**THE STORY OF US:** Last night, the Mets completed a sweep of the Diamondbacks with a 9-0 shutout victory, as they continue their final road trip (3-0) before the All-Star Break...New York is a major league-best 5-0 in July after posting a 7-19 record in June... Tonight, the team begins its final series first half, a three-game set in San Diego.

**SWEEP NOW:** With last night's victory, the Mets picked up their fourth series sweep of the season and first series sweep since May 30-June 1 vs. Philadelphia...It was the Mets second sweep on the road this year (also, April 14-16 at Oakland)...The last time the Mets swept the D-backs in a three-game series was May 7-9, 2021 in New York...The last time it happened in Arizona was April 14-16, 2014.

**HITS DIFFERENT:** According to *sportradar*, the Mets have won their first five games in July for only the third time in club history, also going 5-0 to begin the month in 1990 and 1991...New York ended up winning its first 10 games in July of 1991, its longest win streak ever to begin the month.

**BETTER THAN REVENGE:** New York has won a season-high-tying five straight games for the first time since winning five straight games from May 17-May 21...The Mets last win streak longer than five games was a six-game run from September 15-20 last season... Prior to this stretch, the Mets had won consecutive games one time since the start of June, a two-game win streak June 14 vs. New York-AL and June 16 vs. St. Louis.

**STREAK NOW:** New York's pitching staff has posted a 2.00 ERA during their five-game winning streak, the third-best mark in the majors since July 1...Opponents have managed just a .185 batting average over those five games, second-best in MLB since July 1...New York is the last remaining unbeaten team in July.

**CROWDS IN STANDS WENT WILD:** The Mets have won back-to-back series for the first time since taking two out three from the Rays (May 16-18) and sweeping the Guardians (May 19-21)...New York last won more than two consecutive series back in April, when they won four straight series against Miami, San Diego, Oakland and Los Angeles-NL.

**SPARKS FLY:** The Mets hit seven home runs in their series sweep at Arizona, tied for their most in a single series this season...The team has hit 47 home runs in 28 games since June 4 (1.7 HR/game), the third-highest rate and fourth-most homers overall in the majors in that span.

**LONG LIVE:** Kodai Senga's 8.0-inning effort Wednesday was followed up by Carlos Carrasco's 8.0 shutout innings last night...It is the first time the Mets have received at least 8.0 innings from their starter in back-to-back games since August 2-3, 2015, when Noah Syndergaard and Bartolo Colon turned the trick...Courtesy of Sarah Langs... The Mets are 26-4 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 11-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 4-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

**DEATH BY A THOUSAND CUTS:** The Mets had a season-high 17 hits last night, their most in a game since a 19-hit outburst September 25, 2022 at Oakland...New York is slashing .275/.374/.569 as a team in July...They pace the majors with a .943 OPS this month and rank among MLB leaders for July in home runs (12, second), SLG (second), runs per game (6.2, fourth) OBP (fifth), extra-base hits (22, sixth), walks (22, sixth) and average (10th).

**I'VE GOT A BLANK SPACE, BABY:** Last night, the Mets earned their fifth shutout win of the season and first since May 30...Yesterday's 9-0 victory was New York's largest margin of victory in a shutout since a 10-0 win on September 7, 2022 at Pittsburgh... Carlos Carrasco pitched at least 8.0 scoreless innings for the 12th time in his career and first time since May 3, 2022 vs. Atlanta...The last time a Mets starter tossed 8.0 shutout frames was June 14, 2022 (Chris Bassitt 8.0 scoreless innings vs. Milwaukee).

**YOU KNOW I LOVE SOCIAL:** The Mets are playing their fifth series in a time zone three hours behind Eastern Time this season...New York is 10-3 those 13 games...The Mets went 3-0 in Oakland, 2-1 at Dodger Stadium, 2-2 in San Francisco in April and went 3-0 in Arizona...New York's West Coast portion of the schedule wraps up this weekend with a three-game set at San Diego.

**ELECTRIC TOUCH:** Pete Alonso blasted his 26th home run of the season last night, a 371-foot line drive that had a maximum height of 39 feet, the lowest of any of the 3,048 home runs hit in the majors this year...It was also the lowest max height on any of Alonso's 172 career home runs...Alonso ranks second in the NL and third in the majors with 26 home runs...He is tied for sixth in the majors and ranks third in the NL with 61 RBI...He has recorded 60+ RBI in the first half for the third time in his career (also, 2019, 2022)...He and David Wright (2006, 2008, 2010) are the only Mets to do that three times.

**MR. SMILE, PERFECTLY FINE:** Last night, Francisco Lindor had his first career five-hit game, going 5-5 with two triples and a solo homer...He is the second Met with two triples and a home run in the same game, joining Joe Christopher (August 18, 1964)... He became just the seventh player in the modern era (since 1901) with five or more hits, including two triples and at least one home run, in a single game...The last player to do so was Dmitri Young on May 6, 2003, with the others being Willie Mays (1958), Hoot Evers (1950), Rogers Hornsby (1916), Cy Seymour (1907) and Harry Davis (1901)...Over his last 17 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .328 (20-61) with 16 runs, three doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, 10 walks and five steals with a 1.157 OPS...He had a seven-RBI game earlier this season...Only two other Mets have accomplished both feats in the same season: Yoenis Cespedes (2015 - in the same game) and Carlos Delgado (2008 - separate games).

**PADRES-METS NOTES:** The Mets and Padres met in the Postseason for the first time in franchise history last year...New York has won three of their last four season series with San Diego.

**NEVER GROW UP:** Francisco Alvarez has homered in three straight games for the first time in his career...He has four long balls in his last five appearances...His 16 homers this season are the most by any catcher in the majors and the third-most among rookies... Alvarez has eclipsed Travis d'Arnaud's previous franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Alvarez's 16 home runs are tied for the second-most in a season by a catcher in his age-21 season or younger with Darrell Porter (16, age 21, 1973) behind Johnny Bench (26, age 21, 1969)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

**I BET YOU THINK ABOUT SD:** Jeff McNeil made his major league debut against the Padres on July 24, 2018 and singled in his first career at-bat that day...McNeil leads all current Mets with a .333 average (15-45) and .909 OPS against San Diego in 16 career games against the club...Tommy Pham has hit .301 (34-113) with a .924 OPS in 32 appearances against the Friars...Max Scherzer, Sunday's scheduled starter against San Diego, is 7-3 with a 2.76 ERA (35 ER/114.1 IP) and 156 strikeouts in 18 regular-season starts against the club...His 12.28 K/9 rate vs. the Padres is the best all-time (min. 100.0 IP).

**GETAWAY CAR:** New York has been successful in all eight of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 69 steals in 76 attempts...Their 69 steals are tied for eighth in the majors and tied for fifth in the NL...The team's 90.8 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 43 of their last 44 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 23 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 337 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

**REMEMBER THIS MOMENT:** Brandon Nimmo is tied for fourth in the majors with nine home runs since July 8...Nimmo now has 13 home runs, tied for his most before the All-Star break in his career (also, 2018)...Seven of his 13 homers have tied the game or given New York the lead...He has a .899 OPS over his last 25 games with three doubles, nine homers, 20 RBI and 14 runs...He is tied for third in the majors and shares the NL lead with nine game-winning RBI this season and tied for fourth in the NL and tied for seventh in the majors with 16 go-ahead RBI.

**CALL YOUR OWN SHOTS:** Mark Canha's go-ahead RBI triple in the ninth inning on July 5 represented his fourth game-winning RBI since May 31...Canha has been responsible for driving in the game-winning run in four of the last eight Mets wins he has appeared in... Over that span (since May 31), he is slashing .283/.405/.517 with three doubles, a triple, three homers, 14 RBI and six runs.

**SHINING LIKE FIREWORKS:** On July 4-5, David Robertson recorded a save on back-to-back days for the third time this season (also, April 15-16 and May 30-31)...He recorded his 13th save of the year Wednesday night...The veteran right-hander has posted a 2-2 record with 13 saves and a 1.88 ERA (8 ER/38.1 IP) in 35 appearances this season...He has walked 11, while striking out 45...He ranks seventh in ERA among NL relievers...He is tied for 17th in the NL with 45 punchouts as a reliever...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .189 (13-74) average this year.

**THE BEST THING THAT'S EVER BEEN MINE:** On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that Pete Alonso was selected to the National League All-Star team...He will join the NL All-Star squad as they square off against the AL All-Stars on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...This is Alonso's third career All-Star nod, tied with Keith Hernandez for the most by a Mets first baseman...Alonso is the 13th Met in club history to make at least three All-Star rosters.

**THIS IS LOOKING LIKE A CONTEST:** Alonso also announced Sunday night that he will participate in the 2023 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)...He will be the 10th player to compete in the HR Derby at least four times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six), Albert Pujols (five), Lance Berkman (four), Robinson Canó (four) and David Ortiz (four).

**LET'S HEAR THE APPLAUSE:** Congrats to Head Performance Coach Dustin Clarke who will manage the NL's strength and conditioning at the 2023 All-Star Game in Seattle, WA...Clarke is in his ninth season as the head performance coach and his 13th season in the organization.

**NEXT CHAPTER:** RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

### VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his third win of the season after allowing one unearned run over 7.0 innings on July 1 vs. San Francisco...Allowed five hits, one walks and struck out six batters... Was his fifth quality start of the season and his third over his last four starts.

**MILESTONES AND MORE:** Tonight, Verlander will make his 494th career start, tying Mark Buehrle for the fifth-most in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995)...With six more starts after tonight, Verlander will join CC Sabathia (560), Bartolo Colon (552), Zack Greinke (532) and Andy Pettitte (521) as the only pitchers to make 500 starts in the Wild Card Era...Verlander ranks 25th in major league history with 332 quality starts and is five shy of tying Walter Johnson, Jim Palmer and Rick Reuschel for 22nd all-time...Verlander is the active leader in career wins with 247 and is three wins shy of becoming the 49th player in major league history to reach the 250-career win mark.

**INNINGS EATER:** Verlander has gone at least 6.0 innings in six of his 11 starts this season... In those starts, Verlander has a 1.76 ERA (8 ER/41.0 IP) and a 0.78 WHIP...Verlander has allowed one or zero runs in five of those starts.

**GO WEST YOUNG MAN:** In 20 career starts against NL West opponents, Verlander is 14-2 with a 2.50 ERA (37 ER/133.1 IP), a 0.99 WHIP, a 10.67 SO/9 rate and a .580 opponent's OPS...16 of those starts have been quality starts and Verlander has recorded eight or more strikeouts in 10 of those starts.

**3K AND COUNTING:** Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 34 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**A TRUE COMEBACK STORY:** In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)... Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

**LIKE A FINE WINE:** Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

**THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF:** Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (2-6, 6.61)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.0 innings and allowed one run on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts for the Mets in their 7-2 win at Citi Field against San Francisco on 7/2.

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Peterson took home International League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of May 15-21 after throwing 8.0 scoreless innings and striking out nine batters in a win over the Norfolk Tides on May 21.
