METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Washington Nationals, 9-3, yesterday... The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...They are 1-2 in that span...The Mets have dropped back-to-back games after a three-game winning streak...New York hits the road for a six-game trip (1-2) against the Nationals (1-2) and Braves (three games)...Following this series the Mets return to New York for a seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Marlins (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: Next week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation... Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER: The Mets are 5-13 in August...In 18 games this month, the Mets are batting .263/.334/.472 with 32 doubles, 32 home runs, 94 RBI and 63 $\,$ $walks... They \ rank\ third\ in\ the\ National\ League\ with\ an\ .805\ OPS... The\ pitching\ staff$ has posted a 5.21 ERA during August, the fifth-highest mark in the Senior Circuit.

THE ROOKIE: Tonight, Nolan McLean is set to make his second career Major League start...On August 16 vs. Seattle, McLean earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight in his debut...He joined $\hbox{Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or}\\$ $more\ batters, and\ allow\ zero\ runs\ in\ their\ Major\ League\ Debut... His\ eight\ strike outs$ are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver. Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...He became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

LET'S GO STREAKING: Francisco Lindor is on a nine-game hitting streak. batting .500 (19-38) with 10 runs, four doubles, four homers, eight RBI, four walks, two steals, a .548 OBP and a .921 SLG in that span.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons... His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darrly Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 26-36 on the road this year (.419 winning percentage)...New York has 19 remaining road games on their schedule...The team has not won back-to-back road games since sweeping the Giants in San Francisco from July 25-27.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 1-2 in that span...The Mets are batting .263/.334/.472 against the NL East, while posting a 4.08 ERA.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has reached base safely in nine straight games, posting a .412 OBP in that span...In 13 games this month, Baty is batting .333 (13-39) with 10 runs, four homers, seven RBI, five walks, a steal, a .409 OBP and a .641 SLG... In 25 games following the All-Star break, Baty is batting .282/.352/.526 with 17 $\,$ runs, one double, six homers, 11 RBI, nine walks and an .878 OPS...He has recorded a career-high 15 home runs in 100 games this season.

RISPY BUSINESS: In 18 games in August, the Mets are batting .341 (47-138) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 65 RBI, 22 walks, a .414 OBP, and a .565 SLG with RISP...Their .341 average is second in the majors and tops in the National League in August.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped four straight regular season games at Truist Park...They are 26-41 since the ballpark opened in

RETURN OF THE MARK: Over the last four games, Mark Vientos is 5-14 with two runs, one double, two home runs, two walks for a 1.269 OPS...He is batting .263 (20-76) with five runs, five doubles, three homers, 14 RBI and a .731 OPS after the All-Star break.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 98 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With two more walks, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Brandon Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees, Angels and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 31 home runs and 20 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 25 home runs and 20 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

NOLAN MCLEAN'S HIGHS

LAST TIME OUT: Made his Major League Debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joins Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Becomes the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh)...He is the fourth starter in the majors this season to record eight or more strike? Outs in their Major League debut (also: Mick Abel 9, Logan Henderson 9, and Chase Burns).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: He became the sixth player (fifth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro and Blade Tidwell...He is also the 43rd pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record topping the previous high of 42 in 2021.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: The Mets number three prospect and the number 37 prospect in baseball according to MLBPipeline.com, appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguer players...He has only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 HR...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: In his first start he threw his sweeper 36.3% of the time and generated a 26.7% whiff rate...In the minors, he threw his sweeper 28.4% of the time and recorded 51 swings and misses with the pitch...Opposing hitters only hit .186 (17-91) in at-bats ending with his sweeper.

LET ME GET A WHIFF: In the minors he had a 12.5% whiff percentage this year...Of his 1,363 pitches, he has generated whiffs at least 20 times with four different pitches in his arsenal...Sweeper (51 pitches), Curveball (30 pitches), sinker (29 pitches), and 4-seam fastball (28 pitches).

CAREER: Overall, in three minor league seasons he has posted a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and has recorded 245 strikeouts, good for a K/9 of 9.72In three seasons at Oklahoma State he finished with a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP) and recorded 76 strikeouts good for a K/9 of 11.93.

- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career sixout save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last three outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- In 14 career appearances in Atlanta he has posted a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) and collected nine saves...Has recorded 20 strikeouts over 14.0 IP good for a 12.86 K/9.
- Has gone 4-for-4 in save opportunities against division opponents this season and has a current 7.1 scoreless inning streak vs. the NL East...He has not allowed an earned run in each of his last nine appearances vs. the NL East dating back to April 23.
- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- Has allowed just three earned runs over his last 37 games, posting a 0.70 ERA (3 ER/38.1 IP) with 11 walks and 55 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 0.70 ERA is the best in the majors and his .153 opponents' BA is the fourth best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Aroldis Chapman's 0.93 ERA in that span.
- Among qualified relievers this season, is fifth in K/9.0 IP (13.13, first in NL), sixth in ERA (1.69, third in NL), tied for eighth in saves (24, fourth in NL) and ninth in opponents' BA (.165, third in NL)...Among qualified NL relievers, is fifth in opponents' SLG (.256) and opponents' OPS (.525) and tied for ninth in wins (5)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 40.3 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fifth-best in the majors.
- Over 47 games this season, has gone 5-2 with 24 saves, a 1.69 ERA (9 ER/48.0 IP), 17 walks and 70 strikeouts...The Mets are 36-11 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .165 (27-164) average against Díaz this season...With two outs and runners in scoring position, has allowed just one hit in 22 at-bats (.045 BA)...He has recorded five saves this season of four outs or more which are the most-such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (510), third in saves (140), eighth in appearances (317) and tied for eighth in wins (23).
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.
- Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team after going 3-0, 15-for-16 in save opportunities with a 2.22 ERA (7 ER/28.1 IP) in 28 first half appearances...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
