PITTSBURGH PIRATES (1-2) AT MIAMI MARLINS (2-1)

March 30, 2025 - loanDepot park - Miami, FL - 1:40 EDT - Game #4/Road #4

LHP Andrew Heaney (5-14, 4.28 ERA in 2024) vs. RHP Max Meyer (3-5, 5.68 ERA in 2024)

THE PIRATES: were walked off for the second time in three games in Saturday's 12-inning, 5-4 setback...Earned their first win of 2025 with a 4-3 victory Friday night...Opened the season on the road for the ninth straight year and the 10th time in 11 years...Finished the 2024 season with a 76-86 record (fifth place in the N.L. Central)...Won 15 games in their last at-bat last season (most since having 16 in 2021)...Played in 51 one-run games in 2024, their most since 2018 (also 51).

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Bailey Falter allowed two runs in 6.0 innings while making his season debut in Saturday's game against Miami...Pittsburgh's starters have produced a 2.60 ERA (17.1ip/5er) in its first three games of the 2025 season...That's the 10th-best in MLB and the fifth-lowest in the National League...The only four starting rotations in the National League that have produced a lower earned run average thus far this season are the Rockies (0.00), Nationals (1.64), Phillies (2.45) and Cardinals (2.45).

BACK TO THE OTHER SIDE OF FLORIDA: Pittsburgh's season-opening, seven-game road trip will continue tomorrow with the start of a three-game series against the Rays...It will mark the fifth time the Bucs play the Rays on the road during interleague play (also: 2003, 2014, 2022 & 2023).

TAKE A WALK: The Pirates have walked 20 times in their first three games of 2025...The only team in MLB to receive more free passes so far is the Dodgers (21 in five games)...Last year, the most times Pittsburgh walked in a four-game series also came against Miami here at loanDepot park (26 times)...Oneil Cruz is tied with Atlanta's Marcell Ozuna (six) for the most walks in MLB.

JUST FOUR YOU: Today's game marks the end of Pittsburgh's first four-game series (of six) in 2025...The Pirates' next four-game series will come from 4/14-17 vs. Washington at PNC Park...In 2024, Pittsburgh went 3-1-4 in four-game sets, including a season-opening sweep against Miami here at loanDepot park (also won three of four against the Cubs in May and the Reds in August).

MARATHONS WITH MIAMI: Saturday's 12-inning game between the Pirates and Marlins was Pittsburgh's longest (by innings) since dropping a 14-inning game at Toronto on 5/31/24...Since Derek Shelton became Pittsburgh's manager in 2020, three of its four games that have gone 12 innings or more have come against the Marlins...The other ones came on 3/28/24 here in Miami (Opening Day, 12 innings) and 6/5/21 in Pittsburgh (12 innings, walkoff single by former Pirate and Marlin Jacob Stallings).

BUCS ON THE BASES: Pittsburgh has stolen 14 bases through its first three games of the season, setting a club record since at least 1900, per the Elias Sports Bureau, for its most steals through the first three games of a season, surpassing the mark of 10 steals through three games to start the 1907 campaign...The 14 steals are also tied with the 1984 Cleveland Indians for the most by any Major League team through three games to start a season since at least 1900, per Elias...Seven different Pirates have stolen at least one base, including four players with multiple steals (Oneil Cruz with four, Isiah Kiner-Falefa with three, Ke'Bryan Hayes and Tommy Pham with two).

SPEED DEMONS: In the first three games of this series, Pittsburgh has two games in which it has stolen six bases...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the Pirates had only ever done that twice in a single series since at least 1900 prior to this series (also: in 1907 against the Boston Doves and in 1909 against the Cubs)...Additionally, Pittsburgh is one of only three Major League teams in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to achieve that, along with Cincinnati in 2023 and Texas in 2013...Oneil Cruz became the fifth Pirate since at least 1900, per Elias, to steal at least one base in each of the first three games of a season, joining Andrew McCutchen (three games) in 2013, Lee Lacy (five games) in 1983, Omar Moreno (three games) in 1982 and Fred Clarke (three games) in 1903.

CUTCH: With his fourth-inning, RBI double in Friday's win over Miami, Andrew McCutchen collected the 799th extra-base hit of his Major League career...His 610 XBH with Pittsburgh rank fifth in Pirates history, while his 799 XBH are third-most among active Major League players (The Dodgers' Freddie Freeman has 885 and the Yankees' Paul Goldschmidt has 833)...McCutchen is also just four RBI shy of 1100 for his Major League career, and he ranks fifth among active players in that department (Freeman leads the group with 1236, while the Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton is seven RBI ahead of McCutchen with 1103).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

March 30, 2018: Gregory Polanco hit a go-ahead, three-run homer in the 13th inning to lift the Pirates to a 13-10 win over the Tigers on Opening Day in Detroit. Pittsburgh tallied a total of 17 hits, including three each from Polanco, Adam Frazier and Josh Bell. The 13 runs were the Pirates' most on Opening Day since scoring 14 runs in the 1911 season opener. At five hours and 27 minutes, it was the longest opener in club history. Pittsburgh used eight different pitchers in the victory, with Steven Brault earning the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed as a free agent (one-year contract) on 2/22/25.

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on 2/22 after spending the previous two years as a member of the Texas Rangers...Was the Angels' nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

LAST TIME OUT: Heaney last pitched on 3/19 at Tampa Bay in Port Charlotte, allowing three runs and six hits (two home runs) over 4.1 innings of work (threw 64 pitches).

VS. MIAMI: Heaney will be making his third career start today against the Marlins... He has not allowed a run across 11.2 innings in his first two starts (8h, 2bb, 11k)...He allowed four hits over 5.2 scoreless innings while winning a 6-0 decision on 8/6/23 w/ Texas at Globe Life Field...Heaney also struck out seven and allowed four hits in 6.0 shutout innings while winning a 6-0 decision last year on 6/2 here at loanDepot park.

AS A MARLIN: Heaney was selected by the Marlins with the ninth-overall selection in the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Oklahoma State...He was selected to Miami's big-league roster on 6/16/14 before making his MLB debut on 6/19 vs. the Mets (gave up one run in 6.0 innings, but suffered a 1-0 loss as Zack Wheeler tossed a shutout)... When he pitched here with Texas on 6/2 last season, it marked his first game back in this stadium since 9/21/14 vs. Washington, when he pitched 3.0 innings in relief.

SIGN HERE, PLEASE: Heaney signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on 2/22... He posted a 5-14 record, 4.28 ERA (160.0ip/76er) and 159 strikeouts in 32 appearances (31 starts) with Texas in 2024...Heaney's 159 strikeouts and 160.0 innings pitched both ranked second on the Rangers, trailing Nathan Eovaldi (166 strikeouts & 70.2 innings).

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: Heaney spent the 2023 campaign as a member of the World-Champion Rangers, where he posted a career-high 10 wins...His 9.22 strikeouts per 9.0 innings figure was the highest ever by a left-handed Texas starting pitcher in a season (min. 15 starts)...He finished the year 13th among American League pitchers (min. 140.0ip) in Ks/9.0 innings (9.22) and 19th in strikeout percentage (23.6 percent).

IN NEED OF SOME SUPPORT: Last year, Heaney received two or fewer runs of support in 23 of his 31 starts...His team-low 3.48 run support average as a starter was the eighth-lowest qualified mark in all of Major League Baseball.

FOUR YOUR INFO: Heaney is one of four Major League left-handed pitchers to record 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons, along with Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez and MacKenzie Gore...He is also one of five lefties to throw 145.0-plus innings in each of the last two years, along with Valdez, Kikuchi, Patrick Corbin and JP Sears.

THIS AND THAT: Entering 2025, Heaney has 20 career games with 10-plus strikeouts... That's the sixth-most among left-handed pitchers on an active roster, trailing Chris Sale (87), Clayton Kershaw (68), Robbie Ray (40), Blake Snell (35) and Carlos Rodón (26).
