Trades

Atlanta completed a pair of trades yesterday, first acquiring a player to be named later or cash considerations from the Los Angeles Angels in exchange for Luis Guillorme, before getting INF Zack Short from Boston in exchange for cash later in the day.

Short reported today and is active for tonight's game. He will wear No. 59.

He opened this season here in Queens with the Mets, and batted .111/.273/.111 in nine at-bats. In four major league seasons with the Tigers (2021-23), Mets and Red Sox, he is a career .169/.262/.299 batter with 13 homers in 189 games.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets tonight open a three-game weekend series with what is the fourth of 13 total games between the teams this season... The two next meet for a four-game set back here at Citi Field, July 25-28.

A New York was the first team to take a series from Atlanta this season, winning two-of-three games at Truist Park, April 8-11...The Braves' 16-4 defeat in the rubber game is their largest loss this season.

A Atlanta went 10-3 in 13 games with New York last season, a .769 winning percentage...Since the Mets were founded in 1962, the best single-season winning percentage the Braves have logged against New York is .778, going 14-4 in 18 games with the Mets in both 1964 and 1966.

A The Braves have won 17 of the last 23 games with New York dating to the 2022 season, outscoring the Mets 155-102 (+53) over the stretch.

A The Braves have taken the season series from their N.L. East rivals for six consecutive seasons...Prior to last year's 10-3 mark, they went 10-9 in both 2022 & 2021, 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...Since the start of the 2018 season, Atlanta is 62-40 (.608) against New York overall.

A Atlanta went 5-2 against New York here at Citi Field last season, including a 21-3 victory in the first game of a doubleheader here, August 12.

A RH Charlie Morton is set for his 24th career appearance against New York and his 23rd start... The 6-foot-5, 215-pound right-hander is 6-6 with a 3.71 ERA (51 ER/123.2 IP) in his career versus New York, including one start earlier this season... The New Jersey native allowed five hits and four runs over 5.2 innings in a no-decision, April 8.

A LH Jose Quintana has made nine career starts against Atlanta, compiling a 3-5 record with a 6.55 ERA (33 ER/45.1 IP)... The 6-foot-1, 220-pound Colombian beat the Braves earlier this season, April 11, and allowed five hits and three runs in 5.1 innings...The win was his first versus Atlanta since 2018 and snapped a streak of five consecutive losses to the Braves.

WIN: Atlanta completed a two-game sweep of Boston on Wednesday night, beating the Red Sox, 5-0...The victory marked the Braves' first back-to-back wins since taking four straight, April 22-26.

A Atlanta improved to a major league-best 13-4 (.765) at home this season...Last year's club went 52-29 (.642) at home - good for the third-best record in the majors, behind Los Angeles-NL (53-28, .654) and Tampa Bay (53-28, .654)...The Braves enter play tonight just 9-8 away from Truist Park this season.

A LH Chris Sale made his first start versus Boston since being acquired by Atlanta in a trade with the Red Sox last December, and pitched 6.0 shutout innings with a season-most 10 strikeouts.

MARCELL OZUNA: Opened the scoring with a three-run home run in the first inning on Wednesday night, and followed with a solo home run in his next at-bat...Ozuna's 12 home runs and 38 RBI are both most in the majors.

A The effort marked his 20th career multi-homer game and his second this season...He also did so on April 2 at Chicago (AL)...He is one of four players with multiple multi-homer games this season, along with Houston's Yordan Álvarez, Minnesota's Edouard Julien and Houston's Kyle Tucker.

A His first-inning shot traveled 372 feet to right field...Since the start of last season, his 11 opposite field home runs are bested only by New York's (AL) Aaron Judge, Seattle's Julio Rodríguez and Texas' Adolis García, each with 12.

A Since RBI became official in 1920, his major league-leading 38 RBI are the second-most by a Brave through the club's first 34 games in a season, behind only Hall-of-Famer Henry Aaron (39, 1959).

A Over that same span, he is the 23rd player, 27th instance league-wide, with as many home runs (12) and RBI (38) through their club's first 34 games in a season...Chicago's (NL) Cody Bellinger, then with the Dodgers (2019), is the only other active player to do so.

A Of the 22 retired players, 10 are enshrined in the National Baseball Hall of Fame: Babe Ruth, who did so three times (1921, '26, '30), Jimmy Foxx, twice (1932, '40), Chuck Klein (1930), Roy Campanella (1953), Stan Musial (1954), Henry Aaron (1959), Al Kaline (1962), Willie Mays (1964) Ken Griffey Jr. (1997) and Todd Helton (2000).

PITCHING: Three Atlanta pitchers - Chris Sale, Dylan Lee and Ray Kerr - combined to hold Boston to just seven hits in the shutout on Wednesday...The effort was the Braves' fourth shutout of the season.

A Atlanta also pitched scoreless games on April 1 at Chicago (AL) and April 22-23 vs. Miami...Boston (6) and Philadelphia (5) are the only clubs with more shutouts this season.

A In the Braves' last 23 games dating to April 12, their 2.89 ERA (67 ER/208.1 IP) is third best in baseball behind just the Mariners (2.54) and Dodgers (2.67).

A Atlanta's starting staff since that date has pitched to a 3.06 ERA, while the bullpen owns a 2.57 mark... Both are top five in the NL.

MICHAEL HARRIS II: Went 0-for-4 Wednesday night and is hitless in his last 25 at-bats, dating to a second-inning single on April 30 at Seattle...It is the longest skid of his career.

A The skid spans his last six games, matching the longest drought of his career...He also went six games without a hit last May.

A The run has dropped his average by 49 points, from .304 after play on April 30 to .255 entering tonight.

Today's Game

- A Making his seventh start of the season and second against New York (NL) this year.
 - A Allowed four runs in 5.2 innings pitched in his last start against the Mets in Atlanta.
 - A Has now pitched three consecutive quality starts; sporting a 1.89 ERA in that span.
 - A Suffered the loss in his last start against Los Angeles (NL) after allowing two runs over 6.0 frames.
 - A At 40 years, 167 days-old in his start against Cleveland on April 17, became the fifth Braves pitcher over the age of 40, in the Atlanta-era (since 1966), to toss at least 7.0 scoreless frames, joining Hall-of-Famers Phil Niekro (11x) and John Smoltz (3x), along with Dennis Martínez and R.A. Dickey.
 - A His 165 quality starts are the sixth most among active pitchers...trails teammate Chris Sale who ranks fifth with 173.
 - A His 1996.1 innings pitched are the fourth most among active pitchers.
 - A Trails only Justin Verlander, Max Scherzer and Clayton Kershaw.
 - A Struckout Wyatt Langford to reach 1,900 on his career.
 - A Morton's 1,1913 strikeout are the eighth most among active players.
 - A Teammate Chris Sale ranks fourth with 2,241.
 - A Throwing his curveball on 43.1% of pitches; the highest rate in the majors among qualified starters.
 - A Morton has struck out 415 hitters with his curveball since the beginning of the 2020; the most in the majors.
 - A Morton has recorded 637 strikeouts since joining Atlanta's staff in 2021, the seventh most in baseball.
 - A His rate of 10.29 strikeouts per nine innings is also the seventh highest in the majors during that span among qualified pitchers.
 - A Morton became the 13th player in franchise history to start a game at age 40 or older.
 - A Prior to Morton, the last Braves pitcher to start a game over the age of 40 was R.A. Dickey in 2017.
 - A Six of the 12 other pitchers have been selected into the Hall of Fame (Tom Glavine, Phil Niekro, Gaylord Perry, John Smoltz, Warren Spahn and Cy Young).
 - A Morton and Chris Sale become the first pair of teammates to have each made an Opening Day start and record the last out of a World Series since Hall-of-Famer Dennis Eckersley and Cy Young award-winner Bret Saberhagen with Boston in 1998. (Research courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau)
 - A Morton was the Opening Day starter for Tampa Bay in 2020 and induced a groundout from Corey Seager for the final out in Game 7 of the 2017 World Series with Houston.
 - A Sale was the Opening Day starter for the Red Sox (2018-'19) and the White Sox (2013, '14 & '16)...He struck out Manny Machado in Game 5 as the final out of the 2018 Fall Classic with Boston.
- #### 2023 Recap
- A Started 30 games in his 16th major league season and pitched to a 3.64 ERA (66 ER/163.1 IP) while going 14-12 with 183 strikeouts.
 - A His 14 wins were tied for fifth most in the National League.
 - A Since 2019, Morton's teams have won 79 of his starts; tied for fifth most in the majors during that span...Trailing teammate Max Fried who has 81.
 - A Became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to start at least 30 games at age 39 or older, joining Hall-of-Famers Warren Spahn, Phil Niekro, and John Smoltz as well as R.A. Dickey.
 - A This past season season marked the fifth time in Morton's career in which he made at least 30 starts.
 - A Since 2018, Morton's 166 games started were tied for the seventh most in the majors.
 - A Is one of 20 pitchers in major league history to start at least 30 games in each season between the ages of 37 and 39.
 - A Morton has recorded at least 30 starts in five seasons dating to 2018, the most in the majors among active pitchers over the age of 34.
 - A Justin Verlander ranks second with three such seasons while Yu Darvish, Zack Greinke and Kyle Gibson are tied for third with two each.
 - A His 32% swing and miss rate finished fourth highest among qualifiers in MLB.
 - A Teammate Spencer Strider led the league with a rate of 38.6%
 - A Joined Hall-of-Famers Warren Spahn and Phil Niekro as the only pitchers age 39 or older with at least two separate streaks of four or more consecutive games won in franchise history.
 - A Struck out 10 New York (AL) hitters through 6.0 scoreless frames on August 16.
 - A At age 39 years and 277 days old, Morton joined Hall-of-Famers Phil Niekro

- A Went 4-1 with a 1.91 ERA in the month of August.
 - A The ERA was the second lowest in the majors and the four wins were tied for the third most in MLB for the month.
 - A His 1.91 ERA was a career low in the month of August for Morton.
- A Recorded 10 and 11 strikeouts in consecutive outings on August 16 & 23.
 - A Became the 20th player in major league history (live ball era) at age 39 or older to strikeout 10 or more hitters in consecutive games and first since Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz in 2008.
- A Morton was placed on the 15-day injured list on September 24 (retro to September 23) with right index finger inflammation.

Career Recap

- A A 16-year major league veteran, he has compiled a 132-113 record and a 3.99 ERA across 358 games, 357 starts...Has fanned 1,908 and pitched three shutouts.
 - A Has pitched for Atlanta (2008, '21-23), Pittsburgh (2009-15), Philadelphia (2016), Houston (2017-18) and Tampa Bay (2019-20).
 - A Is a two-time All-Star (2018 & 2019) and won the 2017 World Series while with Houston and 2021 World Series with Atlanta.

- Has yet to allow a barreled ball this season.
- Opponents are hitting ground balls off him 59.5% of the time (league average 43.6%).
- Has pitched to a 1.59 ERA (1 ER/5.2 IP) at Truist Park, compared to a 7.11 ERA (5 ER/6.1 IP) on the road.
- 2024 marks his eighth different MLB season...Pitched for the Chicago White Sox from 2017-'23.
- Made his Braves debut on March 29 at Philadelphia, giving up a run while striking out a pair of Phillies.
- Was acquired by Atlanta from Chicago on November 16, 2023, in exchange for INF Braden Shewmake, LHP Jared Shuster, INF Nicky Lopez, RHP Michael Soroka and minor-league RHP Riley Gowens.

Jesse Chavez • RHP • 6-1 • 175 • 40 yrs • #60

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 10/4 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 5/1

- Needs 10 more strikeouts to reach 1,000...Among active primary relievers, his 990 strikeouts rank fifth behind Craig Kimbrel (1,213), Kenley Jansen (1,173), Aroldis Chapman (1,170) and David Robertson (1,082).
- With RISP, opposing batters are hitting just .118 (2-for-17) off him.
- His hard-hit percentage (30.0%) ranks in the 89th percentile.
- Right-handed hitters are batting just .176 (5-for-34) off him this season.
- From 2021-present, owns a 2.14 ERA (32 ER/134.2 IP) as a Brave...With other clubs during that period (TEX, CHC, LAA), has pitched to a 7.02 ERA (26 ER/33.1 IP).
- On March 30 was credited with his 50th career win (50-63)...Eleven of those wins have come with Atlanta, second-most of any of his major league clubs (Oakland, 17).
- Last season, missed 82 games due to a left shin contusion he sustained on June 14 at Detroit...Was hit by a 99.6 mph grounder off the bat of Miguel Cabrera.
- At the time of his injury, Chavez' 1.69 ERA (5 ER/26.2 IP) in relief ranked fourth in the majors (min. 30 games)... Only Felix Bautista (BAL, 1.16), Carlos Estévez (LAA, 1.50) and Tim Lincecum (TOR, 1.54) had better marks... Season-long, among pitchers with at least 30 outings, Chavez' ERA (1.56) ranked eighth in the majors.
- Last season, his first 10 outings were scoreless for the first time in his 16-season career.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 34 yrs • #26

Saves/Opp: 9/11 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 15/10 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/0

- Has yet to allow a barreled ball this season.
- From April 6-22, logged saves in seven consecutive outings, the longest streak of his career without a decision/no-decision in between.
- Ranks fourth in the National League and for sixth in the majors with seven saves.
- Was named National League Reliever of the month for August 2023 after he pitched 13 scoreless appearances within the month...In 13.0 innings, struck out 17, walked four and allowed only seven hits.
- His 190 career saves rank fifth among active players...Kenley Jansen (421), Craig Kimbrel (417), Aroldis Chapman (321) and Edwin Díaz (205) are the only active pitchers with more.
- Since 2017, his 413 appearances rank fourth in the majors.

Joe Jiménez • RHP • 6-3 • 277 • 29 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 15/11 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/0

- Owns the best Expected ERA in the National League and the second-best in MLB (1.19)...Only Mason Miller (OAK, 0.76) ranks higher...His xERA ranks in the 100th percentile.
- Right-handed batters are hitting just .091 (3-for-33) off him.
- His eight holds rank fifth in the National League and are tied for eighth in Major League Baseball.
- On April 27 faced six batters in the eighth inning and surrendered two earned runs ...Every Cleveland hitter put the ball in play, but those six batted balls averaged 56.3 mph in exit velocity and 53.1 feet of distance.
- On November 2, 2023, agreed to a three-year contract worth \$26 million to remain with Atlanta through 2026.
- From May 20-August 28, held opponents homerless over 33 games and 32.2 innings...At the time, was the sixth-longest active streak in Major League Baseball...Pitched to a 1.65 ERA in that span, with 42 strikeouts against 10 walks.
- His Whiff Rate (32.2%), Strikeout Rate (30.7%) and Walk Rate (5.9%) each ranked in the top 15% of pitchers in 2023.

Ray Kerr • LHP • 6-3 • 185 • 29 yrs • #58

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 1/1 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- On May 8, made his Braves debut, tossing a scoreless ninth inning with a strikeout...Fastball reached 98.1 mph.
- Has pitched nine games with Triple-A Gwinnett this season, going 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (7 ER/14.0 IP)...Has 22 total strikeouts...His 14.14 K/9 ranked ninth in the International League at the time of his call-up (min. 9 games).
- With Gwinnett, opposing batters are hitting just .083 (2-for-24) off his curveball.
- Arsenal includes the fastball (51%), curveball (42%) and a rare changeup (7%).
- On December 15, 2023, was acquired along with DH Matt Carpenter and cash considerations from the San Diego Padres in exchange for minor-league OF Drew Campbell.
