METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Nationals, 3-2, last night...The Mets have won two of their last three games...New York continues a seven-game road trip (2-2) to Cincinnati (1-2) and Washington D.C. (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head home for a six-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games) and Cleveland (three games).

THREE'S COMPANY: Last night, Francisco Lindor cleared the bases with an RBI single in the sixth inning...It was the third time in Mets history that a player has recorded a three RBI single joining Edgardo Alfonzo on August 27, 1997 vs. San Francisco Giants (7th Inn) and Tug McGraw on September 8, 1970 vs. Montreal Expos (8th Inn).

A THOUSAND MILES: David Robertson struck out four last night... He recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in the process... He has 1,001 career strikeouts, recording 1,000 in relief and one as a starter as an opener in 2021 as a member of the Rays... He became the 14th pitcher in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts solely in relief.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 15 games and has allowed one run in 15.1 innings of work, good for a 0.53 ERA... He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 24 in that span... He is holding left-handed hitters to a .133 (4-30) batting average this season...He has converted all eight save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

SAFE AT LAST: Drew Smith entered the ninth inning last night and struck out the only batter he faced to record his first career save...He is 21 - with a 1.88 ERA ( 3 ER/14.1 IP) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts in 16 games this year...He has a $12.56 \mathrm{~K} / 9$ IP ratio this year.

BRIGHAM OUT, BRIGHAM OUT: Jeff Brigham has not allowed a run in nine of his 11 appearances this season, posting a 3.00 ERA (4 ER/12.0 IP)...He has struck out 14 and allowed five hits and four walks in 12.0 innings this year

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been outscored 35-9 in the first inning this year...The Mets are 6-18 when their opponent scores first...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-2 when scoring first this season...Their .867 winning percentage when scoring first ranks second in the majors.

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Pete Alonso is a lifetime .338 (46-136) hitter with 24 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 12 home runs, 29 RBI, 17 walks with a .417 OBP a .684 SLG in 36 career games in Washington D.C...Mark Canha has hit . 406 (13-32) with seven runs, one double, one home run, five RBI and three walks in eight games at the ballpark...Jeff McNeil has slashed $.331 / .390 / .504$ with 16 runs, six doubles, two triples, four home runs, 20 RBI and 12 walks in 34 contests in the district...Brandon Nimmo has slashed .308/.430/.411 with 24 runs, seven doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI and 30 walks in 44 games at the home of the Nationals.

STARTING PITCHING: Mets starting pitchers have tossed 190.2 innings this year, the fifth-fewest innings in the majors...They have surrendered 37 homers, the fifth-most in the majors...New York starters have issued 96 walks, tied for the most in the majors...They are 13-16 with a 5.29 ERA ( 112 earned runs/190.2 innings).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 8-6 against the division this year...The team went $50-26$ against the East in 2022...Their . 658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series against the Nationals in four of the last five years.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York will play their 25th road game today, the second-most in the majors...New York is 12-12 on the road this season...They are 3-3-1 in road series in 2023.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo ranks fifth in the National League with a .317 batting average, is sixth with a .414 OBP and is tied for eighth with 45 hits...Over the last 26 games, Nimmo is batting .343 (36-105) with 16 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 10 RBI nine walks with a .912 OPS...He ranks eighth in the majors and third in the NL with a 1.8 fWAR.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over his last 21 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 16-55 (.291) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine walks with a . 391 OBP and a .455 SLG... He has posted a .389 OBP in 31 games this season, which is second on the team.

AND THEY'RE OFF: Starling Marte is tied for 13th in the majors and tied for seventh in the NL with nine steals... He ranks third among active players with 323 career steals...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more...The Mets are fifth in the National League with a $81.3 \%$ success rate in steals this season...The Mets are eighth the NL with 26 steals this season.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is batting 310 (27-87) with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a . 375 OBP and an . 800 OPS over his last 24 games...Overall, he is batting .273/.369/.374 in 39 games this season.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil has recorded 11 multi-hit games this season... He has 174 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 64 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is tied for the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette (70) and Freddie Freeman (70).

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 43 infield hits this season which is tied for the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 23 times this season...That is tied for the second-most in the majors and tied for the most in the National League...Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 135 times, the most in the majors.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP AI Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the $4: 10$ p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

## LUCCHESI NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on May 7 at Citi Field against Colorado, allowing three earned runs on four hits...Fanned five Rockies batters in the Mets' $13-6$ loss.

THE (NAT)URAL: Lucchesi faced the Nationals earlier this season on April 27 at Citi Field, during which he threw 5.1 innings, allowing three earned runs on five hits and two walks while striking out three in a 9-8 Mets victory... He has faced Washington five times in his career, pitching to a $1-0$ record with a 4.38 ERA (12 ER/24.2 IP)...In those five starts, Lucchesi has fanned 24 Nationals batters... His only win against the NL East rival came on June 6, 2019 while with the Padres, during which he allowed four earned runs in 5.0 innings on four hits, three walks and five strikeouts...In two starts at Nationals Park, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.86 ERA (4 ER/9.1 IP) with 10 strikeouts and has yet to earn a decision.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In two away games this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) and earned his one win on the year thus far in San Francisco on April 21...In two home starts this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 5.79 ERA ( $6 \mathrm{ER} / 9.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ).

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen ( 28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU: Lucchesi holds a 2-4 record in 15 appearances and 13 starts in the month of May... Has pitched to a 4.59 ERA ( $35 \mathrm{ER} / 68.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in those games, while fanning 62 batters...Lucchesi has faced the Nationals in May only once before, on May 9, 2018 while with San Diego...During that start, he threw 5.0 innings, allowing one earned run on six hits and one walk while striking out six batters.

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA ( $19 \mathrm{ER} / 38.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings... Pitched to a 1.19 ERA ( 3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi made three starts this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a . 196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his churve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

## toMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (2-2,5.56)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.1 innings in Detroit against his former team on May 3 in the second game of a doubleheader, allowing six earned runs on eight hits and one walk while fanning three Tigers batters... Was his first start since serving a 10-game suspension for violating MLB's foreign substance policy.
DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next $10+\mathrm{K}$ game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career....He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
