STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game road trip against the Royals (1-0, two to play) and Astros (three to play) tonight at Kauffman Stadium...they have gone 8-3 in the midst of a 23-game stretch over a 24-day span (June 19 - pres.). They have won six straight games (June 24 - pres.), their fourth winning streak of six games or more...join the Cubs and Cardinals (both 2) as the only teams with multiple such streaks...are 16 games above .500 for the first time since May 31 (36-20) and 2.5 games ahead in the division for the first time since May 26 (34-18)...have spent 45 days in first place in the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth...and three in fifth...Saturday they overtook the Yankees for the division lead, their first time atop the AL East since June 12 and the latest they have led the division in a season since July 18, 2023...have held a share of first or second in the division for 82 straight days (April 8 - pres.).

The Rays took the series opener, 10-4, last night in Kansas City...extended their winning streak to six games, their longest since a season-high seven-game stretch between May 1-7...they have outscored opponents 13-13 (+30) over the winning streak...it is the 28th time in team history the Rays have had a plus-30 run differential over any six-game span (last: May 28 - June 3, 2025, +30). They played six runs in the 3rd inning, the third time this season they have reached that mark in a single inning and the first time since a season-high seven-run frame on May 29 vs. LAA (7th inn.). **Junior Caminero** homered for his fifth game in a row (June 25 - pres.) - see more in "La Máxima" note below.

Ryan Vilade followed up Caminero's home run with one of his own, the second time this season the Rays have launched back-to-back homers (also: May 29 vs. LAA - **Yandy Diaz**/**Jonathan Aranda**) - see more in the "Power Surge" note below.

Griffin Jax spun 6.0 innings with three runs allowed, his third career quality start and his first since Aug. 16, 2024 vs. CLE (6.0IP, 2ER).

They went 13-13 in June, their third straight month with a .500 or better record to open the season...it marks the fourth time in franchise history they have been .500 or better in March/April, May, and June to begin a season (2023, 2011, 2008).

According to FanGraphs, the Rays have pushed their postseason odds to 95.0 pct., an MLB-best 66.1 pct. gain from Opening Day (28.9%).

With a win tonight, the Rays would become the first AL team to 50 wins and keep pace with the 2010 Rays for the third-best start in franchise history (2023, 55-28; 2008, 51-32).

LA MÁXIMA—Last night, **Junior Caminero** homered for his fifth straight game (June 25 - pres.), joining **Mike Zunino** (5G, Aug. 11-17, 2021), **Carlos Peña** (6G, June 6-12, 2010), and **Jose Canseco** (5G, May 16-21, 1999) as the only bats in team history to turn the trick...he is the fourth player in the modern era (since 1900) to hit a homer in five straight games before their 23rd birthday (see table on the right)...he is one of four players (**PHI Kyle Schwarber**, **DET Spencer Torkelson**, **CWS Munetaka Murakami**) in 2026 to have tallied a home run in five straight games...only 32 players in the modern era have hit a homer in six straight (last: **BOS Rafael Devers**, 6G - May 15-20, 2024) with **SEA Ken Griffey Jr.** (8G, July 20-28, 1993 - 23,249) standing as the youngest player to do so...at 22.361, he would surpass Griffey Jr. as the youngest to turn the trick tonight.

He has registered eight home runs in his last seven contests (June 23 - pres.), becoming the first Ray to accomplish the feat...he is also the first Ray to have seven home runs in any five-game span, becoming the first major leaguer to do so since **CIN Joey Votto** (July 26-30, 2021 - 7HR)...he is the second-youngest player in the modern era to have seven homers in five games, behind only **BAL Boog Powell** (June 23-27, 1964 - 22,315).

His 75 career home runs are tied for the 22nd most by a player before their 23rd birthday (also: **NY Y Joe DiMaggio** & **TEX Juan Gonzalez**), Caminero turns 23 this Sunday, July 5 and needs one more home run to tie **SF Orlando Cepeda** (76) for 21st most.

After being named AL Player of the Week (June 22-28) on Monday, he was named Defensive Player of the Month for June by Sports Illustrated today...he led all third basemen in the majors with eight defensive runs saved (see table on the right) in June and held a .984 fielding pct. with one error...only 12 infielders in the majors have 8 DRS across the whole season, and it is more than 15 teams have totaled thus far in 2026.

Phase 2 of All-Star balloting began Monday at 12 p.m. ET and continues until Thursday, July 2 at 12 p.m. ET...Caminero is attempting to become the first player in franchise history to start back-to-back All-Star Games and the eighth (9x) to be elected as a starter via fan balloting, including the first since **Yandy Diaz** and **Randy Arozarena** in 2023...the voting for starting third baseman is between him and **TOR Kazuma Okamoto**, who he leads in WAR (3.3 to 2.0), hits (91 to 70), doubles (42 to 11), home runs (23 to 19), AVG (.294 to .236), OBP (.384 to .318), SLG (.555 to .462), OPS (.939 to .779), and OPS+ (158 to 110)...he also trails Okamoto by a single RBI (53 to 52)...in today's update, he is leading Okamoto with 66 pct. of the votes.

JUNE-IOR—In 26 games throughout June, **Junior Caminero** slashed .327/.402/.673 (32-for-98) with 4 2B, 10 HR, 24 RBI, and a 1.075 OPS...he was the only AL player in June to rank in the top 10 in each of the following categories: home runs (1st), slugging pct. (1st), OPS (1st), RBI (2nd), total bases (2nd, 66), hits (3rd), extra-base hits (13rd, 14), average (5th), runs (16th, 19), on-base pct. (8th), and walks (110th, 13).

Marked the second-most home runs in a month throughout his career behind June 2026 (12HR)...alongside **Carlos Peña** (August 2009, September/October 2007), he is one of two players in Rays history to have multiple 10-homer months in their career.

His 24 RBI matched his most in any month of his career (also May 2025) and were behind only **Jonathan Aranda** (May 2026, 25) for most by any Ray in a month this season.

He was named AL Player of the Week (June 22-28) on Monday after slashing .423/.500/1.231 (11-for-26) with 7 HR, 15 RBI, 4 BB, 8 R, and a 1.731 OPS across seven games...he paced all major league hitters in home runs and tied **CHC Dansby Swanson** for the most RBI...his 1.731 OPS ranked second in the majors to NL Player of the Week **WSH Luis Garcia Jr.** (2.170).

Caminero's 23 home runs were tied for the second most before the calendar flips to July in franchise history (see table on the right).

POWER SURGE—Rays batters have registered 13 home runs in their last five games (June 25 - pres.) on the heels of hitting 13 in their 19 previous contests (June 6-24)...they have launched multiple home runs in each of the five games, their longest streak since April 3-9, 2023 (6G) and tied for the eighth-longest streak in team history (4x, last: May 16-21, 2021)...six different Rays have left the yard in the club's last four contests (**Junior Caminero**, 7; **Cedric Mullins**, 2; **Jonathan Aranda**, 1; **Victor Mesa Jr.**, 1; **Ryan Vilade**, 1; **Ben Williamson**, 1).

Mullins launched five of his eight home runs on the season in the month of June...during the month, the outfielder hit safely in 15 of 19 games he started and reached base in all 19 starts...dating back to May 27, he has reached base in 23 straight starts...Mullins has plated an RBI in three straight games (June 26 - pres.) and four of his last five games (June 23 - pres.).

In June, **Yandy Diaz** led the majors with a .385 (37-for-96) average, his best (min. 90PA) since hitting .400 in September/October 2025...it is the seventh-best average over a month in team history under the same criteria...in June 2025 and June 2026 combined, Diaz hit .393 (77-for-196).

ARMED & DANGEROUS—Since the start of their season-long 10-game homestand on June 19, the Rays pitching staff has allowed four runs or fewer in 10 of 11 games, holding a 2.73 ERA (99.0IP, 30ER) over that span, second lowest in the majors behind the Red Sox (2.63)...the staff has permitted an MLB-low 13 walks during the stretch, with three walks or fewer in all 11 games and two or fewer in 10 of the 11.

Rays starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in 16 straight games (June 13 - pres.) and hold a 2.82 ERA (76.2IP, 24ER) with 66 strikeouts to 15 walks and a 1.07 WHIP over that span...they have spun six quality starts in that span and totaled nine quality starts in the month of June.

REAL ROYALTY—The Rays and Royals will complete a seven-game season series over the course of 11 days from June 22 - July 2...the clubs split their four-game set at Tropicana Field between June 22-25 and have split each of their last two season sets (3-3 in 2024-25)...the Rays have not lost a season series to Kansas City since 2017 (4-3), going undefeated in the previous seven (5-0-2; clubs did not meet in 2020).

The Rays can claim the season series with a win tonight, extending their winning streak over the Royals to four games (June 24 - pres)...it would mark their longest winning streak against the Royals since a franchise-best 10-game winning streak between Aug. 30, 2017 - April 23, 2019...a win tonight would also mark their sixth straight victory at Kauffman Stadium, which would be the longest winning streak at the ballpark in team history.

SEEING STARS IN PHILLY—Today, **OF Theo Gillen** (MLB No. 9 | TB No. 1) and **C Nathan Flewelling** (MLB No. 76 | TB No. 2) were named to the AL Futures team roster for the 2026 All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia on July 12 at Citizens Bank Park...in 64 games split between Class-A Bowling Green and Double-A Montgomery, Gillen has slashed .324/.431/.547 (80-for-247) with 13 2B, 3 3B, 12 HR, 49 RBI, 29 SB, and a .978 OPS...the outfield prospect has reached base in 140 of 145 career minor league games since being drafted in the first round (18th overall) of the 2024 First-Year Player Draft out of Westlake (Austin, TX) HS...Flewelling is the organization's top catching prospect and ranks No. 7 among all MLB catching prospects...in 66 games with Class-A Bowling Green, he is slashing .258/.383/.488 (64-for-248) with 11 2B, 2 3B, 14 HR, 42 RBI, and an .871 OPS...the 19-year-old was selected in the third round (94th overall) of the 2024 First-Year Player Draft out of St. Joseph (Red Deer, Alberta, CAN) HS.

Additionally, Triple-A Durham Hitting Coach **Keoni DeRenne** has been named to the AL Futures coaching staff for the game...DeRenne joined the Bulls this season after being with the Royals since 2020 as an assistant hitting coordinator (2020-21) and assistant hitting coach (2022-25).

In previous years, **Junior Caminero** (2023) and **Chandler Simpson** (2024) represented the organization at Futures Games...last year, the Rays were represented by **RHP Brody Hopkins** (TB No. 4).

Six current players on the Rays 40-man roster/Injured List have appeared in Futures Games previously: **Caminero**, **Simpson**, **Ryan Vilade** (2021 w/ COL), **Manuel Rodriguez** (2021 w/CHC), **Gavin Lux** (2019 w/ LAD), and **Yandy Diaz** (2016 w/CLE).

TONIGHT'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 16th start of the season and ninth on the road...will be making his 90th career start and 43rd on the road...is looking to snap a career-high-tying three-game losing streak (also: Sept. 20–Oct. 1, 2022)...has yielded 2 ER or fewer in 10 of 15 starts...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- ★ McClanahan is seeking his 40th career victory, which will tie four other pitchers for seventh most in club history: **Jeremy Hellickson**, **Jeff Niemann**, **Jake Odorizzi**, and **Ryan Yarbrough**...**Blake Snell** ranks sixth with 42 wins...his 13 career road wins are tied with **Colin Poche** for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- ★ With a win tonight, McClanahan will have multiple wins against 10 of 25 clubs faced...has yet to face ATL, AZ, COL, PHI, and TB.
- ★ The Rays are 40-4 in his career when he receives three runs of support or more (6-0 in 2026) and 13-32 with two runs or fewer (2-7 in 2026).

LAST TIME OUT—Suffered his third straight loss despite recording a quality start after allowing a season-high six runs and a career-high-tying three home runs on June 23 vs. KC (L, 6.0IP, 6R-2ER, BB, 4SO, 3HR)...after surrendering back-to-back home runs to **Nick Loftin** and **Jac Caglianone** in the 1st inning, he retired eight of the next 10 batters through the 4th...worked a 1-2-3 6th inning before handing the ball off to the bullpen.

- ★ With his second strikeout in the 3rd inning, he surpassed **Tyler Glasnow** (526) for eighth place on the franchise's all-time strikeout leaderboard...his 529 career punchouts trail **Alex Cobb** (570) by 41 strikeouts for seventh place...among left-handers, he ranks fourth behind **David Price** (1,048), **Scott Kazmir** (874), and **Blake Snell** (648).
- ★ Marked the first time this season McClanahan has been tagged for multiple home runs (last: Aug. 2, 2023 at NYY - 2HR)...his back-to-back home runs allowed in the 1st inning marked the first time in his career he has allowed consecutive homers, and just the third time he has allowed multiple home runs in a single frame (last: Aug. 2, 2023 at NYY - 3rd inn)...had given up three long balls over the 67.2 innings of his first 14 starts.

CROWN TOWN—All four of McClanahan's previous starts opposite the Royals have come at Tropicana Field, most recently a 12-5 loss in his last start on June 23...he is 1-1 with a 2.49 ERA (21.2IP, 6ER) and 0.97 WHIP in the previous four starts, holding Kansas City hitters to a .192/.259/.385 (15-for-78) line, including a 9-for-59 (.153) clip vs. right-handed batters...his first career scoreless start of 5.0 IP or more came against the Royals on May 27, 2021 (W, 5.0IP, 3H, 0R, 6SO).

- ★ **KC Salvador Perez** is 1-for-10 (.100) with 5 SO lifetime vs. McClanahan, marking the southpaw's most career strikeouts against any batter who has never appeared for an AL East club.
- ★ McClanahan is 8-6 with a 3.11 ERA (92.2IP, 32ER) in 17 career starts opposite AL Central foes...he has permitted 2 ER or fewer in 14 of those 17 starts, going 8-3 with a 2.34 ERA (77.0IP, 20ER).
- ★ Five of his nine intraleague starts have been scoreless, but he has a 3.91 ERA (25.1IP, 11ER) in his last five starts vs. the AL compared to a 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER) in his first four...overall, his five wins against the Junior Circuit are tied for fifth most among AL pitchers, two shy of leader **TEX Nathan Eovaldi**.

ROAD TRIPPER—McClanahan is 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (37.0IP, 18ER) in eight road starts this season, marking the most road losses he has recorded in a single season in his career...the team is 2-6 when he starts on the road this year and has lost each of his last four road starts...however, has recorded 9.49 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ratio playing away from home, ranking fourth among AL left-handers (min. 35.0IP) behind **BOS Ranger Suarez** (10.03), **DET Tarik Skubal** (10.02), and **CLE Parker Messick** (9.63).

- ★ Across his last four road starts (May 25–June 17), the southpaw has posted a .297 (22-for-74) opp. average, compared to a .181 (13-for-72) clip in his first four starts (March 31–May 12).
- ★ Opponents have gone 15-for-43 (.349) against him with RISP on the road compared to 4-for-28 (.143) in seven starts at the Trop this year.

KEEP THE CHANGE—He has held opponents to a .146 (13-for-89) clip on his changeup, third in the AL (min. 75AB) to teammates **Ian Seymour** (.141) and **Nick Martinez** (.133) and fourth in the majors, also trailing **PHI Christopher Sánchez** (.142)...min. 100 swings, only four AL southpaws have better changeup whiff rates than McClanahan (36.0%): **DET Tarik Skubal** (49.0%), **ATH Jeffrey Springs** (40.1%), **CLE Joey Cantillo** (39.3%), and **CLE Parker Messick** (38.0%)...he has allowed only 1 XBH on his changeup: a **Taylor Ward** double on May 18 vs. BAL.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS—Left-handed hitters have gone 9-for-55 (.164) against McClanahan...min. 40 AB, the .164 opp. average vs. LHB ranks ninth among AL southpaws...he has walked only three of 40 (7.5%) left-handed batters faced in his last 12 starts (April 19–pres.) while striking out 10 of them...excluding his start on May 1 vs. SF (3-for-6 vs. LHB), lefties are batting .122 (6-for-49) against him in his other 14 starts.

MASTERPIECE OF A MONTH—During May, McClanahan went 4-0 with a 1.41 ERA (32.0IP, 5ER) across six starts, the lowest ERA among AL pitchers (min. 30.0IP)...he also ranked highly among AL starters in WHIP (4th, 0.84), opp. on-base pct. (5th, .231), and run support average (6th, 7.03)...it signaled the fourth-lowest May ERA in franchise history (min. 30.0IP), trailing **Rich Hill** (0.78) in 2021, **Scott Kazmir** (1.15) in 2008, and **Jeremy Hellickson** (1.36) in 2011.

- ★ He was one of three MLB starters and the lone AL starter to post four starts or more of 5.0 scoreless innings or more in May, joining **MIL Jacob Misiorowski** (5GS) and **PHI Christopher Sánchez** (5GS).
- ★ He joined teammate **Nick Martinez** (1.52ERA/29.2IP, 5ER) as the only Rays duo in club history to both turn in a 1.55 ERA or lower during May (min. 25.0IP).
