TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Todd Frazier's Mets and Game 1 of a 6 -game final homestand that includes an upcoming 3 -game series vs the contending Brewers...the Redlegs are coming off their second consecutive 3 -city, 10 -day road trip (5-4 overall, $1-2$ at Sea, 2-1 at Ari, 2-1 at Chi)...following this homestand will finish the 2019 championship season with 3 games at Pit's PNC Park.

CLEMENTE AWARD: RHP/OF Michael Lorenzen in pre-game ceremonies tonight will be recognized as the Reds' nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award, given each year to the Major League player who best represents the game through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field... 18 former award winners are in the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, including Barry Larkin.

SERIES NOTES: At 627 (32-19) the Mets have the highest winning percentage at Great American Ball Park of any team in the National League, including the Reds (702-666-1, .513)...beginning 9/24/13, the Reds are $\mathbf{1 0 - 2 8}$ vs NYM (0-2 in 2013, 2-4 in 2014, 0-7 in 2015, 0-6 in 2016, 3-4 in 2017, 3-3 in 2018, 2-2 in 2019), including a 14-game losing streak from 9/7/14-9/7/16 that ranks as Cin's longest ever vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a 16-game skid vs Ari from 5/8/01-8/13/03... dating back to 1962, the 7-0 series win by the Mets in 2015 was the first season series sweep by either team, followed by NYM's 6-0 series win in 2016.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs (123), HR (44, Major League record), RBI (120) and slugging in runs (123), HR (44, Major League record, Ren inse outscored opponents in the first frame, 123percentage (.572)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 123-
80 , and are $35-13$ (.729) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this a franchise record.

GENO: 3B Eugenio Suárez ranks second in the Major Leagues with a career-high 48 HR , a record for a player from Venezuela, a modern franchise record for a third baseman and tied for the National League record for HR in a season by a player at that position...he shares that NL record with Phi's Mike Schmidt (1980) \& LAD's Adrián Beltré (2004)...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a third baseman since NYY's Alex Rodriguez in 2007 established the Major League single-season record by hitting 52 of his 54 HR while playing third base...Suárez' 48 HR are the most by a Reds batter since George Foster established the single-season franchise record with 52 HR in 1977...since the All-Star break Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 29 HR, a new club record for HR in the second half of a season (27, Ted Kluszewski, 1954), and in slugging percentage (.720) Suárez is trying the become the sixth Reds batter to lead the National League in HR, the first since Foster hit 40 HR in 1978 with a club record 52 HR in 1977, Foster is the last Reds batter to lead the Major Leagues in HR.

RUTHIAN: In the $8-5$ win on $9 / 4$ vs Phi, Michael Lorenzen joined Babe Ruth ( $6 / 13 / 1921$ vs Det) as the only Major League players since 1900 to earn the win, hit a home run and play the outfield in the same game...entered in the seventh inning as the Reds' third pitcher of the game and suffered a blown save after Jay Bruce homered to tie the score at 5-5...in the bottom of the eighth hit his only HR of the season and seventh of his career, a 2-run HR off Blake Parker that extended the Reds' lead to 8-5...played center field in the top of the ninth.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 100 of the Reds' $\mathbf{1 5 3}$ games ( 70 g at $\mathrm{P}, \mathbf{1 5 g}$ in CF, 8 g in LF, $\mathbf{4 g}$ in RF, 13 g as pinch runner, 5 g as a pinch hitter)...in 4 of the last 5 games was the Reds' starting center fielder...he is a career .236 hitter (29-123) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 23 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a .730 OPS...this season as a pinch hitter is $1-5$ with 1 RBI...in his career as a pinch hitter is 5 -for- 25 (.200, 7 RBI) with 3 HR, on $4 / 6 / 17$ off Phi's Adam Morgan, 6/24/18 off Chi's Mike Montgomery and 6/30/18 off Mil's Jacob Barnes (grand slam)... 9 times in his career, including twice this season ( $4 / 9$ vs Mia, $4 / 15$ at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch... 6 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including 3 times as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with as many as 406.2 career innings pitched to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat ( 474.1 ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 400 innings also to play CF at some point in his career...Mahay played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 400th inning in 2007 for the Braves.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is retiring after 46 seasons calling Reds games for 700 WLW Radio...he joined the Reds radio team in 1974 and fo 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry Doggett for the longest running broadcast duo in basebal history...Brennaman is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully ( 67 seasons, 1950-2016), Ralph Kiner of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's Denny Matthews (51, 1969-2019), Mil's Bob Uecker (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) \& Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's Jaime Jarrín (47, 1973-2019).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...on Sunday will wear replica uniforms of the 1999 team that won 96 games but lost a 1-game playoff to the Mets.. the Reds are 5-9 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956 1961, 1967, 1969, 19761990 and 1995.

## RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...has established new career highs in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts...is the first Reds pitcher with 15 wins in a season since Johnny Cueto (20-9) and Alfredo Simon (15-10) each did it in 2014...in the second inning on $9 / 7$ vs Ari recorded his 200th strikeout of the season (Josh Rojas)...in his last 35 apps beginning 9/1/18 is 18-7 and in that span ranks fourth among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.89 (Justin Verlander 2.31, Jacob deGrom 2.48, Gerrit Cole 2.66)...this season ranks among the National League leaders in wins (4th), ERA (10), strikeouts (9th), strikeouts per 9 innings (6th, 10.63) and opponents' BA (3rd, .203)...in his career has allowed 13 HR in the first inning, his highest total in any inning and including 3 HR in the first frame this year...in his $7-4$ win on $8 / 5$ vs LAA, his career-high 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on $8 / 23 / 15$ vs Ari...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)... since his Major League debut in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

## Tomorrow's Pitcher - \#28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...in his last 6 starts is 2-2, 2.13 (38ip, 9er)...has allowed $\mathbf{3}$ leadoff HR (Pit's Adam Frazier, Chi's Kyle Schwarber, Cle's Francisco Lindor)...in the $7-5$ loss on $6 / 23$ at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record 9 strikeouts through the first 3 innings of a game (Mil's Corbin Burnes, $3 / 31 \mathrm{vs}$ StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available... retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the franchise record for strikeouts to begin a game (Robert Stephenson, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by Travis Shaw's HR leading off the third inning...missed the entire 2017 season with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 50 starts since he returned from those injuries is 16-17, 4.36.

In the fourth inning Wed at Wrigley Field hit his 48th HR of the season (solo off Jon Lester)...established a new record for HR in a season by a player from Venezuela (47, Andrés Galarraga, 1996) and tied the National League single-season record for HR by a third baseman (48, Mike Schmidt 1980, Adrián Beltré 2004).

- In 23 apps beginning $8 / 25$ is hitting .369 (31-84, 3 2b, $13 \mathrm{~b}, 14 \mathrm{hr}$, 24rbi, 1.377ops). From 9/2-9/4 missed 3 starts with a bruised left hand suffered on $9 / 1$ at StL when he was hit by a Daniel Ponce de Leon pitch...returned to the starting lineup on $9 / 5$ vs Phi and in 13 apps since then is hitting .388 with four 2-hit games and three 3 -hit games (19-49, 1 2b, 1 3b, 8 hr , 15rbi, . 939 slg , 474 obp ).

Beginning $8 / 12$ has started 30 of the Reds' last 37 games ( 15 gs in LF, 10 gs at 1B, 4gs at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ in RF) and played in the other 7 games.
Made 49 starts ( 27 gs in LF, 9 gs at $1 \mathrm{~B}, 9 \mathrm{gs}$ at $2 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{gs}$ at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ in RF, 1 gs at DH). Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g). In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month ( $.358,11 \mathrm{hr}$, 28rbi).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b
Road Trip: 8-26 (.308), 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .419obp
Has produced 30 doubles for the 10th time in his career...beginning in 2008, his first full season, only Robinson Cano has as many 30 -double seasons (also 10 ).
In his last 12 apps beginning $9 / 4$ is hitting .375 with 5 multi-hit games ( $15-40,42 \mathrm{~b}$, 2hr, 6rbi, . $625 \mathrm{slg}, .490 \mathrm{obp}$ ).
In 21 apps since he was reinstated from the injured list on $8 / 27$ is hitting . 297 (22-74, $52 \mathrm{~b}, 3 \mathrm{hr}, 8 \mathrm{rbi}, 16 \mathrm{r}, .404 \mathrm{obp})$...from $8 / 18-8 / 26$ missed 11 games while on the 10 -day IL with a low back strain.
