**TONIGHT'S TILT...**the Mariners continue a 7-game road trip with the 3rd of 4 games against the Houston Astros (2-0)...Seattle is coming off a 3-game set at the White Sox (1-2)...following the 4-game set in Houston, the Mariners will return home for a 6-game homestand against the Padres (3 G, 5/15-17) and White Sox (3 G, 5/18-20)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Dave Valle** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as sideline reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners won 3-1 over the Astros last night...the Mariners are 11-7 over their last 18 games (4/22-c).

- **Hold Me Close** - Seattle leads MLB, playing 16 1-run games and going 6-10 in those contests this season...they also rank 2nd, playing 24 games decided by 2-runs or fewer...dating back to 2021, Seattle has played an MLB-leading 283 1-run games, going 156-127 (.551), ranking 2nd in winning percentage to only the Milwaukee Brewers (.568/138-105).
- **Bat Control** - **J.P. Crawford** is 1-of-16 players with more walks than strikeouts this season (min. 100 PA).
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 15-7 when they score 4 or more runs.
- **Roster Move** - Today the Mariners announced that RHP **Bryce Miller** was reinstated from the 15-day Injured List and LHP **José Suarez** was designated for assignment.
- **Upcoming TV Schedule** - The Mariners upcoming weekend series against the Padres (May 15-17) will be televised on **Mariners TV** on Friday, **FOX** on Saturday and **Peacock** on Sunday.

**BIG TEX IS BACK...****Bryce Miller** was activated off the Injured List today and will make his season debut after missing the start of the season with a left oblique strain...he made 4 rehab starts between High-A Everett and Triple-A Tacoma holding a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts...Miller was limited by two separate IL stints in 2025 for right elbow inflammation, but excelled during the Postseason, going 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 ER, 14.1 IP) in 3 starts.

**ASTRONOMIC SUCCESS...**the Mariners have won 9-consecutive games against the Astros (9/17-c), including back-to-back series sweeps (3 G, 9/17-19, 2025 and 4 G, 4/10-13, 2026)...Seattle's 9-game winning streak against the Astros is their longest against Houston in Mariners history (previous: 6 G, 7/19-8/31/13)...during the streak, Seattle has outscored Houston 59-26...Seattle has captured the season series against the Astros in each of the last 3 seasons (2023-c), going a combined 31-14 during that span.

**RANDYLAND...****Randy Arozarena** yesterday went 4-for-4 with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP and 1 SB in yesterday's game, his 8th career 4-hit game and first with the Mariners (last: 7/20/24 at NYY w/TB)...it also marked his 2nd career game with 4 runs (last: 7/12/25 at DET) and 4th career game reaching base safely 5 times (last: 6/4/24 at MIA w/TB)...he also became the 2nd player in Mariners history with a home run, stolen base and 2+ doubles in a game, joining Alex Rodriguez (4/20/98 vs. KC)...Randy has been outstanding this season, batting .303 (47x155) with 31 runs, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 10 stolen bases, a .389 OBP and slugging .465 for an .853 OPS in 43 games.

**MANGIA...****Dominic Canzone** set a career-high with 5 RBI last night, hitting his first career grand slam in the 4th inning...over his last 20 games since April 17, he is batting .311 (14x45) with 5 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 11 RBI and an .871 OPS.

**HOT ROD...**since April 3, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .303 (44x145) with 8 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and an .860 OPS...during that span, he ranks 8th in the AL in average and 14th in wRC+ (146)...over his last 16 games since April 25, he is batting .319 (22x69) with 5 doubles, 6 home runs, 11 RBI and .990 OPS...during that span he ranks 9th in the AL in OPS and T-6th in fWAR (0.8).

**NAYLOR HAS BEEN SAILING...****Josh Naylor** has been exceptional as of late, batting .366 (30x82) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 8 stolen bases, a .411 OBP and slugging .524 for a .936 OPS over his last 21 games (4/17-c)...during that span, he ranks 3rd in average, 10th in OBP, 11th in wRC+ (170) and T-1st in SB in the American League...Naylor is 27-for-29 (93.1%) in stolen base attempts with Seattle, ranking 2nd in stolen base percentage trailing only James Jones (93.3%) and ranking just ahead of teammate **Victor Robles** (92.5%) among players with at least 25 attempts.

**FEELING STAFFY...**the Mariners pitching staff has been among the best in the Majors this season, combining for a 3.67 ERA, 105 walks and 370 strikeouts...among MLB pitching staffs they rank 1st in SO/BB (3.52), 1st in BB% (6.6%), T-2nd in quality starts (20), 8th in ERA and T-7th in WHIP (1.22)...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 246.0 IP and ranks 10th with a 3.91 ERA...Mariners relievers rank 4th with a 3.23 ERA.

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...**following the current 4-game set in Houston, the Mariners return home for a 6-game homestand against the San Diego Padres (3 G, 5/15-17) and Chicago White Sox (3 G, 5/18-20)...promotions and events on the homestand include **Hello Kitty Clear Crossbody Bag Night** (May 15), **Salute to Armed Forces Night** (May 16), the **Vedder Cup finale** (May 17), **Josh Naylor Bobblehead** (May 18 and May 19), as well as **Mariners Value Games** (May 18-20)...for more information, visit [Mariners.com/tickets](http://Mariners.com/tickets).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW...**the Mariners have won 9-consecutive games against the Astros dating back to Sept. 17, 2025, their longest winning streak against Houston in club history, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that with a win today, Seattle would capture the 4th 10-game winning streak against an individual opponent in team history?...Seattle's franchise record streak against an opponent is a 13-game streak against the Athletics from July 23, 2021-May 23, 2022...Seattle also has 10-game winning streaks against the Royals (10 G, June 14-Sept. 24, 1985) and Orioles (10 G, June 22, 2000-May 31, 2001).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his season debut tonight against Houston...it marks his 75th career start and his 7th career start against the Astros.
Is kicking off his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...

in his last rehab start with High-A Everett on May 6, he threw 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing 2 hits and 3 walks...he finished with 61 pitches (38 strikes) in his 4th rehab appearance.

"I think I built up really well...The body's responded 100%. ... It's been a month and a half since I felt anything in the oblique. We're fully past that. The last four starts have just been Spring Training for me, trying to build up, work on stuff, see stuff play in game.

"I'm ready to go...I'm glad that I've been up here and I can be at the home games, but it's not the same...I'm ready to get back on the field and help the team put some zeroes up and string some wins together."

REHAB RECAP...

made 4 rehab starts between Triple-A Tacoma and High-A Everett from April 18-May 6, accumulating a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) with 9 hits and 7 walks allowed to 14 strikeouts.

ON THE IL...

started the 2026 season on the 15-day Injured List with a left oblique strain, retroactive to March 22...also spent two separate stints on the 15-day IL in 2025 with right elbow inflammation: May 12-30 and June 7-18.

THE TOTALS...

went 4-6 with a 5.68 ERA (57 ER, 90.1 IP) and 74 strikeouts to 34 walks allowed while posting a 1.406 WHIP to a .267 opponents' batting average across 18 starts in 2025.

2025 POSTSEASON...

made his Postseason debut last year in Game 4 of the American League Division Series on Oct. 8, 2025 at DET, tossing 4.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 4 hits with 2 strikeouts...across 3 Postseason starts last year, he combined for a 2.51 ERA (4 ER, 14.1 IP) with 9 total strikeouts...he tossed 6.0 innings of 1-run, 2-hit baseball in his second Postseason start in Game 1 of the Americal League Championship Series at Toronto.

BIG TEX...

has pitched historically well against the Houston Astros, combining for a 4-1 record with a 2.55 ERA (10 ER, 35.1 IP) and 25 strikeouts to just 23 hits allowed across 6 career starts...last faced the Astros in their home ball park on 9/23/24, going 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing only 2 hits, 2 walks and striking out 5 batters...5-of-6 of his outings against the Astros have been quality starts while 3 have been scoreless 6.0+ inning starts...2 of Miller's 3 scoreless outings have taken place in Houston and he has yet to lose a game in Daikin Park...Miller's 0.724 WHIP in Daikin Park ranks 3rd in MLB while his 1.86 ERA ranks 12th and his .149 opponent batting average ranks 3rd (min. 3 GS).

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...

owns a career 10.43 base runners per 9, ranking 13th in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 17 career games with 4 or fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP amassed between 2023-2025 ranks T-7th in MLB, joining rotation-mates Logan Gilbert (21), Bryan Woo (21), George Kirby (17), and Luis Castillo (10) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span.

CRACKING THE WHIP...

ranks 4th among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders with a 1.127 WHIP...his 105 walks are the 7th fewest through a starting pitchers first 74 games with the Mariners while his 348 hits allowed are 2nd fewest, trailing behind Bryan Woo's 326 through his first 74 games...of pitchers starting pitchers in MLB to allowed 105-or-fewer walks in their first 74 career stars, Miller has allowed the 7th fewest hits.

BWARE THE 4-SEAM...

owns a career .287 opponent OBP and a .226 opponent average on his 4-seam...his OBP on his primary pitch ranks 10th in MLB among pitchers that have thrown 2000+ 4-seam fastballs since 2023...his 443 swing and misses on his 4-seam are 14th most in MLB since 2023, despite missing several games to start this season...of pitchers with over 400 whiffs on their 4-seam since 2023, Miller has the 5th lowest BB% (7.5) on the pitch, behind Yusei Kikuchi-LAA (6.3), Bryan Woo (7.2), Joe Ryan-MIN (5.9) George Kirby (5.0).

GOING THE DISTANCE...

has pitched 6.0+ innings in 30 career games and 5.0+ innings in 58 of his 74 career starts...the Mariners are 36-22 when he pitches 5.0+ innings and 23-7 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 9-22 when he tosses fewer than 5.0 innings.

11:0...

tossed a career-high 11 strikeouts on Sept. 11, 2025 vs. LAA, marking the 5th time during the 2025 season a Mariners starter tossed 10+ strikeouts without a walk, joining Luis Castillo (10 SO, 9/24 vs. COL), (George Kirby (2x, last: 14 SO, 9/14 vs. LAA), and Logan Gilbert (10 SO, 7/22 vs. MIL)...with Emerson Hancock's 14 strikeout, no walk outing on May 2 vs. KC, 3 of the last 8 players to record 11+ K's and 0 walks in a start in MLB are Mariners pitchers with Kirby's start on Sept. 14.

300 CLUB...

recorded his 300th career strikeout on April 11, 2025 vs. Texas in his 59th career start, doing so in his home state...became just the 6th pitcher in Mariners history to record 300+ strikeouts in his first 59 career starts, joining Logan Gilbert (322 SO) and George Kirby (318 SO).
