Brice Turang is the only player on the team who has hit safely in all 6 games this season....he is currently batting .320 (8-for-25, 1hr, 4rbi) and notched the second walk-off hit of his career yesterday vs. Kansas City with a bunt single in the 11th inning.

Back on Track

Since going 0-for-5 with 5 strikeouts on Opening Day, **Jackson Chourio** has hit safely in 5 consecutive games, batting .348 (8-for-23, 1hr, 4rbi) with a .348 OBP/.609 SLG/.957 OPS....he collected 3 hits yesterday, including his first home run of the season.

I Like Ike

Isaac Collins has a hit in each of his 4 games this season....of his 4 hits, he has produced 3 doubles....Collins made his first start of the season (DH) yesterday and went 1-for-3 with a double and stolen base.

THIS EVENING'S GAME: Is game 4 (2-1) of a 7-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Cincinnati (4g)....following this homestand and an off day on Monday, the team takes a 6-game road trip to Colorado (3g) and Arizona (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without **Bob Uecker** on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970)....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager....Murphy was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after guiding the team to a 93-69 record and the NL Central division championship....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from the 2024 coaching staff is associate manager **Rickie Weeks** (2nd season), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach **Jim Henderson** (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (2nd season), hitting coach **Connor Dawson** (4th season), assistant coach **Daniel de Mondesert** (2nd season), infield coach **Matt Erickson** (2nd season) and third base coach **Jason Lane** (10th season/5th in current role)....first base coach **Julio Borbón**, lead hitting coach **Al LeBoeuf** and hitting coach **Eric Theisen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

2024 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 93-69 and finished in first place in the NL Central, 10.0 games ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs....they tied the Padres for the fourth-best record in baseball behind the Dodgers (98-64), Phillies (95-67) and Yankees (94-68)....the Brewers lost to the Mets, 2 games to 1, in the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times over the last seven seasons (missed in 2022) and have won the NL Central in four of the last seven seasons, three of the last four, and two straight....the Brewers are one of just five teams to qualify for the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons....they are joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 688 wins since 2017, which ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight consecutive seasons, missing out by just a game in both 2017 and 2022.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #65 - LHP NESTOR CORTES (1gs, 0-1, 36.00)

CORTES AT A GLANCE: Nestor Cortes, 30, will be making his second start of the season....Cortes made his Brewers debut last Saturday at New York-AL and took a 20-9 defeat (2ip, 6h, 8r, 8er, 5bb, 2k, 5hr, 64 pitches)....his 8 runs allowed tied a career high (also 8/14/20 at Houston)....his 5 walks and 5 home runs allowed marked career highs....he became the first pitcher in Major League history to allow home runs to the first three batters of a game on the first three pitches (Goldschmidt, Bellinger and Judge)....Cortes was acquired from the Yankees with INF Caleb Durbin and cash on Dec. 13 in exchange for RHP Devin Williams....he is signed through the 2025 season.

LAST SEASON: Cortes went 9-10 with a 3.77 ERA in 31 games/30 starts with the Yankees....he was the team's Opening Day starter....he set career highs in starts and innings pitched (174.1)....the team went 13-17 in his starts....he made 13 quality starts, tying a career high (also 2022).

ON BABY ALERT: Nestor and his wife, Alondra, are expecting their first child - a boy - on April 13.

WHAT HAPPENS IN VEGAS: Nestor was celebrating his 30th birthday in Las Vegas with family and friends when he found out he was traded to Milwaukee on Dec. 13.

CAREER: Is 33-22 with a 3.92 ERA in 136 games/87 starts (570ip, 248er)....is in his eighth Major League season pitching for Baltimore (2018), Seattle (2020), New York-AL (2019, 2021-24) and Milwaukee (2025)....was an All-Star in 2022 as he finished eighth in American League Cy Young Award voting....Cortes was selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft out of Hialeah (FL) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Cortes has never pitched in Milwaukee.

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 17-15 with a 4.55 ERA in 68 games/43 starts (273ip, 138er)....went 4-5 with a 4.46 ERA in 16 games/15 starts last season (84.2ip, 42er).

CAREER vs. REDS: Cortes made his only career appearance against the Reds in a start with the Yankees on 7/14/22 at Yankee Stadium (7ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 4k, 1hbp)....he received no decision in the Reds' 7-6, 10-inning win.
