TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 7-game homestand with the first of 3 games against the Texas Rangers...Seattle also hosted the Athletics (1-3) on the homestand...following Thursday's game, the Mariners embark on their final road trip of the season against the Athletics (3 G, 9/11-9/13), Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 9/14-9/16) and Colorado Rockies (3 G, 9/18-9/20)...tonight's showdown against the Rangers will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won Sunday's series finale over the Athletics by a 2-0 final score, their 10th shutout victory of the season.

- **Soar With Four** - The Mariners are 49-21 (.700) in 70 games when they score 4+ runs, and 17-56 (.233) in 73 games when they score 3-or-fewer runs.
- **In The Mix With Six** - The Mariners are 43-28 (.606) in 71 games when their starting pitchers go 6.0+ innings, and 24-49 (.329) in 73 games when starters fail to record 18+ outs in a game.
- **Programming Note** - Tomorrow's radio broadcast will air on **KTTH 770 AM** and the **Seattle Sports App**.
- **Canzone Flirting with Rare Air** - **Dominic Canzone** has an .804 OPS this season after posting an .839 OPS in 2025...Canzone is on pace to be the first Mariners player (min. 250 PA) to post back-to-back .800+ OPS seasons since **Julio Rodríguez** (2022-23)...Nelson Cruz (2015-18) is the last Mariners player to post an .800+ OPS in 3+ straight seasons.
- **J.P. Sizzle** - **J.P. Crawford** has an active 7-game hitting streak (8/31-c), batting .526 (10x19) with 9 walks, a .667 OBP and an 1.246 OPS in 30 plate appearances.

RALEIGH REALLY ROLLING RECENTLY...**Cal Raleigh** went 1-for-3 with a walk in Sunday's win..."Big Dumper" has hit safely in 8-consecutive games (8/29-c) and reached safely at least twice in each of his last 4 games (9/3-c)...he has been red-hot at the plate for the last few weeks (8/16-c), batting .333 (20x60) with 14 runs, 4 doubles, 9 home runs, 16 RBI and 14 walks, getting on base at a robust .459 clip, slugging .850 with a 1.309 OPS across 74 plate appearances...during that span (8/16-c), among players with at least 50 plate appearances, Raleigh's 1.309 OPS ranks 2nd in the big leagues behind only Mickey Gasper-BOS (1.379)...Raleigh's .877 SLG also ranks 2nd to Gasper (.865).

20/20 VISIONARIES...**Randy Arozarena** and **Julio Rodríguez** have both recorded 20/20 seasons in back-to-back years (2025-26), joining Alex Rodriguez and Ken Griffey Jr. (1998-99) as the only other pair of Mariners teammates with a 20/20 season in the same year, also doing so in consecutive seasons...Arozarena and Rodríguez are the only teammates in AL this season to each reach 20+ HR and 20+ SB, joined in MLB by only Jackson Merrill and Fernando Tatis Jr of the Padres.

RANDY'S CONSISTENCY...left fielder **Randy Arozarena** has been remarkably consistent throughout the 2026 season, with his highest monthly OPS coming in August (.884) and his lowest coming in June (.768)...Randy's on-base percentage also has not dipped below .355 in a month, nor his batting average below .250 in a month.

FOUR WITH A SCORE OF HOME RUNS...the Mariners have 4 players with 20+ home runs this season: **Randy Arozarena**, **Dominic Canzone**, **Cal Raleigh** and **Julio Rodríguez**...the M's are 1 of 6 MLB teams to have 4 players record 20+ HR this season and the only team in the AL, joined by the Cubs, Braves, Nationals, Padres and Reds.

MUNY OUR SAVIOR...**Andrés Muñoz** recorded his 102nd save with the Mariners in Sunday's game, moving into sole possession of 3rd place on the all-time Mariners leaderboard, trailing only Kazuhiko Sasaki (129 SV) and Edwin Díaz (109 SV)...the save marked Muñoz 25th of the season, giving him back-to-back 25+ save seasons...he is the 7th Mariners pitcher with back-to-back 25+ save seasons and the first since Edwin Díaz (2017-18).

COLE YOUNG, AMERICAN LEAGUE GOLD GLOVER?...second baseman **Cole Young** has been the best defensive second baseman in the American League this season according to Defensive Runs Saved (*Sports Info Solutions*)...Young's 16 DRS trails only Brice Turang-MIL (20 DRS) in MLB...Young also leads AL second basemen in fielding percentage (.991), assists (365) and innings (1,218.1).

MICHAEL ARROYO DEBUTS...INF/OF **Michael Arroyo** made his Major League debut on Sunday, playing second base and going 0-for-3...in 114 games between Double-A Arkansas (65 G) and Triple-A Tacoma (49 G) this season, Arroyo is batting .283 (131x463) with 84 runs, 23 doubles, 5 triples, 18 home runs, 81 RBI, 43 walks and 17 stolen bases, with a .359 OBP, .471 slugging percentage and .830 OPS...the Cartagena native became the fourth Mariners player born in Colombia, joining INF/OF Jolbert Cabrera (2004), RHP Emiliano Fruto (2006) and IF Donovan Solano (2025).

PROSPECT PIPELINE...The Mariners have had 4 Top 100 prospects (*MLB Pipeline*) debut this season: INF **Colt Emerson**, LHP **Kade Anderson**, OF **Lazaro Montes** and INF/OF **Michael Arroyo**...the Mariners have had at least 1 *MLB Pipeline* Top 100 prospect debut for them in 7 of the last 8 seasons (2019-23, '25-26)...the 4 Top 100 prospects are tied for the most to debut for the Mariners in a season since at least 2011, joining the 4 that debuted in 2013 (INF Nick Franklin, C Mike Zunino, RHP Taijuan Walker and LHP James Paxton)...*MLB Pipeline* historical rankings go back to 2011.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...RHP **Bryan Woo** tossed a career-high 8.0 innings pitched and allowed just 1 hit on Sunday against the Athletics, and...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...it marked the first start by a Mariners player of at least 8.0 innings and 1-hit or fewer allowed since Mike Leake (7/19/19 vs. LAA) allowed 1 hit over 9.0 innings pitched, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marked the 3rd 1-hitter thrown by the Mariners this season, tying the franchise record for most games in a season allowing 1 hit-or-fewer, joining the 2015 Mariners?...Seattle also combined for 1-hitters this season on April 3 at LAA and July 4 vs. TOR.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 8

- **1995** - Randy Johnson wins his 14th and the club moves into a tie with Kansas City for the wild card.
- **1999** - Tom Lampkin hits 2-run game-ending HR vs. Toronto's Billy Koch to give team 4-3 victory.
- **2002** - The Mariners score 8 runs in the 11th inning to beat the Royals 16-9 at Kaufmann Stadium. The game featured 27 hits, six home runs and 13 pitchers combining for 12 walks, two hit-batters, four wild pitches and two blown saves.
- **2011** - Ichiro Suzuki hit his 36th career leadoff home run on the first pitch from Luke Hochevar. The HR broke a tie for 6th place in the all-time record books with Bobby Bonds. The Mariners beat the Royals 4-1.
- **2016** - Kyle Seager hit his 27th home run of the season in the 7th inning of a 6-3 win over the Rangers, setting a new career high.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 19th appearance (18th start) of the season and the 93rd appearance (92nd start) of his career...it marks his 7th career start against the Rangers and 2nd of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 9/2 at BOS, tossed 4.2 innings, allowing only 1 run (1 ER) on 7 hits and 1 walk while striking out 3 batters...marked his 5th start with 1-or-fewer earned runs and 1-or-fewer walks allowed over 4.2 innings, tied for 8th most in the AL since he made his debut on May 13.

FOR THE HOME CROWD...owns a 3.14 ERA (15 ER, 43.0 IP) with a 0.884 WHIP at home, ranking 7th best in MLB, and a 3.36 K/BB...is holding opposing batters to a .159 (24x151) batting average at home for the 2nd-lowest mark in MLB...as of now, is the 6th lowest home opponent batting average recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season...his 24 hits allowed through his first 8 home starts are the fewest allowed by a Mariners pitcher through their first 8 home starts of the season...Miller's 40 baserunners through his first 8 home starts rank T-9th (min. 40.0 IP) fewest through a starting pitchers first 8 home starts since 2023 (also: 2 others).

HE'S FROM TEXAS, I CAN TELL...owns a 2.86 ERA (11 ER, 32.2 IP) with 26 strikeouts, 10 walks, and a 1.10 WHIP over his last 6 games against Texas teams (TEX & HOU)...has allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in 5 of his last 6 combined starts against those 2 teams, including 3 starts with 6.0 innings pitched...in 3 of his last 4 starts against the Rangers has allowed 2-or-fewer runs over 4.0+ IP and in 2 of his last 3 has allowed 1-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP.

MILLER'S STOMPING GROUNDS...over 8 home starts, has recorded 6 outings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0 IP...has struck out 6+ batters in 5 of his home starts...his 5 home starts with 3-or-fewer hits allowed over 4.0+ IP rank T-3rd most in MLB since the start of May while he is 1-of-6 pitchers with 4+ home starts with 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed over 5.0 IP over that span.

SHERIFFS IN TOWN...over 4 appearances (3 starts) against AL West teams this season, owns a 3.57 ERA (9 ER, 22.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts, 1 walk and a 1.01 WHIP, ranking 14th best in MLB in 2026. (min. 20.0 IP)...his 7.50 K/BB against AL West teams this season ranks 4th best in MLB...in 28 career games (27 starts) against AL West teams, he owns a 3.68 ERA (151.2 IP, 62 ER) with a 4.97 K/BB, 11th-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 100.0 IP) and a 1.08 WHIP, ranking 7th-best.

LUCKY NUMBER 500.0...with 4.2 innings of work in his last start on Sept. 2 at BOS, has surpassed 500 career innings pitched (500.2 IP), becoming the Mariners 33rd pitcher to record 500.0 innings with the franchise and the 15th to do so in the first 92 games of their career, joining **George Kirby**, **Logan Gilbert**, and **Bryan Woo**...is the 7th pitcher in MLB that made their debut in 2023-or-later to record their 500th inning pitched, joining Woo...the Mariners are 1-of-2 rotations in MLB to have 4+ pitchers with 500.0 IP with their current team (also: AZ).

LIKE PLAYING CATCH...Miller has allowed 2-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings this season, T-8th most since he made his season debut, and has recorded 5.0+ IP with a single hit allowed in 3 appearances, 1-of-2 players to record 3+ such games since May 13...this season marks the first in which he has recorded multiple games of 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed...his league-leading 3 such outings are also tied for the 2nd most recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season, joining Luis Castillo (2023) and Roy Thomas (1985) and just trailing **Bryan Woo**'s 4 outings in 2025.

THE GOLDEN RATIO...is 1-of-6 pitchers in MLB this season to own 95+ strikeouts and 26-or-fewer walks...his career 3.50 K/BB ranks 13th-best in the AL since 2023 and ranks 7th among Mariners pitching leaders...has recorded 8 games with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks since making his season debut on May 13...his 8 such games are T-9th most in the AL over that span...is 1-of-11 pitchers to make 4 appearances with 7+ strikeouts and no walks since May 13...on June 25 at PIT tossed 11 strikeouts to 0 walks for his 2nd such career outing (also: 9/11/25 vs. LAA), becoming 1-of-6 Mariners pitchers to record multiple such outings in their career.

CRACKING THE WHIP...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400.0 IP) with a 1.125 WHIP...is 1-of-16 pitchers to own a sub-1.119 WHIP and a K/9 greater than 8.3 since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP).
