BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their final homestand of the season with the second game of a three-game series with the Chicago White Sox tonight at Busch Stadium ... This nine-game/10-day homestand against the Pale Hose (1-0), Giants (Sept. 14-16), and Nationals (Sept. 18-20) is their longest of the season ... With 14 games remaining, St. Louis enters tonight's game in 4th place in the National League Central and 6.5 games out of the final NL Wild Card spot ... St. Louis has been mathematically eliminated from the NL Central division race.

FRENEMIES: St. Louis has beaten the White Sox eight times in the last 11 games (May 26, 2021-present), including the last four ... The Cardinals all-time .600 regular season win pct (27-18) over Chicago is their best against any American League opponent (1997-present).

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: After last night's game, **Alec Burleson** and **Jordan Walker** both reached 54 hits in Interleague play this season, most by any Cardinal since Interleague Play began in 1997 ... Burly's 33 RBI vs. AL teams ranks T-3rd all-time, while his 20 extra-base hits rank 2nd ... 2023 **Nolan Arenado** (36 RBI and 21 XBH) holds both Cardinals records.

THE GRANDFATHER OF BASEBALL: With one more win, the Cardinals will have reached 4,000 regular season victories since **John Vuch** was hired by the Cardinals organization before the 1979 season ... **Oliver Marmol** is two wins away from becoming the 9th Cardinals manager with 400.

LET THE KIDS PLAY: This series features the NL's and AL's top offensive productions from rookies this season (*see chart right*) ... The 2026 rookie class boasts the franchise's most plate appearances (1,694), at-bats (1,518), hits (363), homers (48), RBI (188), runs (206), and walks (127) over the last 66 seasons during the Expansion Era (1961-present), while ranking 3rd in fWAR (5.9) and 5th in stolen bases (29).

ROOKIE SENSATION: Through 10 career games, rookie backstop **Leo Bernal** has set Cardinals records with the most RBI (12) and RBI efforts (5) through a player's first 10 career games ... Only **Nelson Burbrink** (13 in 1955) has more hits by a Cards primary catcher than Bernal (12) through 10 games.

OUCH: **Ivan Herrera**'s MLB-high 29 hit-by-pitches are 2nd-most in Cardinals single-season history behind only **Steve Evans** (31 in 1910) ... Overall this season, St. Louis has been plunked 90 times, tying the Angels for the MLB lead this season and matching the 1901 Redbirds for most in franchise single-season history.

20/20 VISION: **Jordan Walker** (28 HR-19 SB) is one stolen base away from becoming the first Cardinal to achieve a 20 HR-20 SB season since 29-year-old **Tommy Pham** (23 HR/25 SB) in 2017 ... **Fernando Tatis** (34 HR/21 SB) in 1999 was the last Cardinal with a 30 HR-20 SB season.

CHICAGO CONNECTIONS

Cardinals broadcaster **John Rooney** spent 18 years (1998-2005) with the White Sox - one in TV followed by 17 seasons in radio...Rooney worked with the World Champion team in back-to-back seasons, following the White Sox win in 2005.

Erick Fedde and **Tommy Pham** were acquired from the White Sox on July 29, 2024 in a three-team, eight-player trade in which the White Sox received **Miguel Vargas** from the Dodgers...Fedde made 30 starts for the Cardinals from 2024-25... Pham was originally selected by St. Louis in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft and played in 385 games for St. Louis (2014-18, 2024).

Randal Grichuk began his MLB career with St. Louis and played in 404 games for the Cardinals from 2014-17.

Jordan Hicks was selected by St. Louis in the supplemental 3rd round of the 2015 MLB Draft and pitched in 187 games with 28 saves for the Cardinals from 2018-23.

José Fermín (July 7, 2023), **Kyle Leahy** (July 7, 2023) and **Riley O'Brien** (Sept. 28, 2021 w/CIN) made MLB debuts vs. the White Sox at Rate Field.

Brandon Allen was originally drafted by the White Sox in the 5th round of the 2004 MLB Draft out of Montgomery (Texas) High School...played five minor league seasons with the White Sox (2004-09).

Gordon Graceffo and **Thomas Saggese** were teammates with **Sam Antonacci** and **Kyle Teel** on Team Italy in the 2026 World Baseball Classic.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** was originally selected by the White Sox in the 7th round of the 1976 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** pitched in 52 games for the White Sox in 1988, and was their Opening Day starter against the California Angels (April 4, 1988 at Comiskey Park)...originally traded by the Cardinals with OF **Lance Johnson** and cash to Chicago for RHP **José DeLeón**.

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** managed both the Cardinals (1996-2011) and White Sox (1979-86, 2021-22) and is currently a Special Advisor for the White Sox.

Tristan Peters played college baseball in 2021 at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Ill.

White Sox 1B/OF Coach **José Leger** was a coach and manager in the Cardinals minor league system from 2018-25.

White Sox Asst. Hitting Coach **Joel McKeithan** played for the Gateway Grizzlies and his brother, **Aaron**, was drafted by the Cardinals in 2021.

White Sox Physical Therapist **Andrew Turpin** is a Quincy, IL native and University of Missouri alum.

Jon Jay played 47 games for the White Sox in '19.

White Sox Pitching Coach **Zach Bove** earned a master's degree in positive coaching and athletic leadership from the Univ. of Missouri in 2015.

Cardinals VP & Sr. Advisor **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

Sam Antonacci (Springfield, Ill.), **Bryan Hudson** (Godfrey, Ill.) and **Trevor Richards** (Aviston, Ill.) were all born within 100 miles of St. Louis.

White Sox Head Groundskeeper **Roger Bossard** designed and built new playing fields at Busch Stadium II and Busch Stadium III, as well as Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium in Jupiter, Fla.

Cardinals.TV play-by-play announcer **Chip Caray**'s grandfather, **Harry Caray**, was a broadcaster for the White Sox from 1971-81.

The Cardinals inducted **Charles Comiskey**, who played for the St. Louis Browns in the 1800s, into the St. Louis Cardinals Hall of Fame in 2022...was the founding owner of the White Sox...the White Sox former ballpark (1910-90) was named Comiskey Park, as was Rate Field when it opened in 1991.

Cardinals Pro Scout **Kerry Robinson** hit his 1st career home run on June 17, 2001 vs. the White Sox at Busch Stadium II.

NL RANKINGS: Swords (29, 8th), Winning percentage (.714, T-8th)

TONIGHT'S START:

- The 29-year old Colorado native (makes his 28th start of the season (29th career) and 126th career appearance. Leahy's first 97 Major League career appearances all came in relief (2023-25).
- Will be making his 1st career start against the White Sox, having made his past three appearances against the Pale Hose all in relief.
- Since June 23, ranks 2nd in MLB (min. 50.0 IP) with a 2.03 ERA (14 ER/62.0 IP) with 12 of his 13 starts in that span yielding 2 runs or fewer;** the Phillies **Jesus Luzardo** leads with a 1.65 mark.
- Allowed 2-or-fewer runs in a career-high 12 straight starts from June 23-August 29, matching the longest streak by a Cardinals hurler since at least 1900, with **Adam Wainwright** (12 in 2009). The streak was snapped in his start last Sun. (Sept. 6 at Colorado).
- Kyle surrendered just 8 runs combined over those 12 starts (1.37 ERA), the fewest by a Cardinal in any 12-start span since **Jack Flaherty** gave up 8 in a 12 start span from Aug 1-Sept. 29, 2019.
- Leahy's 2.74 second half ERA (42.2 IP) ranks 14th in NL since the All-Star Break with teammate **Andre Pallante** (2.35) ranking 10th; min. 40.0 IP.
- Leahy (10) and **Andre Pallante** (12) are the two Cardinals with double-digit wins this season ... Enters tonight on a career-high 5-game winning streak (June 28-present), tying **Andre Pallante** (5/23[1]-6/22) for the longest on the team this year.
- His 132.0 innings pitched are a single-season MLB career high, as are his 124 strikeouts. His career single-season high for IP as a professional is 144.2 in 2022 between Memphis (AAA) and Springfield (AA).
- Ranks in MLB's 97th percentile in arm extension (7.3 ft.), which is measured from how far off the mound he releases the ball on average.
- Led off his Aug. 12 start vs. PHI by striking out Kyle Schwarber (looking) for his 100th strikeout this season, marking his first MLB season with 100+ strikeouts.
- Kyle's 97 career relief appearances before his 1st career Major League start (Sept. 28, 2025 at CHI) were the most by a Cardinal since **Jordan Hicks** (April 21, 2022 at Miami) who made his 1st career start after having made 114 career relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT (Sunday, Sept. 6 at Colorado): ND, W 10-8; 2.2 IP, 6 H, 51 R, 5 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR - 55 pitches.

- While on pitch count, worked 2.2 IP, allowing a season-high 5 runs as his string of 12 consecutive starts allowing 2 runs or fewer was snapped.
- Took a no-decision as the Cardinals staged a comeback with 6 runs in their 5th, going on to a 10-8 win.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

DON'T WALK: Became one of three Cardinals to strike out 8-or-more batters with 0 walks in his 8/7 start vs. COL, along with **Dustin May** (9 SO, 0 BB) on 5/27 at MIL and **Matthew Liberatore** (9 SO, 0 BB) on 8/19 at CIN.

BEND, DON'T BREAK: Ranks T-1st among MLB starting pitchers in opponent batting average with 2 outs & RISP at .125 BA (7-56) with Tampa Bays **Nick Martinez**.

CENTRAL FOCUS: Earned four wins against NL Central opponents this season (April 28 at PIT, May 4 vs. MIL, July 4 at Chicago, Aug. 18 at Cincinnati) to improve to 6-1 in his career against divisional opponents.

EN GARDE: Ranks T-8th among NL pitchers with his 29 Opponent's Sword Swings (1st: Cade Cavalli, 39). *A “sword” swing is an expression of the art of forcing a batter to take an uncomfortable, awkward swing.*

AIR BENDER: Boasts average swing & miss distances of 5.5 inches on his sweeper, 2nd among Cardinals starters (**McGreevy**, 5.6 inches).

HELLO 4TH OF JULY: Hurlled 5.0 scoreless innings through the Wrigley Field fog as the Cardinals handed the Cubs a 3-0 shutout on Independence Day ... Leahy allowed three singles and struck out six on only 77 pitches ... Following a 49-minute pre-game rain delay, **JJ Wetherholt** homered on the first pitch of the game . The game was also halted for 15 minutes after the 6th inning due to heavy fog combined with smoke from nearby fireworks.

PARK PLACE: Has made 8 starts this year at a Park (Last: 8/23 at Citizen's Bank Park); each of his first six road games took place at Parks (Petco Park, Comerica Park, Daikin Park, loanDepot park, PNC Park, Great American Ball Park). His start at Target Field on June 12 ended the string.

NO DECISIONS: Has earned the decision in 14 of his 27 starts, but just 6 decisions in his last 18 starts, going 5-1 since 5/23(2) at CIN.

STRETCHING OUT: Worked at least 5.0 innings in 20 of his 27 starts on the year, including a career-high 6.1 innings on 6/23 vs. Arizona.
