**PITTSBURGH PIRATES (15-11) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (13-12)**  
**April 25, 2026 - American Family Field - Milwaukee, WI - 6:10 CDT - Game #27/Road #14**  
**RHP Mitch Keller (2-1, 2.79 ERA) vs. RHP Jacob Misiorowski (1-2, 3.04 ERA)**

**THE PIRATES:** have split the first four games of this six-game road trip after earning a 6-0 win on Friday night at Milwaukee (lost two of three games from April 21-23 at Texas)...Are in the second game of a stretch of 10 consecutive games against the National League Central (have gone 5-2 against the division so far this year)...Will play two more games at American Family Field before returning to PNC Park for a seven-game homestand vs. St. Louis (Monday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (May 1-3)...Are 14-8 in their last 22 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) following a 1-3 start to the season...Have not lost back-to-back games since dropping each of their first two games of the season from March 26-28 at New York (NL).

**CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE:** Pittsburgh would pick up its third straight series victory against the National League Central with a win tonight at Milwaukee (won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Cincinnati and won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago)...The Pirates have only won each of their first three series against the division in a season twice since the division formed in 1994...That also happened in 2014 (won two of three games from March 31-April 3 vs. Chicago, won two of three games from April 4-6 vs. St. Louis and won two of three games from April 8-10 at Chicago) and 2018 (won three of four games from April 5-8 vs. Cincinnati, won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago, swept a three-game series from April 27-29 vs. St. Louis and won two of three games from May 4-6 at Milwaukee)...Pittsburgh has gone 5-2 against the division to begin the season, with all seven games coming away from home (the Pirates went 7-19 in road games vs. the division in 2025).

**NEAR PERFECTION:** Paul Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on Friday at Milwaukee...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest bid for a perfect game by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes also became the sixth Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts, joining Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) and Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).

**ROAD WARRIORS:** Pittsburgh allowed two baserunners (one hit) in Friday's 6-0 win at Milwaukee...It was the Pirates' eighth road shutout with two or fewer baserunners allowed and one/zero hits in the Modern Era (since 1901), along with August 6, 1902 at New York, August 16, 1911 at Brooklyn, September 7, 1955 at Chicago, July 1, 1966 at New York, August 22, 1972 at San Francisco, August 3, 1990 at Philadelphia and May 27, 1991 at St. Louis.

**ROARING TWENTIES:** Konnor Griffin, who turned 20 years old on Friday, hit his first Major League home run as part of a three-hit, three-RBI performance (also stole a base) in the team's 6-0 win at Milwaukee...He joined Barry Bonds (25th birthday/July 24, 1989 vs. Los Angeles) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) with a home run and a stolen base on their birthday...He also became the third Major League player during the Modern Era (since 1901) to homer on his 20th birthday, along with Washington's Buddy Lewis on August 10, 1936 at New York and Pittsburgh's Aramis Ramirez on June 25, 1998 at Kansas City (Griffin was the only one among that group to have it be his first Major League home run)...Griffin also became one of only seven Major League players in the Modern Era with three hits (including a home run), three RBI and a stolen base on their birthday, the first since Arizona's Wellington Castillo did that in a 12-10, 13-inning defeat on April 24, 2016 vs. Pittsburgh (was his 29th birthday).

**ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY**

April 25, 2012: Pedro Álvarez homered in both games of Pittsburgh's doubleheader split against Colorado at PNC Park, becoming only the second Pittsburgh player in the last 22 seasons to hit home runs in both games of a Pirates doubleheader. The only other player to do it to that point (1991 to date) was Rob Mackowiak, who did that in both games of a doubleheader on May 28, 2004 vs. Chicago (NL).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Keller won a 6-3 decision after allowing two runs on five hits (zero walks) and striking out five batters over 7.0 innings of work on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay.

**AGAINST THE BREWERS:** Keller is 1-7 with a 5.31 ERA (62.2ip/37er) and 69 strikeouts in 12 career starts against Milwaukee...He has lost three straight decisions since earning his lone win w/6.0 shutout innings on May 13, 2024 at American Family Field.

**K IS FOR KELLER:** Keller enters tonight's start six strikeouts shy of passing Deacon Phillippe (861) for ninth place on Pittsburgh's all-time strikeouts list...He surpassed Rick Rhoden (852) for 10th place on the list in his last start on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay.

**HITTING THE ROAD:** Keller has made four straight starts at PNC Park since allowing three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings in his season debut on March 28 at New York (NL)...He earned his last road win last season on August 25 at St. Louis' Busch Stadium.

**CENTRAL PARKED:** Keller's 61 starts against the National League Central since the start of 2019 (his debut season) rank fifth among all Major League pitchers, trailing only Miles Mikolas (73), Kyle Hendricks (65), Sonny Gray (63) and Freddy Peralta (63).

**RIGHT PLACE, RIGHT TIME:** Keller has limited right-handed hitters to a .133 batting average against (6-for-45) and a .321 OPS...The last extra-base hit he allowed to a righthander came last year on September 12 at Washington (homer by Brady House).

**SIX PACK:** Keller pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season (March 28 at New York-NL, April 3 vs. Baltimore, April 8 vs. San Diego)...He was the first Pirate to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove (April 5-16, 2019).

**LIMIT THE LONG BALL:** Keller did not allow a home run in his first three starts of the season, marking his first streak of at least three straight starts without a home run since last season from May 19-30...The streak ended in his start on April 14 vs. Washington, when he allowed a two-out, solo homer to CJ Abrams in the third inning.

**CONSISTENT KELLER:** Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his start on April 8 vs. San Diego, marking his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by a Pittsburgh pitcher in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Bob Friend, who ranks first among those pitchers, made 37 such starts from 1951-65.

**THE OPENING ACT:** Keller started Pittsburgh's Home Opener for the second straight season after also doing so last season on April 4 vs. New York (AL)...Keller, who earned the win after allowing two runs in 6.0 innings on April 3 vs. Baltimore, was the first Pirates pitcher to start back-to-back Home Openers since Zach Duke in 2009 and 2010.

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half...Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.
