METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets silenced the Phillies, 2-0, last night...The Mets are looking for their second series victory of the season...Today, the Mets finish their first road trip of the year, a two-city, seven-game series against Washington (3-1) and Philadelphia (1-1)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Assistant Hitting Coach Jeremy Barnes celebrates his birthday today.

BLANK STREET: The Mets earned their second shutout of the season last night... It was just the sixth time the Mets have blanked the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park... The last time the Mets held the Phils to zero runs in Philadelphia was when they notched a 10-0 victory on August 10, 2017.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 4-0 with a 1.20 ERA (four earned runs/30.0 innings) with two walks and 34 strikeouts...The club's starters have held opponents to a .141 batting average through the team's first six games...The team ranks second in the majors and in the NL with a 1.20 starter's ERA as well as with 34 punchouts...Their 30.0 innings pitched from starting pitchers is second in the majors.

MAXIMUM OVERDRIVE: Max Scherzer has won 12 consecutive decisions and his teams have won each of his last 14 regular season starts...He is unbeaten in his last 20 starts, going 12-0 since June 4, 2021 with a 2.64 ERA (34 earned runs/116.0 innings) to go along with 147 strikeouts and just 23 walks in that span...His teams have won each of his last 14 regular season starts dating back to July 18, 2021...A win today would tie his career-best winning streak...He won a career-high 13 consecutive decisions to begin the 2013 season (April 6-July 3, 2013), a year that culminated in the first of his three Cy Young Awards.

IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY IN PHILADELPHIA: Today, Scherzer will make his 26th career start against the Phillies...His 2.50 ERA (44 earned runs/158.2 innings) against the Phillies is his best against any National League East opponent...It is his fifth-best career ERA against any opponent he has faced (min. 10 starts) behind Toronto (2.48), Chicago-AL (2.43), Tampa Bay (2.41) and Arizona (2.38).

YOU CAN TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Scherzer is 8-1 with a 2.23 ERA (19 earned runs/76.2 innings) in 12 starts at Citizens Bank Park...His teams are 11-1 when he starts a game in this ballpark (only loss was September 2, 2020)...He has never allowed more than three runs at CBP and has held the Phillies to seven hits or fewer in all 12 of his outings here...Each of his last five starts against the Phils have come in the City of Brotherly Love (today's will make six in a row)...He has not faced Philadelphia in his home ballpark since 2019, when he made all three of his starts against the club at Nationals Park...The last time he squared off against the Phillies at home and on the road in the same season was 2018.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz recorded his first save of the season last night... It was his 65th as a member of the Mets...That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 9-14 with 65 saves, a 3.94 ERA (65 earned runs/148.1 innings) with 60 walks and 242 strikeouts...His 242 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (277) and Josh Hader (275) have struck out more...Additionally, his 242 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is 7-21 (.333) with five runs, a double, a triple, a home run and two walks in five games this year...Nimmo batted .292/.401/.437 with 51 runs, 17 doubles, three triples, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 54 walks, five steals with an .838 OPS in 92 games last year...His career .393 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

CITY OF BROTHERLY LOVE: Luis Guillorme is 8-20 (.400) with two runs, a double, three RBI and four walks in 14 games at Citizens Bank Park...Jeff McNeil has hit .324 (34-105) at the ballpark with eight doubles, a triple, a home run, six RBI and nine walks...Dominic Smith has hit to a .308 (32-104) mark with 13 runs, seven doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 15 RBI there...His seven home runs are his highest total for any opponent's ballpark.

OUCH: The Mets have been hit seven times this year, which is second in the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 314 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 41 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 55 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso currently ranks 14th in Mets history with 107 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

PHILS-METS NOTES: Last night, the Mets earned their 500th win against the Phillies in franchise history...The team's 500 wins are its most against any single opponent.

SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER: The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on April 15, the Mets' home opener...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992... He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

A STARLING IS BORN: In 27 career games in Philly, Starling Marte has hit .381 (40-105) with 19 runs, 12 doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, six walks and nine steals with a .435 OBP and a .610 SLG...He is a .392 (80-204) career average vs. the Phillies... That is the fifth-highest average all-time for any player against any one opponent (min. 175 at-bats)...Has hit safely in 42 of his 52 games played against the Phils.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has reached base safely in each of his five games this year...He is batting .471 (8-17) with two runs, three RBI, four walks and a 1.042 OPS this season...He is sixth in the majors in batting average and fifth in OBP (.571)...He is tied for fourth in times on base at 12...Canha has posted a .380 OBP since 2019...That ranks sixth in the major leagues during that span.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are now 4-2 against the NL East this season... Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 4-2 on the road this year...The team finished the 2021 season going 30-51 (.370) with a 4.39 ERA, 224 walks and 686 strikeouts on the road...The team's 30 wins were tied for 23rd in the majors...Outside of 2020, the team's 30 road wins were the fewest for the franchise since they went 29-52 in 2009...Despite this, the Mets' 686 road strikeouts were a franchise record, edging the 2019 Mets by one punchout.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES: The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodríguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS: Buck Showalter became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,555.

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami... Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

LAST TIME OUT: Scherzer today will toe the rubber for his 400th career start...In his last outing, tossed a quality start to earn the win in his Mets debut at Nationals Park on April 8, defeating his former squad...Was pitching in D.C as a visitor for the first time in his career...In 6.0 innings, allowed three runs on three hits, including one home run, with a walk and six strikeouts...Became the first Mets starter to win his team debut since David Peterson won his major league debut in Boston on July 28, 2020.

2021 RECAP: Signed with the Mets on December 1, 2021...Was traded from Washington to the Dodgers on the day of the trade deadline last season...Led the majors in WHIP (career-best 0.86) and opponent batting average (.185)...Had the second-best ERA (career-best 2.46) in the majors and ranked fourth in strikeouts (236)...Notched his ninth career 200-strikeout season...Started the NL Wild Card Game for LA, throwing 4.1 innings of one-run ball in a 3-1 win over St. Louis...Made two appearances in the NLDS against the Giants and recorded the final out of the decisive Game 5 in that series to earn his first career MLB save...Made one start in the NLCS against Atlanta...Finished third in the NL Cy Young vote, his sixth career top-3 finish.

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (1-0, 0.00)

LAST TIME OUT: In his Mets debut, Bassitt faced the Nationals for the first time in his career in Washington D.C. on April 9...He pitched a three-hitter across 6.0 scoreless innings striking out eight and walking one with 93 total pitches.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Became the second Mets pitcher to debut with a line of at least 6.0 scoreless innings with eight or more strikeouts...The only other Mets debut of 6.0 or more innings, no runs and eight or more strikeouts was Collin McHugh's MLB debut in 2012.
