Wheeler went back out for the 7<sup>th</sup> inning, Dillon Dingler reached base on an error and Javier Baez slugged a homer in the next at bat ... Wheeler collected 4 groundouts, 2 flyouts and 15 whiffs

**TODAY'S START:**

- Shining Bright:** Wheeler was named an All-Star for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time in his career and 2<sup>nd</sup> season in a row
- Winning Attitude:** Wheeler is currently 1 win shy of 10 on the season and it would be his 8<sup>th</sup> season with 10+ wins and 5<sup>th</sup> in a row (since 2021) ... **Per Elias, he would become the 10<sup>th</sup> Phillie in franchise history to post 5 straight 10+ win seasons, alongside Steve Carlton (1972-84), Robin Roberts (1949-60), Grover Alexander (1911-17), Cole Hamels (2007-12), Al Orth (1896-1901), Bill Duggleby (1901-06), Jimmy Ring (1921-25), Kid Carsey (1892-96) and Chick Fraser (1899-1904) ... The last few pitchers in the majors to do this with a single franchise were HOU's Framber Valdez (2021-25), CHI's Jon Lester (2015-19), NYY's Masahiro Tanaka (2014-19), WSH's Max Scherzer (2015-19) and WSH's Steven Strasburg (2014-19)**
- Zack With a K:** Wheeler's 182 SO are the most in the NL (2<sup>nd</sup>: Webb: 165) entering today's game and is 3<sup>rd</sup> most in MLB (1<sup>st</sup>: Skubal: 187) ... **In his last start, Wheeler struck out 10 batters without issuing a walk for the 6<sup>th</sup> time this season ... Per Elias, he is the 1<sup>st</sup> Phillie since the mound was moved to it's current distance in 1893 to have 5 games in a single season with 10+ SO and no walks ... Cliff Lee and Wheeler previously had seasons with 4 such games in 2013 and 2021, respectively ... Tarik Skubal, Logan Webb and Garrett Crochet have also done so this season, but before that, the last time a pitcher in the majors did so was 2021, when Gerrit Cole (6 games), Jacob deGrom (5 games) and Corbin Burnes (5 game) did so ... Wheeler's last start was his 31<sup>st</sup> double digit strikeout game of his career and his 6<sup>th</sup> of the season ... He has 23 double digit strikeout games which is now the 6<sup>th</sup> most in Phillies history, behind Steve Carlton (70), Curt Schilling (48), Aaron Nola (31), Cole Hamels (29) and Jim Bunning (25) ... He has now had 4 straight home starts with 10 strikeouts and no walks and per Elias, is the 1<sup>st</sup> pitcher in MLB history to do so ... He has not walked a batter in 31.0 innings at CBP, which is the longest such streak by a Phillie since Zach Eflin in 2021 ... Of his 172 SO, 67 have been on his 4-seamer, 34 have been on his sweeper, 27 have been on his curveball, 23 have been on his sinker, 21 have been on his splitter and 10 have been on his cutter ... 147 of his 172 SO have come on swings and misses ... Wheeler has collected 350 whiffs this season, which are the 3<sup>rd</sup> most in MLB and his 31.4% whiff rate is 4<sup>th</sup> (min. 400 PA) ... After reaching 150 first half strikeouts in his start on 7/12, he became just the 3<sup>rd</sup> Phillie (5<sup>th</sup> instance) to reach 150 SO before the All-Star Game since it was first introduced in 1933, alongside Steve Carlton who did it in 1972 (201 SO) and 1980 (153) and Curt Schilling in 1997 (159) and 1998 (180) ... In his start on 6/9 vs CHI, Wheeler notched his 1000<sup>th</sup> SO as a Phillie ... Per Elias, he became the fastest Phillie to reach the mark ... The previous fastest to reach the mark (in terms of games) was Aaron Nola, who reached 1,000 strikeouts in his 151<sup>st</sup> game with the club ... He also became the fastest to reach 1000 SO with a team since Jacob deGrom reached 1000 strikeouts with the Mets in his 139<sup>th</sup> start**
- WARlord:** Wheeler enters today's game with 40.1 bWAR for his career – Per Baseball Reference, he is one only 180 pitchers in MLB history have reached 40.0+ bWAR in their career out of the estimated 10,000+ pitchers to ever appear in a major league game ... Only 6 other active pitchers have eclipsed the 40.0 bWAR threshold: Justin Verlander, Clayton Kershaw, Max Scherzer, Chris Sale, Jacob deGrom and Gerrit Cole ... Of the 180 pitchers in MLB history to reach 40.0 bWAR, only 4 others have done so exclusively as a starting pitcher: Verlander, deGrom, Cole and Tom Glavine – Wheeler has 280 starts and 0 relief appearances in his career
- You Complete Me:** In his start on 7/6, Wheeler tossed the 5<sup>th</sup> complete game of his career, his first since 8/8/21 vs NYM and it was his 4<sup>th</sup> of 9.0 innings ... Wheeler, who faced 1 batter over the minimum and never pitched out of the stretch while retiring 27 of 28 batters, allowed only 1 baserunner and that was an Austin Hays solo home run in the 5<sup>th</sup> inning ... Wheeler finished with 12 strikeouts, 1 hit allowed and 0 walks – he's the first pitcher in franchise history to toss a complete game with 12+ strikeouts, 0 walks and 1 hit or none allowed – the last National League pitcher with a CG, 12+ SO, 0 BB and 1 H or none allowed was Max Scherzer on 10/3/15 at NYM (CG, 17 SO, 0 H, 0 BB) – it was Scherzer's 2nd no-hitter that season and would have been a perfect game except for an error in the 6<sup>th</sup> inning
- Best of the Best:** Wheeler was named NL Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 2-1 record and a 0.58 ERA (2 ER, 31.0 IP) with 42 SO to 7 BB across 5 starts ... **It's his 2nd career monthly award (May of 2022) and he's the first Phillies pitcher to take home monthly honors since teammate Cristopher Sánchez did so last June ... Wheeler is the first MLB pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to allow 2 ER or fewer over 30.0 or more innings with 40+ strikeouts in June ... Wheeler is only the 11th pitcher (12th instance) to have done so in any month since 1900 ... Wheeler's 0.58 ERA was the best in the National League for the month**
- Hardware Store:** Wheeler was named Co-NL Player of the Week for the week of 7/5 alongside CHI's Michael Busch ... He is the first pitcher to win Pitcher of the Month and then Player of the Week the next week since Zac Gallen won POM in August of 2022 and POW on Sept. 3, 2022
- Man On a Mission:** Wheeler had a career-best scoreless streak of 25.2 innings from 5/6-29 ... It's the 3<sup>rd</sup> longest scoreless streak in MLB this year and the longest in the NL
- Pitch Usage:** 4-seam fastball (41.2%), Sinker (17.7%), Sweeper (14.3%), Curveball (9.5%), Cutter (8.7%), Splitter (8.6%)
- vs AL West:** 10-4, 2.60 ERA (30 ER, 104.0 IP) in 18 starts

In the National League, he ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in WHIP (0.96), OBP AVG (.192) OBP OPS (.253) and OBP OPS (.581), 2<sup>nd</sup> in ERA (2.57), IP (200.0) and fWAR (5.4) and T-2<sup>nd</sup> in SO (224)

- In 2024, was named First-Team All-MLB, finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in NL Cy Young voting, behind ATL's Chris Sale, and was selected to his 2<sup>nd</sup> career All-Star Team
