SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost the series opener, 6-4, vs. Dodgers.

- ◆ **Joc Pederson** gave the D-backs an early lead with a RBI single in the third inning.
- ◆ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** and **Jake McCarthy's** back-to-back homers in the eighth inning (both off Elieser Hernández) were the team's third this season.
- ◆ **Kevin Newman** had 3 hits with a double and 2 singles, including a RBI single in the seventh inning.
- ◆ **Joe Mantiplay** started the game as the opener with a scoreless first inning (1 H, 0 BB, 0 K).
- ◆ **Slade Cecconi** allowed 6 runs in the third inning (no outs) before retiring his final 12 batters faced.

SOLID CROWDS: Saturday's crowd of 35,826 fans for Mexican Heritage Night highlighted the 87,859 fans during the Tigers series and the 6-game homestand's 142,770 fans, an average of 23,795 per game.

- ◆ The D-backs, who are averaging 30,315 per home game, are 1 of 13 teams averaging 30,000+ at home.
- ◆ The D-backs are also averaging 29,978 on the road, the ninth-highest attendance average in the Majors.
- ◆ Overall, the D-backs 30,154 per game average attendance (home and road combined) is 10th in the Majors behind the Dodgers (40,345), Padres (35,979), Braves (34,495), Yankees (34,233), Phillies (32,796), Cubs (32,777), Cardinals (32,728), Giants (31,781) and Astros (30,504).

EL PIKE KEEPS GOING: **Ketel Marte's** career-best 19-game hitting streak (previous was 16 games) is the longest streak -- active or overall -- in the Majors this season...last season, there were 3 streaks of 19+ games, including a season-high 25-gamer by Marcus Semien/TEX.

- His streak is 1 of 6 by a D-back of 19+ games...his 19-gamer is tied for fifth-longest in club history with Matt Williams (1999)...next up at 21 is Danny Bautista (2004), 24 is Tony Womack (2000), 26 is Paul Goldschmidt (2013) and 30 is Luis Gonzalez (1999).
- ◆ Marte's 19-game on-base streak is the second-longest active streak in the Majors behind the 25-game streak for Luis Arraez/SD (also tied for the ninth-longest such streak this season).

JAKE ON THE ROAD: **Jake McCarthy**, in his last 10 road starts, is hitting .323 (10-for-31)/1.002 OPS with 1 triple, 2 home runs, 5 RBI and 6 walks (6 strikeouts).

- ◆ Dating back to August 4, 2023, has hit safely in 12 of his last 18 road starts at a .305 clip (18-for-59)/.866 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homers, 8 RBI and 9 walks (10 strikeouts).

NEWMAN AS THE STARTER: **Kevin Newman**, in his last 13 starts, is hitting .391 (18-for-46)/.994 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

GURRI ON THE ROAD: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has hit safely in 5 of his last 6 road games (.269, 7-for-26) and overall in 15 of 20 road games this season (.284, 25-for-88).

- ◆ Has hit safely in 7 road games vs. NL West, since August 30, 2023, at a .387 clip (12-for-31)/.955 OPS.
- ◆ Since June 24, 2023, has hit safely in 18 of his last 20 road games vs. NL West, batting .313 (26-for-83)/.787 OPS with 6 doubles, 2 homers, 11 RBI and 2 walks.

VS. DODGERS: **Christian Walker** has reached base safely in 6 of his last 7 games vs. Dodgers and 17 of his last 22 games.

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** has reached base safely in 12 of his last 13 games vs. Dodgers since April 2, 2023.

STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS: D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 10 of their last 13 starts, since May 7 (includes Joe Mantiplay as opener on May 20 @ Dodgers)...of the 36 runs allowed during this stretch, 14 came in 2 outings while the other 11 games have totaled 22 runs.

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: **Ketel Marte's** 2.8 bWAR is eighth among all players [pitcher or position]...the Top 4 are Mookie Betts/LAD (3.4), Kyle Tucker/HOU (3.1), Gunnar Henderson/BAL (3.1) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (3.1).

- ◆ Marte's 1.0 defensive bWAR is seventh in the Majors... the Top 3 are Marcus Semien/TEX (1.4), Daulton Varsho/TOR (1.2) and Jarren Duran/BOS (1.2).

THOMPSON KEEPING OPPONENTS QUIET: **Ryan Thompson** has held opponents scoreless in his last 9 games, spanning 10.1 innings (3 of 6 inherited runners have scored) and 17 of 19 games overall, allowing 2 runs in 20.0 innings (4 of 7 inherited runners have scored).

NO LONGBALLS FOR JOE: **Joe Mantiplay's** 39.2-inning homerless streak, since August 8, 2023 (Top 5), is the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors...Tanner Houch/BOS has the longest active streak (47.1 IP).

- ◆ Has held his last 162 batters faced homerless (42 G, 4 GS) since August 8, 2023...is 1 of 2 pitchers (min. 30 G, max. 5 GS) during that stretch to not allow a home run along with Cionel Pérez/BAL (112 BF/34 G/0 GS).

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the Top 10 among outs above average (OAA) leaders: **Christian Walker** (T-4th, 7) and **Ketel Marte** (T-6th, 6).

- ◆ Marte (7 DRS) and Walker (6 DRS) are tied for seventh and tied for 12th, respectively, in defensive runs saved (DRS).
- ◆ The D-backs' 10 DRS are tied for fifth in the NL, with the Phillies, behind the Dodgers (32), Braves (18), Cardinals (15) and Rockies (12).

NEXT STARTER: RHP RYNE NELSON (2-3, 7.06)

- ◆ Making his eighth start of the season.
- ◆ Third career start vs. Dodgers (1-0, 2.25 ERA).

SLAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: 10th start of the season, fifth on the road.

- Has 4 straight quality starts.
- In his last 6 starts, 5 quality, has a 3.13 ERA (13 ER in 37.1 IP), .213 opponent average (30-for-141), 0.99 WHIP, 7 walks and 34 strikeouts.
- Has tossed 5.0+ innings in 10 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 27, 2023...his 9 starts of 5.0+ innings this season are tied for third among NL starters behind Tyler Glasnow/LAD and Mitch Keller/PIT, who have 10.

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in walks (T-5th, 10), walks per 9.0 innings (6th, 1.67) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (7th, 5.10).

NO-HIT FRAMES: Has tossed 4.0 no-hit innings twice this season (April 22 @ Cardinals and May 15 vs. Reds), which are tied for the second longest of his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

LAST START: Took a no-hitter into the fifth inning on May 15 vs. Reds... finished with 7.0 innings worked and 1 run on 2 hits and 2 walks with 9 strikeouts.

- Retired 13 of the first 14 batters faced.
- Lone run came on a Santiago Espinal home run in the fifth inning.
- Fourth time in his career tossing 7.0 innings.

VS. DODGERS: Third career start vs. Dodgers, second @ Dodger Stadium.

VS. NL WEST ON THE ROAD: In 3 career starts vs. the NL West on the road, has a 3.00 ERA (7 R-6 ER in 18.0 IP), .172 opponent average (11-for-64), 0.94 WHIP, 6 walks and 16 strikeouts.

- Has tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings in 2 of his 3 starts.

IT'S UNDER CONTROL: His 67.5 strike pct. ranks ninth in the NL [min. 6 starts].

- His 4.5 walk pct. is sixth in the NL (min: 25 innings)...boasts a 2.0 walk pct. with runners in scoring position, which is tied with Tyler Glasnow/LAD for third in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind Steven Matz/STL and Bailey Falter/PIT who have not allowed a walk with runners in scoring position.

VS. RIGHTIES ON THE ROAD: Is holding right-handed hitters on the road to a .182 average (8-for-44) with 1 walk and 13 strikeouts.

THIRD TIME THRU: Is limiting opponents to a .228 average (13-for-57) with 2 walks and 12 strikeouts his third time thru the lineup.

FIRST PITCH SUCCESS: His first-pitch swing (34.0 to 43.8) and first-pitch strike (63.9 to 74.1) percentages are up from 2023.

BATTED BALL STATS: From 2023 to 2024, his groundball percentage is up to 40.6 from 32.6 while his fly ball percentage is down to 28.1 from 33.9.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts with Arizona.

- Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by The Athletic (No. 38 overall) and MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by *Baseball America*.
- Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP)... was the second D-backs starting pitcher to make their MLB debut @ Rangers and first @ Globe Life Field (last: Nelson Figueroa on June 3, 2000).
- Struck out Josh Jung in the second inning for his first career strikeout.
- Earned his first Major League win on August 25 vs. Reds (2 ER in 5.1 IP, 5 K).
- Recorded 3 career-high-tying 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox.
- Owned a 12.2 inning scoreless streak from 8/13/23 vs. SD (2nd inning) - 8/25/23 vs. CIN (2nd inning).
- Appeared in 1 game in relief, the first of his career, on Sept. 10 vs. Cubs (4 ER in 6.0 IP).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 5 Postseason games, going 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) and 26 strikeouts.

- Made his Postseason debut in Game 1 of the NL Wild Card on Oct. 3 @ Brewers (3 ER in 2.2 IP).
- Was the second-youngest (24-353) pitcher to start a Postseason game in franchise history, behind Daniel Hudson (24-207 on Oct. 2, 2011 @ Brewers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Became the third D-backs rookie to start a Postseason game (also: Josh Collmenter/2011 vs. MIL and Micah Owings/2007 @ COL [source: Elias Sports Bureau]).
- Tossed 4.1 scoreless innings in his second career Postseason start and first @ Chase Field on Oct. 11 vs. Dodgers in NLDS Game 3.
- Became the youngest (24-361) D-backs' pitcher to start a home Postseason game in franchise history (previous: Josh Collmenter (25-239) vs. Brewers on Oct. 4, 2011 in NLDS Game 3) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings in his first career start vs. Phillies @ Chase Field on Oct. 19 in Game 3 of the NLCS (2 H, 0 BB, 9 K).
- Became the first pitcher in MLB history to allow 0 runs and 0 walks in consecutive Postseason starts (source: @ESPNStatsInfo).
- Became the second pitcher in franchise history to strike out 9+ batters without a walk in a Postseason game (also: Curt Schilling, 2001 World Series Game 7) and the fourth Rookie pitcher in MLB Postseason history to record 8+ strikeouts without a walk.

HOW IT STARTED: • Selected by the D-backs in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player draft out of Bellarmine University.

- Named the D-backs' 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year after going 11-7 with a 3.83 ERA (71 ER in 167.0 IP), 218 strikeouts and 1.16 WHIP in 29 starts with Double-A Amarillo and Triple-A Reno...led all organization farmhands in wins, ERA and strikeouts.
- Attended Bellarmine University for 3 years (2018-2020)...was the second-highest draft pick in school history behind Todd Wellemeier (4th round, 2000) and 9th all-time.
