RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of the season against the Tigers (0-2, 1 to play) and Red Sox (3 to play) this afternoon in Detroit...have won five of eight and seven of their last 12 games...are 24-28 since the July 30 trade deadline and 30-32 since the All-Star break...spent 94 consecutive days in fourth place of the AL East from June 20 (entering play) through Sept. 20...have spent the entire season no more than five games below or three games above .500.

With last night's 7-1 defeat, the Rays were officially eliminated from postseason contention...they were one of four teams to qualify for the postseason in each of the last five seasons (2019-23), joining the Astros, Braves and Dodgers. The Rays seven runs allowed marked their most since Sept. 10 at PHI (9), while their six-run margin of defeat was their largest since Aug. 30 vs. SD (L, 13-5). Tampa Bay has been held to one run in back-to-back games and has scored one run or fewer in six of its last 10 contests...the Rays were last held to exactly one run in three straight games July 6-8, 2023 (3G).

The Rays are averaging 3.18 runs per game since the beginning of August, the second-lowest mark in the majors, ahead of the White Sox (3.09). With a win today, Tampa Bay would avoid its first three-game losing skid to Detroit since Sept. 18, 2021—May 16, 2022 (3G)...the Rays have not been swept by the Tigers since a four-game sweep from June 30—July 3, 2016.

Today's contest marks the Rays first time participating a game after being eliminated from the postseason since a five-game stretch at the conclusion of the 2018 campaign (Sept. 26-30).

LIGHTS, CAMINERO, ACTION—Last night, Junior Caminero became the fifth Rays rookie to homer at Comerica Park, joining Tim Beckham, Mikie Mahtook (both Sept. 9, 2015), Evan Longoria (Sept. 25, 2008) and Shane Cox (July 26, 2000)...at 21.082 years old, Caminero became the youngest player to homer at Comerica since TOR Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (20.126) on July 20, 2019.

Caminero's 15 XBH since Aug. 23 are tied with TEX Wyatt Langford and SD Jackson Merrill for second most among MLB rookies behind MIL Jackson Chourio (18).

PITCHING IN—The Rays have held the opposition to three runs or fewer in 15 of their last 18 contests since Sept. 6, ranking fifth in the majors with a 2.62 ERA (154.2IP, 45ER) in that span...they have allowed three runs or fewer 36 times since the All-Star break, tied for third most in the majors behind the Mets (39) and Tigers (37).

Rays starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in 18 consecutive games since Sept. 6, posting a 2.15 ERA (88.0IP, 21ER)...it marks the second-lowest ERA by any MLB starting rotation during that stretch behind the Blue Jays (2.04).

The bullpen's 2.85 ERA (253.0IP, 80ER) since the Midsummer Classic ranks third in the majors behind the Guardians (2.53) and Brewers (2.83).

RUNNIN' RAYS—The Rays 178 SB lead the AL, ahead of the Guardians (147SB), and rank fourth in MLB behind the Nationals (217SB), Reds (205SB) and Brewers (204SB)...they are looking to lead the AL in steals for the first time since 2011.

The 178 steals signal the second-highest mark in a season in franchise history behind the 2009 Rays (194SB).

José Caballero leads the AL with 44 SB, ahead of CLE José Ramírez (40SB), and ranks fourth in MLB behind CIN Ely De La Cruz (65SB), LAD Shohei Ohtani (56SB) and MIL Brice Turang (47SB)...the last Tampa Bay player to lead the AL in steals outright was Carl Crawford (58SB, 2006)...Crawford stole 50 bags in 2007, tied with BAL Brian Roberts for the AL lead.

KELL-YEAH—Kevin Kelly (22.1IP) holds the third-longest active scoreless streak in MLB behind AZ A.J. Puk and NYM Jose Quintana (both 22.2IP)...Kelly has not permitted an earned run in 24 straight outings, tied with Puk for the longest active streak in the majors and tied with Fernando Rodney (2012) for the third-longest streak in club history behind Pete Fairbanks (30, 2022-23) and J.P. Howell (24, 2012).

LOCK IT DOWN—The Rays have won 33 consecutive games when holding a lead through six innings, tied for the second-longest streak in club history (also Aug. 1, 2010—April 20, 2011), behind a 36-game run (April 14—July 12, 2019), according to STATS LLC...they are 53-4 when leading through six frames, tying the Yankees for the second-fewest such losses in MLB behind the Guardians (2)...the Rays also own the majors' second-highest winning pct. when leading through seven innings (59-2/967) behind the Guardians (77-2/975).

The Rays have had an MLB-best 13 players record at least 1+ save, outpacing the Brewers and Dodgers (both 12)...it marks the second-highest total in franchise history behind 2021 (14)...since saves became an official statistic in 1969, the Rays are the only major league club to have at least 13 different players tally at least one save in a season, accomplishing the feat twice.

Under the direction of Kevin Cash (since 2015), 60 different players have recorded a save for the Rays, the most in MLB, ahead of the Cubs (57) and Dodgers (52).

STUCK IN NEUTRAL—Tampa Bay is one of six teams all-time to have held a .500 record at least 33 times, joining the 2011 Blue Jays (33), 2010 Athletics (33), 1993 Cubs (33), 2009 Twins (34) and 1959 Cubs (35)...the Rays were last above .500 entering play on Aug. 25 (65-64).

The Rays were 48-48 before the All-Star break and have gone 30-32 since the break...since the first Midsummer Classic in 1933, only five teams have finished at exactly .500 both before and after the All-Star break: the 2022 White Sox, 2015 Orioles, 1969 Astros, 1958 Tigers and 1953 Senators/Twins (Elias).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays own MLB's best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (53-33, .616), ahead of the Padres (39-25, .609)...their 86 such games lead MLB and are third most in a season in club history (2015-94G & 2003-90G)...their 29-21 (.580) mark in one-run games is tied for fourth in MLB, while the 29 wins are tied for second most...of the Rays 23 games in September, 16 have been decided by two runs or fewer.

RACE TO THE FINISH—The Rays need to go at least 3-1 over their final four games to finish with a .500+ record for a seventh consecutive season...they were last under the mark in 2017 (80-82)...it would surpass 2008-2013 (6) for the longest streak in franchise history...the Rays are one of four teams to post a .500+ record each season from 2018-23, joining the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees.

Since becoming the Rays in 2008, the club has finished with a winning record in 12 of 16 seasons, second most in MLB behind the Yankees (16) and Dodgers (15).

THE MAGIC NUMBER—Tampa Bay is 55-15 (.786) when scoring 4+ runs compared to 23-65 (.261) when scoring three runs or fewer...the Rays are 33-5 (.868) when scoring 4+ runs since June 2, the second-best mark in MLB during that time behind the Padres (49-7/875)...during that same period, Tampa Bay is 17-44 (.279) when scoring three or fewer runs.

RUNS AT A PREMIUM—The Rays .210 batting average with RISP is the worst in the majors and would signal the worst full-season mark in club history, a record currently held by the 2011 team (.224)...the .210 average would be tied with the 1981 Mets for the second-lowest mark by any team since play-by-play data is available (1969), trailing only the 1969 Padres (.200), per Baseball-Reference.

Tampa Bay is averaging 3.74 runs per game this season, which would signal the lowest mark in a season in franchise history...the 2014 Rays are next closest, having scored 3.78 runs per game.

CONNECTIONS

- Rays LHP Tyler Alexander was selected by the Tigers in the second round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Christian University...he made 120 appearances with Detroit from 2019-2023 before being placed on waivers this past offseason.
- Ron Cash, the late uncle of Rays Manager Kevin Cash, played two seasons in the majors with the Tigers (1973-74) and hit .297 in 34 career games.
- Tigers OF Parker Meadows is the younger brother of former Ray Austin Meadows.
- Tigers Vice President, Assistant General Manager Rob Metzler spent 15 seasons with Tampa Bay, seven of which were as the Senior Director of Amateur Scouting.
- Rays Assistant Pitching & Rehab Coach Rick Knapp was the pitching coach for the Tigers under Manager Jim Leyland from 2009-11...his son, Ricky, was selected by the Tigers in the 44th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Port Charlotte High School, but opted to attend Florida Gulf Coast University.
- Detroit has three Sunshine State natives on its active roster: OF Kerry Carpenter (Eustis), OF Riley Greene (Orlando) and LHP Tyler Holton (Tallahassee)...Greene attended Hagerly High School, roughly 130 miles from Tropicana Field, while Holton played collegiately at Florida State, where he was teammates with Rays INF Taylor Walls.
- Tigers RHP Casey Mize, selected first overall by Detroit in 2018 First-Year Player Draft, resides in St. Petersburg during the offseason.
- Tigers Bench Coach George Lombard appeared in 13 games for the Devil Rays in 2003.
- Tampa Bay's inaugural game in franchise history was played vs. Detroit on March 31, 1998.

TODAY'S START—Alexander takes the ball for the 23rd time this season (9th start) and 11th on the road (6th start)...marks his first road start since Aug. 23 at LAD...

LAST TIME OUT—Making his first start since Aug. 23, Alexander worked 4.1 scoreless frames in a 1-0 win over the Blue Jays at Tropicana Field on Sept. 20 (4.1IP, 2H, OR, BB, 6SO, 2HBP)...

BACK WHERE IT BEGAN—This marks Alexander's first appearance at Comerica Park since joining the Rays...he was drafted by the Tigers twice, signing in 2015, and spent five seasons with the club from 2019-23...

He is 1-2 with an 8.31 ERA (21.2IP, 20ER) in five appearances (1GS) vs. AL Central clubs this season, his highest mark against any division.

ON THE ROAD—He is 0-2 with a 6.59 ERA (13.2IP, 10ER) in his last three road outings, all in relief, despite holding opponents to a .204 (10-for-49) average while recording a 0.95 WHIP...

RIGHT ON—Alexander has limited right-handed hitters to a 4-for-29 (.138) average across his last three outings...they hit .328 (21-for-64) against him in his previous five appearances (Aug. 10-Sept. 4)...

SWINGMAN—Of his 142 career appearances, 51 have come as a starter (35.9%) while 91 have come in relief (64.1%)...since 2020, his 52 relief appearances of 2.0+ IP are third most in MLB behind TOR Ryan Yarbrough (57) and CIN Brent Suter (56)...

Alexander is 12-6 with a 4.49 ERA (204.1IP, 102ER) in his 91 career relief appearances compared to 5-22 with a 4.69 ERA (239.2IP, 152ER) in his 51 starts.

He has made five relief appearances of 5.0+ IP this season, tied for the MLB lead with DET Brant Hurter...it matches Austin Pruitt (2018) for third most in a single season in franchise history...

NEARLY PERFECT—On May 17 at Toronto, Alexander carried a perfect game into the 8th inning, retiring 22 consecutive Blue Jays before Danny Jansen's bloop single...the 7.1 IP effort marked the second-longest individual perfect game bid in Rays history...

The 22 consecutive batters retired tied Matt Garza for the second most at any point in a game in Rays history behind Rasmussen...Garza turned the trick during his no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET, the only no-no in Rays history.

ODDS AND ENDS—Nine-hole hitters are a combined 17-for-46 (.370) against him with a 1.017 OPS—min. 40 BF, it marks the second-highest such opp. OPS in MLB behind BOS Kutter Crawford (1.020)...
