**ROSTER MOVES:** RHP Jordan Yamamoto, who was designated for assignment on April 5, has cleared waivers and outrighted to Triple-A Syracuse.

**METSELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Nationals, 4-2, yesterday, taking their first loss of the year...The Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a two-city, seven-game series against Washington (3-1) and Philadelphia (three games)...The Mets return to New York for their home opener on Friday, April 15 against the Arizona Diamondbacks.

**SEE YOU SOON, SEAVER:** The countdown is on until the unveiling of the Tom Seaver statue...The statue will be unveiled in a special pre-game ceremony to the right of the Home Run Apple in front of Citi Field on April 15, the Mets' home opener...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He led the NL in wins three times, ERA three times and strikeouts five times...Seaver was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1992...He spent 12 years with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA and 2,541 strikeouts and is the Mets' all-time leader in wins, strikeouts, shutouts (44), ERA, complete games (171) and starts (395)...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975, as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has gone 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (four earned runs/22.2 innings) with two walks and 25 strikeouts...The club's starters have held opponents to a .145 (11-76) batting average through the team's first four games...The team ranks fifth in the majors and third in the NL with a 1.59 starter's ERA and leads all of MLB with 25 punchouts and 22.2 innings pitched from starting pitchers.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** In 25 career games in Philly, Starling Marte has hit .398 (39-98) with 17 runs, 12 doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI and six walks with a .449 OBP and a .643 SLG...He is a .401 (79-197) career average vs. the Phillies...That is the fifth-highest average all-time for any player against any one opponent (min. 175 at-bats)...Has hit safely in 41 of his 50 games played against the Phils.

**TAKE IT TO THE BANK:** Luis Guillorme is 8-17 (.471) with two runs, a double, three RBI and four walks in 13 games at Citizens Bank Park...Jeff McNeil has hit .333 (34-102) at the ballpark with eight doubles, a triple, a home run, six RBI and nine walks...Dominic Smith has hit to a .311 (32-103) mark with 13 runs, seven doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 15 RBI there...His seven home runs are his highest total for any opponent's ballpark.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha is batting .700 (7-10) with two runs, two RBI, three walks and a 1.469 OPS in three games this season...He is second in the majors in batting average as well as in OBP (.769) and is third in times on base at 10...Canha has posted a .381 OBP since 2019...That ranks sixth in the major leagues during that span.

**BEAT THE STREAK:** Canha has collected three straight multi-hit games...It marks the seventh time in his career he has collected multiple hits in three or more games...His career-high is four consecutive games with multiple hits...He accomplished that feat twice in his career, from August 22-26, 2019 and again from September 18-22, 2019...He is one of 10 players in franchise history to collect multiple hits in each of his first three games of the season...He is the first player to do since John Buck accomplished the feat from April 1-4, 2013...The franchise record-holder is Mike Cameron, who went five straight games to start his season with multiple hits (May 5-9, 2005)...He is followed by Dave Schneck (April 7-14) who opened up his 1974 season with four straight multi-hit contests.

**PHILS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are seeking their 500th win against the Phillies in franchise history...The team's 499 wins are its most against any single opponent.

**VS. PHILADELPHIA:** Taijuan Walker has faced the Phillies six times in his career, going 1-2 with a 3.34 ERA (12 earned runs/32.1 innings)...Five of those six outings came last season, as Walker went 0-2 with a 3.76 (11 earned runs/26.1 innings) against Philadelphia...He has allowed three runs or fewer in five of his six starts against the Phillies...His lone win against the Phillies came on September 20, 2020 at Citizens Bank Park as a member of the Blue Jays.

**MOVING ON UP:** Pete Alonso currently ranks 14th in Mets history with 107 career homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR leaderboard: Jose Reyes (108), Ed Kranepool (118), Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

**DOUBLY DOUBLE-E:** Eduardo Escobar at least one double in seven straight games...That is the longest active extra-base-hit streak in the majors and tied for the longest XBH hit streak of his career...The last player with an extra-base hit in eight straight games was Joey Votto (July 23-30, 2021)...Escobar has a double in each of his three games this season...The only Met with an extra-base hit in more consecutive games to start a year is Rico Brogna, who had an XBH in his first five games in 1995.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Mets lead the Senior Circuit and are third in the majors with a .293 batting average...They lead all of MLB with a .396 OBP... They also lead the majors in hits (41), are tied for the lead in doubles (8) and are tied for fifth with 19 runs scored.

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil has safely hit in each of the first four games of the year...He is batting .438 (7-16) with two runs, a home run, three RBI, two walks with a .500 OBP and a 1.125 OPS...His seven hits are tied for the second-most in the majors...He has collected multiple hits in two of his first four games this season.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been hit a major-league leading five times this year...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 312 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 40 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 55 HBP in the last four seasons.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are now 3-1 against the NL East this season...Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES:** The 2022 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster, including: RHP Chris Bassitt (trade), OF Mark Canha (free agent), INF Eduardo Escobar (free agent), OF Travis Jankowski (free agent), OF Starling Marte (free agent), RHP Adam Ottavino (free agent), LHP Joely Rodriguez (trade), RHP Max Scherzer (free agent) and LHP Chasen Shreve (free agent).

**THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS:** Buck Showalter became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,554.

**HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ:** Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

### WALKER NEWS & NOTES

**GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE:** Walker made three Grapefruit League starts in 2022, all against the Washington Nationals...Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings in his first two starts, allowing just four hits...In his final spring tune-up, allowed six runs on six hits, including two homers, on April 5 in West Palm Beach...All told, Walker went 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA (six earned runs/7.0 innings) with two strikeouts and zero walks.

**TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Last season, entered the break ranked 12th in the majors and ninth in the National League with a 2.50 ERA...Walker's numbers declined in the second half after his All-Star level performance in the first half...He went 0-8 with a 7.13 ERA (51 earned runs/64.1 innings) in 13 second-half starts...Allowed 20 home runs in 64.1 innings after the break after surrendering just six in 94.2 innings before the break...Opponents had an .861 OPS against him after the All-Star game, compared to a .573 OPS against Walker in the first half.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was selected to represent the Mets at the 2021 All-Star Game in Denver, his first All-Star game selection...Pitched 1.0 inning in last year's Midsummer Classic and allowed a solo home run to Rays C Mike Zunino...On May 6 at St. Louis, Walker threw 7.0 one-hit innings with eight strikeouts...On June 9, Walker allowed one earned run in 7.0 innings with nine strikeouts in a 14-1 win over the Orioles...His following start, June 15 against the Cubs, Walker struck out a career-high 12 batters over 7.0 innings without issuing a walk...On August 14 against the Dodgers, Walker took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before surrendering a home run to C Will Smith...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Met since Steven Matz had a no-hitter through 7.1 innings on August 14, 2016 against the Padres.

**VS. PHILADELPHIA:** Walker has faced the Phillies six times in his career, going 1-2 with a 3.34 ERA (12 earned runs/32.1 innings)...Five of those six outings came last season, as Walker went 0-2 with a 3.76 (11 earned runs/26.1 innings) against Philadelphia...He has allowed three runs or fewer in five of his six starts against the Phillies...His lone win against the Phillies came on September 20, 2020 at Citizens Bank Park as a member of the Blue Jays...In that start, Walker allowed one earned run on four hits in 6.0 innings and tied a season-high with eight strikeouts.

**ELECTRIC SLIDE:** In 2020, Walker added a slider to his pitch arsenal and has thrown the pitch just over 21% of the time in each of the last two seasons...Last season, Walker held opposing batters to a .183 batting average (24-131) against his slider and recorded 31 strikeouts with the pitch.

**HOME/ROAD:** In 2021, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) with 58 strikeouts in 14 road starts...The Mets have lost four of his last five away starts...At home, Walker went 4-4 with a 3.46 ERA (35 earned runs/91.0 Innings) with 88 strikeouts in 16 home games (15 starts)...New York won each of his first nine home starts, then dropped his last seven.

**LIMITING LEFTIES:** Last season, Walker held left-handed batters to .192 (48-250) average, tied for the fourth best total among right-handed pitchers in 2021 (min. 200 left-handed batters faced).

**DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers last season...The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts which tied for 10th in the National League.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (1-0, 0.00)

**LAST OUTING:** On Opening Day, April 7, Megill earned the win after pitching 5.0 scoreless innings while allowing two hits and striking out six batters without issuing a walk against the Nationals...Coming into the start, Megill had pitched 89.2 innings in the big leagues, the fewest total by a Mets Opening Day starter.

**100 K:** Megill's first strikeout of the 2022 season was his 100th career strikeout...He became the 14th Mets hurler to have recorded 100 or more strikeouts by their 19th start with the club.
