THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs selected LHP Brandon Hughes today from Triple-A Reno, transferred LHP Kyle Nelson (left shoulder inflammation) to the 60-day injured list and optioned LHP Tommy Henry following last night's game.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost 8-4 vs. Dodgers last night. - Ketel Marte went 2-for-5 with a double.

- Blaze Alexander collected 3 walks as leadoff.

VS. DODGERS: The D-backs are facing the Dodgers for the first time since sweeping them in the NLDS, with an 11-2 win in Game 1 @ Dodger Stadium and a 4-2 win in Game 2, followed by a 4-2 win in Game 3 at Chase Field. - The D-backs were 5-8 vs. Dodgers last season, going $5-3$ in the first 8 games before dropping the last 5 straight (August 8-30).

- The D-backs split 3-3 at home last season, their fourth season since 2017 with a winning or $.500+$ home record vs. Dodgers (also: 2017, '18, '19).

SNAKES AMONG NL LEADERS: Lourdes Gurriel Jr., among NL leaders, is tied for fourth with 22 RBI, Ketel Marte is tied for third with 10 doubles, tied for fifth with 15 extra-base hits, sixth with 62 total bases, tied for sixth with 37 hits, tied for seventh with 23 runs and 10th with a . 311 average, while Christian Walker is tied for fifth with 20 walks and ninth with 22 runs.

WALKER'S STREAKS: Christian Walker is currently riding a 7 -game on-base streak...he is batting .304 (7-for23)/1.009 OPS with 1 double, 2 homers, 6 RBI and 5 walks in the span.

- Defensively, Walker boasts a 30-game errorless streak this season, tied for the second-longest (also: 3 others), behind Teoscar Hernández/LAD (31).

DEFENSE RULES: Christian Walker's 7 errors since 2022 in 332 games (2862.1 innings) are tied for the third fewest among all infielders (also: Freddie Freeman/LAD in 351 G), behind Paul Goldschmidt/STL (3) in 288 G and Ty France/SEA (5) in 314 G.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 14 games this season with $1+$ runs scored in the first inning is second most in the Majors while the Dodgers and Phillies have the most with 15 ...the D-backs are 7-7 (.500) in games where they score $1+$ runs in the opening frame.
-The D-backs have scored $2+$ runs in the first inning in 8 games this season, the second most behind the Phillies ( 11 G ).
$\rightarrow$ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 1 run 6 times, 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 29 runs with a 357 average ( 46 -for-129)/1.039 OPS and 11 doubles, 8 home runs and 11 walks.

COME ONE, COME ALL: The 449,750 total home attendance thru the first 14 home games is the largest since 2004 $(473,148)$ and sixth largest all-time in the span.

GOLDEN BACKSTOPS: D-back backstops' 6 stolen bases allowed and 12 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

- Gabriel Moreno's 55.6 caught-stealing pct. (5-for-9) leads the Majors and Tucker Barnhart's 33.3 pct. (1-for-3) is tied for 10th.
- Moreno leads active catchers with a 41.0 caught-stealing pct. (34-for83 ) and Tucker Barnhart is 11th with a 30.8 CS pct. (171-for-556).
