## Nine Straight

The Braves have lost nine consecutive playoff rounds, dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona.

That streak is the second longest in MLB history.

The Braves last won a playoff round in 2001, sweeping Houston in the NLDS.

Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998.

**THE POSTSEASON:** This series will be the Braves' 36th postseason matchup in franchise history...The Braves lost in the NLDS last season to the Los Angeles Dodgers, 3-1...They are 79-89 (.470) all-time in the postseason, despite having outscored the opposition 665-645 (+20 run differential).

The Braves have played in 14 division series (6-8), 11 league championship series (5-6), nine World Series (3-6) and one wild card game (0-1).

**GAME 1:** The Braves are set to play their 35th Game 1 of a playoff round tonight (that total does not include a wild card game loss in 2012), and are 15-19 in these games...They have also lost eight consecutive series openers in the postseason; they last won a Game 1 in 2001 when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

The Braves are 11-4 in series when they win Game 1 and 3-16 when they drop the opener.

They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games...They last lost a series when winning the opener in 1996, when they won the first two games of the World Series at Yankee Stadium, before dropping the next four.

They last won a Game 1 home game in the 1999 LCS, beating New York, 4-2...They are 0-6 in Game 1 home games since that win.

**AT HOME:** The Braves went 50-31 at SunTrust Park this season, winning 50 home games in a season for the first time since 2013, when that club went 56-25 at Turner Field to tie the single-season record for most home wins.

The club also won 56 home games in 1996, 1998 and 1999.

The Braves finished the season winning 16 of their last 20 games at SunTrust Park, outscoring the opposition 103-65.

**ROSTER:** The Braves postseason roster features 11 pitchers and 14 position players – three catchers, five infielders and six outfielders... Seventeen players on Atlanta's roster have previous postseason experience, including eight who were on the Braves NLDS roster against Los Angeles (NL) last season – OF Ronald Acuña Jr., INF Ozzie Albies, C Tyler Flowers, RHP Mike Foltynewicz, INF Freddie Freeman, LHP Max Fried, OF Nick Markakis and LHP Sean Newcomb.

Thirteen of the 25 players were on the club's Opening Day roster, with only four of those on the pitching staff (LHP Max Fried, RHP Luke Jackson, LHP Sean Newcomb and RHP Josh Tomlin).

None of the Braves first three scheduled starters this series were in the club's rotation to begin the season...LHP Dallas Keuchel was a free agent while RHP Mike Foltynewicz was on the injured list and RHP Mike Soroka was with Triple-A Gwinnett.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Cardinals open their National League Division Series tonight with Game 1 at SunTrust Park...The clubs met six times in the regular season, with the Braves winning four of the games while outscoring St. Louis, 29-27.

The clubs have met four times previous in the postseason, with the Cardinals winning three of the matchups...St. Louis swept the 1982 LCS from Atlanta, before the Braves took the 1996 LCS in seven games...The Cardinals then swept the NLDS in 2000, before winning the 2012 Wildcard Game.

In all, the Braves have lost 10 of 14 postseason games with St. Louis, including each of the last four.

The Braves won both of the series with the Cardinals this season, taking two-of-three here in Atlanta, May 14-16, before winning another two-of-three at Busch Stadium, May 24-26.

LHP Dallas Keuchel is set to make his 11th career postseason appearance and 10th start...The lefty made two starts in last year's postseason as the Astros advanced to the ALCS...He went 5.0 innings in both of his starts, not receiving a decision...Overall, Keuchel is 4-2 with a 3.31 ERA (19 ER/51.2 IP) in the playoffs.

RHP Miles Mikolas is set for his postseason debut tonight...The righty is 1-2 with a 2.61 ERA (6 ER/20.2 IP) in four career games, three starts, against the Braves...All three of his starts against Atlanta came after Mikolas joined the Cardinals, and he lost his only start against them this season...He went 7.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, in a 5-2 loss at Busch Stadium on May 24.

**19 IN '19:** The Braves clinched the 19th division title in franchise history this season, beating San Francisco, 6-0 on September 20 at SunTrust Park to win the National League East...The 19 division titles are tied for the most in major league history with New York (AL)...This season also marks the franchise's 25th postseason berth in the modern era and its second straight.

The Braves won a major league-record 14 consecutive division titles from 1991-2005, with the first three coming as NL West champs before moving into the NL East in the strike-shortened 1994 season...They also won the West in 1969 and 1982, and the East in 2013 and last season.

The Braves became the second National League team to clinch a playoff berth this season and the third division winner in baseball...Los Angeles won the NL West, while New York took the AL East prior to the Braves.

The Braves clinched the title in game No. 155 with starter Mike Foltynewicz earning the win...The Braves won the 2018 NL East title in game No. 155 with starter Mike Foltynewicz collecting the win.

The Braves have now clinched their last three division titles in game No. 155...They also took the East in 2013 155 games into the season..

#### Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 10th career postseason start, and his 11th career appearance in the playoffs.
- A* Is 4-2 with a 3.31 ERA (19 ER/51.2 IP) in his postseason career...His teams are 6-4 in his postseason appearances.
- A* Keuchel's nine career playoff starts are more than the rest of Atlanta's postseason roster combined...Josh Tomlin (4 starts), Mike Foltynewicz (2) and Sean Newcomb (1) are the only other Braves pitchers to start a playoff game.
- A* Keuchel in unbeaten in three career starts in the Division Series, going 2-0 with a 2.04 ERA (4 ER/17.2 IP)...Started Game 3 of the 2018 ALDS for Houston, allowing four hits and two runs over 5.0 innings in an 11-3 win at Cleveland.
- A* In 19 starts for Atlanta during the 2019 regular season, went 8-8 with a 3.75 ERA (47 ER/112.2 IP).
- A* Lost each of his last three starts dating to September 17, pitching to a 6.19 ERA (11 ER/16.0 IP).
- A* Lost three straight starts for the first time since 2016...The three losses this season came after he won five consecutive starts, August 20 to September 11, for the first time in his career.
- A* Despite his three-game losing streak, has pitched to a 2.55 ERA (15 ER/53.0 IP) over his last nine starts...His ERA during the stretch, from August 14 through the end of the season, was eighth lowest in the National League.
- A* Allowed opponents to bat .265 (115-for-434) against him on the season, with a .338 on-base percentage and .426 slugging.
- A* With runners in scoring position, held opponents to a .177/.307/.333 line, with 17 hits in 96 at-bats...Opponents are batting .110 points lower with runners in scoring position than they are with no one on base (.287, 68-for-237).
- A* In 47 opponent at-bats with runners in scoring position and two outs, allowed just eight hits (.170) and 10 RBI.
- A* From his season debut on June 21 through the end of the season, Keuchel induced 208 ground balls, easily most in the majors...He led the majors in both ground ball percentage (61.0) and ground ball/fly ball ratio (3.65) since his debut.
- A* Oakland's Brett Anderson ranked second in the majors with 174 ground balls in that span.
- A* Keuchel had 16 grounded into double plays on the season, most in the National League since he debuted.

#### 2019 Recap

- A* Lost, 9/17 vs. PHI, to stop a streak of five consecutive starts in which he won.
- A* Allowed just four earned runs during the stretch, pitching to a 1.16 ERA (4 ER/31.0 IP)...Struck out 28 in 31 innings.
- A* Won five consecutive starts for the first time in his career...Had previously won four straight on five occasions, last in 2018...No Braves starter has won six straight turns since Kris Medlen in 2012, and no Atlanta lefty has done so since Mike Hampton in 2003.
- A* Started, 8/20 vs. MIA, and allowed six hits and one run over 6.0 innings to earn his fourth win of the season.
- A* Struck out opposing pitcher Elieser Hernandez leading off the third inning for the 1,000th strikeout of his major league career.
- A* Started, 7/23 vs. KC, and logged his sixth career double-digit strikeout game...Fanned 12 Royals over 6.0 innings, one off his career high.
- A* The last Atlanta pitcher to fan more batters in a single start was Kris Medlen, who struck out 13 Nationals over 7.0 innings on September 14, 2012.
- A* Beat the Padres on 7/12, allowing just six hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
- A* Earned the win in Atlanta's final start before the All-Star break, 7/7 vs. MIA, and in Atlanta's first game after the break, 7/12 at SD...Became the third Braves pitcher to start and win consecutive regular season games for the Braves in the modern era (since 1900) and the first since Johnny Sain on 9/6 and 9/11/48.
- A* Pitched at least 7.0 innings in each his three starts from 7/2-12, going 2-1 with a 2.11 ERA (5 ER/21.1 IP) in that span.
- A* Was the first Atlanta starter to pitch at least 7.0 innings in three consecutive turns since 2017, when Jaime García did so from 5/31 to 6/11.
- A* Signed by the Braves to a one-year major league contract on 6/7...Was recalled to Atlanta on 6/21.
- A* Became the first former Cy Young winner to join Atlanta midseason since the Braves acquired reliever Mark Davis from the Kansas City Royals in 1992.

#### Career Recap

- A* Selected by the Houston Astros in the seventh round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft...Signed by Jim Stevenson.
- A* Is a four-time Rawlings Gold Glove Award winner (2014-16, 18), two-time American League All-Star (2015, 2017) and the 2015 AL Cy Young Award winner. Has pitched in parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues (2012-18).
