THAT'S A WRAP: The Orioles completed the 2025 season 75-87 and in fifth place in the American League East, 19.0 games behind the Toronto Blue Jays and New York Yankees...Baltimore finished 12.0 games out of a Wild Card spot.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE: Baltimore used 70 different players, tied for the second-most players in a season by a team in major league history with the 2024 Marlins, trailing the 2025 Braves (71)...The previous O's high was 62 players in 2021.

- 👤 The O's used 41 different pitchers (including position players), second most in a season in franchise history (since 1954) behind the 2021 Orioles (42)...The AL record for most pitchers used in a season is 42, shared by the 2021 Orioles and 2019 Mariners.
- 👤 The Orioles had 34 different position players appear in a game, the most by a major league team since 2022 (37, SF; 34, LAA, OAK, PIT) and tied for the most in a season in franchise history with 1955.
- 👤 Twenty-three Orioles hit a home run, breaking the team record (since 1954) from 2018 and 2012 (22)...That's the most players to homer for one MLB team in 2025.
- 👤 Baltimore had 19 players steal a base, breaking the O's record of 17 from 2018, 2001, 1990, 1988, and 1955.
- 👤 Seven different players appeared at catcher for the Birds, setting the franchise record...The last MLB club to use at least seven catchers in a single season was the 2023 Guardians (also 7).

AL BEAST: The O's went 22-30 against the AL East, their worst record since the schedule moved to 13 divisional games prior to the 2022 season...The Birds won the season series against the Rays (7-6), but lost against the Blue Jays (6-7), Red Sox (5-8), and Yankees (4-9).

- 👤 Baltimore dropped its final six road games against the division at Toronto (3 G, 9/12-14) and New York (3 G, 9/26-28).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: The Orioles had 10 players make their major league debuts in 2025 - six pitchers and four position players: **Samuel Basallo**, **Dylan Beavers**, **Maverick Handley**, **Yaramil Hiraldo**, **Jeremiah Jackson**, **Carson Ragsdale**, **Kade Strowd**, **Tomoyuki Sugano**, **Grant Wolfram**, and **Brandon Young**.

- 👤 Sugano started the fourth game of the season for the Birds and was the first Oriole to make his debut on March 30 at Toronto...At 35 years, 170 days old, Sugano became the oldest player in team history (since 1954) to make his major league debut with the club.
- 👤 Basallo had his contract selected from Triple-A Norfolk on August 17 at Houston...When he debuted at 21 years, 4 days old, he was the youngest position player in the majors, later surpassed by SF's Bryce Eldridge on September 15 at Arizona (20-330).

ALLOW ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF: Baltimore finished the regular season with 11 players on the 28-man active roster who were on the 26-player Opening Day roster...The seven position players were **Colton Cowser**, **Jackson Holliday**, **Jorge Mateo**, **Ryan Mountcastle**, **Tyler O'Neill**, **Adley Rutschman**, and **Jordan Westburg**...Of those seven, only Holliday did not spend time on the Injured List at some point during the year...The four pitchers were **Keegan Akin**, **Yennier Cano**, **Dean Kremer**, and **Tomoyuki Sugano**.

MOST VALUABLE ORIOLE: **Trevor Rogers** was voted the winner of the 2025 Louis M. Hatter Most Valuable Oriole Award by members of the local media...He became the first pitcher to earn the honor since **Rodríguez López** in 2002, and the fourth left-handed hurler to win the award, joining **Randy Myers** (1997), **Mike Cuellar** (1974), and **Dave McNally** (1968).

MANSO THE MANAGER: Third Base Coach **Tony Mansolino** was named the interim manager on May 17, replacing **Brandon Hyde**...The Orioles went 60-59 (.504) to finish the season under Mansolino.

HEY NOW: **Ryan O'Hearn** was the lone All-Star representative, winning a fan vote to start the 95th Midsummer Classic as the designated hitter for the American League in Atlanta...O'Hearn was selected to his first All-Star Game.

- 👤 O'Hearn joined **Nelson Cruz** (2014) as the only Baltimore designated hitters to earn a fan election.
- 👤 Since balloting returned in 1970, the 46 fan elections by the Orioles trail the Yankees (75) and Red Sox (59) among AL clubs.

OPENING ACT: The Orioles opened their 72nd season in Baltimore by beating the Blue Jays, 12-2, at Rogers Centre on March 27...The Birds hit six home runs, the most on Opening Day in franchise history (since 1954) and tied for the second most on Opening Day in MLB history, trailing only the 2019 Los Angeles Dodgers (8 HR, 3/28/19 vs. AZ)...The 10-run margin of victory tied an Opening Day franchise record, joining April 10, 1975 at Detroit (10-0) and April 6, 1973 vs. Milwaukee (10-0)...The O's have won their last three Opening Days (2023-25) by a combined score of 33-14...Their streak of scoring 10+ runs in the first game of the year is tied for the MLB record, shared by the Cincinnati Reds (1893-95) and Milwaukee Brewers (1994-96), per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...Baltimore improved to 47-25 (.653) all-time on Opening Day, boasting MLB's highest winning percentage on the first game of the season since the team moved in 1954.

- 👤 **Tyler O'Neill** went deep in his MLB-record sixth consecutive Opening Day.
- 👤 **Cedric Mullins** and **Adley Rutschman** both hit two home runs, tying the most on Opening Day in team history...Prior to 2025, only two Orioles in franchise history had multi-homer games on Opening Day: **Sam Horn** (4/9/90 at KC) and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Brooks Robinson** (4/6/73 vs. MIL)...Mullins joined Horn (6 RBI, 4/9/90) as the only players in club history (since 1954) with 5+ RBI on Opening Day, while Rutschman joined **Don Baylor** as the only players in MLB since 1900 to have 10 total hits in their first three career Opening Day games, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*.
- 👤 **Jackson Holliday**, **Heston Kjerstad**, **Cade Povich**, **Albert Suárez**, and **Tomoyuki Sugano** all made their first career Opening Day rosters.

WELCOME HOME: The O’s won their Home Opener at Camden Yards on March 31, defeating the Red Sox, 8-5...Baltimore’s 48-24 (.676) record all-time in home openers is the second-highest winning percentage in MLB since the club moved to Baltimore in 1954, trailing the New York Yankees (.694, 50-22).

STRIKE A POSE: With their fourth strikeout in the season finale on September 28 at New York-AL, the Orioles set a franchise record for batter strikeouts in a season...The club finished with 1,457 punchouts, surpassing the previous record set in 2021 (1,454 K).

STEAL SUCCESS: The Orioles stole 121 bases in 2025, the team's most since 2007 (144 SB)...It's the eighth time in team history (since 1954) with at least 121 steals and only the fourth time since 1977.

- 🏆 **Gunnar Henderson** led the team with a career-high 30 stolen bases...At 24 years, 89 days old, he became the youngest player in O's history (since 1954) to steal at least 30 bases...Henderson swiped 20 of those after the All-Star break (7/18), second-most in the AL behind NYY's Jazz Chisholm Jr. (21 SB) and fourth in the majors during that time.
- 🏆 **Colton Cowser** stole 14 bases without a caught stealing, the most by an Oriole without being caught in team history (since 1954) ahead of **Al Smith** (9 SB, 1963)...Joined MIN’s Byron Buxton (24 SB) as the only players in MLB to steal 14+ bases without being caught in 2025.
- 🏆 The Orioles have had a player with 30+ stolen bases for the sixth straight full seasons (since 2019) for the first time in team history...The longest such streak before this was four consecutive years from 2006-09...It's the second-longest active streak behind the Kansas City Royals, who have done so in nine straight full years since 2016.

DYNAMIC DUO: **Gunnar Henderson** and **Jackson Holliday** became the fifth 2B/SS duo under 25 years old in MLB history to each reach base safely at least 200 times in the same season (based on age at end of season and primary position played that year), per *Stats Perform*...The other four all had at least one future Hall of Famer: 2B Tony Lazzeri and SS Mark Koenig (1926 Yankees), 2B Ray Mack and SS Lou Boudreau (1940 Indians), 2B Bobby Doerr and SS Johnny Pesky (1942 Red Sox), and 2B Joe Morgan and SS Sonny Jackson (1966 Astros).

HOMER BY COMMITTEE: The Orioles became the first team in MLB history to have six or more players hit at least 15 home runs in a season without a player hitting at least 20, per *Stats Perform*...The only other major league team in history with five was the 1961 Dodgers, as John Roseboro led the club with 18.

- 🏆 **Gunnar Henderson, Jackson Holliday, and Jordan Westburg** tied for the team lead with 17 home runs, with Westburg and Henderson going back-to-back in the fourth inning of the season finale to reach that mark...It's the first time in O's history (since 1954) that three players finished with the same number of homers in a season to lead the team.
- 🏆 Baltimore did not have a player reach the 20-homer mark for the first time since 2001, when **Jay Gibbons** and **Chris Richard** each paced the club with 15 homers apiece...This season marks the sixth such occurrence in team history (also '01, '74, '57, '55, '54).
- 🏆 The Orioles set a franchise record with 11 players having multiple home runs before the start of May.

WALK IT OFF: **Samuel Basallo** (9/5 vs. LAD – HR & 9/9 vs. PIT – 1B) and **Dylan Beavers** (9/10 vs. PIT – 1B & 9/25 vs. TB – HR) recorded multiple walk-off RBI, marking the first time in O's history (since 1954) that two rookies tallied multiple RBI walk-offs in the same season, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*.

WITH AGE COMES WISDOM: At 41 years, 136 days, **Charlie Morton** became the oldest pitcher to start a game for the Orioles in team history on March 28 at Toronto...The only pitcher older than Morton to pitch for the O's since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954 is reliever **Jesse Orosco**, who made his first appearance for the club at 42 years, 160 days on September 29, 1999 vs. New York-AL...Two days later, at 35 years, 170 days, **Tomoyuki Sugano** became the oldest Japanese player to make his MLB debut since NYM's Ken Takahashi (40-016) on May 2, 2009 at Philadelphia.

WALK THIS WAY: The Orioles drew at least one walk in a franchise-record 172 consecutive games from July 2, 2024-July 12, 2025, breaking the previous mark of 155 games set from June 23, 1955-June 24 (G1), 1956...That was the longest by an MLB team since the San Francisco Giants, who had a 204-game stretch from July 6, 2002-August 22, 2003.

ORDER UP: On April 5 at Kansas City, **Cedric Mullins** became the first MLB player since at least 1901 to start in seven different spots in the batting order within a team’s first nine games of a season, per *Stats Perform*.

SAVE TONIGHT: **Félix Bautista** recorded Baltimore’s first save of the season on April 12 vs. Toronto, snapping a season-opening 13-game streak without one...It was the sixth-longest season opening streak in franchise history, including the longest since the 1988 Orioles went their first 21 games without a save.

SEEING RED: On April 19 vs. Cincinnati, the Orioles hit back-to-back home runs to lead off the game, had two sets of back-to-back homers off two different pitchers, and a player with multiple home runs off the bench...No other team in MLB history had accomplished all three single-game feats over an entire season, let alone in one game, per *Stats Perform*...**Cedric Mullins** and **Gunnar Henderson** opened the game with consecutive homers, while **Ramón Laureano** and **Jordan Westburg** went back-to-back in the third inning...Laureano replaced **Heston Kjerstad** after a hit by a pitch in the first.

FLUSH IT: The O’s fell to the Reds on April 20, 24-2, marking the second-largest defeat in franchise history (since 1954) behind a 30-3 loss on August 22 (G1), 2007 vs. Texas...**Jorge Mateo** and **Gary Sánchez** both pitched in the contest, becoming first pair of O's position players to pitch in the same game since **Larry Harlow** and **Elrod Hendricks** on June 26, 1978 at Toronto.

RAYS UP: Baltimore fell behind Tampa Bay, 6-0, following the top of the second inning on June 27, but rallied for a 22-8 win...Per the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the O's became the first AL or NL team to win by at least 14 runs when trailing by six in the same game...Five previous teams in major league history had won by at least 14 runs when trailing by five runs, last done by the Yankees on July 28, 2015 at Texas (trailed 5-0, won 21-5)...It marked the third time in franchise history (since 1954) the O's scored at least 22 runs, joining September 28, 2000 vs. Toronto (23 R) and June 13, 1999 at Atlanta (22 R)...The Orioles register a franchise-record 14 extra-base hits, surpassing a previous high of 12 (2x, 8/17/08 at DET & 8/14/09 vs. LAA)...The Birds become one of 14 clubs in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to tally 14+ extra-base hits, including the first since the Braves (14 XBH) on May 21, 2021 vs. Pittsburgh... Baltimore's nine doubles tie a franchise record, joining July 30, 1996 at Minnesota and August 18, 2009 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

ROCKIES ROAD: The Orioles defeated the Rockies, 18-0, on July 26 at Oriole Park...The 18-run margin of victory was the largest in a shutout in franchise history (since 1954), surpassing a 17-0 win on July 27, 1969 vs. Chicago-AL...The 18-run margin of victory was the third largest in franchise history behind September 28, 2000 vs. Toronto (22 R, 23-1) and June 13, 1999 at Atlanta (21 R, 22-1).

- 🏆 Baltimore became the first team in the modern era (since 1900) to have 12+ batters get an at-bat in a game and have every one of them get a hit and score a run, per *Stats Perform*.
- 🏆 The O's set a franchise record with 12 different players scoring at least one run, the most by an MLB team since the Twins on September 4, 2023 at Cleveland (also 12)...The Orioles had a franchise-record-tying 12 different hitters with at least one hit for the third time in franchise history (also 9/11/09 at NYY & 9/27/60 at BOS).

FINISHING FIREWORKS: In the final home game of the season on September 25 vs. Tampa Bay, **Dylan Beavers** became the second player in Orioles history (since 1954) to hit a walk-off homer in the team's final regular-season home game, along with **Mickey Tettleton** on October 3, 1990 vs. Toronto, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...Beavers became the first MLB rookie to accomplish the feat since Los Angeles-AL's Taylor Ward in 2018...It marked the ninth time the O's ended the home schedule on a walk off, joining September 28, 2011 vs. Boston (**Robert Andino** 1B), October 4, 2009 vs. Toronto (**Michael Aubrey** 1B), October 3, 1990 vs. Toronto (Tettleton HR), September 29, 1974 vs. Milwaukee (**Boog Powell** BB), October 1, 1970 vs. Washington (**Davey Johnson** 1B), October 1, 1969 vs. Detroit (**Mark Belanger** 1B), October 3, 1964 vs. Detroit (**Sam Bowens** BB), and September 30, 1961 vs. Chicago-AL (**Barry Shetrone** 1B).

SEASON IN REVIEW: In his 10th career major league season, including his second in Baltimore, Eflin made 14 starts, going 6-5 with a 5.93 ERA (47 ER/71.1 IP)...He had three stints on the 15-day Injured List, including April 9 (retroactive to April 8)-May 11 with a right lat strain...His final two stints from June 30 (retroactive to June 29)-July 23 and July 31 (retroactive to July 29)-August 17 were both caused by low back discomfort...On August 17, was transferred to the 60-day IL and on August 18, underwent successful lower back lumbar microdiscectomy surgery, ending his season.

OPENING STATEMENT: On March 27 at Toronto, Eflin became the 44th Opening Day starter in Orioles history (since 1954)...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, he became one of six starting pitchers since 1882 to make back-to-back Opening Day starts against the same opponent as a member of two different teams, joining Madison Bumgarner (2019 w/SF & 2020 w/AZ vs. SD), Wes Ferrell (1937 w/BSA & 1938 w/WAS vs. PHA), Sad Sam Jones (1921 w/BSA & 1922 w/NYY vs. WAS), Duke Esper (1894 w/WAS & 1895 w/BAL vs. PHI), and George Derby (1882 w/DET & 1883 w/BUF vs. CLE).
🗞️ He earned the win that afternoon after tossing 6.0 innings of two-run ball, permitting two hits (1 HR) and one walk with two strikeouts.

DON'T WALK THIS WAY: Eflin walked 13 batters across 71.1 innings, producing a 4.20 percent walk rate, the fifth-lowest mark in MLB (min. 70.0 IP) behind SF's/NYM's Tyler Rogers (2.34%), MIA's Janson Junk (2.90%), STL's/BOS' Steven Matz (3.56%), and ATL's Spencer Schwellenbach (4.15%).
🗞️ Since 2000, only three Oriole pitchers have posted a lower walk rate (min. 70.0 IP) in a season: **Josh Towers** (2.73%, 2001), **Bruce Zimmermann** (3.75%, 2022), and **Tommy Hunter** (4.17%, 2013).

STRING OF SUCCESS: Prior to allowing a season-high eight runs on May 18 vs. Washington, Eflin permitted three runs or fewer in a career-best 14 straight starts from July 24-2024-May 11, 2025, going 8-3 with a 2.79 ERA (26 ER/84.0 IP) during that period...Among all pitchers who threw 75.0+ innings during that stretch, his 2.79 ERA was 11th lowest in the majors.
🗞️ Eflin worked 5.0+ innings in each of his first 10 starts of the year, tied for the second-longest season-opening streak of his career behind 2023 (11 GS).

CHANGE OF PACE: His most effective offering was the changeup, his third-most utilized pitch at a 16.4 percent clip...Eflin held opponents to a .175 (10-for-57) average.
🗞️ Opposing right-handed hitters went 0-for-10 on the changeup, while lefties went 10-for-47 (.213).

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE: In three starts against AL Central opponents, Eflin went 2-0 with a 1.45 ERA (3 ER/18.2 IP)...Against all other clubs, he went a combined 4-5 with a 7.52 ERA (44 ER/52.2 IP).
🗞️ On May 30 vs. Chicago-AL, Eflin earned the victory after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings, scattering four hits and one walk with six strikeouts...It marked his seventh career start of 7.0+ scoreless innings, including his first since August 9, 2024 at Tampa Bay (W, 7.0 IP, 4 H, 1 BB, 7 K).

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Eflin's 5.55 run support average was second among Oriole pitchers (min 10 GS), trailing **Trevor Rogers** (6.07 RSA)...On Opening Day at Toronto, he received nine runs of support, his most since getting 10 runs in his Orioles debut on July 29 (G1), 2024 vs. Toronto.

HOMER UNHAPPY: Eflin permitted a career-high 2.27 home runs per nine innings (18 HR/71.1IP), surpassing his previous mark (2.24 HR/9.0 IP) in 2017...Among all MLB hurlers who threw at least 70.0 innings, his 2.27 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark ahead of HOU's Colton Gordon (2.20 HR/9.0 IP) and ATH's Osvaldo Bido (2.15 HR/9.0 IP).
🗞️ On May 18 vs. Washington, he allowed a career-high-tying four long balls, joining starts on May 28, 2017 vs. Cincinnati and June 20, 2021 at San Francisco.
🗞️ Eflin allowed three lead-off homers, tied with **Tomoyuki Suagno** for the team lead.

LEFT SIDE STORY: Left-handed hitters slashed .316/.339/.649 (55-for-174) with 13 doubles and 15 home runs.

SEASON IN REVIEW: Bradish made six starts in his return from Tommy John surgery, going 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER/32.0 IP) on 23 hits (3 HR), 10 walks, and one hit batter with 47 strikeouts...He made six rehab appearances between Triple-A Norfolk (4 GS), Double-A Chesapeake (1 GS), and High-A Aberdeen (1 GS) beginning July 24, going 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (12 ER/22.0 IP) and 25 strikeouts.

ACE MATERIAL: He allowed two runs or fewer in each of his six MLB starts and has done so in each of his last eight outings since June 28, 2024, tied for the longest such streak of his career (also 9/20/23-5/26/24).

👉 Bradish has also allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last eight starts since June 8, 2024...The only Oriole starter with a longer streak during that period is **Trevor Rogers'** 10-start stretch from August 19, 2024-August 1, 2025.

STRIKEOUT STUFF: Bradish produced a 37.3 percent strikeout rate (47 K/126 BF) over his six outings...He struck out 8+ batters in each of his final three starts, becoming the first Baltimore hurler to do so since **Dylan Bundy's** four-game run from August 7-29, 2017.

👉 In his final start on September 28 at Yankees Stadium, he struck out eight batters across four innings, scattering five hits (1 HR) with zero walks...Bradish became the first starter in franchise history (since 1954) to strike out eight batters and issue zero walks in 4.0 innings for fewer...He was one of only two MLB starters to accomplish the feat in 2025, joining LAD's Shohei Ohtani on August 6 vs. St. Louis (4.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 0 BB, 8 K).

👉 It marked his fifth-career double-digit strikeout performance, including his first since May 26, 2024 at Chicago-AL (11 K).

👉 In the outing, Bradish compiled his 10 strikeouts on only 81 pitches, becoming the second Orioles pitcher to have 10 strikeouts on 81 pitches or fewer in 2025 along with **Charlie Morton** (10 K, 78 P, 6/13 vs. LAA)...Prior to 2025, no starter in franchise history (since 1954) had ever recorded 10+ strikeouts on 81 pitches or fewer.

BEST OF THE BEST: Bradish has a 2.78 ERA (74 ER/240.0 IP) in 44 starts since the beginning of 2023, the sixth-lowest ERA in MLB (min. 240.0 IP) behind PIT's Paul Skenes (1.96 ERA), DET's Tarik Skubal (2.39 ERA), LAD's Blake Snell (2.53 ERA), DET's Tyler Holton (2.61 ERA), and LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto (2.66 ERA).

SEASON IN REVIEW: In his sixth season with Baltimore, Kremer went 11-10 with a 4.19 ERA (80 ER/171.2 IP) and a 1.21 WHIP on 163 hits (22 HR), 45 walks, two hit batters, nine wild pitches, and one balk with 142 strikeouts in 31 games (29 GS)...He also tallied a career-high two appearances in relief (6/12 vs. DET & 9/28 at NYY) and recorded career lows in WHIP (1.21) and xERA (3.83).

LEADING THE WAY: Kremer's 171.2 innings pitched led the Orioles staff and were 1.0 inning shy of his career high set in 2023...He is the seventh pitcher in the last seven seasons to lead the Orioles in innings, marking the first seven-season span with seven different pitchers leading the team in innings since the first eight seasons in franchise history (1954-61), per *Stats Perform*.

WORKING AHEAD: Recorded a career-high 65.7 first-pitch strike percentage, which ranked 10th in MLB and fifth in the AL, trailing DET's Tarik Skubal (71.3%), TOR's Kevin Gausman (68.9%), SEA's Bryan Woo (66.5%), and LAA's Kyle Hendricks (65.9%)...Was the second highest by an Orioles starter in franchise history (since 1954), trailing **Wei-Yin Chen**, who recorded a 68.3 first-pitch strike percentage in 2015.

SPLIT DECISION: Kremer's most effective pitch was his splitter, which he threw 21.0 percent of the time...Held the opposition to a .201 (31-for-154) clip on the pitch, compared to a combined .265 (129-for-487) clip on his other offerings.
⚡ Generated 122 whiffs on the pitch, which accounted for 39.2 percent of all his whiffs produced during the season.
⚡ His 39.4 percent whiff rate on his splitter ranked third in MLB (min. 500 P), trailing LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto (42.1%) and NYM's Kodai Senga (41.8%).

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Kremer spun 7.0 innings and allowed three or fewer hits in six of his starts, tied with BOS' Garrett Crochet and SD's Nick Pivetta for the second-most such starts in MLB, trailing DET's Tarik Skubal (8 GS).
⚡ The six starts of at least 7.0 innings pitched and three or fewer hits are tied for second most in a season in franchise history (since 1954), trailing **Wally Bunker** (7 GS, 1964).
⚡ Had multiple streaks of starts with at least 7.0 innings pitched and three or fewer hits (5/2-8 and 7/11-19), joining Skubal as the only players to have multiple such streaks during the 2025 campaign...Was the first Oriole to do so in the same season since **Bob Milacki** in 1989.

O, WHAT A RELIEF: On June 12 vs. Detroit, he became the first Oriole pitcher to throw at least 7.0 innings in relief since **Aaron Brooks** on September 20, 2019 vs. Seattle (also 7.0 IP) and the first Oriole to throw 105+ pitches out of the bullpen since **Jason Johnson** on August 29, 2000 vs. Detroit (111 P).

EMPTYING THE TANK: Threw a career-high 114 pitches on August 17 at Houston, tied with five others for the fifth most by a pitcher in a single start this season, trailing CLE's Gavin Williams (126 P), SF's Justin Verlander (121 P), TB/CIN's Zack Littell (117 P), and ATL's Chris Sale (116 P)...Was the most by an Oriole since **Jordan Lyles** on May 23, 2022 at New York-AL (117 P).
⚡ Threw 100+ pitches in three straight starts from August 5-17, becoming the first Oriole to do so since **Kyle Bradish** from September 14-26, 2023 (3 GS)...The 318 pitches during that span were the most in a three-game stretch by an Oriole since Lyles threw 319 pitches from July 28-August 8, 2022.

HOME COOKIN': Tossed 20.0 scoreless innings at home from June 12-July 25, the longest streak by an Oriole since **Grayson Rodriguez** (also 20.0 IP) from August 22-September 27, 2023, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*.

LIMITING THE FREE PASS: Kremer registered career lows in walks per nine innings (2.36) and walk rate (6.4%), lowering his numbers from 3.54 and 9.2 in 2024, respectively.
⚡ He walked at least one batter in a career-high 23 straight starts from April 27-September 16.

ROCKY ROAD: Kremer went 5-7 with a 5.30 ERA (55 ER/93.1 IP) in 18 road games (17 GS) compared to 6-3 with a 2.87 ERA (25 ER/78.1 IP) in 13 home games (12 GS).
⚡ Kremer's road ERA was the highest by an Oriole since 2017 (**Wade Miley**, 6.05 ERA) and the seventh highest in team history (min. 17 GS).

APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS: Kremer owned a 2-4 record with a 7.04 ERA (24 ER/30.2 IP) in six starts in March/April compared to a 9-6 record with a 3.57 ERA (56 ER/141.0 IP) in his following 25 games (23 GS) from May 1 through the end of the season.

WHEN SEPTEMBER ENDS: In four September games (3 GS), Kremer posted a 2-0 record with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP), the third-lowest ERA in MLB (min. 15.0 IP) trailing HOU's AJ Blubaugh (0.00 ERA) and LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto (0.67 ERA).

SEASON IN REVIEW: Went 9-3 with a 1.81 ERA (22 ER/109.2 IP) on 70 hits (6 HR), 29 walks, and two hit batters with 103 strikeouts across 18 starts...Batters slashed .180/.240/.263 (70-for-388) off him on the season...The O's were 13-5 in his starts... Began the season on the 15-day Injured List after being placed on the IL on March 27 (retroactive to March 24) with right knee subluxation...Reinstated from the IL on May 11 and was optioned to Triple-A Norfolk...Made his season debut on May 24 (G2) at Boston after being appointed from Norfolk as the 27th man for the doubleheader (ND, 6.1 IP, 2 H, 5 K)...Recalled from Norfolk on June 18 and remained on the big league roster for the rest of the season.

MR. ROGERS' NEIGHBORHOOD: Rogers was voted the winner of the 2025 Most Valuable Oriole Award by members of the local media, joining **Randy Myers** (1997), **Mike Cuellar** (1974), and **Dave McNally** (1968) as the only left-handed pitchers in franchise history (since 1954) to be named Most Valuable Oriole...He was the first pitcher to earn the honor since **Rodrigo Lopez** (2002).
⚡ Led the Orioles with a career-high 5.5 *Baseball Reference* Wins Above Replacement, the third-highest mark by an Oriole southpaw in franchise history (since 1954), behind **Dave McNally** (5.9 bWAR, 1968) and **Erik Bedard** (5.7 bWAR, 2007) and highest by an Oriole pitcher since Bedard in 2007.
⚡ His 5.5 bWAR ranked fourth among all American League pitchers and eighth in MLB.

FALL INTO PLACE: Named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August after going 4-1 with a 1.29 ERA (6 ER/42.0 IP) across six starts...Became the first Oriole to earn the honor since **Corbin Burnes** (September 2024) and the first Oriole left-hander since **Erik Bedard** (July 2007).
⚡ Became the first Oriole in franchise history (since 1954) to make at least five starts and allow one or zero runs in each of the outings in a single month.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Made 10 straight starts of tossing 6.0+ innings and allowing two or fewer runs from July 6-August 30, the longest such streak in club history (since 1954)...Marked the longest stretch by an MLB starter (excluding openers) in a single season since SEA's Félix Hernández (17 GS, 5/18-8/16/14).
⚡ Completed 6.0+ innings in a career-high 10 straight starts from July 6-August 30, the longest streak by an Oriole since **Corbin Burnes** (17 GS, 4/26-7/30/24).

RECORD SETTER: Rogers' 1.81 ERA on the year was the lowest mark by an Oriole starter (min. 100.0 IP) in franchise history, ahead of **Dave McNally** (1.95 ERA, 1968) and **Jim Palmer** (2.07 ERA, 1972)...It marked the third-lowest ERA by an Oriole through his first 18 starts of the season, behind **Milt Pappas** (1.77 ERA, 1965) and **Jim Palmer** (1.78 ERA, 1975).
⚡ His .180 (70-for-388) opponent average, .263 opponent slugging percentage, and .503 opponent OPS were the lowest marks by an Oriole starter (min. 100.0 IP) in franchise history (since 1954), while his .240 opponent on-base percentage ranked second behind McNally (1968, .232 OBP).
⚡ His ERA ranked second among all major league pitchers (min. 100.0 IP) in 2025 behind TEX's Nathan Eovaldi (1.73 ERA), while his opponent average, opponent slugging percentage, and opponent OPS each led all MLB pitchers.

HIGH QUALITY: Tallied a team-leading 13 quality starts during the year, surpassing his previous career high set in 2021 (9 QS) despite making seven fewer appearances this year...Tossed a career-high 10 consecutive quality starts from July 6-August 30, tied with **Corbin Burnes** (4/26-6/16/24) and **Jeremy Guthrie** (5/8-6/26/07) for the longest such streak by an Oriole starter since 1979.

FROM START TO FINISH: Tossed his first career complete game on August 1 at Chicago-NL (L, 8.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 8 K), becoming the first Oriole starter to throw a complete game since **Dean Kremer** (9/23/22 vs. HOU, 9.0 IP)...Became the first Oriole to suffer a loss in a complete game since **Chris Tillman** (9/14/13 at TOR; 8.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K) in the Orioles' 1-0 defeat.

NEED FOR SPEED: In his June 23 start vs. Texas, Rogers hit 96.3 mph on his fastball in the first inning on the sixth pitch of the at-bat to Wyatt Langford, marking his fastest pitch since April 2, 2023 (96.6 mph)...His 93.1 mph average velocity on his four seamer saw a +1.2 mph increase from 2024.

HISTORY MADE: On June 30 at Texas, Rogers had his first plate appearance as a hitter since September 28, 2021 (G1) in the fourth inning...After catcher **Chadwick Tromp** exited in the third inning with an injury, starting designated hitter **Gary Sánchez** substituted as catcher, and Rogers entered the batting order in the ninth spot, replacing Tromp...At the plate, Rogers went 0-for-2 with two strikeouts.

SEASON IN REVIEW: In his first career MLB season, Sugano went 10-10 with a 4.64 ERA (81 ER/157.0 IP) on 173 hits (33 HR), 36 walks (2 IBB), eight hit batters, three wild pitches, and one balk with 106 strikeouts across 30 starts...The 30 starts led the club ahead of **Dean Kremer** (29 GS), while his 10 quality starts were second on the team behind **Trevor Rogers** (13 QS).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: On March 30 at Toronto, he made his major league debut, becoming the third-ever Japanese player for the Orioles, joining right-handed relievers **Shintaro Fujinami** (2023) and **Koji Uehara** (2009-11)...In the start, at 35 years, 170 days old, Sugano became the oldest Japanese player to make his MLB debut since NYM's Ken Takahashi (40-016) on May 2, 2009 at Philadelphia.

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Sugano ranked among all qualified MLB rookies in starts (2nd, 30), innings (2nd), wins (T-2nd), and strikeouts (10th)...His 157.0 innings trailed only NYY's Will Warren (162.1 IP), while his 10 wins were tied with TEX's Jack Leiter, behind CHC's Cade Horton (11 W)...Sugano was seeking to become the fourth O's pitcher to lead all rookies in wins and innings in a season in club history (since 1954) along with **Daniel Cabrera** (2004), **Wally Bunker** (1964), and **Chuck Estrada** (1960), per *Stats Perform*.

- 🏅 Sugano made five starts of 7.0+ innings, the most among all MLB rookies ahead of ATH's Jacob Lopez (4 GS).
- 🏅 He became the 10th Japanese-born rookie pitcher to record 10+ wins in a season (last: CHC's Shota Imanaga in 2024, 15 W).

LIKE FINE WINE: He became the fourth Japanese-born pitcher (8th occurrence) to make 30+ starts at age 35 or older (as of 6/30), joining SD's Yu Darvish (35 years old, 2022), SEA's Hisashi Iwakuma (35 years old, 2016), and LAD's/NYY's Hiroki Kuroda (5x, 35-39 years old, 2010-14).

OFF AND RUNNING: Sugano made 10 starts between April and May, going 4-2 with a 3.15 ERA (21 ER/60.0 IP), .237 (54-for-228) opponent average, and 1.03 WHIP...Among AL pitchers who threw at least 60.0 innings during that period, his WHIP was tied for ninth lowest, while his ERA was 11th lowest.

MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Sugano allowed two walks or fewer in each of his first 14 starts, the second-longest career-opening run by an Oriole starter in team history (since 1954) behind **Josh Towers** (23 GS, 2001-02).

- 🏅 His 5.3 percent walk rate was the lowest by an Oriole rookie (min. 150.0 IP) in franchise history (since 1954), outpacing **John Means** (6.0%, 2019) and **José Bautista** (6.2%, 1988).
- 🏅 The 5.3 percent walk rate also led all MLB rookies (min. 100.0 IP), ahead of CHC's Cade Horton (6.9%).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: Sugano tallied 5 Defensive Runs Saved, the most among Oriole pitchers ahead of **Dean Kremer** (3 DRS)...The 5 DRS were tied for seventh most among all MLB pitchers behind NYY's Max Fried (10 DRS), SF's Logan Webb (7 DRS), and CHC's Matthew Boyd/NYM's David Peterson/ATL's Spencer Schwellenbach/ATH's Luis Severino (all 6 DRS).

HOME RUN HOMEWORK: Sugano permitted 33 home runs, third most in the majors ahead of WSH's Jake Irvin (38 HR) and CIN's Zack Littell (36 HR)...The 33 long balls were the most allowed by an Oriole rookie in franchise history (since 1954), a record previously held by **Eric Bell** (32 HR) in 1987.

- 🏅 Sugano became one of four rookie pitchers in MLB since 1900 to allow 33+ home runs along with SEA's Yusei Kikuchi (36 HR, 2019), DET's Tarik Skubal (35 HR, 2021), and TOR's Jerry Garvin (33 HR, 1977).
- 🏅 Of his 33 homers allowed, 24 were solo shots, third in MLB ahead of Littell (28 HR) and CHC's Shota Imanaga (25 HR)...The 24 solo home runs were tied for the most allowed by an Oriole hurler in club history (since 1954) along with **Jeremy Guthrie** (2009) and **Ken Dixon** (1986).

SUCCESS WITHOUT THE STRIKEOUT: His 15.7 percent strikeout rate was fourth lowest in MLB (min. 150.0 IP), ahead of WSH's Mitchell Parker (14.2%), STL's Miles Mikolas (14.9%), and STL's Andre Pallante (15.5%).

SPLITTING HAIRS: Sugano's most effective offering was his splitter, his most utilized offering at 23.5 percent...Overall, he limited opponents to a .218 (37-for-170) clip on the pitch with a 28.4 percent whiff rate.

- 🏅 From April 17-August 19, a stretch in which Sugano went 9-4 with a 3.99 ERA (52 ER/117.1 IP), he held the opposition to a .192 (24-for-125) mark on the splitter.

SEASON IN REVIEW: Wells went 2-1 with a 2.91 ERA (7 ER/21.2 IP) and a 0.88 WHIP on seven totals runs, 17 hits (4 HR) and two walks with 18 strikeouts in four starts after missing 508 days recovering from right elbow UCL surgery...Was activated from the 60-day Injured List on September 2 and made his season debut that day.

WELCOME BACK, TYLER! Wells made his season debut on September 2 at San Diego, his first MLB appearance since April 12, 2024 vs. Milwaukee...Earned the victory in the outing, his first since July 8, 2023 at Minnesota.

ON THE FARM: Before returning to the Orioles rotation, Wells made six rehab starts between Triple-A Norfolk (5 GS) and Double-A Chesapeake (1 GS), going 1-2 with a 2.49 ERA (7 ER/25.1 IP), 1.11 WHIP, and 24 strikeouts against six walks from July 30-August 15.

👉 Wells fired 9.1 scoreless innings to begin his rehab stint before allowing a two-run homer in the second inning on August 15 to Jacksonville's Maximo Acosta.

👉 Joined MIA's Cal Quantrill (5/18 vs. TB), CHC's Andrew Kittredge (8/6 vs. CIN), and SD's Mason Miller (9/3 vs. BAL) as the only pitchers with an immaculate inning in 2025, per *Elias Sports Bureau*.
👉 Is the fifth pitcher in Orioles history (since 1954) to throw an immaculate inning, joining Gausman, **B.J. Ryan** (9/5/99 vs. CLE, 6th inn.), **Mike Mussina** (5/9/98 vs. TB, 9th inn.), and **Jimmy Key** (4/14/98 vs. CWS, 2nd inn.).

VICTORY AT LAST: Young earned his first career win on August 15 at Houston after allowing a career-low one hit and striking out six batters in a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings...Snapped a streak of 10 starts without a win to begin his career, which was the second-longest winless streak to begin a career in franchise history (since 1954), trailing **Jimmy Yacabonis**, who was winless in his first 11 career starts from June 28, 2018-August 4, 2019.
