AROUND THE HORN

SIX NON-PROFITS SURPRISED WITH OVER \$1 MILLION THRU 2026 KEN KENDRICK GRAND SLAM AWARDS: Six Arizona-based nonprofits - Arizona Educational Foundation, Delivering Dreams Arizona, Foundation for Blind Children, Keys to Change, Phoenix Public Library Foundation and Southwest Human Development - were surprised with a combined \$1 million in grant funding through the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation's 2026 Ken Kendrick Grand Slam Awards...established in 2002, this signature grant program has awarded more than \$13.8 million to organizations across Arizona, supporting transformative, large-scale projects that drive long-term change by improving operations and strengthening communities.

\$100 MILLION IN GIVING: The D-backs and Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation have earned a place among professional sports' most impactful philanthropic organizations in fewer than three decades, reaching a historic milestone of \$100 Million In Giving through their signature "D-backs Give Back" approach and investment in communities across Arizona...March 9 will forever be celebrated annually as "D-backs Give Back Day" as proclaimed by Arizona Governor Katie Hobbs ensuring the organization's longstanding statewide commitment will be recognized each year.

HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs kick off a 3-game series @ Mets today to start a 9-game, 3-city East Coast road trip.

- The D-backs' first-pitch times for today and tomorrow were moved from 4:10 p.m. PHX/7:10 p.m. ET to 1:10 p.m. PHX/4:10 p.m. ET due to expected cold weather and windy conditions.
- Among NL teams, the D-backs rotation's 3.29 ERA (19 ER in 52.0 IP) ranks fifth best, just behind the fourth-best Mets (3.13 ERA, 19 ER in 54.2 IP).
 - Both the D-backs (19) and Mets (19) have yielded the fourth fewest amount of earned runs in the NL, behind the Cubs (17), Pirates (18) and Reds (18).
- Zac Gallen**, in his last 3 starts vs. Mets, is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 ER in 13.0 IP), 0.85 WHIP, opponent .116 AVG, 6 walks and 14 strikeouts.
 - Has allowed 1 earned run or less in 6 of his last 7 outings vs. Mets.
- Geraldo Perdomo's** 33 consecutive plate appearances without a strikeout since March 27 @ Dodgers (third inning) is the longest active streak in the Majors, ahead of Jacob Wilson/ATH (28).
- Corbin Carroll** has reached base safely in 7 of his last 8 games, hitting .313 (10-for-32)/1.067 OPS with 1 double, 2 triples, 2 homers, 9 RBI and 6 walks.
- Ildemaro Vargas** has hit safely in his first 4 games this season at a .545 clip (6-for-11)/1.674 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 homer and 4 RBI.
- Ketel Marte** has reached base safely in 7 of his last 9 games.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 6-5 vs. Braves in 10 innings on Sunday on **Ketel Marte's** walk-off RBI double to split the 4-game series.

- D-backs' 1-4 hitters went a combined 6-for-14 (2 2B, 3B, 4 RBI, BB, sac fly, sac bunt).
- Corbin Carroll** had a season-best 3 hits (3-for-4, 3B, RBI, SB), including his second triple of the season, which is tied for most in the Majors (also: 2 others).
- Ketel Marte**, went 2-for-5 with 2 doubles and 1 RBI...his 10th-inning double marked his first since walk-off since April 13, 2022 vs. Astros (SF in 10th).
- Ildemaro Vargas** recorded a go-ahead 2-run triple off the bench in the fourth inning after pinch-running for Carlos Santana.
- 5 relievers - **Taylor Clarke**, **Ryan Thompson**, **Kevin Ginkel**, **Jonathan Loaisiga** and **Taylor Rashi** - combined to allow 1 earned run over 5.1 innings with 4 strikeouts, including Rashi's first MLB win.
- The D-backs are 5-0 when leading after 8.0 innings and 4-1 after 6.0 innings.

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs selected INF **Luken Baker** from Triple-A Reno, placed INF **Carlos Santana** on the 10-day injured list (strained right adductor; retro to April 6), transferred INF/OF **Jordan Lawlar** to the 60-day injured list (fractured right wrist).

SAVING RUNS: The D-backs' 18 defensive runs saved (DRS) lead the Majors, ahead of the Braves (15), Dodgers (11) and Mets (11).

- Alek Thomas' 4 DRS** are tied for most in the Majors (also: Harrison Bader/SF and Cole Young /SEA), while **Ketel Marte's 3 DRS** are tied for second.
- The D-backs are the only team in the Majors with 2 players who have 3+ DRS.

VS. METS: Last season, the D-backs took 2 of 3 games @ Mets from April 29-May 1 and split the season series 3-3...have won 4 of their last 5 games @ Citi Field since June 1, 2024.

- Nolan Arenado** has reached base safely in 8 of his last 9 games since May 6, 2024, hitting .300 (6-for-20)/.440 OBP with 2 RBI and 4.
- Geraldo Perdomo** is hitting .350 (7-for-20)/.967 OPS with 1 double, 1 homer, 5 RBI and 3 walks in his last 6 games since April 29, 2025.
- Alek Thomas** is hitting .417 (5-for-12)/.917 OPS with 1 double and 1 RBI in his last 3 starts since May 1, 2025.
- Corbin Carroll** has hit safely in 7 of his last 9 games (6-for-22) since Aug. 27, 2024, slashing .273/.385/.930 with 2 homers, 2 RBI and 4 walks.

MARTE REACHES 10 YEARS: On Friday, **Ketel Marte** reached the 10-year milestone of MLB service time.

- Is the second D-back all-time to play 10 seasons with the club, joining Nick Ahmed (2014-23).
- D-backs accolades include Top 5 in NL MVP (fourth in 2019, third in '24), 3-time NL All-Star (2019, '24, '25), 2-time All MLB First-Team (2024, '25), 2-time Silver Slugger (2024, '25), 2023 NLCS MVP.

MINOR LEAGUE SPOTLIGHT: Triple-A Reno LHP **Kohl Drake** yesterday was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week after tossing 5.0 no-hit innings (ND, 2 BB, 5 K) on April 2 @ Albuquerque.
