BOMBS AWAY: The Dodgers blew out the Rangers last night, recording their most lopsided victory of the season, hitting a season high-tying five home runs and plating a season high 15 runs. Los Angeles has now won four of its last five games overall and tonight, looks to win its 14th series of the 2024 campaign (13-8-1) as the six-game Interleague homestand continues (1-0) with the middle contest against the defending World Champions. Following the conclusion of their three-game set with Texas tomorrow night, the Dodgers welcome in the Kansas City Royals for three games this weekend (June 14-16).

- The Dodgers own the second-best record in the NL, behind the Philadelphia Phillies (46-20), and also hold a 7.5-game lead over the San Diego Padres in the National League West division.
- This morning, the Dodgers acquired infielder/outfielder **Cavan Biggio** from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for minor league right-handed pitcher Braydon Fisher. Biggio, 29, appeared in 44 games for the Blue Jays this season and hit .200 with four doubles, two homers and nine RBI. In six seasons, he's slashed a combined .227/.343/.382 with 48 homers and 176 RBI in 490 games. Biggio was originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the fifth round of the 2016 First Year Player Draft out of Notre Dame University.

A COUPLE OF TOUCHDOWNS: L.A. trounced the Texas Rangers, 15-2 last night, recording a season high in runs, banging out 14 hits and mashing five home runs, including a franchise record-tying four in one inning (**Shohei Ohtani, Freddie Freeman, Teoscar Hernández** and **Jason Heyward**). Dodger All-Star catcher **Will Smith** led the initial charge, ripping a three-run homer in the first inning and finishing the night 3-for-4 with two runs scored and three RBI. Smith's 42 RBI rank 10th in the National League and his .874 OPS ranks seventh in the league. Elsewhere on offense, Freeman collected his sixth three-hit game of the year, **Mookie Betts** drove in three runs with a bases-clearing double and Hernández hit his team leading 17th home run. On the mound, **James Paxton** won his sixth game of the season, giving up just one run in 6.0 innings. Paxton's ERA at Dodger Stadium this year fell to 2.51 (8 ER/28.1 IP).

TEOWULF: Reigning NL Player of the Week **Teoscar Hernández** went 1-for-3 with a two-run homer last night and has now homered in three straight games while recording an RBI in a Dodger season-high tying five consecutive games. Hernández's 17 homers and 50 RBI lead the Dodgers and he is tied for sixth in the Majors in both categories. The native of the Dominican Republic is hitting .500 (10-for-20) with five homers and 12 RBI over his last five games.

- Last week, he hit .360 (9-for-25) with four homers, 10 RBI, three doubles, two walks, six runs scored and a stolen base while posting a .960 slugging percentage and a .429 on-base percentage in six games. He recorded four straight multi-hit games from Thursday through Sunday and matched a career-high with six RBI on Saturday night, while also clubbing his fifth-career grand slam in a two-homer game.

RANGER DANGER: The Dodgers and Rangers met last year in Texas with the Dodgers taking two of three, and last night marked their first matchup at Dodger Stadium since 2021. Los Angeles is 23-14 all-time against the Rangers, including a 10-6 mark at Dodger Stadium. L.A. has won 11 of its last 14 vs. Texas since 2018. The Dodgers are in a stretch of playing nine consecutive Interleague games (3-1) and 14 of 18 vs. the AL.

RUTHLESS ROOKIE: Dodger rookie outfielder **Andy Pages** went 2-for-5 with two runs scored last night and is hitting .400 (16-for-40) with two doubles, a homer, three RBI and six walks in his last 12 games. Pages ranks among the rookie leaders in runs (29, T-2nd), hits (47, 5th), doubles (8, T-9th), homers (6, T-6th), extra-base hits (14, T-7th), total bases (73, 8th), RBI (19, T-10th), slugging percentage (.410, 6th) and OPS (.723, 6th) (min. 150 PA).

ALEX IS HIM: Dodger lefty **Alex Vesia** has been dominant over the last two months, allowing one earned run in his last 21 games (23.1 IP). During that stretch, he has given up just seven hits while striking out 34 batters. His 0.39 ERA leads the Majors since April 12 and overall, the southpaw owns a 1.20 ERA with a 0.83 WHIP on the season.

THUMBING THROUGH HISTORY: The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum today announced the donation of the Walter O'Malley Archive by Peter O'Malley and Terry O'Malley Seidler. The archive, assembled and curated by the O'Malley family, includes more than 70 boxes of documents and photographs from the collection of Walter O'Malley, who owned the Dodgers from 1944 until his passing on Aug. 9, 1979. Items in the archive include details of planning and construction of Dodger Stadium, letters from Jackie Robinson to Walter O'Malley, the 1954 press release announcing the signing of Sandy Koufax and the 1959 City of Los Angeles contract requiring Walter O'Malley to privately finance and build Dodger Stadium.

- Tossed 3.0 innings in his last start against Pittsburgh on June 6...allowed three earned runs on seven hits with three strikeouts against one walk
- Notched his first victory in almost two years in his start on May 18 against Cincinnati...fired 6.0 scoreless innings in his first quality start of the season, striking out seven batters on 78 pitches...did not issue a walk for the second time in three starts
- Made his 2024 debut on May 6 against the Marlins...was his first Major League game since June 10, 2022...missed all of 2023 recovering from Tommy John surgery

- **Has held opponents to a .216/.272/.356 career slashline...since 2017, ranks 17th among qualified pitchers (min. 350.0 IP) with a .628 opponents' OPS**

- Spun his first career complete game shut-out on April 25, 2022 at Arizona, striking out ten while allowing just three hits...was his first complete game since Aug. 3, 2019 against San Diego, where he allowed one run on five hits while striking out 15 batters without issuing a walk on 110 pitches...first complete game was against the Rockies on June 21, 2019, allowing only two earned runs on three hits, while establishing career highs in strikeouts (16) and total pitches (111)
- Was named to his second All-Star team in 2021 (also, 2019) as a replacement player...was also named to his first All-MLB team in 2021 after finishing the season with a 16-4 record and a 2.47 ERA (57 ER/207.2 IP)
- Started the first combined no-hitter in Dodger history, walking three and striking out eight in 6.0 innings (93 pitches) in a 4-0 win over the Padres on May 4, 2018 in Monterrey, Mexico...Tony Cingrani, Yimi Garcia and Adam Liberatore fired the final 3.0 innings...it was the 23rd no-hitter in Dodger franchise history and the 13th since moving to Los Angeles
- Recorded his first Major League win on Sept. 21, 2017 at Philadelphia, tossing a scoreless inning of relief with two strikeouts
- Selected by the Dodgers in the first round (24th overall) of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University
