

ROAD TRIPPIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals continue a six-game, seven-day road trip to Pittsburgh (2-1) and Colorado (0-2) with final game of a three-game series vs. the Rockies at Coors Field...this is the Cardinals second to last road trip of the season with a seven-gamer at Chicago (Sept. 19-22) and Arizona (Sept. 23-25) coming up...the Cardinals enter today in first place in the National League Central, 4.0 games ahead of the Chicago Cubs (at San Diego) and Milwaukee Brewers (at Miami), both tied for second place.

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals lost 2-1 to the Colorado Rockies for the second straight game, the second time in Cardinals history they scored only one run or less on consecutive days at Coors Field (July 24-25, 2006; 1-1 record). **Dakota Hudson** took the loss despite a quality start pitching 6.0 innings allowing two runs on four hits with five walks and seven strikeouts. **Paul Goldschmidt** knocked in **Dexter Fowler** for the Cardinals lone run for the second day in a row.

THREE'S COMPANY: The back-to-back 2-1 losses mark the 5th and 6th games out of 106 games played between the Cardinals at Rockies in the Mile High City in which three runs or less were scored. Of the six games, the Cardinals have two wins; a 1-0 win on July 25, 2006 behind the pitching of **Chris Carpenter** and a 3-0 win on May 27, 2017 behind **Adam Wainwright**. The Rockies won all four of theirs by 2-1 decisions.

HOME SWEET HOME VS. WILD, WILD WEST: The Cardinals have played 29 games (16-13) vs. N.L. West opponents with four to play on the road including one at Colorado today and their final road trip to Arizona (Sept. 23-25). At Busch Stadium, the Cardinals decimated their Western opponents with a 14-4 (.778) record outscoring them 101-54; including four-game sweeps against Los Angeles (Apr. 8-11) and Colorado (Aug. 22-25). On the road, the Cardinals are 2-9 against their Western rivals, losing their last seven straight, and being held to two runs or less in 8 of the 11 games and one run or less in their last six.

UPCOMING CHALLENGE: This afternoon's game marks the final game on the Cardinals schedule against a team with a sub-.500 record. The final 16 games on the Cardinals season starting on Friday will be played against teams with current winning records totaling a .533 winning percentage.

STARTER GUNS: The Cardinals starting pitchers have not allowed more than two runs in a start over their last nine games since September 2, posting an 1.02 ERA over those starts (53.0 IP, 6 ER). This includes five scoreless efforts and 23.0 scoreless innings during a four-game series with the San Francisco Giants. The Cardinals team ERA is 2.63 in September, the lowest in the National League.

GOLDI-ROCKS: Despite moving to a new division, **Paul Goldschmidt** hasn't forgot how to hit his old rivals. In six games this season against Colorado, Goldschmidt is batting .391 (9-23) with a home run and five RBI. Goldschmidt is the active leader against the Rockies in RBI (105), doubles (46) and extra base hits (69), while ranking second in home runs (24; Buster Posey, 25). He has hit safely in 11 of his last 12 games at Coors Field (18-44, .409, 5 HR, 13 RBI) with a pair of multi-home run games (6/8 & 6/9/2018).

NO SHORT CHANGE: With his 30th double of the season last night, **Paul DeJong** became the first Cardinals shortstop to hit 30 doubles in a season since **Jhonny Peralta** swatted 38 in 2014. The extra base hit was his 57th, T-5th among Cardinals shortstops with **Solly Hemus** (1953) and four behind **Edgar Renteria's** club record of 61 in 2003.

TIME TO FLY: Since a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL on Aug. 3-7, the Cardinals are 23-9, holding the most wins in Major League Baseball over that period while boasting a league best 2.85 ERA.

SECOND HALF SHILDT: Since taking over the reigns as manager last July, no manager in MLB has more wins Post All-Star Break than **Mike Shildt** (77) and holds the highest winning percentage among National League managers (.616). See chart above

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Dexter Fowler played first six seasons with the Rockies (2008-13)...originally selected by Colorado in the 14th round of the 2004 MLB Draft...is the Rockies franchise record holder in career triples (53)...traded by Colorado with cash to Houston for **Brandon Barnes** and **Jordan Lyles** (Dec. 3, 2013).

Marcell Ozuna's cousin, **Pablo Ozuna**, played in 17 games for the Rockies in 2003.

Paul DeJong made his MLB debut at Colorado (May 28, 2017)...became the 9th Cardinal in history to homer in his first MLB at-bat, a pinch-hit 9th inning solo home run off **Greg Holland**.

Harrison Bader (July 25, 2017 at Busch Stadium) and **John Brebbia** (May 28, 2017 at Coors Field) both made their MLB debuts against the Rockies.

Matt Wieters (junior) and **Charlie Blackmon** (medical redshirt-tendinitis in throwing arm) were teammates at Georgia Tech Univ. in 2007.

Cardinals Asst. GM & Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Andrew Miller and **Bryan Shaw** were teammates on the 2016 AL Champion Cleveland Indians.

Rockies manager **Bud Black** previously managed **Miles Mikolas** (2012-13) while in San Diego, where he made his MLB debut under Black.

Tim Melville graduated from Wentzville Holt High School, where he was the Aflac National Player of the Year as a junior.

Dom Nuñez and Cardinals 2016 1st rounder **Dylan Carlson** were teammates at Elk Grove (Calif.) High School in 2013.

Rockies bullpen coach **Darren Holmes** pitched in five games for St. Louis during the 2000 season.

MLB.com Cardinals reporter **Anne Rogers** previously worked as a Rockies Associate Reporter under **Thomas Harding** in 2018.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **John Mozeliak** began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Sr. Special Asst. to the GM **Bob Gebhard** served as the Rockies' first GM (1991-99)...hired **John Mozeliak** in 1993...worked as a special assistant to former Cardinals General Manager **Walt Jocketty** in St. Louis after leaving the Rockies in 1999...resides in nearby Centennial, Colo.

TODAY'S GAME

- Makes his team-leading 30th start of the season (72nd career start) and 99th career appearance, as he faces the Rockies for the 2nd time this season.
- Will become the first Cardinals pitcher age 30+ to start 30 or more games in consecutive seasons since Adam Wainwright did so in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14.
- Had his team-record streak of having walked two or fewer batters in 43 straight starts dating back to July 4, 2018 broken last Fri. (9/6) at PIT. The streak surpassed the Cardinals previous best of 39 games by Curt Davis (July 3, 1938-Sept. 3, 1939).
- The 43 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer was the longest streak in MLB since 2017 when Clayton Kershaw (47) and Andy Sonnanstine (45) each ran streaks of 40+ dating back to the 2015 season.
- Has induced eight grounded into double plays post All-Star break, T3rd in the N.L. and currently ranks 4th in the N.L. this season with 19 (D. Hudson is 3rd with 20).
- Has walked one or fewer in 21 of his 29 starts, including no walks in 10 outings.
- The Cardinals sport a 38-22 record (.633 win pct.) in his games pitched since 2018. Since July 4, 2018, St. Louis is 28-16 (.636) in his games started.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitched 5.0 innings allowing one run in a no decision the Cardinals eventually lost 9-4. Had his 43-start streak of two walks or less snapped surrendering four walks matching his career high. Has not allowed more than four hits in each of his last three starts.

- Struck out a career-high 10 batters in his 6-3 win at MIL on 8/27.
- Hurlled an eight-hit shutout vs. PIT (7/15), walking none and fanning three in a 100-pitch effort. It was his 2nd career shutout (5/21/18). He became the first Cardinals pitcher to throw a shutout with eight or more hits and no walks since Bob Forsch (9/8/1982 vs. MTL).
- Has a 2.91 home ERA in 14 starts, ranking 3rd on the team and 18th in NL.
