**TONIGHT'S TILT...** the Mariners play the 7th game of a 9-game homestand (4-2) tonight with the first of 3 games against the New York Yankees...the Mariners split a 2-game set against the San Diego Padres (1-1) to open the homestand, followed by a 4-game series win against the Texas Rangers (3-1)...tonight's game against the Yankees will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports** (710 AM) with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith** on the call.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...the Mariners defeated the Rangers on Sunday by a 7-0 score to secure their third consecutive win...<u>Seattle is 8-3 over its last 11 games</u> (9/4-c)...with 12 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 4.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 2.0 games back of Minnesota for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- Staying Connected The Mariners are 15-1 in their City Connect uniforms this season.
- Getting Series Seattle owns a 4-1-2 series record over its last 7 series (8/23-c).
- 27 Up The Mariners pitching staff faced the minimum 27 batters (1 hit allowed, 1 GIDP) in Sunday's 7-0 win against the Rangers...it was Seattle's first time facing the minimum in a 9-inning win since Félix Hernández's perfect game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE**...over their last 11 games dating back to Sept. 4, Seattle's offense ranks tied for 1st in MLB in runs (67), 1st in batting average (.292), 1st in total bases (185), 1st in OPS (.858), 1st in wRC+ (149), 2nd in hits (112) and 2nd in extra-base hits (43)...during that span, the Mariners offense has recorded 10+ hits in 8 of 11 games and 4+ walks in 9 of 11 games, while striking out 10+ times in only 3 of 11 games...in 22 games since Aug. 23 (Dan Wilson's first game as Manager), Seattle is averaging 5.2 runs/game, compared to 3.9 runs/game over the season's first 128 games.

BRYAN ♥ NY...Mariners starter Bryan Woo has yet to surrender a run in 2 career starts against the Yankees, spanning 11.1 IP while allowing only 4 hits and 3 walks (0.618 WHIP) with 12 strikeouts and a .105 (4x38) opposing batting average...Woo made his third start of the season in New York earlier this year, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts in a 6-3 Mariners win against the Yankees.

STALWART STARTERS...the Mariners starting rotation <u>leads the Major Leagues</u> in ERA (3.38), opponent batting average (.223), WHIP (1.03), fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.73), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.52), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88) and quality starts (88)...the 4.88 SO/BB ratio would be the <u>best in Major League history</u> by starters, ranking ahead of the 2019 Dodgers (4.55 SO/BB)...the 1.73 BB/9 is tied for 8th-best in MLB history by a starting rotation.

CAL RALEIGH: SILVER AND GOLD... Mariners catcher Cal Raleigh leads MLB catchers in home runs (30) for the third consecutive season... after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, he is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002)... Cal is also the 12th catcher in MLB history with multiple 30+ HR seasons and the 3rd to do it within his first 4 MLB seasons (also: Mike Piazza and Rudy York)... behind the plate, Cal leads MLB catchers in catcher caught stealing (26) and leads AL catchers in catcher framing runs (12) per Baseball Savant... after leading MLB with 24 CCS last season, Raleigh could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in CCS in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

<u>OFF THE RALES</u>...outfielder/first baseman <u>Luke Raley</u> went 1-for-1 in Sunday's game and has reached base safely in 9 of his last 10 games dating back to Sept. 5...over his last 33 games (8/1-c), Raley is batting .292 (28x96) with 18 runs, 7 doubles, 9 homers, 25 RBI and 15 walks, getting on base at a .407 clip, slugging .646 with a 1.053 OPS...Raley's 1.053 OPS during that span ranks 3rd-highest in MLB (min. 100 PA), trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.178 OPS) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (1.092 OPS), while ranking ahead of Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.024 OPS).

RANDY GOES 20/20 (x4)...Randy Arozarena hit his 20th home run of the season in Sunday's game against the Rangers, securing his 4th consecutive 20 HR/20 SB season (2021-c)...Randy joins José Ramírez-CLE as the only MLB players with a 20/20 season in each of the last 4 seasons (2021-c)....Arozarena is the first player in MLB history to go 20/20 as a qualified rookie, and then also do it in each of his next 3 seasons... Randy is the 3rd Mariners batter to reach 20 HR this season, joining Cal Raleigh (30) and Luke Raley (20).

<u>VICTOR'S WILD RIDES</u>...outfielder **Victor Robles** went 3-for-4 with 1 RBI on Sunday, extending his onbase streak to 9 games...over his last 21 games (8/17-c), Robles is batting .444 (32x72) with 15 runs, 8 doubles, 1 home run, 12 RBI, 6 walks, 5 hit-by-pitches and is 12-for-12 stealing bases, while getting on base at a .512 clip, slugging .597 with a 1.109 OPS...Robles is 25-for-25 in stolen base since joining the Mariners, and 29-for-30 in SB overall this season...Robles is 11-for-11 in stolen base attempts of third base (all with Seattle), most times stealing third base for the Mariners since Ichiro Suzuki (12-for-12 SB of third) in 2008.

THE J-ROD SHOW IS THE HOTTEST IN TOWN...over his last 17 games (8/28-c), Julio Rodríguez is batting .333 (24x72) with 17 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 14 RBI, 8 walks and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .490 clip, slugging .583 with a .974 OPS...on Friday, the 23-year-old hammered his 75th career home run, joining Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (also: 2022-24) as the only 2 players in Major League history with 75+ homers and 75+ stolen bases through a player's first 3 career seasons.

<u>LAST 22 GAMES</u>...Seattle is 13-9 over its last 22 games (8/23-c), sporting a +39 run differential (114 R, 75 RA)...during that span, Seattle owns a 4-1-2 series record...7 of the Mariners 9 losses during that stretch have come by exactly 1 run.

<u>HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS</u>...the Mariners continue their 9-game homestand with tonight with **Seattle College Night**...promotions covering the remaining games on the homestand include **Flannel Night** (Sept. 18) and **Frasier Day** (Sept. 19).

AS YOU KNOW....Mariners starter Bryan Woo is making his 20th start of the season tonight, entering today's action with a 2.38 ERA (28 ER, 105.2 IP) with 10 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 0.823 WHIP, and... AS YOU MAY KNOW...Woo is on track to join Paul Skenes-PIT (21 GS, 2.07 ERA) as the only starters age 24-or-younger in MLB to make 20 starts with a sub-2.50 ERA this season, but...DID YOU KNOW?... Woo is also on pace to become the first Mariners pitcher age 24-or-younger with 20+ starts and a sub-2.50 ERA in a season since Félix Hernández in his 2010 Cy Young season (34 GS, 2.27 ERA, age 24)?...if Woo can maintain his current pace, he would become the first MLB pitcher age 24-or-younger to make 20 starts with a sub-2.50 ERA and a sub 0.900 WHIP in season since Dutch Leonard (0.96 ERA, 0.886 ERA, age 22) of the 1914 Boston Red Sox.

#### **ABOUT BRYAN WOO.**..

- The 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is making his 20th start of the season tonight and his 2nd against New York-AL...marks his 38th Major League start and 3rd career start against the Yankees.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 GS) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
- **LAST TIME OUT...**W#8 on 9/11 vs San Diego...pitched 6.2 innings and allowed 2 runs on 2 hits (1 home run), 1 walk with 5 strikeouts while retiring the first 19 batters he faced...he has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 17 of his 19 starts in 2024.
- HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS...has made 8 starts at T-Mobile Park with a 5-0 record, 1.66 ERA (9 ER, 48.2 IP) and 40 strikeouts to 4 walks...opponents are batting .160 (27x169) against him at home in 2024 with 8 extra-base hits (5 doubles, 3 home run)...in those 8 contests, the Mariners are 8-0.
- **EMPIRE STATE OF MIND...**on 6/22/23 Woo made his Yankee Stadium debut going 5.1 IP surrendering 2 hits, walking 3 batters, and striking out 5...Woo has yet to allow a run against the Yankees in 11.1 innings across 2 starts.
- A SEASON TO REMEMBER...this season, Woo has pitched 105.2 innings and posted a 0.82 WHIP...the lowest WHIP in franchise history with 100.0+ IP prior to this season was Cliff Lee in 2010 (0.95)...Logan Gilbert this season (0.88) and Woo this season (0.82) would both be Mariners franchise
- **IN RECENT MEMORY...**is holding current Yankees hitters to a .143 (4x28) average while walking 2 batters with 10 strikeouts...only one hit has been for extra bases (1 double).
- MAKING UP FOR MISSED TIME...among AL pitchers with at least 100.0 IP, he is 1st in ERA (2.38), on-base percentage against (.223), OPS against (.536), WHIP (0.82) and in opponent slugging percentage (.314) while ranking 4th in batting average against (.198).
- **LIKE HE NEVER LEFT...** has allowed 93 baserunners across his 19 starts (105.2 IP)...he is the only <u>pitcher in MLB history</u> to allow 95-or-less baserunners through his first 19 starts of a season.
- <u>PITCHING POWERHOUSE</u>...is averaging 13.9 pitches-per-inning, the best mark in the Majors this season with a minimum of 100.0 IP.
- A MONTH TO REMEMBER...in the month of August, he made 6 starts and went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 ER, 40.1 IP) and 34 strikeouts to 3 walks...Woo tossed 6.0+ innings in every outing and 5 of the 6 were quality starts...he is the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to throw 40.0+ innings in a single month and produce a WHIP below 0.700 during that month...the only others to do so are James Paxton in May 2018 (43.0 IP, 0.698 WHIP) and Félix Hernández in August 2012 (41.2 IP, 0.576 WHIP).
- NO TRAFFIC...through 37 career starts, he has allowed the fewest baserunners in franchise history (207)...the next closest over their first 37 starts with the Mariners is **Bryce Miller** with 228.
- **DIGGING DEEPER...**in his first 29 career starts, Woo had not pitched into the 7th inning...he has since gone into the 7th inning in 7 of his last 8 starts...6 outings came in consecutive starts (8/2-31) and he was 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 ER, 40.1 IP) and a .171 (25x146) average against.
- THIRTY WOO...recorded 175 strikeouts through his first 37 career starts...became the 12th player in franchise history with at least 175 strikeouts in his first 37 career starts, joining Félix Hernández (217), Mark Langston (210), Logan Gilbert (204), Hisashi Iwakuma (198), Taijuan Walker (196), Erik Hangen (195), Goograf Kirby (194), Proposition (195), France (195), Goograf Kirby (194), Proposition (195), France (195),
