METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets continue their first homestand of the season tonight after sweeping a twinbill against the Phillies yesterday...The Mets are over .500 for the first time this year...With a win tonight, the Mets would secure their first series win of the season...The team is 3-1 so far during their current homestand...The Mets will play two more games against Philadelphia before hitting the road for a six-game, seven-day road trip to Coors Field followed by Wrigley Field.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: New York swept a doubleheader from Philadelphia for the first time since September 24, 2011 at Citi Field...It was the first time the team swept a twinbill at Citi Field since they took two from Miami on August 5, 2019...The team played four doubleheaders in 2020, going 2-6 in those games...The Mets swept one doubleheader (at Yankee Stadium) and was swept three times (vs. Miami, at Yankees and at Washington).

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets batted .286 (6-21) with a double and six RBI with runners in scoring position in the doubleheader yesterday...The team's six hits with RISP equaled their total for the previous six games...From April 5-11, the Mets were 6-41 with RISP with nine RBI...Overall, the Mets are batting .194/.350/.226 with runners in scoring position this season...The team's .194 batting average ranks 27th in the majors and 13th in the NL... On the other hand, the team's .350 OBP with RISP is eighth in the NL and 12th in the majors.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets won two of their first three home games via walk-off fashion...The last team to win two of their first three games via walkoff was the 2015 Cincinnati Reds on April 8 and 9 against Pittsburgh...The Mets have now equaled the amount of walkoff wins they had in 2020.

GIMME! GIMME! GUILLORME!: Luis Guillorme is batting .571 (4-7) with two runs, four walks and a .727 OBP through six games this year...Over the last two years, Guillorme is batting .359/.468/.453 with eight runs, six doubles, nine RBI, 14 walks and a .921 OPS...He owns a .506 OBP in his last 23 starts dating to August 6, 2019.

A MAN AFTER MIDNIGHT: Pete Alonso led off the eighth inning of game one of yesterday's doubleheader with a game-tying RBI single...Alonso has a .688 slugging percentage in extra innings in his career...That ranks eighth in the majors over the last three seasons (min. 15 extra-inning AB)... His five extra-inning RBI since 2019 are tied for the ninth-most in the majors.

SHUT IT OUT: The Mets claimed their first shutout of the season yesterday... It was the first time the Mets blanked the Phillies since April 23, 2019 at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets recorded only one shutout in 2020, a 1-0 win on Opening Day, July 24 over Atlanta.

SWITCHING THINGS UP: From 2019-2020, the Mets totaled 33 at-bats from switch hitters, fourth-fewest in the majors...This season, New York has already surpassed their total from the last two years...Francisco Lindor and Jonathan Villar have combined for 41 at-bats.

STEALERS WHEELER: Zack Wheeler returns to Citi Field tonight...The Georgia native made 126 starts for the Mets and went 44-38 with a 3.77 ERA with 270 walks and 726 strikeouts from 2013-2019...He is 19-23 with a 4.16 ERA with 131 walks and 366 punchouts in 61 starts at Citi Field... Wheeler was acquired by the Mets on July 28, 2011 from the San Francisco Giants in exchange for Carlos Beltrán.

QUALITY EATS: Through seven games this season, the Mets have made five quality starts...The Mets hurled 17 quality starts in 2020, going 9-8 in those games...Mets starters are 2-2 and own a 2.43 ERA (11 earned runs/40.2 innings) with 11 walks and 44 strikeouts in 2021...The team's 2.43 ERA is fourth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit.

20/20 VISION: Nimmo has reached base in 20 straight games dating back to September 11 last season...He is batting .386 (27-70) with 10 runs, five doubles, a triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, 15 walks, a .500 OBP and a 1.071 OPS in that span...It is the second-longest active streak in the majors, behind only Mike Trout's 30-game streak...It is the third-longest streak in Nimmo's career.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets own a 58-49 record against the Phillies at Citi Field.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base at least twice in all seven games this season...Only David Wright has a longer streak to start the season, reaching base in 10-straight games to start the 2012 season... The Wyoming native is batting .435 (10-23) with three runs, three doubles, four RBI, eight walks, a .581 OBP and a 1.146 OPS...He is batting .500 (3-6) with a double and three walks against left-handed pitchers this year.

FLIP, FLIP, FLIPADELPHIA: Dominic Smith owns a .283/.335/.566 with 14 doubles, a triple, nine home runs and 23 RBI in 48 career games against the Phillies...It's his highest batting average against any team in the division... He has recorded 24 extra-base hits against Philadelphia, his highest total against any one team...This includes 18 extra-base hits since the start of the 2019 season, the second-most in that span.

PHILLIN' IT: Jeff McNeil is a lifetime .363 (57-157) hitter vs. the Phillies...His .363 average against Philadelphia is the third-highest mark among active players (min. 100 at-bats)...It is the third-highest batting average by a Met against the Phillies...Asdrúbal Cabrera and John Olerud are tied at the top with a .383 batting average (min. 100 at-bats).

THE LEFTOVERS: The Mets have left at least 10 runners on base in four games this year...Overall, the team has left 63 runners on base in 2021.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets are third in the majors and third in the NL with a .350 OBP this season...Brandon Nimmo leads the majors with a .581 on-base percentage.

PITCHERS WHO RAKE: Mets pitchers are batting .214 (3-14) with an RBI and a walk this year...That is second in the majors (min. 10 at-bats) behind Atlanta's .235 mark...The Mets pitching staff led the National League and were second in the majors with a .167 (52-311) batting average in 2019... Only the Oakland Athletics (.286) had a higher mark...Mets' pitchers hit six home runs in 2019, which also led the majors.

MOVING ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 118 home runs in his career, tying him with Ed Kranepool for 11th on the Mets all-time list...Edgardo Alfonzo is 10th with 120 dingers...He has hit 60 home runs at Citi Field...That places him second on the all-time leader board...Lucas Duda owns the record with 71 home runs at the ballpark.

LIVIN' IT UP IN THE CITI: The Mets are 3-1 at Citi Field this year...The team has posted a 1.89 ERA (seven earned runs/33.1 innings) at home this year... The team's 1.89 home ERA is fourth in the majors and second in the National League...The team finished the season going 12-17 at Citi Field in 2020...The team posted a 5.11 ERA (147 earned runs/259.0 innings) with 111 walks and 306 strikeouts while the batters had a collective .259/.337/.448 slash line... The Mets were outscored 157-127 at home last year.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: Mets Hall of Famer LHP Jerry Koosman, who will have his uniform retired later this year, made his major league debut on April 14, 1967 against the Phillies...Koosman hurled 2.2 hitless and scoreless innings...He issued two walks and struck out Chris Short for his first major league strikeout...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: In his last start, Peterson made his season debut at Philadelphia on April 7...He allowed a career-high six earned runs on a career-high-tying seven hits, including a career-high two home runs in 4.0 innings...Four of his six earned runs came in the bottom of the first inning...Struck out five batters and allowed two walks.

VS. PHILLIES: Peterson tonight will make his second consecutive start against the Phillies...In two career starts against the Phillies, Peterson is 0-1 with a 16.50 ERA (11 earned runs/6.0 innings) with eight strikeouts and six walks...In his nine career appearances against all other clubs, the lefty owns a 2.64 ERA (14 earned runs/47.2 innings).

AT HOME: Peterson is 3-0 with a 4.00 ERA (eight earned runs/18.0 innings) in four career starts at Citi Field...The southpaw has never allowed more than four hits in a start at home...In his most recent home start, September 19, 2020 vs. Atlanta, Peterson struck out a career-high 10 batters, becoming the third-ever Mets rookie left-hander with a double-digit strikeout game and the first since Hisanori Takahashi (July 31, 2010).

IN RARE COMPANY: Last season, Peterson led the Mets pitching staff with six wins...He is one of six rookies in franchise history to finish the season as the team's win leader...Tom Seaver (16 in 1967), Jerry Koosman (19 in 1968), Mark Bombardieri (10 in 1980), Dwight Gooden (17 in 1984) and Dillon Gee (13 in 2011) are the others...Courtesy of Elias.

LIMITING OPPONENTS: In 2020, Peterson ranked seventh in the NL with a .202 (36-178) opposing batting average (min. 200 batters faced)...That included a .161 (5-31) mark vs. left-handed batters.

ATOP THE ROOKIE PETERBOARD: In 2020, Peterson led NL rookie pitchers with six wins...Ranked third among NL rookies with 49.2 innings pitched...Was eighth in that group with 40 strikeouts...Tied for the major league rookie lead in wins...Was eighth among major league rookies in innings pitched...Among rookies with 45.0 or more innings, Peterson was third in NL and fifth in the majors with a 1.21 WHIP, third in the majors in ERA (3.44) and fourth in the majors in BAA (.202).

RELIEF APPEARANCE: Peterson pitched in his only career relief outing and earned the win against Baltimore on September 2, 2020...The lefty threw 4.0 scoreless innings allowing two hits with two walks and one strikeout...It marked the first win by a Mets reliever in a game in which he pitched at least four innings and was not charged with any runs since August 5, 2009 (Nelson Figueroa 4.1 innings vs. St. Louis)...Courtesy of Elias.

FIRST ROUND'S ON ME: Including Peterson, the Mets have four of their first-round selections on their Opening Day roster...Peterson (20th overall pick in 2017) joins Michael Conforto (10th overall, 2014), Dominic Smith (11th overall, 2013) and Brandon Nimmo (13th overall, 2011) as Mets first-rounders on the active roster...In addition to those four, other clubs' first-round picks on the Mets roster include Francisco Lindor (eighth overall, Cleveland, 2011), Albert Almora Jr. (sixth overall, Chicago-NL, 2012), Marcus Stroman (22nd overall, Toronto, 2012) and Taijuan Walker (43rd overall, Seattle, 2010)...Noah Syndergaard, currently on the 60-Day IL, was Toronto's first-round pick in 2010.

GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE: This spring, Peterson started three games and posted a 3.75 ERA (five earned runs/12 innings) with three walks and three strikeouts...In his final outing, Peterson tossed a quality start after allowing two earned runs over 6.0 innings against the Nationals on March 26...Went 1-2 at the plate.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JACOB DeGROM (0-1, 0.64 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: In his first home start of the 2021 season, deGrom took the loss against the Marlins on April 10...The righty pitched 8.0 innings allowed one earned run on five hits...Did not issue a walk and struck out 14 batters, tying a career high.

ELITE COMPANY: Ranks among the active leaders (min. 100 starts) in several categories: ERA (second, 2.59), opponent OPS (second, .602), H/9 (7.22, second), WHIP (1.04, third), K/BB ratio (4.83, third), opponent batting average (.219, fourth), pitches per game (100.3, fifth), HR/9 (0.78, fifth) and K/9 (10.49, seventh).

- Clubbed his 70th career home run in his 220th career game on April 6...Aaron Judge was previously the fastest player to reach 70 homers (231 games).
- Hit his first home run of the season on April 6 at Philadelphia...Its 95.2 mph exit velocity was the lowest on a home run in his career.
- Ended the 2020 season on a power streak, hitting 10 home runs in his final 22 games...All told, last year, Alonso slashed .231/.326/.490 with six doubles, 16 homers, 35 RBI and 31 runs scored in 57 games.
- Finished the spring batting .340 (17-50) with six doubles, four homers, 16 RBI, six runs scored and a 1.121 OPS...He ranked in the top-10 in the majors in several categories: RBI (tied for third), slugging percentage (.700, eighth), OPS (eighth), extra-base hits (10, tied for fifth).

- Is 0 for his last 14...Drove in the game-winning run with a walk-off hit-by-pitch on April 8 in the Mets' home opener...It was his second career walk-off RBI and the Mets' third-ever walk-off hit-by-pitch.
- Ranks seventh among active players with 20 home runs vs. Philadelphia...His 10-game home run drought vs. the Phils is the longest of his career.
- Last season, he ranked among NL leaders in several categories: average (.322, sixth), OBP (.412, sixth), hits (65, tied for seventh), runs scored (40, 11th)...He was one of just seven major leaguers to hit .325 or better in both full months of the regular season...Played in the Mets' first 53 games before a hamstring injury sidelined him for the rest of the year.
