In his last 14 games, **Caleb Durbin** is batting .302 (16-for-53) with 1 HR and ..during this stretch, he has a .356 OBP/.491 SLG/.846 OPS.

Rated Rookie

Caleb Durbin has 22 RBI this season, trailing only the Marlins' Liam Hicks [24] among NL rookies.....Durbin hit the first walk-off homer of his career last night, becoming the 10th rookie in franchise history to accomplish the feat and first since Garrett Mitchell on 4/5/23 vs. New York-NL.

Born Again Christian

In his last 14 games, Christian Yelich is batting .415 (22-for-53) with 6 HR and 15 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a 492 OBP / 774 SLG / 1265 OPS

We Sal-ute You!

In his last 19 games, **Sal Frelick** is batting .347 (25-for-72) with 2 HR and 11 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a 382 OBP / 472 SLG / 854 OPS

U Da Man!

Abner Uribe is unscored upon in 27 of his 31 appearances this season. including 19 of his last 20 outings and 6 in a row.....Uribe ranks among NL relief leaders in strikeouts (T2nd. 41) and ERA (T4th, 1.48).

A Large Inheritance

Grant Anderson has stranded each of his last 12 inherited runners, including a pair on Friday vs. San Diego.

TODAY'S GAME: Is game 3 (1-1) of a 10-game homestand vs. San Diego (1-1), Atlanta (3g) and St. Louis (4g).....is the team's longest homestand of the seaso day on June 16, the team takes a 6-game trip to Chicago-NL (3g) and Minnesota (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (82 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 10*, SECOND: 19, THIRD: 39, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3....the Brewers are currently in third place, trailing the first-place ubs by 5.5 games and second-place Cardinals by 1.5 games (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The team is 11-8-1 in series play. <u>Game 1</u>: 11-10, <u>Game 2</u>: 11-10, <u>Game 3</u>: 11-9, <u>Game 4</u>: 2-1

Sweep Wins [2]: vs. BOS (3g, 5/26-5/28) and at PHI (3g, 5/30-6/1) Sweep Losses [1]: at NYY (3g, 3/27-3/30)

AT HOME: The team is 19-11 at home, going 7-2-0 in series play.....the Brewers are 7-2 in their last 9 home games.

ON THE ROAD: The team is 16-19 on the road, going 4-6-1 in series play.....the Brewers are 6-1 in their last 7 rand games.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made eight replay challenges this season, going 5-3....their last challenge (won) came on 5/28 vs. Boston as an out call at second base involving Sal Frelick was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees [6].....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24)....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 701 wins since 2017 (6th in MLB/3rd in National League).

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #51 - RHP FREDDY PERALTA (13gs, 5-4, 2.92) 2025 Arsenal: 4-Seam Fastball (59.9%) - Changeup (19.4%) - Curveball (14.1%) - Slider (6.7%)

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: Freddy Peralta, 29, will be making his 14th start of the season this evening.....Peralta last started last Tuesday at Cincinnati and took a 4-2 defeat (6ip, 7h, 3r, 3er, 3bb, 9k, 1hr, 103 pitches).....the team is 7-6 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts.....opponents are batting .216 (57-for-264, 9hr).....Peralta was acquired from Seattle with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki in exchange for 1B Adam Lind on 12/9/15.....on 2/28/20, he signed a 5-year contract through the 2024 season with club options for 2025 and 2026.

FREDDY K-RUEGER: Peralta has 1,024 career strikeouts, trailing only Yovani Gallardo (1,226), Ben Sheets (1,206) and Teddy Higuera (1,081) on the all-time franchise list.

LAST SEASON: Peralta went 11-9 with a 3.68 ERA in a career-high 32 starts last season.....the team went 19-13 in his starts.....he made 11 quality starts.....his 173.2 innings pitched marked a career high.....he was among National League leaders in K/9IP (5th, 10.36), H/9IP (5th, 7.41), strikeouts (6th, 200) and AVG (6th, .224).....he produced 200+ strikeouts (200) for the second time in his career and for the second straight season (210 in 2023), joining **Teddy Higuera** (2x), **Corbin Burnes** (3x) and **Yovani Gallardo** (4x) as the only pitchers in franchise history with multiple 200+ strikeout seasons.

CAREER: Is 58-40 with a 3.72 ERA and 1 save in 191 games/142 starts (825.1ip, 341er).....is in his eighth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2018-25).....has gone 50-38 with a 3.70 ERA as a starter (741.1ip, 305er) and 8-2 with a 3.86 ERA in relief (84ip, 36er).....was an All-Star in 2021.....was the Opening Day starter in 2024 and 2025.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 34-19 with a 3.39 ERA in 100 games/72 starts [436ip, 164er]....is 3-0 with a 1.55 ERA in 5 starts this season (29ip, 5er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 24-21 with a 4.09 ERA in 91 games/70 starts (389.1ip, 177er)....is 2-4 with a 3.86 ERA in 8 starts this season (42ip, 18er).

CAREER vs. PADRES: Is 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA in 5 games/2 starts (16ip, 12h, 7r, 7er, 5bb, 23k, 2hr).....did not face San Diego last season.....went 1-1 with a 6.10 ERA in 2 starts in 2023 (10.1ip, 11h, 7r, 7er, 4bb, 14k, 2hr).....his other 3 appearances came in 2019 out of the bullpen (5.2ip, 1h, 0r, 1bb, 9k).
