METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cubs, 8-5, last night at Wrigley Field...New York has won two of their last three games...The Mets are 6-4 over their last 10 games...They are 31-20 this season in series openers and 15-10 in series openers on the road...The Mets have secured a winning season...The Mets continue their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip (2-1) to Chicago (2-1) and Miami (three games).

23 AND ME: Last night, Nolan McLean struck out a career-high 11 batters... Entering yesterday, 23 different Mets rookies had 10+ strikeouts in a game at least once...The last was Kodai Senga in 2023 (5 times, last on 9/14 vs. Arizona)... The team record is 16 by Dwight Gooden, who did it in two straight starts in 1984 (9/12 vs. PIT, 9/17 at Philadelphia)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

DIRTY 30S: The Mets feature three players with 30 + homers - Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor and Juan Soto...This is the first time in franchise history that the Mets have featured three players with 30+ homers in season...The Mets are one of three teams with three players with 30+ homers (also, Yankees and Athletics).

30/30: Lindor and Soto join Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB)...According to Sarah Langs, the Mets have had eight individual 30/30 seasons, the most of any franchise.

THE SIXTH SENSE: Lindor has recorded three straight seasons with 30+ homers...He has six seasons with 30+ homers, which is the second-most 30-HR seasons as a primary SS in MLB history (min 50% games at SS), behind only Alex Rodriguez (seven seasons)...He broke a tie with Ernie Banks...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

ATTABOY ALVY: Over the last 10 games, Francisco Alvarez has batted .323 (10-31) with seven runs, two doubles, four homers, eight RBI, three walks, a .417 OBP and a .774 SLG...In 38 games following the All-Star break, Alvarez is batting .286/370/598 with nine doubles, one triple, eight homers, 21 RBI and 13 walks... This compares to a .236/319/333 slashline with three doubles, three homers, 11 RBI and 13 walks in 35 games prior to the break.

POSTING UP: Pete Alonso appeared in all 159 Mets games this year...Last season, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975) - not including 2020...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...Last year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022)...Alonso has appeared in 413 consecutive games, which is the second-longest streak in the majors (Matt Olson - 780 games, 5/2/21-current)...His streak of 413 consecutive games is the longest in team history.

40/40 CLUB: The Mets have never featured a team with two 40+ homer players...The last team to feature two players with 40+ homers was the 2024 Yankees (Aaron Judge and Juan Soto).

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won three of their last four games at loanDepot park...Overall, they are 61-53 at the ballpark.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: Through 22 games in September, Pete Alonso is slashing .287/340/552 with five doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, six walks and 11 runs...His 123 RBI are the second-most in the majors and are the fourth-most in a single season in Mets history...Since he joined the league in 2019, Alonso has hit 263 home runs, the third-most in that span behind Aaron Judge (281) and Kyle Schwarber (266).

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 124 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season...He has five seasons of 120+ walks, the fifth-most such seasons in Major League history...Only Barry Bonds (11), Babe Ruth (10), Eddie Yost (8) and Ted Williams (8) have had more such seasons.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed four runs over 4.0 innings on September 19 vs. Washington in his third career Major League start...Issued two walks and struck out five batters...Marked his shortest outing of his career so far...Has not allowed a home runs through his first three Major League starts...Is one of 11 pitchers in franchise history to allow zero home runs through their first three Big League starts and the first since Mike Pelfrey in 2006.

SECOND START SUCCESS: In his second career Big League start and Citi Field debut, September 13 vs. Texas, Sproat fired 6.0 scoreless innings and did not issue a walk...He became the 12th pitcher in franchise history to record 6.0 or more scoreless innings in one of their first two Major League starts and the first since Steven Matz (7/5/15 at LAD) and joined Jason Jacome and Tyler Yates as the only pitchers in franchise history to throw 6.0 scoreless innings and not allow a walk in of their first two Big League starts...Additionally, Sproat became the 14th pitcher in franchise history to record a quality start in each of his first two Major League games.

DEBUT NOTES: Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings, allowed three hits, issued four walks and struck out seven in his Major League debut on September 7 vs. Cincinnati...Sproat joined Matt Harvey (11), Collin McHugh (9), Bill Denehy (8), Nolan McLean (8), Tom Seaver (8), Kodai Senga (8), Brent Strom, Randy Tate, Zack Wheeler and Masato Yoshii as the only pitchers in franchise history to record seven or more strikeouts in their Major League debut...Additionally, Sproat joined McHugh, Yoshii, Strom, Denehy Dillon Gee, Brian Bannister and Jason Irsinghausen as the only pitchers in franchise history to record a quality start and allow three or fewer hits in their Major League debut...The right-hander did not allow a hit through his first 5.1 innings of work, tied with Brian Bannister (4/5/06 vs. WAS) for the longest no-hit bid by a Met in their Major League debut...Courtesy of *Elias*.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Brandon Sproat became the eighth Met (seventh pitcher) to make their debut this season, joining Hayden Senger, Justin Hagenman, Blade Tidwell, Jonathan Pintaro, Alex Carrillo, Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...The Mets have had four different pitchers make their debut this season as a starter (also: Tidwell, McLean and Tong) which is the most in a single season in franchise history and the most by a team this season...The previous most was when the Mets had three players make their debut as a starter in 1967, 1982 and 2006...He became the 45th pitcher to make an appearance for the club, tying a Major League record (also: 2024 Miami Marlins)...With McLean and Tong, it was the first time in franchise history the Mets have had three pitchers debut as a starter in a 21-game span...The last team to do so were the 2023 Cleveland Guardians (Peyton Battenfield, Logan Allen and Tanner Bibee)...Courtesy of *Elías*.

SMETS: Spent the entire season with the Syracuse Mets, combining to go 8-6 with a 4.24 ERA (57 ER/121.0 IP), 53 walks and 113 strikeouts over 26 games (25 starts)...Made his last start with the team on August 30 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and earned the win after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 9 K)...His nine strikeouts tied a season high (also: July 19 and July 31) and it was the second time this season he has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (also: July 10)...Among qualified Triple-A pitchers this season, was first in opponents' BA (.218), tied for third in games started, fourth in WHIP (1.24), and eighth in ERA...In 11 appearances (10 starts) since June 28 (G1), he has gone 5-1 with a 2.44 ERA (16 ER/59.0 IP), 21 walks and 70 strikeouts...Over that span, his .163 opponents' BA is the best in Triple-A, his strikeouts and WHIP (0.93) are both second, and his 2.44 ERA (in 11 appearances) is the fourth-best...In 10 starts in that span, he posted a 1.79 ERA (11 ER/55.1 IP)...Sproat has pitched at least 5.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer in nine of those starts...He was named the International League Pitcher of the Year for the month of July after going 2-0 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER/27.0 IP), eight walks and 33 strikeouts...He pitched 5.0 innings in all five July starts, completing seven innings in one of those outings.

RIISING THROUGH THE RANKS: Sproat is currently the Mets' No. 5 prospect and the No. 3 pitching prospect behind teammates Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...He was the No. 13 Mets prospect in 2024, starting the season with High-A Brooklyn...He made five appearances (four starts) with the Cyclones before being promoted to Double-A Binghamton on May 13, 2024...Sproat made 11 appearances with the Rumble Ponies and was then promoted again to Triple-A Syracuse on August 5...In his first professional season, combined across High-A, Double-A and Triple-A to go 7-4 with a 3.40 ERA (44 ER/116.1 IP), 42 walks and 131 strikeouts in 24 appearances (23 starts)...After the season, he was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year and a Postseason All-Star...He was also named to the 2024 MLB All-Star Futures Game roster.

DRAFT DAY x3: Was originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the seventh round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Pace High School in Pace, Florida but did not sign...Was then drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...Forwent signing with the Mets to play in his senior year at UF where he pitched in the 2023 NCAA Men's College World Series Finals...Was drafted again by the Mets in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...Sproat has since spent parts of two seasons (2024-25) in the Mets organization, combining to go 15-10 with a 3.83 ERA (101 ER/237.1 IP), 95 walks and 244 strikeouts.

- Entered in relief in the second inning on September 23 at Chicago-NL and threw 2.2 innings while not allowing an earned run (2.2 IP, H, R, 2 K).
- Tossed 1.2 scoreless innings in relief on September 20 vs. Washington (1.2 IP, K)...Marked his 12th scoreless relief outing of at least 1.2 innings, which are tied for the ninth-most such games in the majors and the seventh most in the NL this season.
- Made his first appearance since being recalled on September 19 vs. Washington and allowed a two-run homer after entering in the fifth (0.1 IP, 2 H, 2 ER, K, HR).
- Was recalled on September 18 for his fourth stint with the team this season...This season he has gone 5-2 with two saves, 12 holds and a 3.69 ERA (25 ER/61.0 IP) through 50 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .226 average (49-217)...Right-handed hitters have batted .194 (25-129) against him compared to a .273 average against left-handers (24-88)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .168 average (18-107)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth best in franchise history through as many games.
- He tossed 3.1 scoreless innings in relief on September 12 vs. Texas...Marked the second-longest scoreless outing of his career (longest: 3.2 IP, 6/8/24 MIA vs. CLE) and his longest appearance of the season.
- Allowed one run over 1.0 inning and earned a hold on August 26 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 3 H, ER).

- In 10 games with Syracuse he posted a 5.93 ERA (9 ER/13.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts...Seven of his 10 appearances were scoreless.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- 15 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...13 of those appearances have been scoreless.
