METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Blue Jays, 3-2, in walk-off fashion on Saturday night...The Mets continue their first homestand of the season, a six-game stand against the Blue Jays (2-0) and the Marlins (three games).

KIDS OPENING DAY: Today is Kids Opening Day at Citi Field, with all kids in attendance having the opportunity to enjoy pre-game entertainment at Mets Plaza beginning at 11:10 a.m...Citi Field will introduce Family Sundays, which will feature a ticket offer for four starting at \$50, with pre-game entertainment on Mets Plaza and family-focused activities throughout the ballpark.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets earned their first walk-off of the season last night... They have 12 walk-off wins since 2024, which is tied with San Francisco for the second-most in the majors during that span.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Mets are seeking their first sweep of the season today...The Mets last swept the Blue Jays was from July 15-17, 2001 at Shea Stadium.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won three games for the first time this season...The team has won four of their last five...New York is a season-high two games over .500 for the first time this season.

AW SUGAR, SUGAR: Edwin Diaz recorded his first save of the season on March 28 at Houston...66 of his 117 saves as a Met have come at Citi Field... That is the most in franchise history...Overall, Diaz is fourth in franchise history in saves.

THE DAVID: David Peterson is set to make his second start of the year today...It will mark his first start in front of the Flushing Faithful in 2025... He is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 ER/6.0 IP), three walks and nine strikeouts...He owns a career 16-8 mark with a 3.44 ERA (80 ER/209.0 IP), 96 walks and 219 strikeouts in 48 games (39 starts) at Citi Field.

HERE'S THE PITCH: The Mets sport a 2.03 ERA (16 ER/71.0 IP) this season... That places them second in the majors and in the Senior Circuit...Only the Dodgers (1.90 ERA) have a lower mark...This includes a 2.45 ERA (11 ER/40.1 IP) from the starting staff and a 1.47 ERA (5 ER/30.2 IP) from the relief staff...The Mets bullpen leads the majors in ERA.

MAX POWER: Max Kranick has retired 17 of the 18 batters he has faced this season...He retired his first 12 batters of the season before allowing a single to Vladimir Guerrero Jr. with one out in the eighth inning on Friday...Kranick has extended his career-high scoreless streak to 10.2 innings (since: 5/7/22).

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 2-0 at Citi Field this year...New York finished the 2024 season going 46-35 at home, including a 46-34 record at Citi Field (one home game in London)...The Mets went 33-12 at Citi Field from June 12 until the end of the season...The team lost consecutive games at home only three times in that period...New York posted a 3.57 ERA at home, which was sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets went 43-38 at Citi Field in 2023, posting a 3.89 ERA.

ALWAYS JUAN: Juan Soto has safely reached base in all eight games with the Mets this season...He is sporting a .371 OBP with three extra-base hits, three RBI and six walks.

JAYS-METS NOTES: The Mets are hosting the Blue Jays at Citi Field for the first time since 2023...The Mets won 12 straight games against the Blue Jays in New York from September 1, 1997 - May 15, 2018...Since then, the team is 4-5 against the Jays in NYC.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the team will wear a tribute uniform patch all season long to honor Mets Hall of Famer Ed Kranepool...Kranepool passed away on September 8, 2024, at age 79... Kranepool played for the Mets from 1962-1979, spending his entire 18-year career with the Mets...He was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a 1965 All-Star and the club's all-time leader in games played...Kranepool remains in the Mets all-time top 10 in many statistical categories including plate appearances, hits, at-bats, total bases, doubles, RBI, walks and runs scored... He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1990.

LAST TIME OUT: Peterson made his first start of the season on March 31 at Miami, earning the win after allowing two earned runs over six innings pitched with nine strikeouts (5 H, 3 BB, 2 HR)...Allowed his only runs on solo home runs to Otto Lopez (second inning) and Eric Wagaman (sixth inning)...His two home runs allowed marked his most in a game since August 21, 2023 at Atlanta.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 48 career games (39 starts) at Citi Field, has gone 16-8 with a 3.44 ERA (80 ER/209.0 IP) with 96 walks and 219 strikeouts...The Mets have gone 31-17 in those games...In nine starts at Citi Field last season, Peterson went 4-2 with a 3.35 ERA (18 ER/48.1 IP), 20 walks and 51 strikeouts.

2024 RECAP: Peterson went 10-3 with a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) in 2024, allowing just eight home runs while adding 46 walks and 101 strikeouts in 21 starts...Among pitchers who threw at least 100.0 innings last season, he ranked eighth in HR/9.0 (0.60, sixth in NL), ninth in ERA (sixth in NL) and 13th in groundball percentage (50.4, eighth in NL)...During the Mets Postseason run, Peterson made five appearances, getting the nod in his lone start for Game 5 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL...The southpaw went 1-0 with one save, a 2.92 ERA (4 ER/12.1 IP) and eight strikeouts in the playoffs...For the first time in his career, he recorded double-digit wins...Marked the third consecutive season Peterson recorded at least 100 strikeouts, becoming 1-of-11 left-handers in franchise history and 1-of-6 Mets southpaws since 2000 to reach the milestone in at least three seasons (joined Tom Glavine, Al Leiter, Steven Matz, Jon Niese and Johan Santana)...Made his season debut on May 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL after starting the season on the 60-day Injured List recovering from left hip surgery.

CAREER YEAR: The left-hander recorded career-bests in wins (10), innings pitched (121.0), ERA (2.90) and HR/9.0IP (0.60) surpassing previous bests in wins (seven, 2022), innings pitched (111.0, 2023), ERA (3.44, 2020) and HR/9.0IP (0.91, 2020)...He also tied a career-high with 21 starts (also: 2023).

THREE AND UNDER: With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts...He is the first Mets southpaw to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010.

SAVE ME: In Game 3 of the NLWC vs. Milwaukee, Peterson recorded the series-clinching save, a career first...He became the first pitcher in franchise history and 19th in major league history to record their first career save in the Postseason...Courtesy of *Elias*.

SPRING TRAINING: In four Spring outings (three starts), Peterson recorded a 0.57 ERA (1 ER/15.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts...His one earned run allowed came from a solo home run to INF David Hamilton on March 13 vs. Boston...Held Spring batters to a .130 (7-54) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 5.0 scoreless innings (2H, 3BB, 4K).

QUALITY DOWN THE STRETCH: Peterson recorded 12 quality starts last season, with 10 of them coming in his last 16 games (July 1 - September 29)...Recorded one quality start in his only outing of the season...From July 1, 2024 to now, his 11 quality starts are tied for the sixth-most in the majors (fifth in NL).

TO THE LEFT TO THE LEFT: In 2024, Peterson held left-handed batters to a .218/.273/.303 slash line (26-119)...Among lefty pitchers facing left-handed batters last season, he ranked fourth in opponents' SLG (first in NL), sixth in opponents' batting average (second in NL), and ninth in opponents' OBP (fourth in NL)...In his career, he has posted a .232 opponents' batting average against lefties (95-409).

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2021 and 2023)...Started the 2024 season on the 60-day Injured List after undergoing left hip surgery in the offseason...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 29-24 with a 4.07 ERA (208 ER/460.0 IP) and 473 strikeouts in 102 games (86 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Began last season with Miami before he was acquired by the Mets on July 30 in exchange for INF Wilfredo Lara.
