Combination of Rays wins and Yankees losses needed to win the AL East title for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since earning back-to-back division crowns from 2020-21.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (3-0), Athletics (3-0), and Red Sox (three to play), tonight at Tropicana Field...have won six straight, eight of nine, 10 of 12, 15 of 20, and 17 of their last 23 games to improve to a season-high 34 games over .500 for the first time since finishing 2023 at 36 games above the mark (99-63)...have won three straight sets, are 5-1-1 in their last seven series, and 11-5-1 in their last 17...are an MLB-best 37-17 across their last 54 games (July 20-pres.)...each of their final three opponents currently occupy a postseason spot (vs. BOS, at NYY, at PHI)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019-pres.)...are attempting to finish a season with the AL's best record for the fifth time, joining their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...lead the second-place Yankees by 5.0 games in the AL East standings, holding an advantage of 3.0 games or more each day since Aug. 3...have led the division for 83 consecutive days (June 27-pres.) and spent a total of 123 days at the helm overall as well as 122 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ✦ The Rays completed a sweep of the Athletics with a 10-1 victory marking their MLB-best 16th sweep of the season...they are the first AL club to register 16 sweeps in a season since the 2019 Astros (17) and are one of nine to have 16 or more since 1980...the last AL East team to have 16 sweeps or more in a season were the 1998 Yankees (21).
- ✦ They have won each of **Drew Rasmussen's** 11 starts since the All-Star break, with the right-hander going 8-0 with a 1.91 ERA (66.0IP, 14ER) in those games...it tied **Matt Moore** (Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013) for the longest team winning streak in a pitcher's starts in Rays history.
- ✦ With his first single yesterday vs. **ATH**, **Chandler Simpson** (147) broke **Carl Crawford's** club record for most singles in a season from 2003 (145)...the 147 singles are the most by an AL hitter since BOS **Dustin Pedroia** (149) in 2016.
- ✦ Despite going without a long ball, they plated 10 runs in the contest...marked the 29th time in franchise history they have turned the trick and the first time since March 29 at STL (11R).
- ✦ The Rays improved to a season-high 34 games above .500 and reached 93 wins in a season for the sixth time, joining 2023 (99), 2021 (100), 2019 (96), 2010 (96), and 2008 (97).
- ✦ The Rays went 6-0 this season against the Athletics, marking the second time in franchise history they have swept a season series against an AL opponent (also: 2018 vs. KC, 7-0).
- ✦ The Rays have won six straight games (or more) for the MLB-most sixth time this season, while no other club has more than three such streaks (ATL, DET, LAD, SD)...their six winning streaks of six games or more surpassed the 2013 Rays (5x) for the most in a single season in franchise history. Dating back to July 20, the Rays are a majors'-best 27-4 when scoring first, including six straight wins (Sept. 8-pres.), and 10-13 when allowing the first run...they have plated the opening run in four straight home games after going a season-high six straight games at Tropicana Field in which they permitted the first tally (Aug. 30–Sept. 12).
- ✦ The Rays enter play tonight with a 5.0-game lead over the AL East, their largest lead since Aug. 19 (also 5.0GA)...in AL history (since 1901), 158 of 164 teams to hold a 5.0-game lead in Sept./Oct. have gone on to win the division; with 113 of 119 AL clubs in the divisional era (since 1969) doing so, including 44 of 45 AL East teams...only the 1978 Red Sox failed to hold their lead, finishing second.

SEE THE VALUE—Through 152 games this season, **Junior Caminero** ranks highly in the AL in home runs (1st, 41), SLG (2nd, 532), XBH (2nd, 65), total bases (2nd, 309), RBI (3rd, 96), OPS (3rd, .895), hits (4th, 161), walk-offs (T4th, 2), multi-hit games (6th, 43), runs (T6th, 94), multi-RBI games (9th, 23), AVG (10th, .277), and OBP (10th, .363)...he is the only player to rank in the top-5 of H, HR, RBI, XBH, SLG, OPS, and walk-offs in the AL.
✦ In his age-22 season, he is on pace to become the fourth Ray in team history to play 162 games in a season, joining **Evan Longoria** (2014), **Delmon Young** (2007), and **Aubrey Huff** (2003)...in reaching 162 games, he would become the first player in the modern era (since 1900) to hit 40 home runs or more and play in 162 games in an age-24-or-younger season...he would also become one of 12 players in the modern era to appear in 162 games in an age-22-or-younger season, and the seventh player to do so without appearing as a DH, PH, or PR...the last player to play 162 games without being a DH, PH, PR in an age-22-or-younger season was BAL **Manny Machado** (162G) in 2015.
✦ Additionally, he is on pace for 102 RBI this season...he would become the 23rd player (27x) in the modern era to produce 40 homers or more and 100 RBI or more while playing 162 games...only eight of the previous 22 players did so without appearing at DH, PH, or PR (ATL **Matt Olson**, 2023; MIL **Prince Fielder**, 2009; MIL **Richie Sexson**, 2003; TOR **Carlos Delgado**, 2000; CHC **Sammy Sosa**, 1999; COL **Vinny Castilla**, 1998; MIN **Harmon Killebrew**, 1969 & 1967; BOS **Carl Yastrzemski**, 1969).
✦ Defensively, he paces the AL with 1,325.2 innings played in the field...he is 56.0 innings behind Longoria's franchise record with 1,381.2 innings played in 2014...at third base, he has produced 3 defensive runs saved (DRS), more than 10 clubs have produced at all positions as a team thus far in 2026.

THE CAMINER-SHOW—Between his walk-off homers on Mon. vs. ATH and Sept. 11 vs. HOU, **Junior Caminero** became the sixth Ray with multiple walk-off plate appearances in the same homestand, first since **José Lobaton** on Aug. 16 and 18, 2013, and the first with multiple walk-off home runs, according to Elias...he joined **Brandon Lowe** (2023), **Johnny Damon** (2011), **Evan Longoria** (2011), and **Carl Crawford** (2003) as the only Rays to record multiple walk-off homers in a season...this marks the majors' first instance of a player recording multiple walk-off blasts in a homestand since BAL **Colton Cowser** turned the trick earlier this season from May 24-25 vs. DET.
✦ He has homered four times in his last 11 games to take sole possession of the AL lead with 41 HR, two ahead of second-ranked HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (39HR)...Caminero is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched NYY **Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead...Caminero would need 5 HR across the Rays final 10 games to match Peña's club record from 2007 (46HR).
✦ He has gone deep 22 times at Tropicana Field, one shy of the most long balls at home in a season in Rays history, a mark set by Peña in 2007 (23HR).

ARMED AND READY—Rays pitchers have allowed 18 runs over the last nine games, turning in a majors'-best 2.03 ERA (80.0IP, 18ER) and 0.73 WHIP in that span (Sept. 8-pres.)...the rotation has yielded one or zero runs in seven of those nine contests, pitching to a 1.25 ERA (50.1IP, 7ER)...Rays starters have gone 5.0 IP or more while yielding two runs or fewer in all nine games, tied for the second-longest streak in club history (see table on the right).

THE COUNTDOWN—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ✦ **Chandler Simpson** (.3107) trails AL Triple Crown candidate HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (.3114) by .0007 for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ✦ Simpson leads the AL in singles (147), stolen bases (44), and is T2nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD **Maury Wills** in 1962, NYY **Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, SLB **George Sisler** in 1922, and DET **Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallix Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **José Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ✦ **Bryan Baker** (40SV) is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024).
- ✦ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), **Simpson** (SB), and **Baker** (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ✦ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.14 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).
- ✦ The Rays need to go 2-8 or better over their final 10 contests to record their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the team record for consecutive such months (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).
- ✦ **Diaz** (.295) could become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back qualified seasons with a .300 average or better...only Crawford, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

TONIGHT'S START—Ian Seymour is slated to make his 15th start of the season and his 45th appearance...marks his 64th career appearance and 20th career start...owns the most strikeouts (98) among AL LHP over his last 14 outings (11 starts) since July 1, ahead of second-place BOS **Payton Tolle** (97)...was selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last eight starts since July 18 at BOS, the longest active streak and third longest by a Ray this year...**Nick Martinez** owns the two longest streaks, with the longest being an 11-start stretch from March 30–May 29.
- Among AL pitchers with 100.0 innings pitched or more this season, his 4.41 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks sixth among MLB southpaws and eighth in the AL.
- When pitching in the 4th inning this year, he has recorded 22 strikeouts in 16.1 IP, limiting the opposition to a .155 (9-for-58) clip...his opp. average in the frame is the second lowest among AL arms (min. 15.0IP in 4th inn.), behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (.126).
- Since transitioning to a starting/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 3.94 ERA (91.1IP, 40ER), a 1.07 WHIP and a .224 (79-for-352) opp. average (18G/12GS) compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his sixth quality start of the season after throwing 6.0 innings of two-run ball on Sept. 12 vs. HOU (6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, BB, 10SO, HR)...struck out **Jeremy Peña** on three pitches to begin his outing before allowing a home run to **Isaac Paredes** in the following plate appearance...recorded three consecutive 1-2-3 innings from the 2nd through the 5th frame...surrendered a **Jose Altuve** double and **Yainer Diaz** RBI-single in the 6th inning before handing the ball to **Tyler Wells** to begin the 7th.

- Struck out 10 batters, the seventh instance a Ray has fanned 10 batters or more in a game this season (last: Seymour, Aug. 31 vs. NYM - 10SO)...he has recorded three outings with double-digit strikeouts this season, becoming the third (4x) Rays southpaw to have as many or more in a season (also: **Blake Snell**; 2019, 5x & 2018, 7x - **Shane McClellanahan**; 2022, 4x).
- Generated a career-high-tying 19 whiffs (also: Aug. 31, 2026 vs. NYM), including nine on his changeup.
- He has allowed a home run in six straight games since Aug. 15 (10HR), the longest streak of his career...tied the longest run by a Ray this season, with **Jesse Scholtens** also giving up a long ball in six straight contests (May 8–Aug. 18 - 8HR).

LOVE THAT DIRTY WATER—Seymour is set to take the mound for his fifth career appearance and third start against the Red Sox tonight...owns a 1-0 record with a 3.27 ERA (11.0IP, 4ER), 12 strikeouts, a 0.82 WHIP, and a .108 (4-for-37) opp. average in those four appearances against the club...in 24 career appearances (seven starts) against AL East competition, he is 5-3 with a 4.48 ERA (66.1IP, 33ER), 82 strikeouts, a 1.15 WHIP, and a .227 (57-for-251) opp. average.

- His two starts against Boston both came this season, where he has logged a 5.14 ERA (7.0IP, 4ER) with a .125 (3-for-24) opp. average.
- Seymour is 10-7 with a 3.94 ERA (137.0IP, 60ER), 160 strikeouts, a 1.15 WHIP, and a .211 (108-for-512) opp. average against the AL over 44 career outings (14 starts)...the Rays are 23-21 when he pitches against an AL foe in his career.
- Made his MLB debut on June 9, 2025 at BOS, nearly 30 miles from his hometown of Westborough, Mass. (W, 2.0IP, 0H, 1R-0ER, 2BB, 2SO).

LOVE LETTER TO THE TROP—Seymour has appeared in 24 games (nine starts) at Tropicana Field this season...in those outings, he has a 4-4 record, a 3.75 ERA (69.2IP, 29ER), 87 strikeouts, a 0.98 WHIP, a .204 (52-for-255) opp. average, and two saves...he has allowed three runs or fewer in 23 of those 24 games in 2026, giving up six runs on July 12 vs. SEA...he is one of four AL pitchers with four wins or more, six holds or more (6), and multiple saves at home, joining MIN **Jeff Hoffman** (4W, 10HLD, 3SV), MIN **Andrew Morris** (4W, 10HLD, 3SV), and BOS **Garrett Whitlock** (6W, 11HLD, 2SV)...he is the seventh pitcher in franchise history to do so and the first since **Garrett Cleavinger** in 2024 (5W, 6HLD, 3SV).

- Across 30 career appearances (10 starts) at home, he has allowed four earned runs or more just twice: Aug. 19, 2025 vs. NYY (6ER) and July 12, 2026 vs. SEA (5ER)...has logged a 5-5 record with a 3.63 ERA (89.1IP, 36ER), a 1.04 WHIP, and a .216 (72-for-333) opp. average in those 30 career home outings.

SWING-AND-MISS STUFF—He boasts a 29.2 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking fifth among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to NYY **Brent Headrick** (32.2%), TEX **Jacob Latz** (31.5%), BOS **Jovani Morán** (31.6%), and HOU **Steven Okert** (30.9%)...126 of his 150 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, second most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (131)...Seymour's 117 swinging strikeouts are fifth most among AL southpaws this season.

- His out-of-zone swing pct. (35.6%) has increased 9.2 points from his mark last season (26.4%).

CHANGING IT UP—Seymour has utilized his changeup 29.0 pct. of the time this season, down from his 31.4 pct. usage rate in 2025...his 29.0 pct. usage rate in 2026 ranks sixth in the majors (min. 1,500 pitches) and third among southpaws behind PHI **Cristopher Sánchez's** MLB-leading 37.2 pct. clip and ATL **Martin Pérez** (30.9%)...min. 500 changeups thrown this year, Seymour's 39.0 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the third-highest mark in the majors behind DET/LAD **Tarik Skubal** (46.8%) and **Sánchez** (45.9%).
