## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (72-81) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (74-80)

SEPTEMBER 20, 2024 AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK, CINCINNATI, OH - 6:40 EDT - GAME #154/ROAD #76

RHP MITCH KELLER (11-10, 3.87 ERA) vs. RHP NICK MARTINEZ (9-6, 3.37 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** beat the Cardinals 3-2 last night in the finale of their four-game series at Busch Stadium...Are 2-5 in their last seven games since winning four straight from September 8-11...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 50 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (51); it's also the most one-run games for the team since playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.8 percent) in MLB...Have gone 23-23 against the National League Central (Pittsburgh's last winning record against the NL Central came in 2018 when the team went 43-33).

**COMING THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH:** Nick Gonzales recorded his 10th game-winning RBI of this season with his run-scoring single in the eighth inning last night (his first game-winning RBI of the year came on May 19)...Gonzales is hitting at a .429 clip (6-for-14) with runners in scoring position since September 2...Since returning from the injured list on August 26, he also ranks 14th in the National League with a .317 batting average.

**NICK WITH THE STICK:** Nick Gonzales comes into today with a 10-game on-base streak, which is tied for the longest of his career (he also reached base safely in 10 straight from September 28 of last season to May 17, 2024)...Gonzales is hitting .324 (12-for-37) with a pair of doubles, triple and two RBI during his current 10-game on-base streak.

**THE REAL DEAL:** Nick Gonzales recorded his 10th game-winning RBI of the season against the Cardinals on Thursday...In the last 50 years, the only Pirates second baseman at 25 or younger to have more game-winning RBI in a season is Neil Walker (11 in 2011; age at time of game).

**STARTING THINGS OFF:** Luis Ortiz allowed two runs in 6.0 innings but came away with a no-decision in his start last night against the Cardinals...Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded the fourth-lowest ERA (3.84) among all National League teams...The only three starting rotations in the National League to have a lower ERA this year are the Braves (3.66), Phillies (3.73) and Cubs (3.84)...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

**SETTING UP THE SERIES:** The Pirates have won the last four series against the Reds, matching their longest series winning streak against a single opponent since 2018 (also four straight against the Reds)...The last time the Pirates defeated a single opponent in more consecutive series was a seven series streak against the Dodgers spanning 2013 to 2016...The last series when the two teams met in Pittsburgh on August 25 concluded with a two-run walkoff home run from Yasmani Grandal off Alexis Diaz.

**IKF:** Isiah Kiner-Falefa has hit safely in each of his last six starts, going 11-for-29 (.379) with four doubles and an RBI...He has also recorded 21 hits this month, which are tied for the 11th-most in the National League.

**LATE NIGHT DELIVERY:** Yasmani Grandal hit a game-tying homer in the seventh inning against the Cardinals on Thursday...According to StatsPerform, the Pirates are the only team with two players with at least two game-tying/go-ahead home runs in the seventh inning or later at age 35 or older (also Andrew McCutchen).

**FIRING CUBAN MISSILES:** Aroldis Chapman comes into today ninth in all of MLB among relief pitchers with 92 strikeouts (Bryan Abreu and Cade Smith are tied for the MLB lead among relievers with 100 strikeouts apiece)...Chapman's 92 punchouts are the second-most in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...The only Pirates southpaw reliever with more strikeouts in a single season is Rod Scurry (94 in 1982).

**SAVING THE DAY:** Aroldis Chapman converted his 331st career save Thursday night to break a tie with John Wetteland for 16th on the all-time saves list.... The only three southpaws in MLB history to record more saves than Chapman since saves became an official stat in 1969 are John Franco (424), Billy Wagner (422) and Randy Myers (347).

**TODAY'S STARTER** **RHP MITCH KELLER** **#23**

**2024 RECORD: 11-10, 3.87 ERA**

**HEIGHT/WEIGHT:** 6-2/205 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R  
**BORN:** April 4, 1996 **SIGNED:** Thru 2028  
**AGE:** 28 **HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 28-year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season... Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First Year Player Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Keller allowed four runs (3er) in 6.0 innings and lost a 5-1 decision against Kansas City on Saturday at PNC Park.

**VS. CINCINNATI:** Keller will be making his 17th career start against the Reds, including his third of the 2024 campaign...He made his big league debut here at Great American Ball Park on May 27, 2019, in game two of a doubleheader, where he allowed six runs in 4.0 innings while losing an 8-1 decision...Since 2019, Keller's 16 starts against the Reds are tied for the most by any pitcher along with Miles Mikolas.

**LEADING THE WAY FOR ANOTHER YEAR:** Keller leads the Pirates with 169.2 innings pitched this season...He led the Pirates with 194.1 innings pitched last season as well as 2022 when he logged a total of 159.0 innings...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to lead the team in innings pitched in at least three straight seasons was Doug Drabek, who did so in five straight years from 1988-92.

**ON THE ROAD:** Keller has gone 6-6 with a 4.82 ERA (84.0ip/45er) in 15 starts this season on the road (the Pirates are 9-6 in his 15 road starts)...Tonight will be Keller's first road start against a National League Central team since he faced the Reds here at Great American Ball Park on June 25 when he won a 9-5 decision.

**SEARCHING FOR A DOZEN WINS:** Keller comes into today looking for his 12th win of the season after winning a career-high 13 games in 2023...Since 1990, the only three Pirates to win at least 12 games in back-to-back seasons are Denny Neagle (1995-96), Doug Drabek (1990-92) and Kevin Correia (2011-12).

**LEAGUE LEADERS:** Keller comes into today ranked 11th in the National League in innings pitched (169.2) and walks per 9.0 innings (2.28), ninth in run support average (5.09) and 10th in pitches per inning (15.8).

**AS A STARTER:** Keller has 129 starts as a member of the Pirates since making his big league debut in 2019...Keller's 129 starts are tied for 39th all time along with Cy Blanton, Bob Klinger and Jason Schmidt.

**AND THE WHIFF:** In 2023, Keller set the club record by a right-handed pitcher with 210 strikeouts, surpassing the previous mark of 209 held by A.J. Burnett in 2013.

- Since the beginning of last season, Keller's 369 strikeouts are the fourth-most among all right-handed pitchers in the National League...The only three National League right-handed pitchers to punch out more batters during that time are Zack Wheeler (417), Freddy Peralta (403) and Aaron Nola (385).

**ON DECK:** The 23-year-old Jones will make his 21st career start tomorrow afternoon...Allowed two runs in 4.0 innings but had a no-decision in his last start on 9/15 against the Royals...Is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (21.1ip/12er) in four starts since being reinstated from the injured list on 8/27 (missed 46 games with a right lat strain)...The Pirates are 5-1 in his last six starts...Ranks seventh among all National League rookies in ERA (3.85) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (120).
