METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 10-2, last night in Philadelphia...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games (0-4)...The Mets are in the midst of a six-game road trip (0-4) to Atlanta (0-3) and Philadelphia (0-1)...New York is 18-21 on the road compared to 27-10 at Citi Field in 2025...Following the trip, the Mets return home for a brief four-game homestand against the Braves.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have dropped seven straight games, which is their longest losing streak of the season...The team lost a season-high five straight games twice in 2024...The 2023 Mets lost a season-high seven straight from June 2-9, 2023...The last time the Mets lost eight in a row was from May 31 -June 9, 2018...New York has posted a 6.68 ERA (45 ER/60.2 IP) over the last seven games, while batting .205/279/308...They have been outscored 51-16 in that span.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL...They are 0-4 in that span...New York is 12-8 against the NL East this season, sporting a 3.61 ERA...They have hit .249/320/416 against the division.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 45-31 record this season...Their record through 76 games is the fifth-best start in franchise history... Only the 1986 (54-22), 1988 (48-28), 2022 (47-29), 2006 (47-29) and the 1990 (46-30) teams had a better season-opening record...The 1971 team also went 45-31 through their first 76 games.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last 23 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .311 (28-90) with 15 runs, five doubles, five homers, 12 RBI, eight walks, five steals and an .907 OPS...In 17 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .343/405/597 with five doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, six walks and three steals.

AW SNAP: Jeff McNeil has reached base safely in 21 of his last 22 games...He is batting .282 (22-78) in that span with nine runs, four doubles, six homers, 13 RBI, six walks, a .345 OBP and a .564 SLG...He is batting .274 (17-62) with seven extra-base hits, 11 RBI and a .338 OBP in 18 games this month...He batted .222 (14-63) in 24 games in May.

JUAN OF A KIND: In 18 games this month, Juan Soto is batting .300/481/600 with 16 runs, three doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, 20 walks and one steal...Over the last 13 games, he is batting .333 (15-45) with five extra-base hits and a .483 OBP...He has recorded a Major League-leading 63 walks...His 63 walks through the team's first 76 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 85.9 (61-71) stolen base percentage this season which is the best mark in the majors...The Mets are one of eight teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 41.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-51), the best mark in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a season-high six earned runs over 4.1 innings against Tampa Bay on June 15...It was the first time he had allowed six or more earned runs since September 10, 2024, at Minnesota while with the Angels...Dating back to last season he had made 16 consecutive starts of allowing four or fewer earned runs which was the second-longest such streak of his career...His team has a 12-4 record in the games he's started during that span.

VS. PHILADELPHIA/NL EAST: Has made two starts against Philadelphia in his career and he has a 1-0 record with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP)...One of those starts came this season on April 22 and he allowed one earned run over 5.0 innings and picked up the win...In nine career starts against NL East opponents he has a 4.44 ERA (24 ER/48.2 IP) and a 3-1 record...This season he's made three starts against divisional opponents and he has a 2.93 ERA (5 ER/15.1 IP) with a 2-0 record...The Mets have won all three games he's started against NL East opponents this season and he's allowed one or zero runs in two of those three starts.

START ME UP: His 3.80 ERA (29 ER/68.2 IP) is the best of his career through his first 14 games of a season, topping his 4.62 ERA through his first 14 starts of 2023...He earned his sixth win of the season on June 4 and that matches his most wins through his first 14 starts of a season (2023)...Has allowed two or fewer earned runs in nine of his 14 starts this season and the Mets have an 10-4 record in all games he has started.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: He has posted a 2.51 ERA (9 ER/32.1 IP) through six road starts this season compared to a 4.95 ERA (20 ER/36.1 IP) through eight home starts this season...The Mets are 5-1 in road games that Canning starts this season.

NO EXTRA BASES: In 14 starts this season Canning has produced a plus five in Net Bases Prevented (a sum of advances prevented, and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to *Baseball Savant*...That is tied for the most this season with teammate David Peterson and Atlanta's Grant Holmes...Since the start of 2020 he is tied for second with 21 Net Bases Prevented...He is tied with Chris Flexen and trails only David Peterson (29).

GRIFFIN FANNING: During Spring Training, he struck out 22 batters over his 14.1 innings of work, highlighted by his nine strikeouts in 4.2 innings vs. Tampa Bay on March 17...His 22 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Grapefruit League and tied for the 17th-most across the majors...Canning finished the spring with an impressive 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP) and a K/9. rate of 13.8%...He struck out a season-high eight batters on April 17 vs. St. Louis and he has racked up 63 strikeouts through his first 14 starts of this season...In his last two major league seasons, Canning has recorded 130 and 139 strikeouts respectively.

SLIDE TO THE LEFT: Canning has thrown his slider more this season than he ever has before...So far, he has thrown his slider 31.4% of the time compared to 24.1% of the time last season and 29.9% during the 2023 season...He has picked up 24 strikeouts on his slider so far this season and is generating a 32.3% whiff rate on the pitch...He has generated 63 swing & misses with his slider this season, which is the 12th-most in the majors this season...He has thrown his slider 381 times this season which is the 10th-most anyone has thrown their slider in majors this year.

WORKHORSE: Last season, he set a career-high with 31 starts and 171.2 innings pitched for the Angels and in 2023 he finished with 127.0 innings...He is just one of 51 pitchers to throw at least 125.0 innings in each of the past two seasons...In the last two seasons combined, Canning has thrown 298.2 innings which ranks 48th in the majors over that time.

KEEP THE CHANGE: Canning's changeup is one of his best pitches and last season it had a run value of four which ranked eighth in the majors...He threw his changeup 26.7% of the time and he held his opponents to a .259 batting average against that pitch...He also generated a 28.8% whiff% on his changeup which was the 11th-highest clip in the majors...So far this season he has thrown it 23.8% and it produced a 22.9% whiff rate while picking up 16 strikeouts with the pitch...His changeup has produced a positive four run value, which is tied for 13th-best mark in the majors this season.

STAY GOLDEN: Canning was awarded the American League Rawlings Gold Glove in 2020, and he owns a career .955 fielding percentage...Last season he had a perfect fielding percentage on his 32 chances, and he is perfect through his first 14 chances so far this season.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: He signed a one-year contract with the Mets on December 19, 2024, and he had spent his entire five-year major league career with the Angels prior to signing with the Mets this past offseason...Canning owns a career 31-37 record with a 4.67 ERA (299 ER/576.2 IP) and 546 career strikeouts.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to tonight's game, marking his third stint with the team (also: 4/30-5/1 and 5/30-6/2)...An appearance tonight would mark his first career outing against the Phillies...Has faced all other 29 Major League teams at least once.
- He last pitched for the Mets on May 31 vs. Colorado and tossed a scoreless ninth inning (H, K).
- Made his Mets debut on April 30 vs. Arizona, allowing two earned runs over 2.0 innings in relief (2 H, BB, 2 K)...Was his longest appearance since June 21, 2024 at Pittsburgh with Tampa Bay (also: 2.0 IP).
- Last pitched for the Syracuse on June 17, recording the loss after allowing a season-high four earned runs over just 0.1 IP (5 H, HR)...Has spent the majority of the season with Syracuse, posting a 3.97 ERA (10 ER/22.2 IP) with four walks and 15 strikeouts in 22 games...16 of his 22 appearances have been scoreless...Prior to the game on 6/17, he had posted a 2.42 ERA and a .197 opponents' BA in 21 games with Syracuse.
- Has made 13 career appearances vs. the NL East, going 1-0 with one save and a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP)...10 of those 13 outings have been scoreless.
- In his Major League career, has held left-handed batters to a .212 average (156-737) compared to a .247 average (190-768) against right-handed hitters.
- Over parts of 10 seasons with the Houston Astros (2016-20), Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22), Philadelphia Phillies (2022), Los Angeles Angels (2023), Tampa Bay Rays (2023-24) and the Mets (2025), has combined to go 27-22 with a 4.00 ERA (179 ER/403.0 IP), 112 walks and 418 strikeouts in 305 games (seven starts)...Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 25th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of California State Fullerton...Was signed by the Mets as a minor league free agent on October 31, 2024.
- Was an All-Star and World Series Champion in 2017 with the Astros.

- He threw a perfect ninth inning on June 17 at Atlanta (1.0 IP, K)...Each of his last four outings have been scoreless and he has been scoreless in 24 of his 29 appearances this season.
