#### **SNAKEBITES**

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

FOUR STRAIGHT W'S: The D-backs have won a season-high 4 consecutive games.

♦ Last season, the D-backs won a season-high 6 straight games (3x - May 28-June 2, June 6-12 and Aug. 19-25), marking the first time to reach the 6-win feat since 2020.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 5-4 @ Reds yesterday to complete the 3-game sweep.

- ◆ Ketel Marte hit safely in his 10th straight game.
- ◆ Joc Pederson collected his second 3-hit performance of the month and slugged his second home run in 4
- ◆ Paul Sewald collected his first save of the season in his second game back (0 ER in 1.0 IP, 2 K).

VS. ORIOLES: This marks Arizona's first series @ Baltimore since Sept. 23-25, 2016.

- ♦ Last season, the D-backs hosted the Orioles @ Chase Field for 3 games, the first time since 2019.
- ♦ The D-backs are 5-4 all-time @ Orioles...their last win @ Oriole Park at Camden Yards came on June 17, 2007 (W, 6-4).

BATS AGAINST BALTIMORE: Over his last 7 games vs. Orioles, Gabriel Moreno is batting .478 (11-for-23)/1.303 OPS with 1 double, 2 homers, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

- ♦ In 3 games last season, Christian Walker hit .429 (3for-7) with 2 homers and 3 RBI.
- ◆ Corbin Carroll, over his 3 games in 2023, hit .385 (5for-13) with 1 double, 1 homer and 1 RBI.

WELCOME TO CAMDEN YARDS: Only 8 players on the D-backs' active roster have played a game @ Camden Yards: Tucker Barnhart (4G), Randal Grichuk (28G), Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (29 G), Ketel Marte (3 G), Gabriel Moreno (2 G), Kevin Newman (5 G), Joc Pederson (6 G) and Eugenio Suárez (6 G).

MEMORABLE VISITS FOR WALKER & MORENO: Christian Walker hit his first career homer in his third career MLB game with the Orioles on Sept. 20, 2014 vs. Red Sox @ Camden Yards (solo off Rubby De La Rosa, 4th inn.).

♦On the final day of the 2022 season, Oct. 5, 2022 (Game 1 of doubleheader) @ Orioles, Gabriel Moreno slugged his first career home run (3-run off Mike Baumann, 6th inn.).

GRICHUK VS. CHARM CITY: Randal Grichuk's 22 home runs vs. Orioles since 2018 are tied for third most among all players (also: Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Gleyber Torres), behind Aaron Judge (28) and J.D. Martinez (27).

MARTE'S 10+-GAME HIT STREAKS: Ketel Marte is currently riding a 10-game hit streak...his 10 total 10-game hit streaks in his career with Arizona marks the third most in franchise history, behind Luis Gonzalez (12) and Paul Goldschmidt (11) [source: Stats LLC].

CLEAN FIELDING TEAMS: Since April 22, the D-backs have made 3 errors (1 being Catcher's Interference), which are second fewest in the Majors, behind the Orioles (2).

ABOVE AVERAGE DEFENDERS: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the top 10 of MLB Outs Above Average leaders: Christian Walker (T-2nd, 7), Kevin Newman (5th, 5) and Ketel Marte (T-6th, 5).

WALKER, THE FORMER ORIOLE: Christian Walker was originally signed by Orioles as a fourth-round selection in 2012 out of the University of South Carolina and spent 5 seasons in the organization (2012-16).

- ♦ Participated in the 2013 MLB All-Star Futures Game @ Citi Field.
- ♦ Was named Baltimore's 2014 Brooks Robinson Minor League Player of the Year after hitting .288 (153-for-532) with 73 runs, 25 doubles, 2 triples, 26 homers, 96 RBI and 56 walks.

SUÁREZ ON A MISSION FOR 30: Eugenio Suárez has homered against 29 of the 30 teams...the only remaining team is against Baltimore.

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.7 bWAR is third among all players (pitcher or position), behind Mookie Betts/ LAD (3.2) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3.0), while his 1.1 defensive bWAR is tied for second (also: Witt Jr.).

SWWWEEP: Yesterday, the D-backs sealed their first sweep of the season and first on the road during regular season since June 9-11, 2023 @ Tigers.

♦ In 2023, the D-backs collected 7 series sweeps and 2 total on the road (@ Nationals and @ Tigers).

HR / BUNT HIT / SB: Joc Pederson became the fourth D-back in franchise history to record a homer, bunt hit and stolen base in a game (also: Corbin Carroll/2024, Luis Terreto/2004 and Tony Womack/2002).

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 16 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is third in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (19) and Phillies (17).

- ♦ The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 9 games this season, which are second most to the Phillies (12).
- ♦ The D-backs' 34 runs scored in the first inning are the second-most in the Majors, behind the Phillies (38) and ahead of the Padres (33) and Marlins (32).

#### NEXT STARTER: RHP RYNE NELSON (2-2, 5.23)

- ◆ Earned the win in his last start on May 5 vs. Padres (4 ER in 5.0 IP).
- ♦ Will make his first career start vs. Orioles.
- ♦ Has made 2 starts vs. AL East opponents vs. Yankees on April 1, 2024 (L; 4 ER in 2.2 IP) and @ Blue Jays on July 14, 2023 (ND; 1 ER in 5.2 IP).

In his last 2 starts (both road) vs. the AL, is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (2 ER in 11.2 IP), .222 opponent average (10-for-45), 0.83 WHIP, 0 walks and 19 strikeouts.

**IT'S UNDER CONTROL**: His 88.4 pct. competitive pitch location (pct. of pitches within the center of the zone) ranks fourth in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind only Martín Pérez/PIT (89.1%), Trevor Rogers/MIA (88.9%) and Jake Irvin/WSH (88.8%).

- His 68.4 strike pct. ranks fourth in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind Jared Jones/PIT (71.9%), Chris Sale/ATL (70.4%) and Yoshinobu Yamamoto/LAD (68.6%).
- His 3.4 walk pct. is third in the NL (min: 25 innings)...boasts a 2.4 walk pct. with runners in scoring position, which ranks sixth in the NL [min. 6 starts], behind 5 others who have not allowed a walk with runners in scoring position.

**THIRD TIME THROUGH:** In his third time thru the lineup, is limiting batters to a .227 average (10-for-44) with 1 walk and 10 strikeouts.

**VS RIGHTIES ON THE ROAD:** Is holding right-handed hitters on the road to a .167 average (6-for-36) with 1 walk and 13 strikeouts.

**NO-HIT FRAMES:** His 4.0 no-hit innings tossed on April 22 @ Cardinals were the second longest of his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

**FIRST PITCH SUCCESS:** His first-pitch swing (34.0 to 44.3) and first-pitch strike (63.9 to 76.4) percentages are up from 2023.

**BATTED BALL STATS:** From 2023 to 2024, his groundball percentage is up to 41.5 from 32.6 while his fly ball percentage is down to 26.8 from 33.9.

**2023 RECAP:** Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts with Arizona.
