Crawford** 6/3-6/6)...France's career-high XBH streak is 5 G (9/8-9/13/2020).

Kyle Seager's pinch-hit, walk-off RBI single was the 19th pinch-hit walk-off hit in Mariners history...it was the first since Chris Herrmann's pinch-hit walk-off home run on Sept. 25, 2018 vs. Oakland.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-day, 8-game homestand (3-1) with the 2nd of 4 games vs. Tampa Bay...will host the Colorado Rockies (2 G, 6/22-23) to conclude the homestand following Sunday's series finale vs. the Rays...opened the homestand with a 3-game set vs. Minnesota (2-1)...following the conclusion of the homestand, will embark on a 7-day, 6-game road trip vs. Chicago-AL (3 G) and Toronto (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS**, as well as broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Rays last night by a 6-5 score in walk-off, come-from-behind fashion...have won 4 of their last 5 games and 15 of their last 24...are 14-9 in day games and 21-27 at night...are 20-15 at T-Mobile Park and 15-21 on the road...are 29-11 when scoring at least 4 runs and 6-25 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 26-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- **One-Run Fun** - The Mariners have the most one-run wins (15) in the Majors this season...the next-closest American League teams have collected 12 one-run wins (Boston, Oakland)...Seattle (15-7, .681) owns the 2nd-best winning percentage in one-run games, trailing only Los Angeles-AL (11-5, .688).
- **Walk It Off** - Seattle earned its 4th walk-off win of the season last night...**Kyle Seager** delivered a pinch-hit, walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the 9th...Seager joins **Jake Fraley** (walk, 4/1 vs. SF), **Ty France** (single, 4/16 vs. HOU) and **Tom Murphy** (sacrifice fly, 5/31 vs. OAK) as Mariners with walk-offs this season.
- **Comebacker** - The Mariners earned their 14th come-from-behind victory of the season last night...it was also their 2nd win this season when trailing after 8 innings (also: April 11 at Minnesota).
- **Milestone Watch** - **Kyle Seager** (496) is 4 walks away from recording 500 in his career...his 295 doubles are tied with Ichiro Suzuki for 3rd-most in team history.
- **Games Played** - Seager has appeared in 71 games this season, in sole possession of the Major League lead...he's also appeared in 207 consecutive games for the Mariners, a career-high streak.
- **Happy Birthday** - Mariners left-hander **Nick Margevicius** (25) and taxi squad catcher **Caleb Joseph** (35) both celebrate birthdays today.

I'M SO FRANCE-Y...**Ty France** crushed a 2-run home run in the bottom of the 6th inning last night, his 2nd homer in his last 3 games...he has hit safely in 6 consecutive games (6/12-c), which ties a single-season high streak...he is batting .391 (9x23) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI in that span...France has also registered at least 1 extra-base hit in 4 consecutive games, which ties a team-high for the Mariners this season...the 26-year-old's longest career hitting streak is 8 games (9/23/20-4/3/21).

J.P. STANDS FOR JUNE POP...**J.P. Crawford** is batting .375 (24x64) with 10 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs, 9 RBI and 8 walks in the month of June...he has reached base safely 32 times since June 1, which leads the Majors...he's gotten on-base at a .432 clip, slugging .578 with a 1.011 OPS in the month.

- **vs. LHP** - The 26-year-old is batting .345 (30x87) with 8 doubles, 1 home run and 10 RBI in 91 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers this season...the .345 average ranks **best in the American League** among left-handed hitters with at least 50 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers this season.
- **First of All** - Crawford is batting .338 (26x77) with 11 runs, 7 doubles, 2 home runs, 9 RBI and 8 walks in 19 games out of the leadoff spot this season...the .338 average ranks **best in the American League** among players with at least 50 plate appearances out of the leadoff spot this season.

SEAGER WALK-OFF...**Kyle Seager** delivered a pinch-hit, walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the 9th inning last night to give the Mariners a 6-5 win...it was Seager's 3rd career walk-off hit and first since a walk-off RBI double on June 20, 2017 vs. Detroit...his first career walk-off hit was a 3-run home run on April 23, 2014 vs. Houston...it was Seattle's 19th pinch-hit, walk-off hit in franchise history and the first since Chris Herrmann's pinch-hit, walk-off home run on Sept. 25, 2018 vs. Oakland.

LONGING FOR SHED...**Shed Long Jr.** went 2-for-4 with a pair of doubles last night...his RBI double in the 9th inning tied the game 5-5...the 25-year-old has an active 4-game hitting streak...he is batting .400 (6x15) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 5 RBI in that span...Long Jr. has reached base safely in 7 of his first 8 games to begin the season...he has started 4 games at second base and 4 in left field.

MOORE REACHES DOUBLE DIGITS...**Dylan Moore** recorded his 10th stolen base of the season last night...it is his 3rd consecutive 10+ stolen base campaign to begin his career...he is 1 of 20 Mariners all-time to have at least 3 seasons with at least 10 stolen bases in a Seattle uniform...he is the first since Ichiro Suzuki did it 12 times from 2001-12.

LUIS LUIS...**Luis Torrens** is batting .444 (4x9) with 3 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs and 2 RBI since returning to Seattle on June 15...he has homered in back-to-back starts and raised his batting average by 24 points from .178 to .202 in a span of just 3 games.

ROLL IT...Seattle leads the Majors with 73 double plays turned this season, ranking ahead of Boston (68), Colorado (65), Philadelphia (65) and Texas (65)...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** has been involved in 46 double plays defensively, 6th-most in the Majors and the most among non-first basemen.

PACK THE HOUSE...the Mariners have received approval from the state of Washington to open T-Mobile Park to 100% capacity beginning on July 2 vs. Texas...the Mariners will celebrate with a Grand Re-Opening Night at T-Mobile Park on July 2 vs. the Rangers, offering \$4 center field bleacher seats and \$17.76 main level seats...Jeopardy Champion Ken Jennings with throw out the Ceremonial First Pitch and the Mariners will host the first post-game fireworks show at T-Mobile Park since September of 2019.

WHERE MITCH RANKS...**Mitch Haniger** is batting .259 (67x259) with 45 runs, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 16 home runs, 40 RBI and 19 walks in 66 games this season...among American League players with at least 60 percent of their games played in the outfield this season, Haniger ranks 1st in extra-base hits (32), T1st in HR (16), 5th in RBI (40), 3rd in runs (45), 6th in hits (67), 4th in doubles (15) and 5th in slugging percentage (.510).

VOTE NOW, VOTE OFTEN...Mariners fans can cast their all-star ballots at <https://www.mlb.com/all-star/ballot> until the voting period for Phase 1 concludes at 4:00 pm ET/1:00 pm PT on Thursday, June 24...on Sunday, June 27, the top three vote-getters at each position (and the top nine outfielders) in each league will be revealed at 12:00 p.m. (ET) on the 2021 Google MLB All-Star Ballot Finalists Show exclusively on MLB Network, and they will advance to the second phase of voting to determine who makes the All-Star teams and starts for each league.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Yusei Kikuchi** takes the mound for the Mariners tonight...the left-hander turned 30 years old yesterday...**AND YOU MIGHT KNOW...**that Yusei has a 2.70 ERA (15 ER, 50.0 IP) in his last 8 starts since April 29 with 31 hits allowed, 14 walks and 55 strikeouts...he has held opponents to a .175 batting average (31x177) in that span, a .236 on-base percentage, .339 slugging percentage and .575 OPS...Kikuchi has tossed a team-leading 9 quality starts this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Yusei has registered a quality start in 7 of his last 8 starts?...the 7 outings of at least 6.0 innings pitched with 3 or fewer earned runs are tied for 2nd-most in the American League in that span...Yusei is tied with Gerrit Cole-NYY, Kyle Gibson-TEX and Robbie Ray-TOR, with the quartet of starters trailing only Casey Mize-DET (8 QS since April 29) in that span.

ABOUT KIKUCHI...

- Yusei celebrated his 30th birthday yesterday on June 17.
- Left-hander is making his 13th start of the season, his 54th Major League start and his 1st career start vs. Tampa Bay.
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School.
- Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu Lions of Japan's Pacific League.
- In 7 seasons with Seibu, was 69-45 with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.

LAST OUTING...ND in last outing at Cleveland...tossed 7 scoreless innings allowing just 3 hits and 3 walks while striking out 6...left the game with a 4-0 lead before the bullpen allowed Cleveland to tie the game in the 9th.

THAT'S QUALITY...recorded a quality start in 6 consecutive outings from April 29 - May 30, marking the longest quality start streak of his career...left the game in the top of the 5th inning on June 5 at Los Angeles-AL...after getting hit by a line drive comebacker, ending the streak having tossed 4.0 innings while striking out 8 with 64 pitches (48 strikes).

W #1...had one of best starts of his career, tossing 7.0 shutout innings and allowing just 1 hit at HOU on April 29 in 1-0 SEA win...had a no-hitter thru 6 1/3 innings in notching his 1st W of season...allowed only a Correa opposite field double...tossed season-high 95 pitches.

SEASON OPENER...ND in 2021 debut on 4/2 vs. SF...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 3 ER on 6 hits 1 walk with a career-high tying 10 strikeouts...left the game with the score tied 3-3 after the 6th inning in 3-6 Mariners loss.

TAKKKKE A SEAT...set a career high with 11 strikeouts May 11 vs. Los Angeles-NL, while tossing 6.1 innings and allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits with 1 walk...first Mariners pitcher to record 11 strikeouts in a game since James Paxton did it on July 1, 2018 against Kansas City.

START ME UP...Yusei has made 53 career starts with Seattle in his 3-year Major League career...he is currently ranks 13th in starts as a Japanese-born pitcher in the Major Leagues...he trails Mac Suzuki (1996-2005), whose 67 starts are currently 12th-most...Hideo Nomo hold the record for a Japanese-born pitcher with 318 career MLB starts...Kikuchi's 53 starts trail Hisashi Iwakuma's 136 starts (2012-17) for most in Mariners club history.

(NO) THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT...since start of 2020 season, Kikuchi has the 8th-lowest run support average among all qualified AL starters (min. 75.0 IP)...he has received just 3.80 runs per game over that span...he has made 21 starts since beginning of 2020 season, and the Mariners scored 2 runs or less in 11 of them and 1 run or less in 7 games...6 runs of support Aug. 27, 2020 at SD was most runs of support he has received over this span.

2020 RECAP...went 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (27 ER, 47.0 IP) with 20 walks and 47 strikeouts in 9 starts during his second Major League season...tossed at least 6.0 innings in 4 starts, including 3 of his last 4 starts to end the season.

SMALL BALL...Kikuchi was 1 of 10 players in MLB to make 9-or-more starts and allow 3 or less home runs in 2020...the others include Justus Sheffield-SEA (10 GS, 2 HR), Max Fried-ATL (11 GS, 2 HR), Randy Dobnak-MIN (10 GS, 3 HR), Dallas Keuchel-CWS (11 GS, 2 HR), Brad Keller-KC (9 GS, 2 HR), Corbin Burnes-MIL (9 GS, 2 HR), Spencer Turnbull-DET (11 GS, 2 HR), Zack Wheeler-PHI (11 GS, 3 HR) and Steven Brault-PIT (10 GS, 2 HR).

HISTORIC DEBUT...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome.

COMPLETELY KIKUCHI... recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18, 2019 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elías, and Gil Meche).

WELCOME TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025...is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).

EARLY YEARS...the native of Morioka, Japan, pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School...helped lead his high school to a runner-up finish at the national high school invitational in April and to the semifinals in the national championship in August before being the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft...made his professional debut for Seibu's minor league team in 2011 and also pitched with Melbourne in the Australian Winter League that year.

JAPAN CAREER...was a 3-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2018)...in 2017, led the Pacific League in ERA (1.97) and wins (16)...posted a 69-45 mark with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) over 7 seasons with the Saitama Seibu Lions in Japan's Pacific League.
