**11TH ANNUAL D-BACKS RACE AGAINST CANCER:** On Sunday, September 29, the D-backs will host their 11th annual "D-backs Race Against Cancer" presented by Dignity Health Cancer Institute...proceeds from the event will support local patient care and cancer research projects such as screening tools to assist with earlier diagnosis, innovative treatment options for those currently facing cancer, and creating and maintaining support systems for patients' families...registration ends after September 28 and no race day registration will be available...for more info, visit dbacks.com/race.

#### SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs won their Major-League-best fourth straight game, 5-0, last night @ Brewers, their first shutout @ Brewers since May 25, 2017 (4-0) and 14th all-time.

- ◆ Ketel Marte (2-for-2, HR, 2 RBI, 3 BB) hit his career-best 34th home run...has reached base 9 times in his last 2 games, going gone 5-for-6 with 1 double, 2 homers, 4 RBI and 4 walks.
- Joc Pederson (1-for-2, HR, 2 RBI) hit his 23rd homer to kickstart the scoring in the first inning.
- ♦ Merrill Kelly (W; 0 ER in 5.0 IP, 2 H, 6 K) recorded his fifth win with his 19th career 5.0+-inning shutout, first since Aug. 24, 2023 vs. Reds (0 ER in 7.0 IP).

**IN THE STANDINGS:** The D-backs hold the second spot in the NL Wild Card, 2.0 games behind the Padres (first WC), and 1.0 game up on the Mets (third in WC) [own tiebreaker] and 3.0 games over the Braves (fourth in WC).

The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 5.0 games and the Padres by 2.0 games.

**4 THE SWWWWEEP:** The D-backs are seeking their first-ever 4-game sweep vs. Brewers and second series sweep all-time (last: 3-0 from April 5-7, 2013 @ Brewers).

**87 WINS & COUNTING:** The D-backs' 87 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 7 games to go, are their third-most wins since 2008 behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have reached 90+ wins 6 times (1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

**ON THE ROAD:** Since the All-Star break, the D-backs' 22 road wins (22-11, .667) are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Padres (21) and Tigers (19).

**WINS WITH STARTERS GOING 5.0+:** The D-backs' 72 wins when starting pitchers toss 5.0+ innings are tied for the fourth most in the NL (also: Padres), behind the Phillies (83), Mets (76) and Braves (76).

**DINGER SEASON:** The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season (203 HR) for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 203 homers are fifth most in a single season in franchise history, behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR), 1999 (216 HR) and 2001 (208 HR)...their 203 homers this season are fifth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (226), Orioles (224), Dodgers (221) and Braves (204).

MLB'S BEST SINCE JULY 1: Since July 1, Arizona leads MLB with an .847 OPS, .355 OBP .491 SLG, 458 runs and 6.45 R/G.

♦ The D-backs' 46 wins (46-25, .643; 20-12 home, 26-13 road) are tied for the most in MLB with the Mets (46), ahead of the Astros (43), Tigers (43) and Padres (43).

**CORBIN CHARTER MEMBER OF 20+ HR / 30+ SB SEASONS:** Last night, **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back ever to record consecutive seasons with 20+ homers and 30+ stolen bases...since 2012, he is 1 of 3 players to accomplish consecutive seasons of the feat in their age 23 season or younger (also: Bobby Witt Jr./2022-23 and Mike Trout/2012-13).

**FIRST-INNING HISTORY:** The D-backs are the first team to boast a first-inning average of .325+ since the 2000 Cardinals (.336) and are just 1 of 9 teams since 1979 to have a first-inning average of .320+:

**FIRST-INNING FANS:** The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 37 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (31) and Marlins (26).

- ♦ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with a .325 AVG, .383 OBP, .560 SLG, .943 OPS, 206 hits, 120 runs and 355 total bases.
- Arizona's first-inning .943 OPS, .325 AVG, .383 OBP, .560 SLG, 206 hits, 36 homers and 355 total bases are the best in franchise history.

**FIRST & NINTH-INNING OFFENSE:** In the first and ninth innings combined, the D-backs' offense leads the Majors with a .301 AVG, .365 OBP, .532 SLG, .897 OPS, 332 hits, 61 homers, 208 runs, 1.34 runs per game and 124 XBH.

**THE BUCK STOPS WITH PUK:** Since Aug. 3, **A.J. Puk** is 1 of 2 relievers to go scoreless [min. 20.0 IP]...owns a current career-best 23 straight scoreless games (21.2 IP) with 8 hits and 3 walks allowed and 36 strikeouts.

♦ Puk is 1 of 4 D-back relievers all-time to reach 23+ consecutive scoreless appearances...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless appearances by a reliever is 26 by Yoshihisa Hirano (May 6-July 3, 2018, 22.2 IP)...the franchise record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched by a reliever is 25.0 IP by Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008, 24 appearances).

**RUNS PER GAME:** The D-backs' 5.50 runs per game lead the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (5.14) and Yankees (5.01), and rank second in club history (5.60 R/G in 1999) [the last Arizona team to have 5.00 + R/G was in 2019 (5.02)].

- ♦ Since Aug. 1, the D-backs' 31 games with 5+ runs (25-6 record) are the most in MLB, ahead of the Dodgers (26, 23-3) and Cubs (26, 22-4).
- The D-backs 852 runs this season are second in franchise history, behind 1999 (908 runs) - a difference of 56 runs.

#### NEXT STARTER: LHP EDUARDO RODRIGUEZ (3-3, 5.09)

- Won his last start on Sept. 18 @ Rockies after tossing a season-high 6.1 innings with 2 runs allowed on 5 hits and 11 strikeouts.
- Made his lone start vs. Giants on Sept. 19, 2019 while with the Red Sox (W; 1 ER in 6.0 IP, 3 H, 2 BB, 10 K).

Became the 10th D-back starting pitcher all-time to record a quality start in his MLB debut (last: Drey Jameson, Sept. 15, 2022 vs. Padres...his 83 pitches marked the fewest thrown among D-back starters all-time who threw at most 6.0 innings in a debut (previous low: John Patterson, 85 on July 20, 2002 @ Padres).
- Limiting lefties to a .231 AVG (9-for-39) with 8 strikeouts.
- Earned his first Major League win in his second career start on July 13 vs. Blue Jays (1 ER in 6.0 IP).
- ♦At the age of 17, he drew interest from Major League teams after converting from a position player to a pitcher...but at age 18, he was unable to sign due to a wrist injury from basketball, so he quit baseball...he moved out of Venezuela looking for a better life, going to to Ecuador, Colombia and Peru where he sold energy drinks and strawberries with whipped cream at traffic lights and cleaned windshields.
