AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a six-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at the Athletics (through Sun.)...will also play a three-game set at Seattle (Mon.-Wed.)...went 3-3 on their recent homestand after dropping two-of-three vs. Tampa Bay and winning two-of-three vs. San Diego.
► Their +61 run differential this season is the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (+83).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees recorded their first “walk-off” win of the season after defeating the Padres, 4-3, in 10 innings on Wednesday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Max Fried** (7.0IP, 5H, 1R/ER, OBB, 8K, 1HR) started and allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP in a no-decision...**CF Cody Bellinger** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) recorded the Yankees' first hit of the game with a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning...**PH Trent Grisham** (1-for-1, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his 10th home run of the year with a pinch-hit game-tying two-run HR in the eighth inning...**PH J.C. Escarra** (0-for-0, 1RBI, 1SF) hit a pinch-hit “walk-off” sac fly in the 10th inning...**RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP, 1BB, 3K, 1HP) tossed a scoreless 10th inning to earn his first win as a Yankee.

LAND OF THE FRIED: **LHP Max Fried** allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0 innings in a no-decision on Wednesday vs. San Diego...**is 6-0 with a 1.05 ERA (51.2IP, 6ER) in eight starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in six of those starts**...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 4/4), posting a 0.77 ERA (47.0IP, 4ER) in that span.
► **His 1.05 ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankee through his first eight starts of a season** (since 1913 when ER became an official stat), trailing only Whitey Ford's 1.01 ERA through his first eight starts in 1956 and Phil Niekro's 1.04 ERA through his first eight starts in 1984.
► Leads the Majors in ERA and pickoffs (four), is tied for first in wins (tied for first in AL), ranks third in opponents' OPS (.515, third in AL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.269, fourth in AL) and WHIP (0.91, fourth in AL), eighth in groundball percentage (51.4%, third in AL) and ninth in opponents' BA (.187, sixth in AL).
► **The Yankees are 8-0 in his eight starts...marks just the fourth time in franchise history the Yankees have won a pitcher's first eight starts with the team**...the Yankees also won Whitey Ford's first 22 starts with the club from 1950-53 (won first 23GS when including postseason), Joe Cowley's first 11 starts with the Yankees in 1984 and Russ Ford's first eight starts with the club in 1910.

MERRY GRISHMAS: **OF Trent Grisham hit his 10th home run of the year with a pinch-hit game-tying two-run HR in the eighth inning on Wednesday vs. San Diego**...marked his first career pinch-hit HR and was the second by a Yankee this season (also Oswald Peraza on 3/29 vs. Milwaukee).
► Was the first Yankee to hit a pinch-hit HR that either tied the game or gave the team the lead since Gary Sánchez hit a go-ahead two-run HR when the Yankees were down 2-1 in the seventh inning on 6/16/21 at Toronto...is the first Yankee to accomplish the feat in the eighth inning-or-later since Sánchez hit a go-ahead grand slam in the eighth inning on 8/30/20-Game 2 vs. the Mets.
► **Seven of his 10HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (six)**.
► Has 6HR in his last 13 games (since 4/19).
► Has 10HR in 31G this season after hitting 9HR in 76G in 2024.
► Is hitting .292/.376/.640 (26-for-89) with 19R, 1 double, 10HR, 20RBI, 11BB and 1HP in 31 games this season.
► Has 5RBI in his last three games (since 5/5).
► Is tied for fourth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (six, tied for second in AL) and is tied for sixth in HR (tied for third in AL) and go-ahead RBI (eight, tied for second in AL).

SAVED BY THE BELL: **INF/OF Cody Bellinger recorded the Yankees' first hit of the game on Wednesday vs. San Diego with a game-tying solo HR in the seventh inning**...marked his fifth HR of the year...has 2HR in his last four games (since 5/4) and 3HR in his last eight games (since 4/29).
► Has hit safely in each of his last five games (since 5/3), batting .316/.381/.632 (6-for-19) with 4R, 2HR, 4RBI, 2BB and 1SB over that span.
► In 14 career games vs. the A's, has hit .370/.435/.519 (20-for-54) with 11R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR, 6RBI, 7BB and 1SF.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.78 ERA (116.2IP, 36ER) over their last 22 starts (since 4/14)**...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.203), opponents' OBP (.277), opponents' OPS (.601) and WHIP (1.11), and rank second in opponents' SLG (.324, first in AL) and ERA (second in AL).
► Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 18 of their last 22 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 16 of those starts.

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 10-3 vs. the Athletics since 2023, 15-5 since 2022 and 19-8 since 2021.

ALL RISE: **OF Aaron Judge** had his 32-game on-base streak snapped on Wednesday vs. San Diego (4/2-5/6)...was tied for the third-longest on-base streak of his career, trailing only a 45-game streak from 8/29/22-4/12/23 and a 37-game streak from 5/2-6/12/24 (also had a 32-game streak from 5/28-6/30/17)...batted.413/.503/.702 (50-for-121) with 26R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 23RBI, 20BB/4IBB, 2HP and 3SB over that span.
► **Has reached base in 35 of his 37 games this year**, batting .400/.491/.750 (56-for-140) with 34R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 12HR, 34RBI, 23BB/5IBB, 2HP and 3SB.
► **Leads the Majors in BA by 43 points, OBP by 41 points, SLG by 115 points and OPS by 156 points**.
► **Has reached base multiple times in 22 of his last 28 games (since 4/7), 25 of his last 32 games (since 4/3) and 27 of his 37 games this year**...his 27 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.
► **Has hit 4HR in his last eight games (since 4/29) and 5HR in his last 10 games (since 4/27-G2)**.
► Over his last 28 games (since 4/7), has hit .427/.516/.699 (44-for-103) with 20R, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR, 17RBI, 18BB/3IBB, 1HP and 1SB.
► Has hit .483/.571/.862 (14-for-29) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 21RBI, 5BB/4IBB and 1HP with RISP this year.
► In 39 career games vs. the Athletics, has hit .301/.416/.636 (43-for-143) with 29R, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR, 38RBI, 27BB/11BB, 2HP and 1SF...**has 3HR in his last five games vs. the A's** (since 4/24/24).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 62HR this year, their most home runs through their first 37 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 61HR in 2003)...also lead the Majors in OBP (.342), SLG (.465) and OPS (.807), rank second in runs per game (5.57, first in AL), third in total bases (580, first in AL), tied for third in runs scored (206, second in AL) and XBH (130, first in AL), fourth in walks (147, second in AL) and are tied for fourth in times on base (486, third in AL).

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.87 ERA (213.0IP, 68ER) over their last 24 games (since 4/12), the third-lowest ERA in the Majors over that span, trailing only Detroit (2.57) and Kansas City (2.82).
► Lead the Majors this season in opponents' BA (.206), rank second in opponents' SLG (.331, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.623, first in AL), fifth in opponents' OBP (.293, third in AL) and K/9.0IP (9.28, third in AL), and sixth in strikeouts (336, third in AL).

GOOD AS GOLD: **INF Paul Goldschmidt has hit safely in 24 of his last 31 games (since 4/4), batting .356/.398/.466 (42-for-118) with 16R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 15RBI, 9BB, 2SB and 1SF**.
► **Has hit safely in each of his 16 road games this year, batting .435/.466/.536 (30-for-69) with 10R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 4BB and 1SB**...is one of only seven Yankees in franchise history to hit safely in his first 16 road games of the season, joining Derek Jeter (23G in 2007), Jack Lelivelt (21G in 1912), Ben Chapman (18G in 1933) Patsy Dougherty (18G in 1904), Alfonso Soriano (17G in 2003) and Earle Combs (17G in 1926).
► Has hit .452/.514/.613 (14-for-31) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI, 4BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for seventh in the Majors in hits (tied for third in AL), ranks eighth in BA (fifth in AL) and tied for 10th in OBP (tied for fourth in AL).
► Has reached base safely in 28 of his 37 games this season, batting .341/.391/.464 (47-for-138) with 21R, 8 doubles, 3HR, 17RBI, 11BB/2IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
► Is tied for second in the Majors in multi-hit games (16, second in AL), ranks third in BA (third in AL) and sixth in hits (sixth in AL).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (1-2, 5.65 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his eighth start of the season in tonight's series opener at the Athletics...the 25-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Sunday vs. the Rays and took his second loss of the season (4.2IP, 7H, 5R/3ER, 3BB, 8K, 1HR)...is 1-2 with a 5.65 ERA (28.2IP, 18ER) and 34K in seven starts this year...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in five of his seven starts this season...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...spent the majority of last season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts...following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect...over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2022-24), has gone 25-18 with a 4.31 ERA (367.2IP, 342H, 209R/176ER, 140BB, 410K, 44HR) in 76 career appearances (74 starts)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

LAST TIME OUT: Last pitched on Sunday vs. the Rays and took his second loss of the season (4.2IP, 7H, 5R/3ER, 3BB, 8K, 1HR)...both his 8K and 102 pitches marked career highs...also set season highs in hits and runs allowed.

- 2025:** Has gone 1-2 with a 5.65 ERA (28.2IP, 18ER) and 34K in seven starts this season...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in four of his seven starts this season...has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in five of his last six starts (since 4/6).
- ✦ Made his season debut on 4/1 vs. Arizona and did not record a decision...allowed only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (1H, 4BB, 4K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit on a two-run HR to Corbin Carroll in the third inning.
 - ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-4 loss in extra innings on 4/6 at Pittsburgh (4.0IP, 6H, 4R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...retired his first 8BF...allowed a two-run double to Bryan Reynolds in the third inning and two runs in the fourth inning on a sacrifice fly to Tommy Pham and an RBI double to Isiah Kiner-Falefa.
 - ✦ Earned his first Major League win on 4/12 vs. San Francisco after allowing only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (2H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR)...after allowing a two-run HR to Wilmer Flores in the second inning, retired his next 10BF and 11 of his final 12BF.
 - ✦ Recorded the shortest start of his career on 4/17 at Tampa Bay (ND, 1.2IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 1K, 0HR).
 - ✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 3-2 loss on 4/22 at Cleveland (5.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...after allowing a leadoff single in the first inning, did not allow a hit to his next 17BF (1BB)...exited the game with two runners on...Mark Leiter Jr. came on in relief and allowed both inherited runners to score.
 - ✦ Took his second loss of the season on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay after allowing 5R/3ER in 4.2IP (7H, 3BB, 8K, 1HR)...both his 8K and 102 pitches marked career highs...also set season highs in hits and runs allowed.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Will make his fifth road start of the season and seventh of his career tonight at the Athletics...has gone 0-1 with a 6.29 ERA (24.1IP, 17ER) in his six career road starts.

- 2024:** Saw his first Major League action with the Yankees last season, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...opponents batted .340/.404/.608 (33-for-97, 5HR); LH .349/.442/.581 (15-for-43, 2HR); RH .333/.368/.630 (18-for-54, 3HR).
- ✦ Recorded at least 6K in three of his five starts.
 - ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/30 at Philadelphia and did not record a decision (5.1IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...struck out Bryce Harper (swinging) in the first inning for his first Major League strikeout...retired 12 of his final 14 batters faced (1H, 1HP).
 - ✦ Spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts.
 - ✦ Over his final 13 starts with the RailRiders from 6/1-9/18, allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 10 of his 13 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in nine of those starts and one-or-zero earned runs in six starts...posted a 2.91 ERA (21.2IP, 14H, 9R/7ER, 6BB, 30K, 2HR) in four starts with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre during the month of July.
 - ✦ Following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect.

VS. ATHLETICS: Will be making his first career appearance vs. the Athletics tonight.
