TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the finale of a 9-game homestand (4-4) today with the last of 3 games against the New York Yankees (0-2)...the Mariners split a 2-game set against the San Diego Padres (1-1) to open the homestand, followed by a 4-game series win against the Texas Rangers (3-1)...following today's series finale, Seattle will travel to Texas for a 6-game road trip at the Rangers (3 G, 9/20-9/22) and Houston Astros (3 G, 9/23-9/25)...today's game against the Yankees will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's contest to the Yankees by a 2-1 score in 10 innings...with 10 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 5.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 3.0 games back of Minnesota for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **Series-ly Good** - Seattle owns a 4-2-2 series record over its last 8 series (8/23-c).
- **1-Run Experience** - The Mariners have played in 52 1-run games this season, going 25-27...eight of the Mariners last 11 losses have come by 1 run.
- **What a Relief** - **Troy Taylor** (7th inning) and **Collin Snider** (9th inning) each struck out the side in order in last night's game, the first pair of Mariners relievers to do so in the same game this season.
- **Go Nuts, Modesto** - Mariners Class-A Affiliate Modesto Nuts won the deciding 3rd game of the California League Championship Series by a 2-1 score over the Lake Elsinore Storm, their 2nd-consecutive California League Title.
- **Happy Birthday!!** - **Luke Raley** celebrates his 30th birthday today.

LOGAN GILBERT IS GOOD...**Logan Gilbert** is 7-11 with a 3.24 ERA (69 ER, 191.2 IP), 34 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.89 WHIP in 30 starts this season...Gilbert leads the Majors in WHIP while ranking 2nd in quality starts (22), 3rd in Opp. AVG (.195), T-7th in strikeouts, 12th in ERA and T-8th in fWAR (4.0)...Gilbert is 2 strikeouts shy of becoming the 9th different pitcher (done 22x) in franchise history with 200+ strikeouts in a season and the 3rd different Mariners pitcher in the last 3 seasons, joining Robbie Ray (2022) and **Luis Castillo** (2023).

CAL: SILVER & GOLD FRONTRUNNER...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** leads Major League catchers with 30 home runs...after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, he is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002)...defensively, Cal leads the Majors in catcher caught stealing (26), ranking ahead of Will Smith-LAD (24) and Alejandro Kirk-TOR (23)...after leading the Majors in CCS last season, Raleigh could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in CCS in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83...Raleigh also leads American League catchers in Catcher Framing Runs (13).

THIS JUST IN: TURNER MASHES...**Justin Turner** went 2 for 4 with 1 double, 1 home run and 1 RBI in last night's game...Turner has reached safely in each of his last 13 games (9/4-c), batting .304 (14x46) with 10 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 3 RBI and 9 walks, getting on base at a .411 clip and slugging .543 (.954 OPS).

BIG THUNDER BRINGING THE NOISE...outfielder/first baseman **Luke Raley** is batting .287 (29x101) with 19 runs, 7 doubles, 10 home runs, 26 RBI and 15 walks, getting on base at a .398 clip, slugging .654 with a 1.052 OPS over his last 35 games (8/2-c)...Raley's 1.052 OPS during that span ranks 3rd-highest in MLB (min. 100 PA), trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.163 OPS) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.059), while ranking ahead of Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.011 OPS) and Corbin Carroll-ARI (.991).

STUDLY STARTING...the Mariners starting rotation leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.42), opponent batting average (.224), WHIP (1.03), fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.76), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.54), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.82) and quality starts (89)...the 4.82 SO/BB ratio would be the best in Major League history by starters, ranking ahead of the 2019 Dodgers (4.55 SO/BB)...the 1.03 WHIP is tied for the 2nd-best in MLB history, trailing only the 1908 Chicago White Sox (1.02).

TO THE VICTOR GO THE SPOILS...outfielder **Victor Robles** has reached base safely in 10 consecutive games (9/4-c), batting .531 (17x32) during that span...over the last month (8/17-c), Robles has been one of the best hitters in baseball, batting .444 (32x72) with 15 runs, 8 doubles, 1 home run, 12 RBI, 6 walks, 6 hit-by-pitches and 12 stolen bases, getting on base at a .518 clip, slugging .597 with a 1.115 OPS over his last 22 contests...since Aug. 17, Robles' .444 average leads the Majors (min. 50 AB), ranking ahead of Luis Arráez-SD (.371) and Miguel Rojas-LAD (.356) by a wide margin.

RAKER'S DOZEN...over their last 13 games dating back to Sept. 4, Seattle's offense ranks 2nd in MLB in runs (70), 1st in batting average (.281), 2nd in total bases (212), 2nd in OPS (.837), T-2nd in hits (127) and 1st in extra-base hits (49)...during that span, the Mariners offense has recorded 10+ hits in 8 of 13 games and 4+ walks in 10 of 13 games, while striking out 10+ times in only 4 of 13 games.

QUITE THE QUARTET...the Mariners have 4 pitchers who qualify for the ERA title (at least 162.0 IP): **Logan Gilbert** (191.2 IP), **George Kirby** (179.0), **Luis Castillo** (175.1), and **Bryce Miller** (173.1), marking the first time Seattle has had 4 pitchers toss 162.0+ innings since 2014 (Roenis Elías, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma and Chris Young)...Seattle has had 4 pitchers toss 162.0+ IP all with sub-4.00 ERA's twice in franchise history: 2014 and 1991 (Erik Hanson, Brian Holman, Randy Johnson and Bill Krueger).

FOUR FOUR...over his last 19 contests (8/28-c), center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .346 (28x81) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 5 home runs, 14 RBI, 9 walks and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .402 clip, slugging .580 with a .982 OPS...Julio has hit safely in 15 of those 19 games.

LAZARO IN A CLASS (A) OF HIS OWN...Minor League Baseball announced yesterday that Mariners prospect **Lazaro Montes** has been named a California League All-Star and also California League MVP...the 19-year-old hit .309 (79x256) with 46 runs, 13 doubles, 2 triples, 13 home runs, 72 RBI and 43 walks with a .938 OPS in 65 games for the Class-A Modesto Nuts this season, before being promoted to High-A Everett...the Mariners #3 prospect (MLB.com) was also named the league's "Top MLB prospect"... additionally, infielders **Tai Peete** and **Luis Suisbel** were also named Cal League All-Stars.

AS YOU KNOW...**Justin Turner** hit a game-tying home run in the bottom of the 8th inning of last night's game, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Turner is the 4th player in franchise history age 39-or-older to hit a game-tying or go-ahead home run in the 8th-inning or later?...he is joined by **Edgar Martínez** (5x), Ken Griffey Jr. (2x) and Raúl Ibáñez (2x)...the last Major League player age 39-or-older to hit a game-tying or go-ahead home run in the 8th-inning or later was 42-year-old Albert Pujols on Sept. 11, 2022 at PIT.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season and 2nd against New York-AL...he will also make the 119th start of his MLB career and 6th career start against the Yankees.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 9/14 vs. Texas...spun 6.0 innings and allowed 4 runs on 6 hits (2 home runs), 1 walk, 7 strikeouts...he has thrown 6.0+ frames in 7 of his last 8 starts (8/4-c).

TOP OF HIS LEAGUE...among qualified AL pitchers this season, Gilbert ranks 1st in WHIP (0.89), 1st in quality starts (22), 2nd in innings pitched (191.2), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.196), 3rd in strikeouts (198) and T-8th in ERA (3.24).

LOOKS ARE DECEIVING...this season, despite a 7-11 record, Gilbert has produced a 0.89 WHIP over 191.2 innings...he is 1 of 3 pitchers in Major League history with a losing record, 162.0+ innings pitched and a sub-0.90 WHIP...the only other pitchers to do so are Ed Walsh (1910) and Cy Young (1905).

LUCKY 7...tied for the most starts of 7.0+ scoreless IP in MLB...has totaled 5 of those outings (38.0 IP) this season (8/10 vs. NYM, 7/14 at LAA, 6/22 at MIA, 6/16 vs. TEX and 5/4 at HOU) tied with Framber Valdez-HOU and Dylan Cease-SD.

30 TIMES OUT...through his 30 starts this season, opposing hitters are batting .196 (136x693) against Gilbert...Randy Johnson is the only pitcher in franchise history that has ever finished a season with a sub-.200 opponent average against (1997, .194)...so far this season he has allowed 181 baserunners, 2nd-fewest in franchise history through 30 starts...trailing only Bryce Miller from this season with 175 baserunners allowed.

SPLIT SECOND DECISION...hitters this season are batting .094 (8x85) against Gilbert's splitter with 3 doubles and 1 home run...the .094 average is the 3rd-lowest in the Majors and the 2nd-lowest in the AL against a splitter (min. 60 PA).

WHIPPING IT UP...his 0.89 WHIP is the lowest qualified WHIP in franchise history, on pace to be 1 of 4 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a single season, joined by teammate Bryce Miller (0.99)...since making his MLB debut, Gilbert trails only Tarik Skubal (1.04) for the lowest WHIP in the American League (1.07) (min. 500 IP).

FEELING SUPPORTED...is 36-0 in his career when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 44-10.

QUALITY MIDSET...22 of his 30 starts have been quality starts, most in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors...he has gone 6.0+ innings in 25 of his 30 starts...the Mariners are 13-12 when he pitches in 6.0+ innings.

ALL-STAR CALIBER...on July 7, was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-star break led AL starters with 132.1 IP, 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/21) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.

30 FOR 30 FOR 30...made his 30th start of the season in his last start on 9/14 vs. TEX, his 3rd consecutive season with 30+ starts...he is now the 9th different pitcher (10th time) in franchise history to accomplish this feat...the last to do so was Félix Hernández who put together 10 straight seasons from 2006-2015.

COMPLETE PACKAGE...he tossed his 2nd career complete game on 9/7 at STL (also: 7/4/23 at SF) and a had career-low for hits allowed in a complete game (2)...it was the first complete game loss with 2-or-less hits allowed in franchise history since Félix Hernández did so on 9/23/10 at Toronto.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...he is posting a 67.5% 1st pitch strike rate, the highest of his career...among pitchers with 160.0+ IP, this is the 2nd-highest in the AL.
