AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a season-long 10-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Toronto (through Sun.)...will also play a three-game series vs. Houston (Tues.-Thurs.) and a four-game set vs. Boston (8/28-30)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game road trip after dropping two-of-three games at Toronto and sweeping Baltimore in three games.

- **Their 72-55 (.567) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (79-49, .617), Los Angeles-NL (77-51, .602), Tampa Bay (76-51, .598), Atlanta (75-53, .586) and Chicago-NL (74-54, .578).
- Have won four straight games (since 8/16) after losing their previous three games (8/13-15)...have won six of their last nine games (since 8/11) and eight of their last 12 games (since 8/7)...**are 18-11 in their last 29 games (since 7/19) and 22-13 in their last 35 games (since 7/9).**
- **Have won four of their last six series (since 7/31) and have won or split nine of their last 12 series since 7/6 (are 7-3-2 in those series).**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees completed a three-game sweep of the Orioles with a 6-1 win on Thursday at Camden Yards...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (6.0IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR) earned his seventh win of the season after allowing just 1R/ER over 6.0IP...**3B José Caballero** (0-for-4, 1RBI) drove in the first run for the Yankees after reaching on a fielder's choice in the third inning...**DH Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice, including an RBI single in the third inning...**LF Heliot Ramos** (1-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) collected his first RBI as a Yankee with an RBI double in the third inning...**1B Luis García Jr.** (3-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI) recorded 3H, including a solo home run in the sixth inning...**RF Spencer Jones** (3-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1SB) recorded a season-high-tying 3H, including a solo home run in the sixth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-4, 1 triple, 1RBI) hit an RBI triple in the eighth inning...**LHP Ryan Yarbrough** (3.0IP, 4K) earned his third save of the season after retiring all nine batters faced and striking out a season-high-tying four batters.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES: **OF Spencer Jones** recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Thursday at Baltimore, including his sixth home run of the season with a solo shot in sixth inning (also 3H on 6/5 vs. Boston)...**has hit safely in six of his last eight games (since 8/12), batting .300/.323/.500 (9-for-30) with 5R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI, 1HP and 3SB over that span.**

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: **INF Luis García Jr.** hit his career-high 25th home run of the season (and second as a Yankee) with a solo shot in the sixth inning on Thursday at Baltimore...has hit .279/.309/.541 (115-for-412) with 53R, 23 doubles, 5 triples, 25HR, 80RBI, 19BB, 2SF and 4SB in 118 games this season...is tied for fourth in the Majors in multi-HR games (four), ranks fifth in SLG and tied for ninth in RBI.

- Over his last 84 games (since 5/9), has batted .296/.328/.615 (90-for-304) with 39R, 17 doubles, 4 triples, 24HR, 64RBI, 15BB, 1SF and 2SB...during that stretch, leads the Majors in SLG, is tied for third in HR and RBI, ranks fourth in XBH (45) and sixth in OPS (.943).
- Has batted .293/.321/.575 (103-for-351) with 23 doubles, 5 triples, 22HR and 15BB vs. right-handed pitchers this season
- Has hit .317/.336/.529 (33-for-104) with 7 doubles, 5HR, 50RBI, 4BB and 2SF with runners in scoring position this year.

RICE RICE BABY: **C/INF Ben Rice** reached base twice, including an RBI single in the third inning, on Thursday, at Baltimore...has 2HR and 4RBI over his last four games (since 8/16).

- Has hit a career-high 34HR in 122 games this year after hitting 26HR in 138 games in 2025.
- 57 of his 114H this year have been extra-base hits (20 doubles, 3 triples, 34HR).

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: **Yankees relievers have allowed just 1ER over their last 15.2 innings** (since the eighth inning on 8/16 at Toronto)...**have posted a Major League-best 2.46 ERA (252.1IP, 69ER) over their last 67 games (since 6/3),** holding opponents to a .197 (179-for-908) BA during that stretch.

- **Own the best inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season (21.5%) and the second-best bullpen ERA (3.00, second in AL)**...also rank second in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.299, second in AL), opponents' OPS (.644, second in AL) and WHIP (1.19, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (.219, first in AL) and opponents' SLG (.345, second in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.92, second in AL) and ninth in K/BB (2.51, fifth in AL).
- **Have three relievers in the top-seven for the lowest inherited runners scored percentage in the Majors this season** - Tim Hill (6.7%, first), Brent Headrick (10.3%, fifth) and Fernando Cruz (13.6%, seventh).

GOOD SCHLITT: **RHP Cam Schlittler** will make his 27th start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Toronto...has gone 10-6 with a 2.19 ERA (152.0IP, 37ER) and 189K in 26 starts this season, holding opponents to a .196/.249/.321 (109-for-555) slash line...**his 2.19 ERA is the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era (since 1961),** trailing only Steve Kline (1.71 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.91 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.16 ERA in 1964).

- **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 26 starts this season,** tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 18 starts this season, including 16 of his last 22 starts (since 4/17)...his 18 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied with Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1963) for the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season since 1913** (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Ford (20GS in 1964) and Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969).
- **His 189K are the sixth-most by a Yankees pitcher through their first 26 games of a season,** trailing only Gerrit Cole's 217K in 2021 and 200K in 2022, David Cone's 214K in 1997, Ron Guidry's 194K in 1978 and Luis Severino's 192K in 2017.

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 18 of their last 21 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 15 of those starts, posting a 2.04 ERA (119.0IP, 27ER) during that span**...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 21 of their last 26 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 18 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.33 ERA (143.0IP, 37ER) with 161K during that span.

- **Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six of their last seven starts (since 8/13) and eight of their last 10 starts (since 8/9).**
- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 100 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 127 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 99GS in 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 76 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 127 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 80 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 32 of their last 36 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 27 of those starts, posting a 2.70 ERA (193.0IP, 58ER) during that span.
- **Yankees starters own the best ERA in the Majors (3.36),** rank third in strikeout rate (25.3%, first in AL), opponents' BA (.225, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.38, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.662, second in AL), tied for third in strikeouts (711, tied for first in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.290, second in AL) and opponents' SLG (.372, third in AL), fifth in WHIP (1.15, third in AL) and HR/9.0IP (1.06, third in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.31, third in AL) and seventh in BB/9.0IP (2.84, fourth in AL).

COLE TRAIN: **RHP Gerrit Cole** earned his seventh win of the season on Thursday at Baltimore after allowing just 1R/ER over 6.0IP (4H, 1BB, 8K, 1HR)...**struck out Samuel Basallo in the sixth inning for his 1,015th strikeout as a Yankee, surpassing Roger Clemens (1,014K) for 12th place on the Yankees' all-time strikeout list.**

- Has gone 7-6 with a 3.11 ERA (92.2IP, 32ER) and 100K in 16 starts this season...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 13 of his 16 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 11 of those starts.**
- **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (since 7/28) and 1ER-or-fewer in four of those starts, going 4-1 with a 1.47 ERA (30.2IP, 5ER) and 34K during that span.**
- Has tossed at least 6.0IP in seven of his last eight starts (since 7/8) and 10 of his 16 starts this season.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.22 ERA (1,134.2IP, 406ER) this season** (next: Milwaukee-3.46)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 18 of their last 26 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 14 of those games, posting a 2.47 ERA (237.0IP, 65ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 23 of their last 34 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.67 ERA (310.0IP, 92ER) with 335K during that span.
- Their 471R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 127 games of a season in the last 48 162-game seasons (since 1977), trailing only their 442R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

MERRY GRISHMAS: **OF Trent Grisham** reached base twice on Thursday at Baltimore...**is batting .341/.383/.773 (15-for-44) with 7R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 3BB over his last 11 games (since 8/8).**

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (10-6, 2.19 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his 27th start of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Toronto...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his 26th start of the season on Saturday at Toronto and allowed only 1R/ER over 5.1IP in a no-decision (4H, 3BB, 7K, 0HR)...**has gone 10-6 with a 2.19 ERA (152.0IP, 109H, 44R/37ER, 34BB, 189K, 14HR) in 26 starts this season**...has also allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 18 of his starts, including 16 of his last 22 starts (since 4/17)...**his 2.19 ERA is the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era** (since 1961), trailing only Steve Kline (1.71 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.91 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.16 ERA in 1964)...**his 18 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied with Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1963) for the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Ford (20GS in 1964) and Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969)**...was named to his first All-Star team, but did not pitch...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...in 40 career Major League starts, has gone 14-9 with a 2.44 ERA (225.0IP, 167H, 68R/61ER, 65BB, 273K, 22HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 34-of-40 career starts, 2R-or-fewer in 29 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 23 starts...according to *Elias*, **his 2.44 career ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 40 career starts since 1913** (ignoring relief appearances and excluding openers), trailing only Stan Bahnsen (2.33 ERA) and Ron Guidry (2.41 ERA)...**also marks the fourth-lowest ERA by any Major League pitcher whose first 40 career appearances were all starts since 1913** (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Paul Skenes (2.03 ERA), José Fernández (2.30 ERA) and Dwight Gooden (2.38 ERA)...**his 273K through his first 40 career games are the most in franchise history** (previous: Masahiro Tanaka - 256K)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 26th start of the season on Saturday at Toronto and allowed only 1R/ER over 5.1IP in a no-decision (4H, 3BB, 7K, 0HR)...after allowing an RBI single to Alejandro Kirk in the third inning, retired nine of his final 11 batters faced (1H, 1BB).

- 2026:** In 26 starts this season, has gone 10-6 with a 2.19 ERA (152.0IP, 109H, 44R/37ER, 34BB, 189K, 14HR)...has held opponents to a .196/.249/.321 (109-for-555) slash line...**see Major League rankings at right**.
- His **2.19 ERA is the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era** (since 1961), trailing only Steve Kline (1.71 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.91 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.16 ERA in 1964).
 - His **189K are the sixth-most by a Yankees pitcher through their first 26 games of a season**, trailing only Gerrit Cole's 217K in 2021 and 200K in 2022, David Cone's 214K in 1997, Ron Guidry's 194K in 1978 and Luis Severino's 192K in 2017.
 - Has **allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 26 starts this season, including 1R-or-fewer in 16 starts (including six scoreless starts)**...his 22 starts of 3R-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
 - Has **allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 18 starts this season, including 16 of his last 22 starts (since 4/17)...his 18 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied with Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1963) for the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Ford (20GS in 1964) and Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969)**.
 - Has gone 8-2 with a 1.14 ERA (95.0IP, 12ER) and 114K in 15 road starts this season...has allowed one-or-zero ER in 13 starts, including 11 of his last 12 starts (since 4/23)...according to *Elias*, **his 1.14 ERA on the road is the seventh-lowest by any Major League pitcher over his first 15 road starts of a season** (since 1913), trailing only Bob Gibson's 0.72 ERA in 1968, Walter Johnson's 0.88 ERA in 1913, Claude Hendrix's 1.01 ERA in 1914, Luis Tiant's 1.05 ERA in 1968, Grover Alexander's 1.07 ERA in 1916 and Greg Maddux's 1.12 ERA in 1995.
 - Has recorded at least 7K in 16 of his starts, including 8K in 11 starts...has recorded at least 10K in a start three times this season (13K on 6/19 vs. Cincinnati, 12K on 7/24 at Philadelphia and 11K on 8/9 vs. Atlanta).
 - Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 17 of his starts, the second-most in the Majors (first in AL).
 - The Yankees are 15-11 in his starts...his 15 team wins are tied for the seventh-most in the AL.
 - Has received 2R-or-fewer of support in 16 of his starts, including one-or-zero runs in 12 starts...has received one-or-zero runs of support in six of his last seven starts (since 7/11).
 - Has tossed at least 6.0IP in 15 of his 26 starts this season, including 14 of his last 22 starts (since 4/17)...his 15 starts of at least 6.0IP are tied for the sixth-most in the AL...has tossed more than 6.0IP nine times this season, including at least 7.0 innings five times.
 - Has held right-handed batters to a .190/.232/.306 (41-for-216) slash line this season...ranks fourth in the Majors in opponents' OBP (second in AL), fifth in opponents' OPS (.538, second in AL) and seventh in opponents' BA (fourth in AL)...has held left-handed hitters to a .201/.259/.330 (68-for-339) slash line.
 - Opposing batters are hitting .151/.219/.269 (14-for-93) off Schlittler with RISP this season**.
 - Has started after a Yankees' loss 12 times this season...the Yankees are 7-5 in those starts with Schlittler going 3-3 with a 2.61 ERA (69.0IP, 20ER)...over his last 10 such starts (since 4/17), the Yankees are 6-4 with Schlittler going 3-2 with a 2.14 ERA (59.0IP, 14ER) in that stretch...in those 10 starts, has tossed at least 6.0IP six times and has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in eight starts.
 - Was named to his first All-Star team, but did not pitch.
