METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Orioles, 7-3, last night...New York has lost five straight and six of its last seven games...The Mets lost a season-high seven straight games from June 2-9...On Monday, the team returns home for the start of a 10-day, 10-game road trip against the Cubs (three games), Braves (four games) and Pirates (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: Today, the Mets conclude a six-game road trip (0-5) to Kansas City (0-3) and Baltimore (0-2)...The last time the Mets lost every contest of a road trip that was six or more games long was from May 12-17, 2017...New York lost three games in Milwaukee and then three games in Arizona.

HIP, HIP, JOSE: José Quintana is slated to make the start today...He has appeared in nine games (seven starts) against the Orioles over his career...He is 2-4 with a 3.74 ERA (19 ER/45.2 IP) with 10 walks and 46 strikeouts...The lefty last started against the O's on July 16, 2017 when he tossed 7.0 shutout innings with 12 strikeouts.

Q RATING: Of the 198 pitchers to make at least 10 starts since August 6, 2022, only seven have a lower ERA than Quintana's 2.42: Jeffrey Springs (2.00), Max Fried (2.01), Clayton Kershaw (2.24), Brandon Woodruff (2.26), Eury Perez (2.36) and Justin Steele (2.40)...Info courtesy of Sportsradar.

CHARMED: Buck Showalter returns to Baltimore as an opposing manager tonight...Showalter managed the Orioles from 2010-18, going 669-684 in that span...He was named Manager of the Year in 2014, guiding the Birds to a 96-66 record and ending the club's 15-year playoff drought...In 22 seasons as a manager, Showalter has compiled a 1,702-1,637 record...He places 19th on the all-time managerial wins list.

JEFF McHITS: In 14 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .298 (17-57) with eight runs, two doubles, one triple, one home runs, nine RBI, two walks with a .344 OBP and a .421 SLG...He has struck out thrice in his last 76 at-bats.

EIGHT GAMES A WEEK: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in seven of his last eight games, batting .400 (12-30) with seven runs, three doubles, seven RBI, three walks, with a .471 SLG and a .800 SLG...Francisco Lindor ranks 12th in the majors with a 4.0 fWAR...That is seventh-best in the National League.

LINSANITY: Over the last 40 games, Lindor is batting .293 (43-147) with 30 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 22 walks, 11 steals with a .387 OBP, a .578 SLG and a .958 OPS...Lindor has stolen 17 bases in 110 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

THE CITY THAT READS: Brandon Nimmo has appeared in five games at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...He is a .647 (11-17) lifetime hitter with seven runs, three doubles, two triples, three RBI and three walks...Starling Marte has batted .263 (5-19) with one run, three RBI and two walks in five career contests at the yard.

BIRDS AREN'T REAL: Pete Alonso has gone 13-38 (.342) with four doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, 11 runs scored in 10 career games against the Orioles...Is on a seven-game hitting streak against Baltimore, going 12-27 (.444) with four doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, two walks, nine runs scored and a 1.520 OPS...Has three homers, four doubles, six RBI, seven runs scored and a 1.581 OPS in his last four games against the O's.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 31 home runs...He is tied for third in the NL and tied for seventh in the majors with 77 RBI...He is hitting .322 (19-59) with 10 extra-base hits, 15 RBI, nine runs and a 1.037 OPS in his last 15 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season...He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is tied with Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 32-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 24-37 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.98 ERA in away games...This compares to a 3.84 mark at home...New York has played 60 games on the road this year...That is the second-most in the majors...Only the Phillies have played more road games with 62.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .289 (65-225) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, three triples, six home runs, 29 RBI, 32 walks, a .379 OBP and a .440 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .218/.327/.425 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .262 (62-237) with 42 runs, 17 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 47 RBI, 23 walks, a .336 OBP, a .515 SLG and an .851 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .211/.314/.411 with 17 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of 14 of 18 games against American League opponents...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 14-19 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 249-246 record in Interleague play...The team's .503 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 79 steals in 88 attempts...The team's 89.8 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 56 stolen base attempts.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1986, the Mets swept a doubleheader from the Cubs at Wrigley Field...The Mets defeated the Cubs by a score of 7-6 in both games...In game one, New York scored two runs in the top of the 12th...Dwight Gooden made the start, but allowed five runs in nine innings of work...OF Lenny Dykstra led the charge, collecting four hits and two RBI for the leadoff spot...OF Mookie Wilson drove home the winning runs with a two-RBI single in the 12th...Rick Anderson earned the win in game two, allowed three runs in 5.0 innings of work...Wilson and 1B Keith Hernandez each recorded three hits, while C Gary Carter and SS Howard Johnson homered...The Cubs scored twice in the bottom of the ninth before Jesse Orosco entered the game to record the final out of the game to earn his 15th save.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Luisangel Acuña helped Binghamton walk it off in a 4-3 win over New Hampshire yesterday...He finished the game going 1-2 with two runs, one RBI, two walks and a steal...In 89 games between two teams combined this year, Acuña is batting .310/.374/.441 with 70 runs, 25 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 52 RBI, 40 walks with 43 steals...Acuña is ranked as the second-best prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his third start of the season on August 1 in Kansas City...He threw 6.2 IP and allowed three earned runs on six hits and two walks while striking out two batters.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

GOOD MORNING BALTIMORE: Today, Quintana will make his 9th career start against the Orioles...Quintana last faced Baltimore on August 26, 2021 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards with the Angels and allowed one run over 2.0 innings in relief.

YOU GOTTA EARN 'EM: Quintana has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 17 starts dating back to July 23, 2022...It is the longest such streak of his career and the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his last start against Kansas City on August 1.

HOT STREAK: Quintana has not allowed a home run over his last 79.1 innings dating back to August 4, 2022...Is the longest such active streak in MLB...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,535) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,912), Chris Sale (2,135), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,551).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: KODAI SENGA (7-6, 3.25)

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 5.2 innings against the Royals at Kauffman Stadium on August 2...Allowed three runs on 11 hits, with two walks and six strikeouts.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga was the fifth Mets rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Tom Seaver (1967), Jerry Koosman (1968), Dwight Gooden (1984) and Pete Alonso (2019).
