**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Cardinals, 4-2...After winning six straight, the Mets have dropped three of their last four games...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 13-7...The Mets continue a seven-game home stand (0-1) against the Cardinals (0-1) and Cubs (four games).

**CITI CONNECT:** The Mets will don their City Connect uniforms for the first time today...Representing on all fronts, the uniform honors everything about NYC that makes it the World's City – the trains that connect our fans, the bridges that bring our boroughs together and the concrete that serves as the steady heartbeat of the city's grit and grind...The Mets will wear the uniform every Saturday, except for June 1.

**ESQUIRE MARTINEZ:** J.D. Martinez made his season debut last night for the Mets...He went 2-4 with a double and an RBI...Martinez ranks eighth among active players with 367 career doubles and 1,003 RBI.

**WALK THIS WAY:** Brandon Nimmo is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for second in the National League with 19 walks...He is walking at a 16.8% rate, which is the fourth-best in the majors and the best in the National League...He has safely reached base in eight straight games, posting a .417 OBP in that span...Nimmo has recorded 416 career walks, which places him 13th on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Mike Piazza with 424 walks as a Met.

**STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING LINDOR:** In 17 games since April 7, Francisco Lindor is batting .286 (20-70) with 13 runs, four doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, six walks with one steal, a .342 OBP and a .514 SLG.

**REEDING RAINBOW:** Reed Garrett notched his fourth win of the year in his seventh appearance on Wednesday in San Francisco...In the history of major league baseball, only three other relievers have more than four wins in their first seven outings of a season...Bill Fischer (five wins with the 1963 Kansas City Athletics), Hugh Bedient (five wins with the 1912 Boston Red Sox) and Hall of Famer Rube Waddell (five wins with the 1905 Philadelphia Athletics)...Prior to Garrett, the last major leaguer with four wins in his first seven outings as a reliever was Tanner Roark in 2013 with Washington...Additionally, Garrett is tied for the major league in wins and his 25 strikeouts leads all relievers...Garrett's 25 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first seven outings of the season.

**IT'S IN THE CARDS:** Pete Alonso is a .290 (29-100) hitter with 22 runs, six doubles, nine home runs and 21 RBI in 27 career games against St. Louis... Starling Marte has hit .287/.345/.412 with 34 extra-base hits with 42 RBI in 121 career games against St. Louis...Tyrone Taylor Has hit .278/.344/.504 with 14 extra-base hits and 21 RBI in 44 games against St. Louis.

**IN THE CITY:** The Mets enter the day 6-7 at Citi Field this season...The team has won six of their last eight games at the ballpark...New York has posted a 2.55 ERA (34 ER/120.0 IP) at home this year, the lowest mark in the majors.

**ADAM'S SONG:** After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made seven scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit and issued only one walk in those 7.2 innings, striking out 14 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) this season with one walk and 17 strikeouts...Opponents are batting .121 (4-33) against him.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** New York owns the third-lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.55 (88 ER/223.0 IP) mark...Their 241 strikeouts are also third in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.99 ERA (30 ER/90.1 IP) with 40 walks and 111 strikeouts...Their 2.85 ERA (31 ER/98.0 IP) is the second-best in the Senior Circuit...Their 124 strikeouts from the bullpen are the most in the major leagues.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Starling Marte recorded his 1,500th career hit yesterday...He became the sixth player born in the Dominican to record 1,500 hits and 300 steals...Marte is batting .321 (25-78) with 13 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, six steals with an .828 OPS in 18 games since April 6...He has safely hit in 14 of those 18 games...He is 9-21 with three-extra base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...Overall, Marte is batting .288/.327/.442 with eight extra-base hits in 25 contests in 2024.

**RANK AND FILE:** Pete Alonso is now one home run away from 200 for his career...He is rising the leader-board in several categories in franchise history:

**EL JEFF-E:** Since going 1-15 through the first five games of the season, Jeff McNeil has hit .299 (20-67) with 10 runs, six doubles, one home run, seven RBI, six walks with a .373 OBP and an .806 OPS in 19 games.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** In 18 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .274/.341/.432 with 99 runs, 34 doubles, one triple, 21 home runs, 56 walks with an .773 OPS...Their .274 average is the second-best in the majors, while their .341 OBP, .432 SLG and their .773 OPS is third-best...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

**SWING AND NO MISS:** Mets batters have struck out 186 times this year... That is the third-fewest in the major leagues and the fewest in the NL... Overall, the team has posted an 19.4 strikeout percentage, which is the sixth-lowest in the majors and third in the National League...Jeff McNeil ranks eighth in the majors, striking out only 10.8% of the time.

### HOUSER NEWS & NOTES

**DOOGIE HOUSER, NYM:** On April 4 vs. Detroit, Adrian Houser made his Mets debut in the first game of a doubleheader...The right-hander threw 5.0+ innings and allowed one run on three hits, three walks and recorded three strikeouts... Houser was acquired from Milwaukee along with OF Tyrone Taylor in exchange for RHP Coleman Crow on December 20, 2023.

**HOUSE(R) OF CARDS:** Today, Houser will make his 17th career appearance and 14th career start against the Cardinals, his most against any single opponent... Last season, Houser faced the Cardinals twice and went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP)...Over seven games (six starts) at home against St. Louis, Houser has posted a 2.00 ERA (8 ER/36.0 IP), a 0.97 WHIP and a .179 opponent batting average...On September 4, 2021, Houser threw his lone complete game and shutout against the Cardinals at American Family Field...In that start, Houser allowed just three hits, recorded seven strikeouts and did not issue a walk.

**HOME COOKING:** Through his first two home starts as a Met, Houser has pitched to a 2.65 ERA (3 ER/10.1 IP) and has allowed only five hits...His five hits allowed in his first two home starts as a Met are tied with David Peterson, Matt Harvey, Nelson Figueroa, Jorge Sosa and Kazuhisa Ishii for the third-fewest by a Met in their first two home starts with the club...Only Corey Oswalt and Jack DiLauro (three each) had allowed fewer hits in their first two home starts as a Met.

**YO, ADRIAN:** Since 2019, Houser has allowed 96 barrels, tied with former teammate Freddy Peralta for the fourth-fewest in the majors...During that span, Houser ranks fifth in the majors in average launch angle against (Six Degrees) and 13th in the NL in average exit velocity against (88.2 MPH) (Min. 500.0 IP).

**2023 SUMMARY:** Began the season on the 15-Day Injured List with right groin tightness...Made his season debut on May 7 at San Francisco and allowed two runs over 4.2 innings...Did not allow a run over 11.1 innings in back-to-back starts from May 19 - May 24...Threw a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed one run on June 4 at Cincinnati...Made two relief appearances on June 19 and June 23...Matched his career high for the third time with 10 strikeouts on July 22 vs. Atlanta...Landed on the 15-Day Injured List on August 28 with right elbow effusion and was activated on September 14...Over four starts in September/October, went 3-1 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP).

**OKLAHOMA!** Houser is the 18th player in franchise history born in the state of Oklahoma...He is the first player born in Oklahoma to appear in a game for the Mets since Matt Reynolds in 2016...He is the first Oklahoma native to pitch for the Mets since 2012 when Mets pitching coach Jeremy Hefner made his major league debut...Houser has known Hefner for many years and worked with Hefner during the offseason in Oklahoma.
